THE UNIVERSITY OF ILORIN HISTORICAL NOTES



PREAMBLE

The University of Ilorin is located in the ancient city of Ilorin, about 300 kilometres from Lagos and 500 kilometres from Abuja, the Federal Capital City. Ilorin, the Capital of Kwara State, is strategically located at the geographical and cultural confluence of the North and South and can be described as a gateway town.

The University of Ilorin is one of the institutions of higher learning established by a decree of the Federal Military Government in August 1975. This step was taken to provide more opportunities for Nigerians aspiring to acquire University education and to generate relevant high-level manpower for its developing economy.

Initially, as an affiliated College of the University of Ibadan, Dr. T.N. Tamuno, Professor and Head of History Department at the University of Ibadan, was appointed the first Principal of the University College, Ilorin, in September 1975. Shortly after Professor Tamuno's assignment as Principal of the College, he was appointed the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ibadan. It therefore, became necessary to appoint another Principal in the person of Dr. O.O. Akinkugbe, Professor of Medicine and former Dean of the then Faculty of Medicine, University of Ibadan, in December, 1975.

With the assistance of the then Military Governor of Kwara State, late Colonel Ibrahim Taiwo, the new Principal, Professor O.O. Akinkugbe, was, by March 1976, in residence at Ilorin, in rented quarters, which also included a three-bedroom Guest Chalet at 5. Forest Road, G.R.A., where the administrative work of the University was carried out. Akinkugbe started with four members of staff comprising two Administrative Officers, one driver and one Clerk/Typist. Soon after, staff recruitment began in earnest, and by July 1976, a sizeable number of academic, administrative and technical staff had been employed for the take-off. Immediately, the administration moved to a slightly more spacious location at Sabo-Oke. The support enjoyed by the fledging institution continued under the third Military Governor of the State, Brigadier George Innih, who gave a portion of the Kwara State College of Technology to the University. This served as the Mini Campus for 36 years but presently houses the University of Ilorin Secondary School and the Institute of Education.

ACADEMIC AND PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

Following an entrance examination, 200 foundation students were admitted into residence on Saturday, October 23, 1976, and academic activities commenced on Monday, October 25, 1976, after the Principal's maiden address at about 10.00 a.m. in the Africa Hall. The University College had three foundation Faculties namely: Arts, Science and Education headed by Professors O. Awobuluyi, M.O. Olofinboba and J.O.O. Abiri as Deans respectively. The foundation Principal Officers were: the Registrar, Mr. Olu Daramola, the University Librarian, Mr. B.A. Oni-Orisan, the Bursar, Mr. I.A. Oyawoye and the Director of Works, Mr. R.A. Imohiosen. Under their administrative and academic leadership, the institution marched ahead towards the development of its science-oriented programmes.

In October 1977, the University College Ilorin attained a full autonomous status of a university and has since then been developing by leaps and bounds. The student population of 200 in 1976 had increased to about 54,8494 in 2017. Up till January 1982, the University carried out its academic programmes, involving the Faculties of Arts, Science, Education, Engineering and Technology, Business and Social Sciences and the Pre-Clinical aspect of the Health Sciences on the Mini Campus. The completion of the faculty blocks for Natural Sciences and Engineering as well as 8 blocks of students' hostels by December 1981, made it possible for the actual movement of over 1,000 science-oriented students to the Main Campus to pursue their various academic programmes on 2nd January, 1982.

The main campus currently houses the Faculties of Agriculture, Arts, Communication and Information Sciences, Education, Engineering and Technology, Environment Sciences, Law, Life Sciences, Management Sciences, Pharmaceutical Sciences, Physical Sciences, Social Sciences, and Veterinary Medicine as well as the Postgraduate School, while the College of Medicine, which comprises the Faculties of Basic Medical Sciences and Clinical Sciences, is located in the premises of the University of Ilorin Teaching Hospital pending the completion of the its permanent site which is about five kilometres to the main campus.

Within the main campus are also the former Central Administration building (formerly transferred to the Faculty of Arts but which now houses the General Studies Division, the offices of the University Resources Development Management Board, the Library and Publication Unit, the Department of Adult and Primary Education, among others), Directorate of Works and Maintenance, the Physical Planning Unit. Conference Centre, Student Canteens and Unilorin "Bukateria" Centre. Other buildings are a block of workshops for the Department of Agricultural Engineering, completed in 1988; a big Library Complex, 1991; a Students' Centre, 1993; five blocks of offices and classroom for the Faculty of Education, 1993 which in 2013 was transferred to both the faculties of Management and Environment Sciences after the completion of a new block of complex for the Faculty of Education and 15 lecture theatres (with the seating capacities of between 350 and 600 students built for each of the faculties), blocks of offices and laboratories for Sugar Research Institute, 80-students capacity language laboratory, block of offices for departments of Economics, Political Science, Sociology, Social Work, Psychology and Geography and Environment Management, a Prometric Centre for 500-position capacity, Four storey Office and laboratories for departments of Mass Communication and Computer Science, a Phonetics laboratory, Central Research Laboratory Complex, a new Central Administration (seven storey building), and 2000 seater capacity state-of-the-art Auditorium.

