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Onireti tasks UNILORIN Desk Officers on diligence, professionalism

he Director, Centre for International Education (CIE), University of Ilorin, Prof. Lateef Onireti Ibraheem, has enjoined the institution's Desk Officers of various universities and organisations to always approach their responsibilities with diligence, excellence, enlightenment and professionalism.

Prof. Ibraheem gave this advice last Monday (February 5, 2024) while addressing the Desk Officers at the Boardroom of the Centre.

The Director explained that the Desk Officers, who are senior academic staff members of the University, have a lot of roles to play towards helping the University to achieve its corporate objectives and particularly the Vision 1:10:500 of the institution's Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN.

Prof. Ibraheem explained that the responsibilities of the Desk Officers are pivotal in the efforts geared towards the internationalisation of the University.

The Director pointed out that the concerned officers also have a critical role to play in the academic growth of the University and ensuring the diffusion of cultural heritage as well as positive Collaborations.

Prof. Ibraheem, who teaches at the Department of Arabic, said that Desk Officers are the ambassadors of the University and that they must, therefore, discharge their duties diligently and professionally in order to represent the University effectively.

He added that the Desk Officers are also the custodians of the various Memoranda of Understanding signed between the University and other universities and organisations.

Prof. Ibraheem, who is also the Mufti of Ojokuland in the Oyun Local Government Area of Kwara State, encouraged the Desk Officers to check the websites of the designated universities and organisations for them to explore all the areas that would be of advantage to the staff and students of the University of Ilorin.

Niyi-Gafar charged the Desk Officers to adhere strictly to the regulations and essence of the collaborations between the University of Ilorin and their designated universities and organisations.

Dr Niyi-Gafar, who is a lecturer at the Faculty of Law, University of Ilorin, noted that the Desk Officers must also be meticulous to ensure that the MoU they would be signing on behalf of the University should be legally safe and truly beneficial to the institution before endorsing such.

On his part, the Assistant Director of the Centre, Dr Zubair, who traced the history of the CIE, explained that since the establishment of the Centre in 2009, it has facilitated a lot of progress to the University.

He pointed out that the Centre has attracted some projects and expatriate staff and foreign students to various academic Departments, which contributed to the international fame and recognition as well as positive rating of the University over the years

Dr AbdulHakeem Zubair, who is a lecturer at the institution's Department of Arabic, added that the University has signed no fewer than 150 Memoranda of Understanding with similar institutions across the five continents of the world.

While he noted that some of the Memoranda of Understanding are active, a number of them are dormant. He, therefore, urged those in- charge of the various desks

to ensure that every effort is made to ensure the reactivation of the dead MoUs and survival of the existing ones.

Dr Zubair added that the University has functional collaborations with the International Association of Universities (IAU), the Association of African Universities (AAU) and the Association of West African Universities (AWAU), as well as Ku8, and U6+, among other international collaborations.

Also commenting, Dr Azubike Onuora-Oguno an Associate Professor at the Department of Jurisprudence and International Law, University of Ilorin, who is also a Desk Officer, encouraged his colleagues to always be ready to invest in their career progression for them to achieve their goals.

He explained that Desk Officers needed to ensure that they sacrifice their times and energy as well as resources to ensure that the Memoranda of Understanding under their care do not die.

He also said that it was important for the University authorities to give academic staff members of the University latitude to do the Centre's assignment, saying that they stand to gain a lot from the responsibilities if well achieved.

The meeting attracted about 30 Desk Officers from various Departments and Faculties, including the Dean, Faculty of Physical Sciences, University of Ilorin, Prof. Abdullahi Baba Alafara.

Prof. Omotesho, who is a former Director of Academic Planning of the University, insisted that the award is essentially targeted at enabling the institution to produce outstanding alumni who would be able to compete with their colleagues from allover the world.

He pointed out that the new awards would not stop the existing "Merit Awards" for deserving staff members of the various units of the University usually conferred during convocation ceremonies.

Prof. Omotesho also explained that other awards would also be institutionalised for different categories of stakeholders of the University so as to stimulate the desire for the greatness of the nation's most soughtafter University.

