UNILORIN wins NUGA football Gold!

...VC hails victorious UNILORIN Warriors, other medalists By Temitope Omoniyi

The Better by far University, the University of Ilorin, again proved its mettle last Friday (March 25, 2022) in far away University of Lagos, Akoka, as it dusted all other universities by winning the most coveted football Gold medal in the just concluded 2022 edition of the Nigeria University Games (NUGA).

The University's football squad, UNILORIN Warriors, won the football Gold by defeating the Obafemi Awolowo University football team by 5 - 4 through penalty kicks in the finals.

The final match played at the University of Lagos sports centre ended goalless at regulation time.

During the penalty shootout, UNILORIN Warriors lost one penalty while OAU lost two, with the last penalty kick converted to a goal by Olatunji Maleek for UNILORIN.

The Captain of UNILORIN Warrior, Sadiq Ajao, told **UNILORIN BULLETIN** that resilience was key for his team to win the keenly contested match.

Ajao said, "It was a tough match, we wanted to play our pattern, but the OAU side having studied it stopped us from using the flanks.

"OAU is a good side with quality players, so we had to be patient to win via penalty kicks. When we lost the first penalty, we did not lose hope; anyway, penalty is a game of luck".

Use your talents for nation building, Ojuade charges artistes

The Chairman, UNILORIN 89.3 FM, the official radio station of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Jeleel Oluksunkanmi Ojuade, has appealed to artistes in the country to always pay greater attention to nation building through their performances.

Prof. Ojuade stated this penultimate Wednesday (March 16, 2022) while delivering a lecture entitled "Fuji: Ayinde Barrister Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow" at the First Sikiru Ayinde Barrister's Colloquium jointly organised by the Maiyegun of Yoruba land, King Wasiu Ayinde Marshall and the Fuji Musicians Association of Nigeria (FUMAN) in Lagos.

The renowned academic said that artistes, particularly musicians, have a lot of roles to play in ensuring good governance and patriotism as offered by the late doyen of Fuji Music, Alhaji Sikiru Ayinde Barrister, who always emphasised the need for the nation to remain in peace and harmony through qualitative political administration at all levels.

Prof. Ojuade paid glowing

tributes to the late Alhaji Ayinde Barrister, who, he said, devoted his entire life and times to the evolution and development of Fuji Music and projection of Yoruba culture.

He reminded musicians that they were not just promoters of their indigenous cultures but are empowered to use their talents to break cultural barriers as done by the late musical icon who used his talents to reach out to members of other cultural groups across the country.

The foremost Professor of Dance

said that though Barrister was a devout Muslim who reflected Islam in his songs but nevertheless accommodated Christianity and traditional religious practices as a way of promoting unity among adherents of all faiths.

Prof. Ojuade, who encouraged artistes to use the privilege of their position to advance social growth and economic development, recalled the contributions of Alhaji Ayinde Barrister, in that wise, saying that had the nation heeded his calls some of the challenges it is currently facing would have been averted.

While thanking the Federal Government for honouring Dr. Sikiru Ayinde Barrister while he was alive with the award of the Member of the Federal Republic (MFR), Prof. Ojuade appealed to the government of Oyo and Lagos States to immortalise the late cultural icon with an edifice, adding that such a project would at the end promote the economic viability of the two States.

Prof. Ojuade described the late Musician as a highly gifted and talented artiste whose renditions and compositions remain evergreen 12 years after his demise.

How to prevent kidney failure – Odunola

The Director of the Unilorin Health Services, Dr. Rasheed Odunola, has encouraged members of the University community and the general public to always take care of their kidney by managing their blood sugar, blood pressure, maintaining a healthy diet and weight, drinking enough water, reducing salt intake, limiting alcohol and abstaining from smoking, and most importantly avoiding self-medication to prevent kidney failure.

He also appealed to the governments at all levels to employ more medical personnel into various health centres in the local, state and federal health care facilities to cater for the health needs of the teeming Nigerian population.