Other projects include the building of the Postgraduate School, a 4-storey block that houses the Centre for Peace and Strategic Studies and the Centre for International Education, a block of office for the Centre for Ilorin Studies, for Research Development and In-House Training that also houses the Office of the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Research and Innovation) a block of office for the Technical and Entrepreneurial Centre, new offices and laboratories complex for Faculty of Life Sciences, a 2000-seater multi-purpose hall complex, a 2-storey block of offices for the Department of Material and Metallurgical Engineering, a block of offices for Ilorin Business School, a 4-storey office complex for the Faculty of Arts, several University Public-Private Partnership (PPP) Students' Hostel Development Projects, Information Communication Technology Centre also referred to as Network Operating Centre (NOC), 1-storey block of offices for the Department of Optometry and Vision Science, 1-storey block of offices for the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, construction and rehabilitation of the existing blocks of offices and classrooms in the former Unilorin Secondary for use by the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine and Veterinary clinic at the former MBA school in Sabo Oke, Ilorin, construction of new Engineering Workshop and Research Centre, six different Bank buildings, an E-learning Centre, six 250-seater capacity Computer-based Testing (CBT) halls, Geology and

Mineral Sciences Complex, Performing Arts Theatre Complex, Faculty of Law block of classrooms, the University Store building, Home Economics and Food Science block, Cooperative building, Academic Staff Union Secretariat, Laboratories and offices for the Departments of Chemical Engineering and Statistics, New Senate, Police post at the University gate, Fire Prevention Unit and workshops for the Directorate of Works and Maintenance.

The College of Health Sciences also experienced some tremendous physical development since its relocation from the Mini campus and the former General hospital as evident by the construction of administrative blocks, a block of offices for the lecturers, a block of 4 lecture halls, 8 blocks of student hostel, a laboratory complex, a library block and an ultra-modern, fully-equipped medical simulation centre in the University of Ilorin Teaching Hospital premises. The year 2017 witnessed on-going construction and the completion of some blocks of classrooms/lecture halls, students' hostel, staff offices, College and Faculties offices in the proposed permanent site.

The University also constructed a Central Power Station unit to serve as stand-by power supply for the entire main campus, a radio station, a sport complex with a sports pavilion, comprising a standard indoor sports hall, a fitness centre, a tartan track, 4 lawn tennis courts, 2 basketball courts and 2 volleyball courts. Extensive construction and rehabilitation works were carried out on many roads on the campus (e.g. the link road between the main campus and the College of Health Sciences, construction of walkways, drainages and sand crete block fence at Bolorunduro and Ile-Apa boundary of the University, construction of students' sit-outs across Faculties, gate and gate house at Sentu boundary of the University 200m² and 500m² elevated water tanks and three 1000m concrete ground water tanks, water distribution network and the overhead electricity lines from Ganno to the main campus, parking lots across Faculties and Departments, public toilets at the University zoo, as well as, construction and rehabilitation of street lights. Over the years, several bore-holes were also sunk in addition to the building of a Booster Water Station to improve water supply. Special mention must be made of the Unilorin water dam which has also been completed and the dam site that now serves as a recreation venue.

GROWTH OF FACULTIES

As at 2019, there are fifteen Faculties in the University. These are

Agriculture, Arts, Communication and Information Sciences, Education, Engineering and Technology, Environment Sciences, Law, Life Sciences, Management Sciences, Pharmaceutical Sciences, Physical Sciences, Social Sciences, and Veterinary Medicine. Altogether there are 106 academic Departments in the fifteen Faculties. The duration of undergraduate degree programmes ranges from three to six years, depending on entry qualifications, and discipline. The University started with the traditional "Three-Term System," but later changed to the "Two Semester System" called Harmattan and Rain Semesters with effect from 1979/80 session. Each semester comprises one-half of an academic year as determined by Senate. Also, instruction in the various Faculties, with the exception of the medical programme in the Faculty of the Clinic Sciences of the College of Health Sciences, is by the course system and courses are quantified into credits.

The University has teaching support units which include the Computer Services and Information Technology (COMSIT), Network Operating Centre (NOC), Central Workshop, Biological Garden, Community Based Experience and Services (COBES), Medical Educational Resources Unit (MERU), World Health Organisation (WHO) Collaborating Centre, General Studies Unit, Teaching and Research Farm, Centre for International Education, Centre for Research, Development and In-house Training, Technical and Entrepreneurial Centre, Central Research Laboratory, Centre for Peace and Strategic Studies, Students' Industrial Work Experience Scheme (SIWES) Unit, Students' Affairs Unit, Academic Planning Unit, Directorate of Corporate Affairs, Unilorin Sport Council, Legal Service Unit, Unilorin SERVICOM, University Health Services (Human and Environmental Health Units), Physical Planning Unit, Directorate of Work, Advancement Office, Clinical Skill National Centre for Hydro-power Research Development, Unilorin Medical Screening Centre, Unilorin Stem Cell Research Centre, Centre for Ilorin Studies, Ilorin Archives and Documentation Centre (UADC), Linguistics Immersion Centre, and Unilorin Counselling and Human Development Centre.

In the University, there are also the Public Service Units, which are the University School (Primary and Secondary), Centre for Affiliated Institutions, School of Preliminary Studies, Unilorin Joint Universities Preliminary Examinations Board (JUPEB), Unilorin Consultancy Services Centre, Unilorin Bookshop, Unilorin Printing Press, Unilorin Guest Houses and Unilorin Researchers' Lodge, Unilorin Petrol Station,

Unilorin Business School, Unilorin Resources Development and Management Board (URDMB), Unilorin Zoo, Unilorin Veterinary Teaching Hospital, Unilorin Dental Clinic, Unilorin Laboratory-to-Product Centre, Centre for Open and Distance Learning, Institute of Molecular Science and Biotechnology, Endowment/Alumni Relations Unit, Unilorin Microfinance Bank, Institute of Education and Educational Technology Centre. Although an academic Unit, the Library is actively involved in rendering service to the University and the public. In addition, there is a Sugar Research Institute which is mainly a research unit situated along Ilorin-Ajase-Ipo road.

