

Standard of Education not declining - Abdulkareem

ontrary to the views in many circles over the years, the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Sulyman Age Abdulkareem, has said that the standard of education in Nigeria was not declining.

The Vice-Chancellor stated this during a special interview he granted a national newspaper, Sunday Trust, in his office recently.

Prof. Abdulkareem said that as a participant in the nation's educational system, he would not say that the standard and quality of education in the country is deteriorating, but that the problem is distraction.

He explained that students pursuing various academic programmes in Nigeria are being exposed to too many distractions such as strikes and lack of teachers' dedication, saying that despite those factors the nation's educational system is still producing many extremely brilliant students.

VC assures Unilorin remedial students of admission

he Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Sulyman Age Abdulkareem, has assured students of the institution's School of Preliminary Studies, Fufu, of admission into the University proper provided they are able to pass their remedial examinations and get the minimum score of 180 in the Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME).

Prof. Abdulkareem gave the assurance last Wednesday (March 2, 2022) while flagging off the 2021/2022 orientation programme held at the School Hall.

"You are assured of admission if you meet up with the major requirements. You are to pass the remedial examination and get the minimum pass mark of 180 for you to get admission", he declared.




