Abdulkareem rejoices with Muslims at Eid-el Fitri

The Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Sulyman Age Abdulkareem, has rejoiced with members of the University's Muslim community as well as the generality of Muslims across the nation on the successful completion of the Ramadan fast, which ended over the weekend.

In a statement signed by the institution's Director of Corporate Affairs, Mr. Kunle Akogun, the Vice-Chancellor said that Muslims should remain grateful to Allah for enabling them to participate effectively in the month-long spiritual cleansing exercise, which Ramadan fast represents.

Prof. Abdulkareem said that the series of self-denials to which Muslims exposed themselves throughout the month were not for

While pointing out that the nation would be better off if all citizens adopt the teachings of Ramadan in their subsequent relationships and interactions with one another, the Vice-Chancellor explained that the neglect of the virtues of Ramadan by Muslims would be a disservice on the part of all those who took part in the fast for the last 30 days.

Prof. Abdulkareem called on Muslims to reflect the lessons of Ramadan in

their private lives and in their public interactions with their fellow citizens for us to build a greater nation.

Speaking on the ongoing industrial dispute between the Federal Government and university workers, the Vice-Chancellor advised both parties to draw inspirations from the experiences, lessons and essence of Ramadan by embracing peace, reconciliation and progressive tendencies in the interest of the students.

He added that the ongoing industrial

logjam, which is forcing students to remain at home, could and should be resolved for the benefit of all, saying that he is personally at pain with the strike.

Prof. Abdulkareem, who is also the Chairman of the Committee of Vice-Chancellors of Nigerian Universities (CVCNU), assured stakeholders that the University of Ilorin would continue to ensure that it offers quality service delivery to the students, the nation and humanity at large.

The Grand Kadi, who was a guest on Al-Irshad, a special Ramadan programme that focuses on The Truth, appealed to Muslim faithful in the University of Ilorin, and Nigeria, in general, to pay their Zakat as commanded by Allah to alleviate the abject poverty that is ravaging the country.

Justice Kamaldeen explained that Allah introduced Zakat to make everyone enjoy a bit of good life, pointing out that if Muslims observe the Zakat as authorized by Allah, poverty would have reduced in the world.

He explained that any Muslim who

has up to N2, 412,123. 92 is qualified to pay 1/40 of such amount, which is about N60, 300, as Zakat.

Aside from being among the pillars of Islam, the jurist said paying the Zakat is essentially important because it purifies the wealth and souls, eradicates poverty and moves observers closer to Al-Janat (Paradise).

Justice Kamaldeen, however, encouraged willing Muslims to pay their Zakat to reputable Islamic organizations such as the Majalis (Council) for Sadaqah, Zakat, and Waqf, which was recently launched by the Emir of Ilorin.

UNILORIN don to journalists: Use your pen to promote peace, value reorientation

A senior lecturer at the Department of Microbiology, University of Ilorin, Dr. Kamaldeen Ajijolakewu, has urged Muslim media practitioners in the country to demonstrate professionalism in discharging their duties and use their pen to promote peace and social value reorientation.

Dr. Ajijolakewu gave the charge last Thursday (April 28, 2022) while delivering a lecture at a Ramadan programme organised by the Kwara State Muslim Media Practitioners of Nigeria (MMPN) held at the NUJ Press Centre, Ilorin.

Speaking on the topic, "Maximising the benefits of Ramadan", the don also urged media practitioners to change most negative narrative about Islam and Muslims on the media space, saying that such practice would be a condition to remove their sin in the hereafter.

He said that fasting is recommended by the Almighty Allah for every believer, adding that it is the surest way to have sins forgiven and guarantee entry to Paradise.

Dr. Ajijolakewu, who is also the Chief Imam of Sarab Central Mosque, Ilorin, said that no sinner would gain Paradise,

adding that there is no place for the filth in Paradise. He, however, said that some of the ways human beings can get cleansed from sins is either through getting punished in hell, being saved through intercession of good people, or through good deeds from one's profession.

The cleric, thus, enjoined media practitioners to endeavour to gain paradise and attract Allah's forgiveness and mercy through what they disseminate to members of the public in form of news materials.

"Through your profession, you may have yourselves cleansed of your sins or get your sins forgiven by Allah through what you write as journalists to promote good deeds or promote Allah. The Almighty Allah would forgive you, except if one has committed shirk (associating other gods with Allah)".

The don said that Muslims can maximise the benefits of Ramadan through exaltation of the Almighty Allah, observing complete Salat, providing Sadaqat, Zakatul-Fitri, and observing I'tikaf.

He also said that rewards for all the good deeds by believers are multiplied in folds in the month of Ramadan and are directed to attract Allah's mercy.

Dr. Ajijolakewu, who said that

there is need for more Muslims in journalism, added that Muslim media practitioners could help to educate people on Islam better than others.

He said that having more Muslims in the media profession would also discourage demonising of Islam by some unscrupulous non-Muslims.

He also urged Muslims to believe in the power of prayers and be spiritually contented, enjoining them not to rely on any substance or items as substitute to power of prayers.

Earlier in his welcome address, the state Coordinator, MMPN, Mallam AbdulRasaq Laaro, described the programme as unique to get Allah's favour and asked practitioner to be conscious of their duties.

He said that part of the objectives of the group include "to promote, preserve, protect and cater for the religious, moral, social and spiritual advancement of the Muslims in Nigeria and globally; and to encourage literacy and intellectual pursuits among all Muslims and in particular the study of Islam".

The event witnessed special prayers for the nation, Kwara state, the Association, and individual members of the Association.