POSTGRADUATE SCHOOL

A Postgraduate School was inaugurated on 8thNovember, 1983. Prior to the time, matters relating to Postgraduate Programmes were handled by the Board of Postgraduate Studies. Postgraduate studies initially commenced in the Faculty of Science when in 1977, two candidates were enrolled for the Masters of Science degree in the Department of Biological Sciences. Since then, higher degree programmes including doctoral programmes have commenced in other faculties; and the Postgraduate Diploma in Education (PGDE), Diploma in Medical Radiologic Diagnosis (DMRD), Postgraduate Diploma in Computer Science (PGDCS), Postgraduate Diploma in Statistics (PGDS), Postgraduate Diploma in Strategic Management (PGDSM) have also been introduced.

The University Postgraduate programmes have progressed well in enrolment and graduation since its inspection in October, 1978. For instance, from 2 Masters Degree graduating students in 1978, the University graduated 1074 Masters Degree students in 2017 and from only 2 Ph.D. graduating students in 1983, the University also graduated 120 Ph.D. students in 2017. Given the above, it imperative to note that the University has continued to establish and maintain high standard of scholarship in its various academic disciplines through teaching, research and postgraduate programmes.

STUDENTS' ACCOMMODATION AND WELFARE

All the students were initially residential but as the students' population increased over the years, the existing halls of residence became overstretched. The University, therefore, had to embark on the off-campus system with effect from the 1981/82 session. Available data indicated that about 80 per cent of the total students' population of 43,915

live off-campus. By implication only about 11,000 students are accommodated in both the University students' hostels and those provided by private developers through the Public-Private Partnership Initiative. The Halls of Residence are administered through the Students' Welfare Board and a Committee of Hall Masters/Mistresses.

Hitherto, the University used to have two Central Cafeterias, one each at the Mini and Main Campuses but following the Federal Government directive on federally-subsidised students' feeding, effective from October, 1984, students' catering services were provided by private caterers appointed by the students, to run the eateries. The latter catering system became operational in November, 1984. The Students' Catering Committee provides the necessary guidelines for its operation. It also monitors the quality and quantity of food, general environmental sanitation, and water supply to the eateries. However, by mid-1990, the students' catering services ceased to exist and instead were replaced by food canteens referred to as "Bukaterias".

To further enhance, students' welfare at the beginning of every session, the Student Affairs Unit organised an orientation programme for new students. This largely ensured peace and tranquillity on the campus. It is the University policy that for any students' clubs and associations to exist in the University, it is mandatory for such students' clubs and associations to register with the Student Affairs Unit to ensure proper monitoring of their activities. In an attempt to bridge the gap between the University Administration and students and to cultivate leadership ability in the students, membership of some committees was extended to the students. Such committees included Students' Welfare, Sports, Students' Disciplinary and Ceremonials.

STAFF ACCOMMODATION

Whereas initially, the University provided accommodation for its senior members of staff only, it extended this facility to the junior staff upon the completion of the Federal Government Low-Cost Housing Units at the Main Campus. For the senior staff, there are 141 housing Units on the Main Campus, made up of 98 bungalows, 7 maisonettes and 9 blocks of 4 flats each. This is in addition to 56 units on the University Government Reserved Area (GRA) Quarters. There are also the University Guest Houses to cater for the immediate accommodation of new staff. A cost-saving housing policy of Rent Grant/Furniture Loan was introduced in 1984 to replace the former policy of providing part-furnished

accommodation to staff on HATTIS 9 and above. This however, has ceased as a result of the consolidated salary structure introduced by the Federal Government in 2007.

FORMER AND PRESENT OFFICERS OF THE UNIVERSITY

The Visitor to the University is the Head of State. Thus, the University of Ilorin has had eleven Visitors since its inception. These are: Lieutenant-General Olusegun Obasanjo Psc, Jssc, (August 1975-September, 1979); Alhaji Usman Shehu Aliyu Shagari (October 1979-December 30, 1983): Major-General Muhammadu Buhari, *CFR*. (January, 1984-August 26, 1985); Major-General Ibrahim Badamosi Babangida, *CFR*, fss, mni, (August 27, 1985-August 26, 1993); Chief Ernest Shonekan (26th August, 1993-November 17, 1993); General Sanni Abacha (Late) (November 1993- June 8, 1998), General Abdulsalami Abubakar (9th June, 1998-May 28, 1999); Chief Olusegun Obasanjo., *GCFR*, (29th May, 1999-29th May, 2007) and Alhaji Umaru Musa Yar'Adua, *GCFR* (May 29, 2007 to 2011), Dr, Goodluck Jonathan, *GCFR* (2011-2015) and Alhaji Mohammadu Buhari, *GCFR* (May 29, 2015-2023).

The University has had five Chancellors. The first Chancellor was His Royal Highness, Alhaji Umar Sulaiman O.B.E., O.O.N., Hon. LL.D. (Lagos), the late Emir of Bedde (1978-1981). The second Chancellor, His Royal Highness, Kuvyo Shekarau Angyu Masa Ibi II, Aku-Uka of Wukari 1981-2000. The third Chancellor, His Royal Highness, Justice Ambrose Allagoa, Amayanabo of Nembe (2000-2006). The fourth Chancellor, His Royal Majesty, Benjamin Ikenchuku Keagborekuzi I, the Dein of Agbor Kingdom (2006-2015). The fifth Chancellor, His Royal Highness, Alhaji Abdulmumin Kabir Usman, the Emir of Katsina (2015-). These distinguished traditional rulers have served the University with great devotion and commitment.

