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## Strike: VC, ASUU Chairman seek quick resolution of logjam

s the industrial action by university workers drag on, the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Sulyman Age Abdulkareem, and the Chairman of the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU), UNILORIN Branch, Prof. Moyosore Ajao, have called for a quick resolution of the crisis so that students would return to their classes to continue their academic journey.

The duo spoke in separate chats with UNILORIN BULLETIN last Monday (May 2, 2022) after joining other Muslim faithful to observe the 1443AH Eidel-Fitri prayer at the University of Ilorin Eid Praying Ground.

Prof. Abdulkareem, who said that his only wish for now is to see the resumption of academic activities on the university campuses, lamented that students have stayed back enough and the ongoing strike is not doing them any good. He then prayed that both the government and the unions would reach a reasonable agreement soon.

The Vice-Chancellor said, "My prayer is that Almighty Allah would make things easier for the government to make it possible for students to come back to school. We have stayed back long enough and we are doing nobody any good by doing so.

"So, my prayer is that we all work with government and agree on something reasonable and let our students come back".

On his part, the UNILORIN ASUU Chairman appealed to the Federal Government to do the needful to ensure that the universities are open and the students return to their classes because it is the only way the progress of any nation can be achieved.

Prof. Ajao also appealed to the government to look into the security challenges bedeviling the country, saying that

no investor would come into a country when there is no guarantee of the safety of lives and properties.

While many Nigerians are battling with unemployment and high level of poverty in the midst of abundant resources, Prof. Ajao said that the nation's economy needs to be turned around to make the country a better place for everyone.

Meanwhile, a former Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ilorin and Registrar of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), Prof Ishaq Oloyede, OFR, has said that the admission board is ready to conduct hitch-free examinations that will stand the test of time for the teeming admission seekers in the country.

Prof. Oloyede, who also joined others for the Eid-el Fitri prayers at the

UNILORIN Eid Praying Ground, however, urged the citizens to continue to pray to Almighty Allah to guide Nigerian leaders on the right path.

Corroborating Prof. Oloyede's stance, the Taliba of Ebira land, Alhaji Usman Hamza, urged Nigerians to engage in serious prayers for our leaders so that they can make the best decisions that would be in the best interest of the people and country at large.

Alhaji Hamza also urged Nigerians to commit themselves to imbibing the lessons and practices observed during Ramadan, with a specific appeal to the rich people in the country to help the needy. He expressed the belief that the nation's security situation worsened because of the high rate of poverty in the land.

The collaborative fellowship involves funding for a project to be provided by CADFP.

The award letter sent to Prof. Ademola-Popoola from the CADFP Advisory Council, a copy of which was made available to **UNILORIN BULLETIN** last Monday (May 2, 2022), indicated that the Winter 2022 application cycle for the CADFP was very competitive".

Explaining the import of the fellowship, Prof. Ademola-Popoola told UNILORIN BULLETIN that the CADFP-funded Project, would involve Dr. Folajimi coming to the University of Ilorin for a period of 90 days for Collaborative research as well as Graduate student teaching/mentoring.

She said, "The All-discipline fellowship will also include Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Machine Learning Capacity Building Workshops".

The Field of Study includes Computer Science, Artificial Intelligence and Robotics.

According to Prof. Ademola-Popoola, "the areas of expertise required are Artificial intelligence (AI), recommender systems, machine learning, natural language processing, and adaptive games".

She said, "The Fellow will collaborate with the University's Department of Computer Science and COMSIT to explore collaborative research opportunities in areas that integrate artificial intelligence and computer science, with the potential of joint publications in one or more of the following related journals and conferences: (1) JMLR (Journal of Machine Learning Research); (2) Advances in Artificial Intelligence Journal; (3) AAAI Conference on Artificial Intelligence (IAAI-22); (4)

AAAI Conference on Artificial Intelligence".

Prof. Ademola-Popoola explained that "the Fellow will teach two or three subjects in the following areas as a guest lecturer: (1) programming; (2) artificial intelligence (AI); and (3) machine learning (ML) / language processing (NLP), while our academics observe the Fellow's teaching practices.

"By meeting with 10-15 graduate students in computer science for thesis and dissertation advice, the fellow will give valuable feedback to assist them indeveloping their current research thesis/projects.

"Furthermore, the fellow will facilitate training workshops on research methodology and grant/proposal writing for students and faculty members", adding that "the fellow will provide professional development opportunities for our faculty and graduate students by organizing two community-based training workshops on machine learning and game development for social impact".

