## Oyawoye's death, a great loss to humanity -- Egbewole



he Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has described the death of the Aremo of Offa, Prof. Jamiu Mosobalaje Oyawoye, as a great loss not only to the ancient Offa Kingdom but also to the rest of the nation and humanity.

Prof. Oyawoye, Africa's first Professor of Geology, died on Monday afternoon at the ripe age of 96 years.

In a statement signed by the University's Director of Corporate Affairs, Mr Kunle Akogun, the Vice Chancellor said that he received the news of the death of the renowned scholar and community leader with rude shock, noting that Prof. Oyawoye died at a time when his counsels were still cherished.

The Vice Chancellor said that Prof. Oyawoye, who was a onetime Chairman of the West African Examinations Council (WAEC), was an outstanding statesman, a deeply religious personality, exciting business man and a priceless asset to the people of his community and the nation.

He added that Prof. Oyawoye, who served as the Baba Adinni of Kwara State, was not only a leading intellectual but one of the pioneer sets of eggheads that took over leading academic positions at the premier University of Ibadan shortly after the nation's independence.

Prof. Egbewole said that the deceased was a great friend and patron of the University of Ilorin, recalling that he was one of the eminent Kwarans who responded to the call of the University for support.

The Vice Chancellor specifically mentioned the late elderstatesman's sponsorship of the Mosobalaje Oyawoye Annual Lecture at the University's Faculty of Physical Sciences, since the past 15 years.

The annual lecture, he said, has been of tremendous positive impact on the staff and students of the Faculty as well as members of the public over the years.


Prof. Egbewole condoled with the government and people of Kwara State on the death of a truly distinguished citizen.

He also sympathised with the Olofa of Offa, Oba Mufutau Gbadamosi Esuwoye II, and the good people of Offa and especially the Muslim community on the demise of an outstanding community leader.

The Vice Chancellor urged the bereaved Oyawoye family to take solace in the fact that their patriarch led a fulfilled life full of pioneering achievements in the service of Almighty Allah and humanity.

Prof. Egbewole prayed Allah to forgive the shortcomings of Prof. Oyawoye and grant him peaceful repose in Aljannah Fridaous.

The AVAC, which is an initiative of De Montfort University, in conjunction with the University of Ilorin and Microscale Embedded Limited, Abuja, is in partnership with the Innovate UK, a United Kingdom's innovation agency, which provides money and support to organisations to make new products and services.

The project is an online platform for enhancing agricultural value chains in Nigeria using data analytics and Geographic Information Systems (GIS). The project is aimed at enabling farmers to sell to buyers directly and will provide them with location-aware value chain information to enhance their productivity.

While flagging off the project, Prof. Egbewole said the University of Ilorin is pleased to be part of the initiative, which is one of the major interventions in the value chain of agricultural projects in Africa.

The Vice Chancellor said that value chain in agricultural products cannot be overemphasised because a lot of wastage is happening on the farm. He said, "I believe this will stop the wastage in agriculture, create value, ensure that our farmers are happier, and our society will accommodate whatever is produced and we will have the opportunity to export quality products".

According to him, the partnership between the University of Ilorin and De Montfort University should impact UNILORIN in such a way that it will create visibility for the University by improving the ranking of the institution.

Prof. Egbewole, who is a Professor of Jurisprudence and International Law, pointed out that while the Innovate UK project is on, he expects that the AVAC programme will end up innovating Nigeria as a country and the university as an institution.

While congratulating Prof. J. O. Olaoye and Dr M. O. Sunmonu, both of the University of Ilorin and African Knowledge Base Supervisors of the project, for winning the project fund for the University of Ilorin, the Vice-Chancellor said, "The competition of this nature came with a lot of challenges. That you have put a lot into getting to this stage to register the name of our University among the most advanced universities in the world means a lot to us".

Prof. Egbewole assured the partners that "at the University of Ilorin, we are diligent, we follow due process, and we are ever committed to whatever it is that we do because we are indeed better by far. Let me assure the team that the University of Ilorin is greatly interested and will monitor all steps for the 15 months that the project will be on. The monitoring is to ensure it does not lapse after 15 months and

will scale up to the next stage of the project.

"I see the future of this project not only residing in Engineering and Agriculture, but it will go to Communication and Information Sciences, Arts, Law, Life Sciences and at the end of the day, all aspects of our University will be involved because by the time we look deeply, we might likely see a gap that any of the Faculties in the institution will be able to fill.".

The Vice Chancellor also encouraged the farmers, who were present at the event and those that would join later, to ensure they key into the initiative, saying, "The process is designed to improve your work and to ensure what you do now will be different from the way you did it before. Because if you do it better, you are likely to get a better result. If you get a better result, your economy is likely to improve. And if your economy improves, Nigeria's economy will improve and this will make all Nigerians happy".

In his own remarks, the Academic Supervisor of the project from De Montfort University, Dr Suleiman Yerima, who participated in the official flagging off of the programme via Zoom, said that his institution partnered with the University of Ilorin because of the track record of the indigenous people involved and the track record of the University.

Dr Yerima said De Montfort University is pleased to work with UNILORIN on the project, which is targeted at producing long- and short-term technological solutions to notable agricultural problems, which might likely extend the partnership beyond this project.

Dr Yerima, who is a Senior Lecturer of Cyber Security at De Montfort University's School of Computer Science and Informatics, said with the indigenous idea that could provide a solution to the problem of society, every partner in the project must develop "a can do it" attitude.

He added that the partnership will take on the challenge of achieving the

prevention of food wastage, enhancing food security, and promoting the emergence of new businesses through support for institutions and farmers.