Dr Odunola gave this advice while featuring as a guest on a special edition of 'Ko tan sibe', a current affairs programme on UNILORIN 89.3 FM recently.

The medical expert, who identified the kidney as one of the most important organs in the human body, said that the

organ is responsible for removing excess and toxins water from the blood in form of urine, controlling blood pressure, producing red blood cells, carefully controlling the salt and water in the body, and keeping bones healthy, among others.

Speaking on the symptoms of kidney disease, the Director of the Unilorin

Health Services advised the public to immediately report to accredited hospitals when they observe symptoms such as having trouble sleeping, feeling the need to urinate more often or their urine is foamy, having trouble concentrating or feeling more tired unnecessarily.

Dr. Odunola, who is also a Member of the University Council, however, appealed to the government at all levels to subsidize the treatment of kidney disease so that poor people who are battling with it can also get treatment.

While observing that most people who died of kidney failure could have gotten the right treatment, the renowned medical practitioner lamented that the cost of treating the disease prevent most people from complaining to physicians.

He also appealed to the government to procure more kidney dialysis machines for public hospitals and train health officials on how to use them, saying that this will go a long way in alleviating the suffering of the poor masses.

In the third place match, host Unilag defeated Nasarawa State University by 3 goals to 2.

The event tagged NUGA-UNILAG 2022 was hosted by the University of Lagos between March 16 and March 27, 2022.

To reach the finals, the UNILORIN boys whitewashed Sokoto State University by 5-0 in their opening game before losing 0-1 to University of Benin in their second game. The better by far lads hammered University of Calabar 3-0 in the final group game to emerge leaders of Group C with six points and a superior goal difference.

In the quarterfinals,

UNILORIN Warriors pipped Abubakar Tafawa Balewa University Bauchi 1-0 before defeating Nasarawa State University 2-1 in the semifinals.

Meanwhile, the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Sulyman Age Abdulkareem, has congratulated the UNILORIN Warriors for making the University proud by lifting the 2022 NUGA football trophy.

In a chat with UNILORIN BULLETIN shortly after the football final match, Prof. Abdulkareem, who was represented at the closing ceremony by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research, Technology and Innovation), Prof. Mikhail Buhari, said the team's victory is characteristic of the Better-by-far nomenclature of the

University.

The Vice-Chancellor also congratulated all the other members of the Team UNILORIN, especially the various medal winners, for putting up a very impressive showing at the tournament.

Other senior University officials that attended the 2022 NUGA closing ceremony included the outgoing Chairman of Unilorin Sport Council, Prof. Gafar Ijaiya, incoming Chairman of Sport Council, Prof. Omodele Eletta, outgoing Director of Sport, Prof. Olufunmilola Dominic, incoming Director of Sport, Dr. Tajudeen Ibrahim, coaches, athletes, alumni and current students of the University.

In his welcome address at the Games opening ceremony penultimate Friday (March 18, 2022), the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Lagos, Prof. Oluwatoyin Ogundipe, said NUGA games had been a veritable source to producing a new galaxy of stars that would add to the national teams in various sports which would bring glory to the country and themselves in no distant future.

No fewer than 7,000 student-athletes and officials converged on Unilag for University Games. The participants from over 76 universities nationwide featured in a total of 21 sporting events.

This is the fourth time that UNILAG would be hosting the games in the 56-year- history of NUGA, first in 1958, second and third in 1978 and 1998 and now – the 26th edition.

Court orders reinstatement of UNILORIN don as Provost, COED

The Kwara State government on May 21, 2021, announced the removal of the Provost, citing mismanagement and insubordination, among other offences. This prompted Prof. Yusuf to approach the Industrial Court for relief from what he called unjust removal.

Delivering the judgment in the Suit No: NICN/IL/08/21 penultimate Friday (March 18, 2022), Justice K. D. Damulak decried the arbitrary removal of Prof. Yusuf and ordered his immediate reinstatement.

