The University of Ilorin College of Health of Sciences has produced a new set of 83 medical doctors. The professional initiation and admission ceremony of the new medics, the 24th in the series, came up last Wednesday, March 25, 2009 at the University of Ilorin under the Chairmanship of the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Is-haq O. Oloyede.

In his lecture at the occasion, entitled “Quality in Healthcare: a Different Perspective”, Oba Dr. Victor Adesimbo Ademefun Kiladejo began by chronicling the story of his excitement when admitted into the medical school and his joy to be inducted into the profession many years back. He therefore congratulated the graduands on their success noting that they had won a very challenging competition.

According to the Osemawe and Paramount Ruler of Ondo Kingdom, it is essential to maintain quality, which is doing the right thing right at the first time and doing it better the second time. He also defined quality further as “sustained superior performance at all times”. *(Contd. on page 2)*

Oladosu appointed Chief Imam of the University

Following the recent retirement of the former Chief Imam of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Rasheed Ajani Raji, a new Chief Imam has been appointed by the Unilorin Muslim Community. He is Prof. Abdul Ganiy Abdus Salaam Oladosu, the Director of Academic Planning, University of Ilorin.

Prof. Oladosu, a native of Erin Osun in Osun State, was born in Cape Coast, Ghana, on the 10th of February, 1950. He had his Arabic education under the tutelage of Sheikh Muhammad Kamaldeen Habeebullah al-Adabiy before proceeding on scholarship to the prestigious Al-Azhar University, Cairo, Egypt, founded in 970 A.D., where he bagged a B.A. (2nd Class Upper) in Foreign Languages and Literature with emphasis on simultaneous translation in 1979. He subsequently obtained his M.A. in Teaching Arabic as a Foreign Language (TAFL) from the American University in Cairo in 1982 before bagging a Ph.D in Arabic Language Education in 1988 at the University of Ilorin. *(Contd. on page 3)*

New medics urged to be honest and hard-working

He described quality as a necessary criterion in achieving healthcare success as he highlighted the visible and invisible consequences of poor quality. According to the King, the visible consequences are poor utilisation, prolonged illness, wrong diagnosis and treatment increased litigation, repeated OPD visits and death while the invisible costs are frustrated patients, loss of patients trust, unnecessary illness, wasted medications or polypharmacy, lost pride and poor cost recovery.

The Guest Lecturer, who was described by the Chairman as a royal father-doctor, admonished the new graduands to cultivate “a conscious and deliberate process of strategic thought, planning and continuous appraisal” in order to remain leading and relevant players in contemporary healthcare business. While urging the graduands to maintain the virtues of honesty and integrity, he charged them to be hard-working, noting that the only place where you find wealth before work is the dictionary”.

Earlier in his address, captioned “Health is Wealth”, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Is-haq O. Oloyede, had observed that medicine is a noble profession because it deals with life and there is nothing as important as human life. He emphasised that health providers are significant citing the Qu’ranic verse, “if anyone killed a person... it would be as if he killed all mankind, and if anyone saved a life, it would be as if he saved the life of all mankind”. He submitted that medical practitioners are special and as such, the new graduands should be focused.

“A medical career is bolstered by service, sacrifice and selflessness. Your duty is to serve regardless of sentiments; your call is to sacrifice sleep, comfort and leisure to protect life. Your job is to be selfless such that under no circumstance will monetary consideration over-rule your keen sense of professional judgement”, Prof. Oloyede said.

In his farewell address to the medical graduands, the Provost, College of Health Sciences, Prof. Bababode J. Bojuwoye, congratulated the graduands on making “the first flight to Geneva” and decried the emergent trend in which some medical doctors serve as cashiers in banks. He urged the graduands to imbibe “the spirit of humility, patience, honesty, integrity and dedication to the service of humanity”.

“You must shun unethical practice and let the motto of your alma mater, ‘probitas doctrina’ meaning *in character and in learning* be your watchword. Bear in mind that in any profession you find practitioners who belong to three groups: the good, the bad and the ugly. So it is with the medical profession. The choice is yours as to which group you want to belong to”, Prof. Bojuwoye noted.

One of the graduands, Dr. Adenike Abubakre, in a chat with *Unilorin Bulletin* expressed her gratitude to God for making her scale through the hurdles as she described medical training in Darwinian terms: the survival of the fittest. The daughter of the Vice-Chancellor of Al-Hikmah University, Prof. R. D. Abubakre, urged her colleagues to imbibe the lessons provided by the lecture and the speeches delivered saying that the foundation of success is to follow good advice.

The reputable Harvard University has announced that students from low-income families can now attend the University without paying tuition fees.

According to the President of the University, Lawrence H. Summers, “when only ten percent of the students in elite higher education come from families in the lower half of the income distribution, we are not doing enough. We are not doing enough in bringing elite higher education to the lower half of the income distribution”.

In the announcement recently made by the authorities of the institution, students from families that earn less than \$60,000 a year are qualified to attend the University for free: no tuition fees, no student loans!

Prof. Oladosu joined the services of the University of Ilorin in 1983 as an Assistant Lecturer and rose through the ranks to become a Professor in 2005. He is a member of many professional associations and had served the University in several capacities including being Head of the Department of Curriculum Studies and Educational Technology (SCET), Editor-in-Chief of *Journal of Curriculum and Instruction*, Sub-Dean, Student Affairs, Director, Institute of Education, among several others at various times.

The Director of Academic Planning has also served as external examiners to various higher institutions across the country and he was a member of various NCE and NUC Accreditation teams over the years. He had also attended conferences and participated in seminars and workshops and presented papers within and outside Nigeria. He has at least 35 books, chapters and journal articles to his credit.

As a religious leader, the former Deputy Chief Imam of the University had been a vanguard of moral education among youths since he joined the University. He has traversed the four corners of Nigeria and beyond delivering lectures on Islam and morality, counseling couples and solemnising marriages. The former broadcaster and translator at the Egyptian Broadcasting Station, Cairo, is a resource person to various Islamic organisations and a well sought-after public speaker.

Meanwhile, two Deputy Chief Imams (I and II) have also been appointed by the Muslim Community along with the Chief Imam. They are respectively Dr. Y.K. Jumu’ah of the Department of Religions and Dr. N. I. Raji of the Department of Arabic.