According to the Professor of Ophthalmology, "this will create an opportunity for our graduate students, faculty, and staff to learn from the fellow's global experience in facilitating related workshops on AI and games for social good".

Speaking on the Project Objectives, Prof. Ademola-Popoola said, "Our university has significant gaps in the teaching and practice of artificial intelligence, machine learning, game development, recommender systems, and natural language processing. This is because these specialties are still in their infancy in Nigeria, with very limited access

to researchers and processors working on these areas".

However, the proposed project, according to her, "will open new doors of opportunities to build the capacity of both students and Faculties through the Carnegie Fellowship and beyond. This is in line with our University's strategic vision 'to be an international centre of excellence in learning, research, probity and service to humanity".

She explained further that "in line with our University's mission 'To provide a world-class environment for learning, research and community service', the project will provide an opportunity to learn form the Fellows, how to set up laboratories for artificial intelligence, machine learning, and the development of educational games. This will foster research in these rapidly growing field and bring our university to the forefront of knowledge and resource providers in these areas by providing our community with the necessary skills and knowledge".

On the project impact, the don said that it "will support the efforts of our university to promote innovation, scalable, commercial value, and problem-solving, ideas targeted at local problems with measurable outcomes to evaluate their impact".

Prof. Ademola-Popoola further explained that "by continuing to collaborate with the researcher and establishing a relationship with the fellow's university after the visit, we hope that this will be the beginning of a framework for a long-term relationship between our university and the fellow's university. This is also in line with the diversity and inclusion strategies of the requested fellow's institution to "internationalize the university".

#### Let's sustain the Ramadan spirit, Unilorin Chief Imam tells Nigerian Muslims

The Chief Imam of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Nasir Abdus-Salam, has encouraged Muslims in Nigeria to sustain the spirit of love and charity after the Holy Month of Ramadan as exhibited during the 30 days of fasting.

Prof. Abdus-Salam, who gave the admonition last Monday (May 2, 2022) in a chat with *UNILORIN BULLETIN* shortly after leading this year's Eid-el Fitri prayer at the University of Ilorin Eid praying ground, defined Ramadan as a coaching ground where people learn to internalize the spirit of unity, peace, and love for one another. He enjoined Muslims worldwide and in particular, the members of the University of Ilorin community, to be their brother's keeper to make the world a better place.

While calling on the leaders and the citizens in general to fear Allah in their dealings, the Chief Imam reminded Nigerians irrespective of their status in life that everyone will give an account of his/her stewardship before Allah on the day of judgment.

Also speaking, the Chairman of the UNILORIN Muslim Community, Prof. Ibrahim Katibi, admonished Muslims and non-Muslims to imbibe virtues such as sharing with the less privileged, solving problems in their community, and creating extra time to serve God. He also urged them to imbibe the spirit of periodic fasting after Ramadan.

members of the University community, both Muslims and non-Muslims, to sustain the harmonious relationship that exists in the institution in order to ensure that the University sustains its reputation as the most religious tolerant institution in Nigeria.

Meanwhile, the Director of UNILORIN Health Services, Dr. Rasheed Odunola, who identified fasting as a nonpharmaceutical method of treating some illnesses such as obesity, and diabetes, among others, encouraged Nigerians to observe fasting occasionally.

According to Dr. Odunola, "If people can fast between 12 to 16 hours daily, most illnesses will evade that person in terms of the weariness of the dead cells. It will not grow very well and abnormal cells will not even grow well. This abnormal cell has been identified to be the major cause of illness.

The Medical Director, who is also a Member of the University Governing Council, explained that intermittent fasting helps the human body to exhaust sugar stores and start running fats, adding that it boosts human memory and reduces tissue damage in surgery, and improves the result.

On her part, Dr. Rafiat Oyekunle of the Department of Information and Communication Science (ICS), Faculty of Communication and Information Sciences urged Muslim parents, especially mothers to learn to be patient with their husbands and children as demonstrated during the Ramadan.



30 days Ramadan period was a tutorial for Muslims, also enjoined every Muslim faithful to sustain all the virtues learned and practised during Ramadan after the season has gone.

Also speaking with the **UNILORIN BULLETIN**, a Lecturer at the Computer Science Department, University of Ilorin, Dr. Modinat Abolore Mabayoje, appealed to parents not to allow the society to teach their children bad ways of life.

She enjoined the parents to fulfill their parental responsibilities by always counseling their children on right and wrong as stated by religion and society.

Dr. Mabayoje, who hinged her point on the popular saying that charity begins at home, lamented that the spike in the rate of immorality being witnessed in the Nigerian society today emanated from the family setting and was compounded by the government.