The University has been blessed by the high calibre of men who have led its Council. These include: His Royal Highness, the Hon. Mr. Justice Ambrose Allagoa, Mingi XI, *LL.B.*, *B.L.*, *KSG.*, *CON.*, the Amanyanabo of Nembe (1978-1982), Mr. F.O. Ihenacho, *CFR.*, *CMG.*, *M.A.*, *(Cantab.)* (April to December 31, 1983), and Alhaji Hamza R. Zayyad, *M.Sc.* (*Soc. Sc.*), *F.C.A.*, *F.C.C.A*, *A.T.I.I.*, *F.I.B.A.*, *F.I.P.M.* (August, 1984-February, 1986. Others are Prof. T.M Yesufu (1986-1990); Prof, C.O. Taiwo (1990-1993); Alhaji Abdul Gusau (late) (1993-1994), Chief (Dr.) N. E. Nwauwa served as Acting Chairman (November 1994-1997)

following the passing away of the then incumbent Chairman, Alhaji Gusau, Alhaji M.B. Kirfi (1997-1999), General Saliu Ibrahim (retired) (May, 2000-2005), Emeritus Professor Ayo Banjo (May, 2005-October, 2007), Alhaji Tukur Mani (February, 2009-2012). Late Alhaji Saka Sa'adu served as the Acting Chairman (2012-2013), His Royal Highness, Prof. Chukwuka Okonjo, Obi of Okgwaski-Ukwu (2013 – 2017); Dr. Abdullahi Jibril Oyekan, *MFR* (2017- 2021) and then Malam Abidu Rafindadi Yazid, *OON* (2021-2022). These men have demonstrated inspiring leadership, as Pro-Chancellors and Chairmen of Council, in ensuring the rapid development of the University.

Professor O.O. Akinkugbe, after serving as Principal from December, 1975 to September, 1977 became the first Vice-Chancellor in October 1977 and provided sound leadership until October 1978. Through his foresight, tireless efforts and effective pioneering zeal, the University made a very good start. Professor Akin O. Adesola, another distinguished Medical Scientist, succeeded Professor Akinkugbe as the second substantive Vice-Chancellor in October, 1978 and continued to build solidly on the firm foundation laid by his predecessor until he was appointed the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Lagos in April, 1981. Professor A.F. Ogunsola, a renowned educationist took over and served as Acting Vice-Chancellor from April, 1981 to 5th November, 1981, while Professor S. Afolabi Toye, (late) a distinguished scholar, seasoned and dynamic administrator, was appointed as the third substantive Vice-Chancellor of the University. He headed the University from November 9, 1981 to November 8, 1985. The mantle of leadership was taken over from him by Professor Adeove Adenivi, M.D. (Lond.) B.S., D.C.H. (Lond.), F.M.C. (Paed.), an eminent Medical Scientist. He was in office from November 9, 1985 to November 1992.


The baton was thereafter passed to Professor J.O. Oyinloye, a Physicist, in November 1992. His tenure expired in August 1997. Professor Shuaibu Oba AbdulRaheem, a Professor of Literature-in-English, assumed office in August 1997 and was in office till August 2002. Professor M.O. Fawole served as Ag. Vice-Chancellor from September 2002 to October 9, 2002 before Professor Shamsudeen O. O. Amali, a Professor of Theatre Arts took over the mantle of leadership. He served from October 2002 to October 2007. Professor Is-haq O. Oloyede, a Professor of Islamic Studies and the first University of Ilorin Alumnus to become a Vice-Chancellor served from October, 2007 to October, 2012. Professor AbdulGaniyu Ambali, a Professor of Veterinary Medicine

served from October, 2012 to 2017. The tenth substantive Vice Chancellor, Professor S.A. Abdulkareem, an international scholar of Chemical Engineering, assumed office in October, 2017.

Mr. Olu Daramola (Late), B.A. (Lond.), M.A.(Columbia), the foundation Registrar retired on 31st October, 1985 after nine years of meritorious service. Mr. A. O. A. Alao, B.A. PGCE (ABU, Zaria), M.A. (London), an educationist and seasoned administrator from the Kwara State Civil Service, took over on 1st November, 1985 as the Registrar, and held the post till December 1997. Mr. M. T. Balogun, B.Sc. (ABU, Zaria), H.E.A.P. (Manchester), came into office on 2nd January, 1998 and retired in 2002. Mrs. M. O. Ololade served as the acting Registrar from 2002 to May 2003. Mrs. O. O. Oyeyemi, B.A. (Ibadan), M.Sc. (Surrey), served as Registrar from May 2003 to 2013. Mr. E.D. Obafemi served as Registrar between 2013 and 2018 while the incumbent Registrar, Dr. Folaranmi M. Olowoleni, assumed office in 2018.

In October 1985, the University celebrated its 10thAnniversary. One of the highlights of the celebration was the launching of a N20 million Endowment Fund to supplement Government's dwindling subvention. In 2000, the University celebrated its 25th Anniversary and in 2015 commemorated its 40th year of existence. Activities lined up for the anniversary includes the 31st Convocation ceremony and the launch of a book titled "University of Ilorin at 40: The Soaring Eagle".

The University has gone a long way in its contributions to the human and material development of our country through its products who are working in various areas of the public and private sectors of the country. The University has continued to wax stronger, maturing into a reputable citadel of higher learning and ranking among the very best universities in Africa.

University of Ilorin Statute No. 1

UNIVERSITY OF ILORIN ACT 1979 No. 81

An Act to provide for the establishment and incorporation of the University of Ilorin and make comprehensive provisions for its due administration.

Commencement: [28th September, 1979]

Constitution and Functions of the University and its Constituent Bodies, etc.