The judgment is premised on the provision of Section 26(2) and (5) amongst others, which state that the Provost shall be appointed by the Governor, hold office for five years only, and shall only be removed if the Governor is satisfied that having regard to all the circumstances existing at the particular moment, it is in the interest of the College to remove the Provost.

The court said that the removal in itself connotes that grievous and unpardonable errors were committed by the Provost and such error investigated and the Provost must have been granted fair hearing, which was not the case when the

Provost was purportedly removed.

Justice Damulak consequently ruled that Prof. Abdulraheem Yusuf, who is entitled to exhaust his five-year tenure, be paid all his outstanding salaries, allowances, and entitlements.

The learned Judge also ruled that the plaintiff should be allowed to perform his duties without any form of interference from the Defendants who are the College of Education, Ilorin, the Council of the College, the Registrar of the College, the Governor of Kwara State, and the Attorney General of Kwara State.

The Honourable Court also granted N5 million as general damages against the defendants as claimed in relief 11 of the Statement of Fact.

In his reaction to the judgment, the Chairman of the Ilorin Emirate Staff Association, University of Ilorin, Prof. Suleiman Funsho Ambali, welcomed the reinstatement of Prof. Yusuf, who he described as a distinguished *Unilorite* and a committed member of the Association.

Prof. Ambali described the judicial victory of Prof. Yusuf as a stimulating one for the University of Ilorin as it came a few

hours after the appointment of another distinguished Unilorite, Dr. Uthman Abubakar Akanbi-Jos, as the new Balogun Alanamu of Ilorin.

In a statement signed on his behalf by the Secretary of the Association, Mr. Abubakar Imam, the IESA Chairman urged Prof. Yusuf, who is generally known among his colleagues and students as "Comrade", to see his travail as one of the libations he had to offer towards the greatness of his ancestral community, where the College is situated and Kwara State at large.

He commended Prof. Yusuf for pursuing his conviction in a court of law instead of either resorting to self-help or resigning to fate as he said that his decision and eventual victory would serve as enduring lessons to all.

Prof. Ambali, who is a former Dean of the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, University of Ilorin, urged others to always be mindful of their actions and inactions while in office as such may be called to question anytime as it has happened to the renowned scholar cum academic administrator.

UNILORIN dons task govts on policies to end deforestation

Two lecturers from the Faculty of Agriculture, University of Ilorin, Dr. Folaranmi Babalola and Dr. Tajudeen Amusa, have enjoined government at all levels and relevant stakeholders to make policies that will protect the ecosystem and also end deforestation in the country.

The duo made the call last Monday (March 21, 2022) while featuring on a special radio programme to commemorate this year's International Day of Wildlife and Forests, monitored by **UNILORIN BULLETIN**.

It would be recalled that the United Nations General Assembly in 2012 and at its 68th session in 2013 proclaimed the commemoration of the International Days of Forests and Wildlife to celebrate and raise awareness on the importance of all types of forests as well as the importance of engaging in tree planting, and importance of wild animals and plants respectively.

In their separate remarks, Dr. Babalola, who identified ecosystem as various species of wild animals and plants, said that human-beings depend on them for livelihood and survival, while Dr. Amusa, said that the International Day of Forests is

marked to discourage cutting of trees for the sake of modernization and urbanization, without planting.

Speaking on the theme for this year's World Wildlife Day, "Recovering key species for ecosystem restoration", Dr. Babalola said that animal such as vulture is created to remove carcass on the roads to make the environment clean.

The don, who condemned killing of wild animals as food which may lead to their extinction, stressed that wild animals such as pangolin, elephants and lions could be conserved through forest reserve, game reserve and national parks for tourism and

research purposes.

On his part, Dr. Amusa, disclosed that human life has direct connection with forest as it provides humans with medicines, foods, clothings amongst others.

The don maintained that despite the direct connection of forest with human-being, it must not be over-utilized to the detriment of future generations.

He explained that forest sustainable management is key to combating climate change, poverty alleviation and contribute to the prosperity and well-being of the present and future generations.
