Egbewole heads consortium of universities in Kwara

he Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has been elected the pioneer Chairman of the newly formed consortium of all universities in Kwara State, called "Ku8".

The group was formed to create interuniversity relationships among all the universities in Kwara State that would ensure great academic strive in all the universities through knowledge sharing.

Prof. Egbewole's emergence was announced last Wednesday (January 11, 2023) during the maiden meeting of the body, held at the University of Ilorin and attended by six Vice Chancellors of the member universities and representatives of two others. (Contd. on page 3)

he nation's most sought-after University, the University of Ilorin, has done it again as close to a dozen of its academic staff were listed among 500 top authors in the last three years from across Nigeria. Another report also identified 10 foremost UNILORIN scientists, whose research findings have continuously dominated the academia.

A copy of the list of the highly rated authors compiled by Elsevier, a globally renowned academic publishing giant, made available to UNILORIN BULLETIN, showed that 11 distinguished UNILORIN academics from across various Departments proved their mettle through high grade publications between 2019 and 2022. Unilorin COBES gets WHO's recognition

he World Health Organization (WHO) has recognised the University of Ilorin's Community Based Experience and Services (COBES) as a collaborative centre for research and manpower development.

The Provost of the College of Health Sciences, University of Ilorin, Prof. B. S. Alabi, made this known penultimate Friday (January 6, 2023) when he led the Top Management Committee (TMC) of the University of Ilorin College of Health Sciences on a courtesy visit to the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN.

Prof. Alabi said, "It has also earned the College full membership, in the bronze category of the International Network of Community Oriented Institutions for the Health Science with its headquarters in Maastricht, Netherlands, now known as Towards Unity for Health (TUFH)".

While enumerating some

achievements of the College, the Provost said, "Academic staff have attracted research grants in which they are principal investigators such as Severe Malaria (AQUAMAT) by Professor O. A. Mokuolu, (H3 Africa) in Africa Kidney Disease Research Network by Dr. T. O. Olanrewaju and Multicenter (NIH) Stoke Investigative

Research and Educational Network (SIREN) by Professor K. W. Wahab among others."

He thanked the Vice Chancellor for the support given to the College and prayed for him to have a successful tenure while also making request on some critical needs in the College.

In his remarks, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Egbewole, thanked the TMC for the visit and prayers, noting that he holds them in high regard.

Pointing out that the College of Health Sciences is a critical arm of the University, Prof. Egbewole said that's the reason that a reasonable percentage of the University's budget goes to the College, promising to support the College to advance scholarship.

He noted that it is capital intensive to run a medical school, assuring that the University is committed to making the University of Ilorin College of Health Sciences the number one medical training school in Nigeria.

The breakdown of the report, which was released on December 24, 2022, equally showed that the University of Ilorin accounted for 2.2% of the listed publications among over 170 public and private universities operating in Nigeria.

Leading the pack of these outstanding UNILORIN academic giants is Dr Adewale George Adeniyi, the 2021 UNILORIN Researcher of the Year, who posted the highest number of publications among his fellow Unilorites as 135 of his scholarly outputs were listed with 2251 citations. Next to him is Dr Awotunde Joseph Bamidele's whose scholarly outputs totalled 92 with 523 citations as Dr Abdulateef Oluwagbemiga Balogun recorded 51 scholarly outputs and 387 citations.

Prof. Wahab Kolawole and Prof. Nasir Faruq had 40 scholarly outputs each with the former having 251 citations to his credit while the latter recorded 248 citations. The immediate past Vice Chancellor of the institution, Prof. Sulyman Age Abdulkareem, has 36 of his scholarly outputs listed with 232 citations. Dr Muyiwa Michael Orosun has 34 scholarly outputs and 263 citations to his credit while a former Dean, Faculty of Physical Sciences, Prof. Folahan Amoo Adekola was listed with 33 scholarly outputs with a compliment of 207 citations as well as the immediate past Dean, Faculty of Communication and Information Sciences, Prof. Rasheed Gbenga Jimoh, who also made the list with 27 scholarly outputs and 146 citations.

Prof. Jamiu Kolawole Odusote, a former Director, Technical Entrepreneurship Centre, has 29 scholarly outputs and 293 citations while Prof. Adeyinka Tella was listed with 27 scholarly outputs and 73

citations.