Speaking when he paid a courtesy visit to the Vice Chancellor penultimate Tuesday (January 30, 2024), Dr Neliaku said that the award granted the University by the *New Telegraph* newspaper highlighted the transformative strides made under the leadership of Prof. Egbewole within his first year in office.

Dr Neliaku, who has served in the Office of the Political Adviser to the President of Nigeria from 2003 to 2006, thanked Prof. Egbewole and his team for what they accomplished within a year. He also commended the University's commitment to maintaining the lowest tuition fees in the country.

He explained that despite the challenging economic climate, the Vice Chancellor's consideration for the financial well-being of the less privileged has not gone unnoticed.

While briefing the Vice Chancellor in his office during a courtesy call last Monday (February 5, 2024), the Director of LABTOP, Prof. Mohammed Jimoh Saka, disclosed that NOTAP recognised the institutions that are doing well in the area of transforming research output to finished products in order to fast track the country's economic development.

Prof. Saka said that the competition, which culminated into the award, saw the participation of 48 institutions, including universities and polytechnics across Nigeria. He explained that NOTAP employed a rigorous evaluation process, utilising questionnaires, campus visitations, and a comprehensive assessment of various activities to rate the winners, with a particular focus on the universities' involvement in training feasibility.

Prof. Saka explained that Unilorin's success could be attributed not only to the number of patents held but also to the institution's dedication to feasibility studies. He noted that other universities with more patents did not receive the same recognition, showcasing the uniqueness of *Unilorin's* approach.

The Director commended the Vice Chancellor for providing extensive training opportunities since assuming office, fostering interaction with NOTAP on science and technology. He also highlighted the active engagement with students through a dedicated student wing, contributing significantly to the centre's success.

The Director of LABTOP, however, noted that the Vice Chancellor had initiated a comprehensive strategy to position Unilorin for the top spot in the next awards. He said the strategy includes providing a state-of-the-art office, bolstering manpower, intensifying the university's commercialisation efforts, and establishing valuable connections with industries within and outside the country.

In response to the University's successes at the Intellectual Property and Technology Transfer Offices (IPTTO) awards, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Egbewole, congratulated the LABTOP Director and his team for doing the

university proud.

However, he expressed the need to expedite the commercialisation of the university's extensive patent portfolio, saying that it is imperative to translate all innovative research outputs into tangible products for the benefit of the society.

The Vice Chancellor also directed the LABTOP Centre to proactively seek further collaborations with industries both within and beyond the state who are capable of leveraging the university's patented technologies, in order to ultimately bring about positive transformations for the wider society.

Meanwhile, the Deputy Director of LABTOP, Dr George Adeniyi, said that the university's management is actively working to fortify and motivate the centre to propel the University of Ilorin's research endeavours to new heights. According to him, the centre is planning to rollout at least one product annually from its impressive portfolio of over 20 patents.

While explaining that there are concerted efforts to achieve this feat, Dr Adeniyi said that the objective is not only to innovate but also to contribute meaningfully to the community by addressing specific needs.

To ensure the relevance and effectiveness of these products, he opined that the LABTOP Centre is placing a strong emphasis on evaluating societal needs and aligning research priorities accordingly.

Dr Adeniyi emphasised the abundance of local challenges in the region that demand technological attention, adding that the centre is committed to leveraging its expertise to address these issues.

Among the notable patents held by Unilorin is the biolistic composite, which has garnered attention from the Nigerian Army. Dr Adeniyi revealed that there is a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) in place to develop this technology to a commercial level. However, he lamented that bureaucratic challenges had momentarily slowed down the process.

Other members of the LABTOP team who came to present the award to the Vice Chancellor were the Deputy Director LABTOP, Dr M. O. Oloyede, and the Centre's Lab Attendant, Mrs Bebeyi Folashade. Also in the team was the President of Intellectual Property Club (IP Club), University of Ilorin, Mr James Titiloye and the Director of Research II of IP Club, Mr Emanuel Oluwatobi Oyewumi.