1. Incorporation and Objects of the University of Ilorin

- (1) There is hereby established a University to be known as the University of Ilorin (in this Act referred to as "the University"), which shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession and a common seal.
- (2) The University may sue or be sued in its corporate name.
- (3) The objects of the University shall be-
 - (a) to encourage the advancement of learning and to hold out to all persons without distinction of race, creed, sex or political conviction the opportunity of acquiring a higher and liberal education;
 - (b) to provide courses of instruction and other facilities for the pursuit of learning in all its branches, and to make those facilities available on proper terms to such persons as are equipped to benefit from them;
 - (c) to encourage and promote scholarship and conduct research in all fields of learning and human endeavour;
 - (d) to relate its activities to the social, cultural and economic needs of the people of Nigeria; and
 - (e) to undertake any other activities, appropriate for a university of the highest standard.

2. Constitution and Principal Officers of the University

- (1) The University shall consist of:
 - (a) a Chancellor;
 - (b) a Pro-Chancellor and a Council;
 - (c) a Vice-Chancellor and a Senate;
 - (d) a body to be called Congregation;
 - (e) a body to be called Convocation;
 - (f) the Campuses and Colleges of the University;
 - (g) the Faculties, Schools, Institutes and other Teaching and Research Units of the University;
 - (h) the persons holding the offices constituted by the First Schedule to this Act other than those mentioned in paragraphs (a) to (c) of this subsection:

[First Schedule.]

- (i) all graduates and undergraduates; and
- (j) all other persons who are members of the University in accordance with provision made by statute in that behalf.
- (2) The First Schedule to this Act shall have effect with respect to the Principal Officers of the University therein mentioned.

[First Schedule.]

(3) Subject to section 5, provision shall be made by statute with respect to the constitution of the following bodies, namely the Council, the Senate, Congregation and Convocation.

3. Power of the University and their Exercise

- (1) For the carrying out of its objects as specified in section 1 of this Act, the University shall have power:
 - (a) to establish such campuses, colleges, faculties, institutes, schools, extra-mural departments and other teaching and research units within the University as may from time to time seem necessary or desirable subject to the approval of the National Universities Commission;
 - (b) to institute Professorships, Readerships, Lecturerships and other posts and offices and to make appointments thereto;
 - (c) to institute and award fellowships, scholarships, exhibitions, bursaries, medals, prizes and other titles, distinctions, awards and forms of assistance;
 - (d) to provide for the discipline and welfare of members of the University;
 - (e) to hold examinations and grant degrees, diplomas, certificates and other distinctions to persons who have pursued a course of

- study approved by the University and have satisfied such other requirements as the University may lay down;
- (f) to grant honorary degrees, fellowships or academic titles;
- (g) to demand and receive from any student or any other person attending the University for the purpose of instruction such fees as the University may from time to time determine subject to the overall directives of the Minister;
- (h) subject to section 20 of this Act, to acquire, hold, grant, charge or otherwise deal with or dispose of movable and immovable property wherever situate;
- (i) to accept gifts, legacies and donations, but without obligation to accept the same for a particular purpose unless it approves the terms and conditions attaching thereto;
- (j) to enter into contracts, establish trusts, act as trustee, solely or jointly with any other person, and employ and act through agents;
- (k) to erect, provide, equip and maintain libraries, laboratories, lecture halls, halls of residence, refectories, sports grounds, playing fields and other buildings or things necessary or suitable or convenient for any of the objects of the University;
- (l) to hold public lectures and to undertake printing, publishing and book selling;
- (m) subject to any limitations or conditions imposed by statute, to invest any moneys appertaining to the University by way of endowment, whether for general or special purposes, and such other moneys as may not be immediately required for current expenditure, in any investments or securities or in the purchase or improvement of land, with power from time to time to vary any such investments, and to deposit any moneys for the time being uninvested with any bank on deposit or current account;
- (n) to borrow, whether on interest or not, and if need be, upon the security of any or all of the property movable or immovable of the University, such moneys as the Council may from time to time in its discretion find necessary or expedient to borrow or to guarantee any loan, advances or credit facilities;
- (o) to make gifts for any charitable purpose;
- (p) to arrange for the general welfare of children of members of staff;
- (q) to do anything, which it is authorised or required by this Act or by statute to do; and
- (r) to do all such acts or things, whether or not incidental to the

foregoing powers, as may advance the objects of the University.

- (1) Subject to the provisions of this Act and of the statutes and without prejudice to Section 8 (2) of this Act, the powers conferred on the University by subsection (1) this section shall be exercisable on behalf of the University by the Council or by the Senate or in any other manner, which may be authorised by Statute.
- (2) The power of the University to establish further campuses and colleges within the University shall be exercisable by Statute and not otherwise.

4. Functions of the Chancellor and Pro-Chancellor

- (1) The Chancellor shall in relation to the University, take precedence before all other members of the University, and when he is present shall preside at all meetings of Convocation held for conferring degrees.
- (2) The Pro-Chancellor shall, in relation to the University, take precedence before all other members of the University, except the Chancellor and except the Vice-Chancellor, when acting as Chairman of Congregation or Convocation and the Pro-Chancellor shall, when he is present, be the Chairman at all meetings of the Council.

5. Composition of the Council

- (1) There shall be a Council for each of the Universities of the Council consisting of
 - i. the Pro-Chancellor;
 - ii. the Vice-Chancellor;
 - iii. the Deputy Vice-Chancellors;
 - iv. one person from the Federal Ministry responsible for Education;
 - v. four persons representing a variety of interest and broadly representative of the whole Federation to be appointed by the National Council of Ministers;
 - vi. four persons appointed by the Senate from among its members;
 - vii. two persons appointed by the Congregation from among its members; and
 - viii. one person appointed by Convocation from among its members

(2) Persons to be appointed to the Council shall be of proven integrity, knowledgeable and familiar with the affairs and tradition of the University.