Similarly, 10 foremost scientists from the University, whose research findings have continuously dominated the academia have been identified. They were the trio of former Vice Chancellor of the Federal University of Technology, Minna, Prof. Musbau Adewunmi Akanji; the Vice Chancellor of the Federal University of Technology, Akure, Prof. Adenike Temidayo Oladiji and the Dean, Student Affairs, University of Ilorin, Prof. Musa Toyin Yakubu, who carried out a penetrating research on "Aphrodisiac Potentials of the aqueous extract of fadogia agretis.

Others identified were Prof. Folahan Amoo Adekola with his "Kinetics, isotherm and thermodynamic modelling of liquid phase absorption of Rhodamine B dye" as "Work Motivation, Job Satisfaction, and Organisational Commitment of Library Personnel in academic....." undertaken by Prof. Adeyinka Tella also accounted for his rating among the UNILORIN Best 10.

Also listed were; Dr Adewale George Adeniyi with his work entitled "A Review of Coirfiber Reinforced Polymer Composite"; Prof. Olufemi Desalu for his" Diabetic Foot Care: Self Knowledge and Practice Among Patients Attending Three Tertiary Institutions" and Prof. Lukman Olajide Abdur-Rahman, whose work, entitled "Global Patient Outcomes After Elective Surgery: Prospective Cohort Study in 27 Low, Middle and High Income Families" found him accommodation in the list as well as Prof. Babatunde Raphael Olanrewaju, whose work with the title "Impact of Off-Farm Income on Food Security and Nutrition in Nigeria", also qualified him for the classification and, of course, Prof. Kolawole Wasiu Wahab securing inclusion in the list consequent upon the importance attached to his work entitled "May Measurement Month 2017: An Analysis of Blood Pressure Screening Results Worldwide".

Universities that formed the KU8 consortium are the University of Ilorin (established in 1975), Al-Hikmah University, Ilorin (established in 2005), the Kwara State University, Malete (established in 2009), Landmark University, Omu-Aran (established in 2011), Summit University, Offa (established in 2015), Crown-Hill University, Ilorin (established in 2016), Ahman Patigi University, Patigi (established in 2021); Thomas Adewumi University, Oko (established in 2021), and the University of Offa, Offa (established in 2021).

Other officers of the KU8 are the Vice Chancellor of Thomas Adewumi University, Oko, Prof. Francisca Oladipo, General Secretary; and the Vice Chancellor of Landmark University, Omu Aran, Prof. Charity Onye Aremu, Treasurer.

In his remarks, the Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, who is also the convener of the meeting, Prof. Egbewole, said that the idea of 'The KU8 Initiative' was to promote functional academic linkages and institutional collaboration for the attainment of effective delivery of the core mandate of teaching, research and community service among the member universities.

According to Prof. Egbewole, "The purpose of KU8 (or eight Universities in Kwara State) is mainly to develop closer relationships, promote academic linkages and establish institutional collaboration, which will allow joint activities in delivering the universities' mandates of teaching, research and community service'

The Vice Chancellor said, "This is necessary too to avoid one of the ironies of today's world in which human beings are so advanced that we go to the moon but we are so backward to visit or assist our neighbour. The essence is to pursue the global without compromising the local because ultimately, all development permeates from the rear.

"The crux of this meeting aligns with the operational philosophy that I champion. I told the Senate of the University of Ilorin in my inaugural address, titled, "Together Everyone Achieves More", that TEAM is just an acronym depicting that. As

unity is strength and we cannot clap with a hand, we can support one another to overcome challenges and deepen the training of our teeming young ones. A broom sweeps only when the individual broomsticks come together and work together. The University of Ilorin extends its hands of fellowship to all Kwara universities as it looks forward to a future where members of the KU8 will be emerging the best in several areas'

Prof. Egbewole said, "As a university strategically located in the cultural confluence of Nigeria, we have realised that unity is strength and united we stand, divided they fall. It is our philosophy that with cooperation, coordination, collaboration, interaction, and networking, we can only be stronger. Today's meeting is in furtherance of that philosophy."

According to him, the need for closer interaction is even more compelling this time because the Nigerian university system through the National Universities Commission (NUC) is deploying the Core Curriculum Minimum Academic Standard (CCMAS) which requires the development of a percentage (30%) of the curriculum by the institutions.