UNILORIN advises staff on plans for retirement

he Head, Pension Unit at the Registry of the University of Ilorin, Mrs Abimbola R. Ologe, has advised staff members of the University on the need for them to be extremely careful in their retirement plans.

Mrs Ologe gave this advice last Wednesday (January 7, 2024) at the institution's Main Auditorium while speaking at a sensitisation programme organised for staff of the University who are due for retirement this year.

Mrs Ologe, who is a Principal Assistant Registrar, explained that it was important for employees of the University to be careful with decisions that would have impact on their future financial security.

She stressed the significance of embracing retirement planning and making well-informed decisions to ensure a comfortable future. She further advised all staff members to think thoroughly and consider their options before choosing a PFA and subscribing to a retirement plan.

In his paper, a pension fund administrator, Mr Kolapo Adeyara, explained that there are two types of retirement plans, namely Programmed Withdrawal and Annuity.

He explained that the programmed withdrawal is the first lump sum option, where the PFA administrator spreads the balance of the withdrawal over a predetermined number of years, providing a steady monthly or quarterly

payment to the retiree. He pointed out that the programmed withdrawal is primarily based on an expected life expectancy period.

Mr Adeyara, who was the representative of the Custodian Assurance Limited, said that the other type of pension is "Annuity", which, unlike the first one provides lifetime payments to the retiree, saying that the risk of longevity is often transferred to the PFA.

Mr Adeyara added that the Custodian Life Assurance Limited mission is targeted at developing, packaging and delivering innovative issurance products that best satisfy customer needs while operating a highly profitable, efficient, resourceful and ethical organisation.



Fawole buries mom in style

t was an emotional time for members and friends of the Komolafe family of Atiba Quarters, Esun Ekiti and Onipede of Ituru Quarters, Oke Ayedun Ekiti, as the remains of the mother of the Dean of the Faculty of Agriculture, University of Ilorin, late Mama Rebecca Aina Komolafe, was laid to rest at Imo in the Ilesha North Local Area Development Council, Osun State penultimate Friday (February 2, 2024).

Reflecting on the life and times of her late mother, the Dean said that the deceased nonagenarian made her and her siblings to understand and appreciate the significance of family life.

"She was someone who taught us the meaning of family life; she loved her husband and taught us how to take care of our husbands. I believe she is resting in peace because she lived a fruitful life," Prof. Fawole added.

She also recalled fond memories of the warmth and hospitality that characterised visits to her mother's home. "I will miss the warmth with which she received us every time we went home. She spoiled us with all sorts of things – warmth, laughter. My children were always eager to go to her place because she was very lovely, humble, and accommodating," Prof. Fawole reminisced.

Also speaking with the *UNILORIN BULLETIN*, the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic), University of Ilorin, Prof. Olubunmi Abayomi Omotesho, described the late Matriarch as an outstanding patriot and a great family and nation builder considering her remarkable achievements and impact on her children and the society at large.

Prof. Omotesho said that "There is nothing any parent will wish for more than what Mama and her late husband had done. They have been able to take care of their children, see them succeed in life, and have great-grand-children. It's a grace that God has allowed them to enjoy. That is why I thank God for their lives".

While highlighting the significant role played by late Mama Rebecca in shaping the lives of her children, the Ý i с е Deputy Chancellor observed that "The coming of guests from all walks of life is a reflection of the impact that Mama has made on other lives through her children. We thank God for this,



Garlands for a veritable Numero Uno

igeria's most sought-after university, the University of Ilorin, has continued to elevate its national standing with its latest award of "Outstanding Nigerian University of the Year 2023" conferred on it in Lagos penultimate Friday (February 2, 2024) by the *New Telegraph*, Nigeria's most authoritative newspaper in Politics and Business reporting. According to the frontline national newspaper, the University won the prestigious award because of its "exceptional contributions in governance and other areas of life".

Prof. Egbewole said, "We are determined to go to the next level by ensuring that our Vision 1-10-500 becomes a reality".

Indeed, the University of Ilorin made remarkable strides in the Year 2023, which marked the first anniversary of Prof. Egbewole's VCship.