Tenure of Council

2A. The Council so constituted shall have tenure of four years from the date of its inauguration provided that where a Council is found to be incompetent and corrupt, it shall be dissolved by the Visitor and a new Council shall be immediately constituted for the effective functioning of the University.

Powers of the Council

2AA. The powers of the Council shall be exercised, as in the Law and Statutes of each University and to that extent establishment circulars that are inconsistent with the Laws and Statutes of the University shall not apply to the Universities.

Independence of the Council in Exercise of its Functions

- 2AAA. (1) The Governing Council of a university shall be free in the discharge of its functions and exercise of its responsibilities for the good management, growth and development of the University.
 - (2) The Council of a university in the discharge of its functions shall ensure that disbursement of funds of the University complies with the approved budgetary ratio for:
 - (a) Personnel cost
 - (b) Overhead cost
 - (c) Research and development
 - (d) Library developments
 - (e) The balance in expenditure between academic vis-a-vis non-academic activities."

[Inserted by Universities (Miscellaneous Provisions) (Amendment) Act 2003]

6. Functions of the Council and its Finance and General Purposes Committee

(1) Subject to the provisions of this Act relating to the Visitor, the Council shall be the governing body of the University and shall be charged with the general control and superintendence of the policy, finances and property of the University, including its public relations.

- (2) There shall be a committee of the Council, to be known as the Finance and General Purpose Committee, which shall, subject to the directions of the Council, exercise control over the property and expenditure of the University and perform such other functions of the Council as the Council may from time to time delegate to it.
- (3) Provision shall be made by statute with respect to the constitution of the Finance and General Purposes Committee.
- (4) The Council shall ensure that proper accounts of the University are kept and that the accounts of the University are audited annually by Auditors appointed by the Council from the list and in accordance with guidelines supplied by the Auditor-General for the Federation; and that an annual report is published by the University together with certified copies of the said accounts as audited.
- (5) Subject to this Act and the Statutes, the Council and the Finance and General Purposes Committee may each make rules for the purpose of exercising any of their respective functions or of regulating their own procedure.
- (6) Rules made under subsection (5) of this section by the Finance and General Purposes Committee shall not come into force unless approved by the Council; and in so far and to the extent that any rules so made by that committee conflict with any directions given by the Council (whether before or after the coming into force of the rules in question), the directions of the Council shall prevail.
- (7) There shall be paid to the members respectively of the Council, of the Finance and General Purposes Committee and of any other committee set up by the Council allowances in respect of travelling and other reasonable expenses, at such rates as may from time to time be fixed by the Council.
- (8) The Council shall meet as and when necessary for the performance of its functions under this Decree and shall meet at least three times in every year.
- (9) If requested in writing by any five members of the Council, the Chairman shall within twenty-eight days after the receipt of such request call a meeting of the Council. The request shall specify the business to be considered at the meeting and no business not so specified shall be transacted at the meeting.

7. Functions of the Senate

(1) Subject to section 6 of this Act and subsections (3) and (4) of this section, and to the provisions of this Act relating to the Visitor, it shall be the general function of the Senate to organise and control

- the teaching of the University, the admission (where no other enactment provides to the contrary) of students and the discipline of students, and to promote research at the University.
- (2) Without prejudice to the generality of subsection (1) of this section and subject as there mentioned, it shall in particular be the function of the Senate to make provision for:
 - the establishment, organisation and control of Campuses, Colleges, Faculties, Departments, Schools, Institutes and other teaching and research units of the University, and the allocation of responsibility for different branches of learning;
 - ii. the organisation and control of courses of study at the University and of the examinations held in conjunction with those courses, including the appointment of examiners, both internal and external;
 - iii. the award of degrees, and such other qualifications as may be prescribed in connection with examinations held as aforesaid;
 - iv. the making of recommendations to the Council with respect to the award to any person of an Honorary Fellowship or Honorary Degree or the title of Professor Emeritus;
 - v. the establishment, organisation and control of halls of residence and similar institutions at the University;
 - vi. the supervision of the welfare of students at the University and the regulation of their conduct;
 - vii. the granting of fellowships, scholarships, prizes and similar awards in so far as the
 - viii. awards are within the control of the University; and
 - ix. determining what descriptions of dress shall be academic dress for the purposes of the University, and regulating the use of academic dress.
- (3) The Senate shall not establish any new Campus, College, Faculty, Department, School, Institute or other teaching and research units of the University, or any hall of residence or similar institution at the University, without the approval of the Council.
- (4) Subject to this Act and the Statutes, the Senate may make regulations for the purpose of exercising any function conferred on it either by the foregoing provisions of this section or otherwise or for the purpose of making provision for any matter for which provision by regulations is authorised or required by this Act or by Statute.
- (5) Regulations shall provide that at least one of the persons appointed as the examiners at each final or professional examination held in

- conjunction with any course of study at the University is not a teacher at the University but is a teacher of the branch of learning to which the course relates at some other University of high repute.
- (6) Subject to a right of appeal to the Council from a decision of the Senate under this subsection, the Senate may deprive any person of any Degree, Diploma or other Award of University which has been conferred upon him if after due enquiry he is shown to have been guilty of dishonourable or scandalous conduct in gaining admission into the University or obtaining that Award.

8. Functions of the Vice-Chancellor

- (1) The Vice-Chancellor shall, in relation to the University, take precedence before all other members of the University except the Chancellor and, subject to section 4 of this Act, except the Pro-Chancellor and any other person for the time being acting as Chairman of the Council.
- (2) Subject to sections 5, 6 and 13 of this Act, the Vice-Chancellor shall have the general function, in addition to any other functions conferred on him by this Act or otherwise, of directing the activities of the University, and shall to the exclusion of any other person or authority be the Chief Executive and Academic Officer of the University and ex-officio Chairman of the Senate.