Speaking earlier at the opening ceremony of the meeting, the Ag. Vice Chancellor of the Kwara State University (KWASU), Prof. Shaykh Luqman Jimoh, commended the convener of the KU8 for coming up with such a brilliant initiative, adding that it will be very useful and supportive not only to member universities but also to the society in general.

Prof. Jimoh disclosed that the late Vice Chancellor of KWASU, Prof. Muhammed Mustapha Akanbi, SAN, had earlier initiated a robust collaboration with the University of Maiduguri and the Borno State University, adding that he was also keen on bringing all universities in Kwara State under one umbrella, but he thanked God that Prof. Akanbi's desire has now come to pass with the formation of KU8.

In their separate comments at the meeting, the Vice Chancellor of Al-Hikmah University, Prof. Noah Yusuf; and the Vice Chancellor of Ahman Patigi University, Prof. Mahfouz Adedimeji, described the formation of KU8 as a step in a right direction and expressed optimism that the initiative would bear fruitful results.

Other Vice Chancellors in attendance that equally made contributions and brilliant suggestions included those of Landmark University, Prof. Charity Onye Aremu; Crown-Hill University, who was represented by Prof Jeleel Ojuade; Thomas Adewumi University, Prof. Francisca Oladipo; and Prof. Abiodun Musa Aibinu of Summit University.

The renowned academic, who bemoaned the high level of indiscipline, decay and stagnation the country is currently battling with, stated that what Nigeria needs at this point in its history is a value reorientation of its citizens, particularly the younger ones, based on the nation's indigenous cultural system, which Social Studies, as a discipline, entails.

He explained that Civic Education, which is currently being taught at primary and secondary schools, is not comprehensive enough to tackle the decreasing social decay as Social Studies would do.

Prof. Yusuf, who is the immediate past Provost, Kwara State College of Education, Ilorin, insisted that the teaching of Social Studies is the surest, fastest and scientific way of inculcating discipline in learners, saying that a disciplined society consists of members who obey the laws of the land.

Justifying his position, Prof. Yusuf explained that the teaching of Social Studies is the only way that people's ideas and thinking can be seriously and adequately influenced.

He added that Nigeria and its citizens must be deliberately socialised in order to battle the perilous vices and other criminal tendencies that are becoming the norms in our land as he said that socialising comes before civicising.

Prof, Yusuf, who had previously served as Sub-Dean, Student Affairs Unit, University of Ilorin, explained that to maintain peace, harmony and stability, everyone should be carried along and have equal access to opportunities.

The former Provost posited that equity and justice are not only necessary but essential for a nation as complex and heterogeneous as Nigeria.

To make the teaching of Social Studies serve the identified purpose, Prof. Yusuf advised teachers of the subject to be prepared to expose their students to many instructional strategies that would enhance, promote and encourage social interactions, active engagement in learning and self

motivation.

Drawing from the experiences he gathered in his decades of teaching and administration, Prof. Yusuf urged teachers at all levels to always lead their students by example in and out of schools, saying that teaching by example is more penetrating and would leave enduring impression in the minds of learners than mere words of instruction.

Prof. Yusuf, who is popularly known among his colleagues and students as 'Comrade', also encouraged authors of textbooks to shift emphasis from teacher's activities to student's activities, which he said would promote learning by doing.

In view of the changing nature of the world we live in, the foremost scholar also called for the periodic review of the Social Studies curriculum in order to put into consideration societal changes.

Speaking on his experience as a teacher, particularly at the University of Ilorin, which is also his alma mater, Prof. Yusuf said that the University is undoubtedly one of the leading ivory towers in Nigeria. The Inaugural Lecturer agreed with a former National President of the Academic Staff Union of Universities, Prof. A. Ogunyemi,

when he described the nation's most sought after University as not only "Better by far" but also "Better by fact" considering its quality of service delivery.

Prof. Yusuf, whose career trajectories saw him teaching at every stratum of the nation's educational system, encouraged his younger colleagues to be focused on their career in order for them to also attain its pinnacle. He also advised them not to be discouraged by challenges but convert such situation into opportunities of displaying the stuff they are made of.

