
## Faculty honours Zubair, W/Africa's first Professor of Islamic Law

The Vice Chancellor described Prof. Zubair as a fine breed of academic and one of the most outstanding scholars who served at the University's Faculty of Law, saying that "he was the best of us and among the best that can be found anywhere".

Prof. Egbewole noted that Prof. Zubair, who is generally acknowledged as the first Professor of Islamic Law in the West African subregion, is a man of his words and someone who did his best for all those who came across him.

While congratulating the retired academic giant on his multidimensional accomplishments, the renowned Senior Advocate of Nigeria, who described the event as "the celebration of goodness", thanked Prof. Zubair for all his services to the University of Ilorin, particularly for the mentorship he provided for nearly all the academic staff of the Faculty.

Prof. Egbewole encouraged staff of the University to always act according to their conscience, saying that to be misunderstood is not a weakness and that once the conviction is strong those who misunderstood righteousness will eventually come back to celebrate the hitherto misconstrued position.

Speaking earlier, the Chairman of the occasion, Prof. Shuaibu Oba AbdulRaheem, OFR, said that the event represented a significant landmark in the history of the Faculty of Law, University of Ilorin.

Presenting the 'Nigerian Outstanding University' award to the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, the Managing Director/Editor-in-Chief of Daily Telegraph Publishing Company Limited, Mr Ayodele Aminu, said that the University won the award because of its dedication to academic excellence.

For the past 12 years, the University of Ilorin has continued to be the preferred choice of admission seekers, making it the nation's most subscribed institution of higher learning as affirmed by the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB).

In 2023, the University was rated as the 3rd Best University in Nigeria based on the number and quality of scholarly outputs of its staff members in the last three years on Elsevier/Scopus - SciVal.

Also in 2023, four of its Faculties and 11 courses offered at the institution were ranked among the world best by the Times Higher Education (THE).

According to a recent ranking published by Study Abroad Aide, a leading platform for international students mobility, the University of Ilorin was ranked the 9th Best Value University for International Students among the 149 universities in Nigeria. The institution was also rated among the top 21% Best Value Universities globally, encompassing 8,060 institutions across 69 countries.

Reacting to the recognition of the institution by the New Telegraph, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Egbewole, SAN, dedicated the award to the "hardworking workforce of the University of Ilorin", adding that "the reward for hard work is

### Don blames poor economy for upsurge in crimes

Senior Lecturer at the Department of Criminology and Security Studies, University of Ilorin, Dr Monsurat Isiaka, has said that the prevailing inclement economic situation in the country is responsible for the upsurge in the crime rate being recorded across the nation.

Dr Isiaka, who is a specialist in Criminal Justice System and Terrorism, stated this last Monday (January 29, 2024) in a chat with UNILORIN BULLETIN in her office.

She explained that the need to make ends meet or live big by mindless individuals and groups who are not gainfully employed or whose means of livelihood are being threatened by unbridled economic degradation have led to increasing criminality across the country

Dr Isiaka, who is a former Coordinator of the Department of Criminology and Security Studies, University of Ilorin, therefore, urged citizens to be careful in their dispositions in order not to fall prey to criminals who often disguise as helpers or comforters.

She particularly appealed to students of the University and other institutions of higher learning across the nation to be meticulous in the display of affluence within and outside the shores of their campus as she explained that the various campuses might have been infiltrated by criminals who are profiling likely targets.

The renowned criminologist insisted that students are admitted to learn and not to impress their colleagues with wealth and therefore advised them to always be moderate in the quality of their dresses, ornaments and telephones they use so as not to attract criminals who disguise as colleagues.

Dr Isiaka also urged staff and students, particularly female ones, to avoid asking for free ride from anyone they do not know, saying that such individuals may be criminals who are in search of prey that may be used for rituals.

The don appealed to the federal government to swiftly address and arrest the nation's dwindling economy as she said that for as long as the nation's economy is in comatose crimes and criminality would continue to be the order of the day.

She specifically insisted that something urgent must be done by the government and other employers of labour to ensure that the wages payable to workers are reflective of the current economic situations.

Speaking on campus safety, Dr Isiaka explained that it has become important for management of institutions of higher learning to tighten security within and around the campuses to ensure the safety of lives and property of staff and students.

She suggested that there should be restrictions on the number of commercial vehicles that are allowed to operate on the various campuses and that such vehicles must be properly labelled for ease of identification by the authorities and passengers.

Dr Isiaka also said that it has become important for the management of all those institutions to install security gadgets on their campuses and work with the Police and other security agencies, pointing out that criminals are not likely to operate where they are aware that they are being monitored.

She added that the wearing of identification cards by students and staff of institutions of higher learning within and outside their campuses should be made compulsory and that they should all be armed with the contacts of those that can be called upon whenever they sense danger.

Dr Isiaka insisted that security is the business of everyone and that everybody must take his or her security very important, saying that if that happens the entire nation would be secured.



that such events would always bring together all Faculties of Law in Nigeria and the Department of Islamic Law where the course is taught as such would help in repositioning the teaching and learning of Islamic Law in Nigeria.

She added that the Department was also considering institutionalising an annual lecture series, which is intended to bring its alumni who are trailblazers at national and international levels to showcase scholarship and serve as inspiring models to the upcoming ones.

The Guest Lecturer at the event, who is also an alumnus of the institution, Dr Umar Oseni, while delivering his lecture, titled "Becoming a Global Islamic Law Professional-Prerequisites, Polemics and Prospects", advised that there should be a panel of exclusive Islamic Law in a Supreme Court to enable fair judgments in Islamic Law, as many Muslim cases are taken outside Islamic Law.

Dr Oseni suggested that all Islamic court matters should end in the Court of Appeal where there are competent jurists in the field rather than the Supreme Court as presently

constituted.

He also advised students to invest in books, adding that studying without the guidance of books equates to law students failing right from start.

Also speaking, a Senior Advocate of Nigeria, Mallam Yusuf Olaolu Ali, SAN, commended the Guest Lecturer for his notable contributions to the profession of Islamic Law, urging him to continue to stand out like his father, who is also the Chief Imam and Waziri of Auchi Kingdom, Prof. Zakariyah Idrees Oseni, who he described as an outstanding Professor of Arabic and someone whose legacies at the University would continue to be celebrated.

The Chairman of the occasion, who is also the Registrar of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), Prof. Is'haq Olanrewaju Oloyede, CON, in his contributions, decried the relegation of Islamic Law to the level of Customary Law in many parts of the country.

He explained that the relegation is not only unjust but also unprofessional.

Prof. Oloyede, who is a former Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, also called on the Muslim L a w y e r s A s s o c i a t i o n o f Nigeria(MULAN) and the Islamic Law Department to write a well-detailed paper to President Bola Ahmed Tinubu and the Chief Justice of Nigeria, Justice Olukayode Ariwoola, stating the problems their decisions have caused and possible ways to solve these issues.


