

... flags off N600m poultry farm

*Olofa hails varsity management

ast Thursday (July 21,2022) was another great day in the annals of the newly re-crowned most subscribed institution of higher learning, the University of Ilorin, as dignitaries from all walks of life joined the Governor of the Central Bank of Nigeria(CBN), Mr. Godwin Emefiele, to commission the institution's multimillion naira poultry farm located at Amoyo in the Ifelodun Local Government Area of Kwara State.

The poultry farm was financed by CBN loan of N600 million under the apex bank's Tertiary Institutions Poultry Revival Scheme (TIPRES).

Speaking at the event, the CBN Governor congratulated the University of Ilorin for making the establishment of the poultry farm a reality, saying that with the development, the University has again shown that it is a model among its peers in Nigeria.

The CBN Governor, who was represented on the occasion by the Deputy Director and Secretary to the Agricultural Credit Guarantee Scheme of the Bank, Mr. Edwin Nzelu, said that the Bank would continue to support any investment that would ensure food sufficiency and employment generation in the country.

he Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Sulyman Age Abdulkareem, has expressed his appreciation to the Central Bank of Nigeria (CBN) and other stakeholders for their cumulative efforts that

culminated in the establishment of the UNILORIN GgMax Poultry Farm.



While noting that the poultry subsector was very important for the drive towards economic greatness of the country, Mr. Emefiele thanked the management of the University of Ilorin for buying into the aspiration of the CBN on food production and employment generation through the commercial farm initiative.

Mr. Emefiele pointed out that the UNILORIN Poultry Farm was the first of its kind by any institution of higher learning in Nigeria since the CBN intervention programme in agriculture started in 1977.

He added that the University of Ilorin poultry farm would certainly bridge the gap between the demand and supply for chicken and eggs not only within Kwara State but across the country.

Kwara State, Mallam AbdulRahman towards the establishment of a commercial

AbdulRazaq, thanked the CBN for the loan advanced to the University of Ilorin to establish the farm as he urged the Bank to consider given more support to Kwara State.

Mallam AbdulRazaq expressed the reediness of his administration to support improved livestock production as he drew the attention of the management and staff of the University to the need to come with solutions that will mitigate the challenges facing livestock production in Nigeria.

The Governor, who was represented by the Kwara State Commissioner for Communication, Mr. Towoju Olabode George, promised that the Kwara State Government would continue to provide support to the University of Ilorin for it to continue to excel as the nation's most subscribed University.

He added that the Kwara State Also speaking, the Governor of Government would collaborate with the CBN

poultry settlement in the state with a view to encouraging youth participation and for the State to serve as a model in poultry production in Nigeria.

In his remarks, the Olofa of Offa, Oba Muhammadu Mufutau Gbadamosi Esuwoye II, who spoke on behalf of about ten leading traditional rulers who graced the ceremony, congratulated the University of Ilorin for coming up with the farm, which he believed would complement the efforts of other stakeholders in the provision of food and direct as well as indirect employment for hundreds of citizens of the country.

Oba Gbadamosi, who is also a successful poultry farmer, said that his farm would continue to partner with the University of Ilorin GgMAX Farm for it to achieve its corporate objectives.

While recalling that the establishment of the farm was one of the several things he had in mind and promised the institution's stakeholders on his way to becoming the 10th Vice-Chancellor of the University, Prof Abdulkareem paid glowing tributes to the Chairman and members of the immediate past Governing Council of the University, Dr. Abdullah Jibril Oyekan, MFR as well as the current Chairman of the Council, Mallam Abidu Rafindandi Yazidu,OON and his colleagues on the Council, who were also at the event, for their support.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the farm, which is situated on 30-hectare land, currently houses 17,000 layers, a feed mill with an installed capacity of 5 tons/hour and a semiautonomous Broiler Processing Unit with a capacity to process 1,000 birds/day, among other facilities.w4q1

Prof. Abdulkareem explained that the farm has engaged 55 full time employees while over 200 artisans are also earning their daily sustenance from it, saying that the farm has become "our modest contribution to generating employment and lightening up the local economy".

The renowned Professor of Chemical Engineering also assured that the farm was poised to contribute to the

nation's food security by bridging the gap between the demand for poultry products and the supply brought on largely by the ban on importation of poultry products.

Prof. Abdulkareem also expressed the conviction that "the University will see a huge leap in its Internally Generated Revenue" as it would make money available for critical aspects of the University's operations in the areas of research and physical development.

The Vice-Chancellor, nevertheless, called on the CBN to consider a downward review of the interest rate on the loan from 9% to 5% beyond February 2023 for the business to flourish, while assuring that the farm would be properly managed for it to achieve its target and for the University to become a model in the running of such a commercial initiative.



The two-in-one event with a Preconference Workshop themed, "Statistical Theories and Methods in Drug Development" facilitated by Statistics researchers and professionals in drug development from Novartis Phama AG, USA, drew participants from higher institutions and research institutes all over the world.

The PSSN, which is the registered society of Statistics Professionals in Nigeria, was established with the mission to contribute to the development of the nation through advanced statistical research that benefits decision-makers, policy advisers, industrialists, and investors.

Again, UNILORIN wins JAMB merit award, N75m prize money By Kunle Akogun

or the third consecutive time, the University of Ilorin has won the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB)'s 2020 Institution of First Choice by admission seekers in the country.

The award, which gave the University a prize money of N75 million, is one of the five categories for the 2020 JAMB National Tertiary Admissions' Performance-Merit Award (NATAP-M Award).

UNILORIN had previously won the same award in the 2018 and 2019 editions of NATAP-M Award, adding another category, the Institution with the Highest Number of Admitted International Students in the 2019 edition.

Twelve other tertiary institutions, drawn from federal, states and privately owned tertiary institutions, won in various categories of the award at a grand ceremony held in Abuja last Thursday (July 21, 2022).

The Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Prof. Sylvia O. Malomo collected the award on behalf of the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Sulyman Age Abdulkareem.

Each of the five categories of the awards is worth N100 million shared in N75million for winner, N15million for first runner up and N10million for second runner up among the winning institutions.

While speaking on the criteria for selection of winning institutions, the JAMB Registrar, Prof. Ishaq Oloyede, noted that the 2022 award happens to be the third edition of the award since it was initiated in 2018.

The five categories of awards and the winning institutions include 2020 Institution of First Choice, in which the University of Ilorin emerged as the most soughtafter tertiary institution in Nigeria,

with 81,659 applicants in the 2020 Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examinations (UTME), while Ahmadu Bello University (ABU) ranked second with 75,446. Bayero University, Kano (BUK), ranked third with 59,506.

Other categories include, the Most National Institution in 2020 Admission, won by the Kaduna Polytechnic, with admitted candidates from across 33 states of the federation; and the 2020 Most Improved Institution in Gender Balance, won by the Federal University, Lafia.

The others are, Institution With Highest Number of International Students in 2020 Admission, won by Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria; and the Most Compliant Institution In Keeping to the Guidelines in 2020 Admissions, won by Covenant University, Ota, Ogun State.