The well-attended inaugural lecture, which was presided over by the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, was graced by the Deputy Governor of Kwara State, Mr. Kayode Alabi who was represented by Prof. Timothy Opoola a former Vice Chancellor of the University, Prof. AbdulGaniyu Ambali, OON; the Emir of Ilorin, Alhaji(Dr) Ibrahim Sulu-Gambari, CFR, who was represented by the Balogun Alanamu of Ilorin, Dr Uthman Abubakar Akanbi-Jos; and the National President, Ilorin Emirate Descendants Progressive Union (IEDPU), Alhaji Aliyu Otta Uthman, fsi, as well as relations, colleagues, friends and students of Prof. Yusuf from far and near.

Gear up for improved IGR, Akogun charges UNILORIN FM Staff

In pursuit of the mandate recently handed down to all revenue generating units of the University by the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, the institution's Director of Corporate Affairs, Mr Kunle Akogun, has charged staff of the UNILORIN 89.3 FM, the official radio station of the University, to take their jobs more seriously in order to exceed the expectations of stakeholders.

Mr Akogun gave this advice last Tuesday (January 10, 2023) while addressing a meeting of the top management staff of the station at the Directorate's Conference Room.

The Director said that the meeting was specifically called to rub minds on what needed to be done for the station to attract more patronage, particularly from within the campus-based business concerns that deal with materials and services relevant to members of the University community.

Mr Akogun said that it was important for all the staff of the station to work harder and with absolute determination of rebranding the station in order to ensure that it becomes more efficient for it to support the institution's revenue drive.

He added that staff members of the station must show more discipline,

knowledge and professionalism in the discharge of their responsibilities, saying that the station must bring in more revenue to the University as it polishes its image.

Mr Akogun said that henceforth no effort would be spared for the total rebranding of the station for it to attract more clients who would bring in more revenue.

Participants at the meeting agreed with the Director that the station must be run in line with the views of the new University management, saying that the previous week's visit of the Vice Chancellor to the station was

a wakeup call for staff of the station that must be taken seriously.

They, however, expressed the conviction that the University's management should take the lead in the revenue drive by consistently imploring all the units of the University to always patronise the radio station in terms of advert placements.

In his contribution, the Station Manager, *UNILORIN 89.3 FM*, Mr Idris Akintola Ibrahim (Alooma) thanked Mr Akogun for his good leadership as he recalled series of efforts he initiated, which accounted for the positive variance recorded in the revenue generated last year compared with that of the previous year.

He assured the Director that everything worth doing would be done to ensure that the station generates more revenue in a way that its philosophical essence would not be tampered with so as not to draw the irk of the National Broadcasting Commission (NBC).

1. Social media and Digital Skills in the Workplace

Social media invites and updates are constant. Twitter, Facebook, YouTube, and LinkedIn are becoming the norm for online communication. People realise they must always be current, but it is a time-consuming activity that affects productivity. Social media requires effective communication. Electronic communication is replacing face-to-face interactions. Texting has replaced many phone calls (texting) Participants will learn how social media and the workplace can work together, which is important because social media is becoming the primary form of communication. Digital skills are of great importance in the workplace.

2. Cyberethics and Digital Citizenship

Technological advances and the Internet have made the world a global village, allowing strangers to communicate. While this benefits all internet users because a wide range of activities may now be done online, cyberethical misbehaviours such as plagiarism, cyberbullying, spamming, internet libel, identity theft, child pornography, cyber-sex, cyberstalking, and revenge pornography are prevalent. Cyberethical misbehaviour is often due to ignorance. Individual netizens must ensure that their use of ICT does not violate the rights of others, despite civil society's restrictions. This short course seeks to raise cyberspace users' awareness of ethical ICT use to ensure a safer online experience for all.

3. Soft Skills

Soft skills, in contrast to qualifications, technical skills, and

occupational experience, tend to be more personality-based. They include interpersonal skills, interpersonal abilities, and transferable abilities. In contrast, hard skills are frequently job-specific technical competencies.

4. Workplace Conflict Resolution

Disagreements in the workplace emerge when individuals' demands, values, and interests conflict. Conflict inside an organisation is complex. Formal authority and power conflict with the affected individuals. There are arguments regarding the distribution of income, completion of the assignment, and length of labour. Individuals, departments, unions, and management have jurisdictional disputes. Subtle conflicts include rivalries, jealousies, personality clashes, role definitions, and power and favour struggles. Individuals respond differently to contradictory desires and needs. This short course highlights these issues with a view to understanding them and proffers solutions with a view to increasing organisational harmony.