Transfer of property, etc., to the University

9. Transfer of Property, Functions, etc.

- (1) All property held by or on behalf of the Provisional Council shall, by virtue of this subsection and without further assurance, vest in the University and be held by it for the purposes of the University.
- (2) the provisions of Second Schedule to this Act shall have effect with respect to, and to matters arising from, the transfer of property by this section and with respect to the other matters mentioned in that Schedule. [Second Schedule]

Statutes of the University

10. Power of University to make Statutes

- (1) Subject to this Decree, the University may make Statutes for any of the following purposes, this is to say-
 - (a) making provision with respect to the composition and constitution of any authority of the University;
 - (b) specifying and regulating the powers and duties of any

- authority of the University, and regulating any other matter connected with the University or any of its authorities;
- (c) regulating the admission of students where it is done by the University, and their discipline and welfare;
- (d) determining whether any particular matter is to be treated as an academic or a non-academic matter for the purposes of this Decree and of any statute, regulation or other instrument made thereunder; or
- (e) making provision for any other matter for which provision by statute is authorised or required by this Act.
- (2) Subject to section 25(6) of this Act, the Interpretation Act shall apply in relation to any Statute made under this section as it applies to a subsidiary instrument within the meaning of section 27 (1) of that Act. [Cap 123.]
- (3) The Statute contained in Third Schedule to this Act shall be deemed to have come into force on the commencement of this Act and shall be deemed to have been made under this section. [Third Schedule]
- (4) The power to make Statutes conferred by this section shall not be prejudiced or limited in any way by reason of the inclusion or omission of any matter in or from the Statute contained in Third Schedule to this Act or any subsequent Statute.

11. Mode of Exercising Power to make Statute

- (1) The power of the University to make Statutes shall be exercised in accordance with the provisions of this section and not otherwise.
- (2) A proposed Statute shall not become law unless it has been approved:
 - (a) at a meeting of the Senate, by the votes of not less than twothirds of the members present and voting; and
 - (b) at a meeting of the Council, by the votes of not less than twothirds of the members present and voting.
- (3) A proposed Statute may originate either in the Senate or in the Council, and may be approved as required by subsection (2) above by either one of those bodies before the other.
- (4) A Statute which:
 - (a) makes provision for or alters the composition or construction of the Council, the Senate or any other authority of the University; or
 - (b) provides for the establishment of a new Campus or College or for the amendment or revocation of any Statute whereby a Campus or College is established, shall not come into operation

unless it has been approved by the Federal Executive Council.

(5) For the purposes of Section 2(2) of the Interpretation Act, a Statute shall be treated as being made on the date on which it is duly approved by the Council after having been duly approved by the Senate, or on the date on which it is duly approved by the Senate after having been duly approved by the Council, as the case may be or, in the case of a Statute falling within subsection (4) of this section, on the date on which it is approved by the President.

12. Proof of Statutes

A Statute may be proved in any Court by the production of a copy thereof bearing or having affixed to it a certificate purporting to be signed by the Vice-Chancellor or the Registrar to the effect that the copy is a true copy of a Statute of the University.

13. Power of Visitor to decide Meaning of Statutes

- (1) In the event of any doubt or dispute arising at any time as to the meaning of any provision of a Statute, the matter may be referred to the Visitor, who shall take such advice and make such decision thereon as he shall think fit.
- (2) The decision of the Visitor on any matter referred; to him under this section shall be binding upon the authorities, staff and students of the University, and where any question as to the meaning of any provision of a Statute has been decided by the Visitor under this section, no question as to the meaning of that provision shall be entertained by any Court of law in Nigeria: Provided that nothing in this subsection shall affect any power of a court of competent jurisdiction to determine whether any provision of a Statute is wholly or partly void as being ultra vires or as being inconsistent with the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria 1999. [Cap. C23]
- (3) Subsections (1) and (2) of this section shall apply in relation to any doubt or dispute as to whether any matter is for the purposes of this Act an academic or a non-academic matter as they apply in relation to any such doubt or dispute as is mentioned in subsection (1) of this section; and accordingly, the references in subsection (2) of this section to any question as to the meaning of any provision of a statute shall include references to any question as to whether any matter is for the said purposes an academic or a non-academic matter.

— UNIVERSITY OF ILORIN CONDITIONS OF SERVICE —

Supervision and Discipline

14. The Visitor and Visitation

- "7AA (1) There shall be a Visitor for each of the Universities.
 - (2) The Visitor shall cause a visitation to each University, when necessary, at least every five years.
 - (3) The Visitor shall make the report of such visitations and White Paper thereon available to the Council which shall implement same."

[Enacted by Universities (Miscellaneous Provisions) (Amendment) Act 2003]

- (4) It shall be the duty of the bodies and persons comprising the University:
 - (a) to make available to the Visitor, and to any other persons conducting a visitation in pursuance of this section, such facilities and assistance as he or they may reasonably require for the purposes of a visitation; and
 - (b) to give effect to any instructions consistent with the provisions of this Act which may be given by the Visitor in consequence of a visitation.

15. Removal of certain Members of Council

- (1) If it appears to the Council that a member of the Council (other than the Pro-Chancellor or the Vice-Chancellor) should be removed from office on the ground of misconduct or inability to perform the functions of his office or employment, the Council shall make a recommendation to that effect through the Commissioner to the Federal Executive Council and if the Federal Executive Council, after making such enquiries (if any) as may be considered appropriate, approves the recommendation it may direct the removal of the person in question from office.
- (2) It shall be the duty of the Minister to use his best endeavours to cause a copy of the instrument embodying a direction under subsection (1) of this section, to be served as soon as reasonably practicable on the person to whom it relates.