Speaking earlier, one of the facilitators of the project who doubles as the African Knowledge Base Lead, Prof. J. O. Olaoye, said that the objectives of each KTP programme are to facilitate the transfer of knowledge and technology and the spread of technical and business skills to the company, stimulate and enhance business-relevant research and training undertaken by the knowledge base, and enhance the business and specialist skills of a recently qualified graduate.

Olaoye, who is a Professor of Agricultural and Biosystems Engineering, explained that the AVAC initiative will build an innovative solution to enhance the Nigerian agricultural and food value chain systems and improve farmers' productivity by addressing challenges in food distribution and improving the availability of safe, nutritious foods. He added that this will enhance selling produce at the right time for the right price which will minimise crop spoilage.

Prof. Olaoye also observed that AVAC will ensure less food wastage, increase yield, reduce storage use and reduce CO2 emissions, which will also enable small-holder farmers to access location-based information to link processors, transporters, markets, and distributors.

Other dignitaries on the occasion include the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic), Prof. Olubunmi Abayomi Omotesho; the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Management Services), Prof. Sulyman Folurunsho Ambali; the University Registrar, Mr Mansur Adeleke Alfanla; and the Dean of the Faculty of Agriculture, Prof. D. A. Labode; among others. The programme was also attended by farmers from the three senatorial districts of Kwara State.

Prof. Adesiji, whose lecture was entitled "Workers Together, Workers To Gather and Workers To Get There", explained that it was very important for all the stakeholders to offer maximum support to farmers in order to enhance their productivity and consequently boost food security.

The Inaugural Lecturer decried the near abandonment of farmers whose farming enterprises are not large enough, saying that every farmer who engages in commercial farming and even those who do at subsistence level needed to be encouraged with funds and facilities.

Prof. Adesiji said that farmers needed to be particularly supported with extension services through which they can gain access to emerging information, facilities and implements as well as methodologies.

The renowned agriculturist added that farmers must also be given extension services that are relevant to their needs and which must also be responsive to local conditions, saying that those who offer these services must be methodical in their approaches to information dissemination and management.

Prof. Adesiji added that farmers should be given the privilege of making their choices among extension officers, saying that giving them such opportunities would lead to the achievement of the essence of the extension services.

The don also canvassed for the exploration and adoption as well as adaptation of research findings in the knowledge and wherewithal being extended to farmers, stressing that it is

extension services to be research oriented. Speaking on the pervasive influence of m o d e r n communication techniques on farmers and agricultural practices, Prof. Adesiji said that extension services could be better delivered through radio, television and consultative meetings as well as on mobile phones.

T h e Inaugural Lecturer also appealed to the government to

always establish and implement clear policies and regulations that would enhance quality extension services.

He also emphasised the need to institutionalise reward system for farmers who deploy and adopt knowledge transferred to them through extension services, saying that such practice would encourage more farmers to utilise the services provided by extension officers.

Prof. Adesiji also implored all those who are involved in extension services to find a way of collaborating among themselves for cross fertilisation of ideas.

The Inaugural Lecturer appealed to concerned authorities to always find a way

The lecture, which was presided over by the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, was attended by dignitaries from far and near including friends, colleagues, students and relations of Prof. Adesiji.

### 6 UNILORIN student-athletes qualify for World University Games

**n** an outstanding display of talent and dedication, six students of the University of Ilorin have earned their qualifications to compete in the highly anticipated FISU World University Games in China between July 28 and August 8 this year.

This was disclosed by the University's Director of Sport, Prof. Tajudeen Ibraheem, in a memo to the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN.

Prof. Ibraheem said that the six UNILORIN athletes were among the 12 that participated at the trials hosted by the University of Benin between May 8 and May 14, 2023.

Prof. Ibraheem thanked the Vice Chancellor and his entire management team for the support the athletes and officials received before and during the trial competition in Benin City.

The outstanding athletes are Musa Nurain, Latoya Alabi, Ruqayyah Mustapha, Fareedah Aderibigbe, Usman Qudus Afolabi, and Sofiat Obanishola. At the trial competition in Benin City, Musa Nurain, a student of the Department of Educational Technology, won two gold medals in 100m and 200m race. Nurain, an electrifying sprinter, has become a force to be reckoned with on the track following his blistering speed and unwavering determination.

Joining Nurain in the field events are Latoya Alabi and Ruqayyah Mustapha, who have secured their qualifications in both the javelin throw and the discus throw. Ms Alabi and Ms Mustapha, both of the Department of Human Kinetics Education, picked gold medals, in their respective events.

Fareedah Aderibigbe of the Department of English, known for her martial arts prowess in the combat game, recorded a gold medal in the mat event of taekwondo (Batan 53KG). In 2022, Ms Aderibigbe, complemented by the remarkable achievements of her teammates, helped the UNILORIN Taekwando team, to make a historical feat by emerging as the top most ranked side at the Nigeria University Games (NUGA) hosted by the University of Lagos. In the realm of racquet sports, Usman Qudus Afolabi of the Department of Human Kinetics Education earned his qualification in badminton (male category). Armed with lightning reflexes and exceptional hand-eye coordination, Afolabi emerged as a dominant player on the court as he qualified among the best four.

In the female category, Sofiat Obanishola's finesse and strategic prowess propelled her to the top of her game as she recorded wins in all her games. Ms Obanishola, a student of the Department of Human Kinetics Education, is poised to make a lasting impression on the badminton court, challenging the world's best university players.

The World University Games, widely regarded as the pinnacle of university-level sports competitions, will see thousands of student-athletes from around the globe gather to showcase their skills and represent their educational institutions. Held biennially, the event serves as a platform for young athletes to display their abilities and potentially launch their careers in their chosen sports.