5. Human Resources Management

Human resource management (HRM) is the strategic approach to the successful management of people within a company or organisation so that they contribute to the company's or organisation's market success. It aims to maximise staff performance in support of an employer's strategic goals. Core HRM activities include hiring, training, compensating, formulating regulations pertaining to, and building retention strategies foremployees.

6. Core Management Principles

There is always the need to engage in training of managers to acquire interpersonal skills and strategies that they can be applied in their job roles. Occasionally, it is beneficial for staff to take a break from job-specific or technical skills focused training courses. Additionally, employees can gain a deeper understanding of topics unrelated to their core work functions. This will allow them to gain a broader perspective, which will be beneficial to them in the context of their work. The employees' ability to focus more on their own health will also contribute to an improvement in work-life balance, thus allowing them to enjoy their work experience, boost employee morale, and improve their overall performance.

7. Leadership

While everyone desires to be a leader, leadership is a skill that is acquired through time by focusing on communication, competency, teamwork, awareness, emotional control, and inspiration. A good leader can get the most out of people by focusing on their performance and building a solid relationship with them to work on mutual benefits, which results in organisational growth. This Leadership Development short course will help in acquiring leadership abilities.

8. Project Management

Students should be able to identify effective project management practices and their associated processes after completing this course. The course should investigate the components of effective project management and put into practise the best practices that are widely accepted in order to successfully manage projects.







Prof. Adeoye, a seasoned academic, versatile administrator, cerebral labour activist and former Chairman of the UNILORIN's Ceremonials Committee, is also a former Chairman of the University's Chapter of the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU). He is an indigene of Odo-Otin Local Government Area of Osun State.

Born on February 2, 1968, the new L & PC Chairman attended the Baptist Primary School, Kano, between 1974 and 1980.He was also educated at the Community High School, Agbeye-Osogbo, between 1980 and 1985 before proceeding to the School of Aviation, Alakia, Ibadan, from where he received a Diploma in Air Ticketing Reservation in 1987.

Prof. Adeoye attended the University of Ilorin, from where he earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in Performing Arts. From 1999 to 2000 and between 2001 and 2007, he was at the University of Ibadan for his Master of Arts and doctorate degrees in Theatre Arts, respectively, with specialisation in Play Directing. He also earned a Master's degree in Public Administration(MPA) from the University of Ilorin in 2002.

Prof. Adeoye commenced his exciting working career as an NYSC staff of the University of Uyo, Akwa Ibom State, from 1997 to 1998. He was subsequently appointed as a Graduate Assistant by the same University after his satisfactory completion of the mandatory youth service.

In 1999, his alma mater, the University of Ilorin, offered him an appointment in the institution's Department of the Performing Arts as a Graduate Assistant. He subsequently rose through the ladder of academic positions and attained its pinnacle as a Professor in 2015.

Aside teaching and research, Prof. Adeoye has equally served the University of Ilorin in several positions. He was, between 2004 and 2005, a Member of the Faculty of Arts Development Committee. He also served as a Member of the Faculty of Arts Research Committee from 2004 to 2005. Between 2010 and 2012, he was a Member of the University of Ilorin Property Management Board. He also served as the Ag. Head, Department of the Performing Arts, University of Ilorin from

2012 to 2014.

Prof. Adeoye served as the General Secretary of the University's Chapter of the Academic Staff of Universities from 2008 to 2012 as well as its Chairman between 2014 and 2016.

This hardworking teacher has been a Member of the Governing Council of the University of Ilorin since 2016. His membership of the Council has made him a Member of the University's Staff Disciplinary and Appeal Committee (SDAC) as well as the Appointment and Promotions Committee (A&PC).

He is also a Member of the International Federation of Translators (IFT), the Nigeria English Studies Association(NESA), the Association of Nigeria Authors (ANA),the National Association for the Promotion of Studies in Arts and Sciences (NAPSAS), the International Theatre Institute (ITI), the Society of Nigeria Theatre Artists (SONTA) and the American Studies Association of Nigeria(ASAN).

The intellectual profundity of this hardworking academic has not gone unrewarded. He was the Best Graduating Student in M.A Theatre Arts at the University of Ibadan in 2000.He was also the Best Graduating Student in B.A. Performing Arts at the University of Ilorin in 1996 and the Best Graduating Student in Literature-in-English at the end of his School Certificate Course in 1985.