16. Removal of, and Discipline Academic, Administrative and Professional Staff

(1) If it appears to the Council that there are reasons for believing that any person employed as a member of the academic or administrative or professional staff of the University, other than the ViceChancellor, should be removed from his office or employment on the ground of misconduct or of inability to perform the functions of his office or employment, the Council shall:

- (a) give notice of those reasons to the person in question;
- (b) afford him an opportunity of making representations in person on the matter to the Council; and
- (c) if he or any three members of the Council so request within the period of one month beginning with the date of the notice, make arrangements-
 - for a joint Committee of the council and the Senate to investigate the matter and to report on it to the Council;
 and
 - ii. for the person in question to be afforded an opportunity of appearing before and being heard by the investigating Committee with respect to the matter; and
 - iii. if the Council, after considering the report of the investigating Committee, is satisfied that the person in question should be removed as aforesaid, the Council may so remove him by an instrument in writing signed on the directions of the Council.
- (2) The Vice-Chancellor may, in a case of misconduct by a member of the staff which in the opinion of the Vice-Chancellor is prejudicial to the interest of the University, suspend such member and any such suspension shall forthwith be reported to the Council.
- (3) For good cause, any member of staff may be suspended from his duties or his appointment may be terminated by Council; and for the purposes of this subsection "good cause" means-
 - (a) conviction for any offence which the Council considers to be such as to render the person concerned unfit for the discharge of the functions of his office; or
 - (b) any physical or mental incapacity which the Council, after obtaining medical advice, considers to be such as to render the person concerned unfit to continue to hold his office; or
 - (c) conduct of a scandalous or other disgraceful nature which the Council considers to be such as to render the person concerned unfit to continue to hold his office; or
 - (d) conduct which the Council considers to be such as to constitute failure or inability of the person concerned to discharge the functions of his office or to comply with the terms and conditions of his service.
- (4) Any person suspended pursuant to subsection (2) or (3) of this

section, shall be on half pay and the Council shall before the expiration of a period of three months after the date of such suspension consider the case against that person and come to a decision as to:

- (a) whether to continue such person's suspension and if so on what terms (including the proportion of his emoluments to be paid to him);
- (b) whether to reinstate such person in which case the Council shall restore his full emoluments to him with effect from the date of suspension;
- (c) whether to terminate the appointment of the person concerned in which case such a person will not be entitled to the proportion of his emoluments withheld during the period of suspension; or
- (d) whether to take such lesser disciplinary action against such person (including the restoration of such proportion of his emoluments that might have been withheld) as the Council may determine; and in any case where the Council, pursuant to this section, decides to continue a person's suspension or decides to take further disciplinary action against a person, the Council shall before the expiration of a period of three months from such decision come to a final determination in respect of the case concerning any such person.
- (5) It shall be the duty of the person by whom an instrument of removal is signed in pursuance of subsection (1) above to use his best endeavours to cause a copy of the instrument to be served as soon as reasonably practicable on the person to whom it relates.
- (6) Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this section shall prevent the Council from making regulations for the discipline of other categories of staff and workers of the University as may be prescribed.

17. Removal of Examiners

(1) If, on the recommendation of the Senate, it appears to the Vice-Chancellor that a person appointed as an examiner for any examination of the University ought to be removed from his office or appointment, then, except in such cases as may be prescribed, he may after affording the examiner an opportunity of making representations in person on the matter to the Vice-Chancellor, remove the examiner from the appointment by an instrument in writing signed by the Vice-Chancellor and, subject to the provisions

- of regulations made in pursuance of section 7(5) of this Act, the Vice-Chancellor may, on the recommendation of the Senate, appoint an appropriate person as examiner in the place of the examiner removed in pursuance of this subsection.
- (2) It shall be the duty of the Vice-Chancellor, on signing an instrument of removal in pursuance of this section, to use his best endeavours to cause a copy of the instrument to be served as soon as reasonably practicable on the person to whom it relates.

18. Discipline of Students

- (1) Subject to the provisions of this section, where it appears to the Vice-Chancellor that any student of the University has been guilty of misconduct, the Vice-Chancellor may, without prejudice to any other disciplinary powers conferred on him by statute or regulations, direct-
 - (a) that the student shall not, during such period as may be specified in the direction, participate in such activities of the University, or make use of such facilities of the University, as may be so specified; or
 - (b) that the activities of the student shall, during such period as may be specified in the direction, be restricted in such manner as may be so specified; or
 - (c) that the student be rusticated for such period as may be specified in the direction; or
 - (d) that the student be expelled from the University.
- (2) Where a direction is given under subsection (1) (c) or (d) above in respect of any student, the student may, within the prescribed period and in the prescribed manner, appeal from the direction to the Council; and where such an appeal is brought, the Council shall, after causing such inquiry to be made in the matter as the Council considers just, either confirm or set aside the direction or modify it in such manner as the Council thinks fit.
- (3) The fact that an appeal from a direction is brought in pursuance of the last foregoing subsection shall not after the question of the direction while the appeal is pending.
- (4) The Vice-Chancellor may delegate his power under this section to a disciplinary board consisting of such members of the University as he may nominate.
- (5) Nothing in this section shall be construed as preventing the restriction or termination of a student's activities at the University otherwise than on the ground of misconduct.

(6) It is hereby declared that a direction under subsection (1) (a) above may be combined with a direction under subsection (1) (b) of this section

Miscellaneous and General

19. Exclusion of Discrimination on Account of Race, Religion, etc.

No person shall be required to satisfy requirements as to any of the following matters, that is to say, race (including ethnic grouping), sex, place of birth or of family origin, or religious or political persuasion, as a condition of becoming or continuing to be a student at the University, the holder of any degree of the University or of any appointment or employment at the University, or a member of anybody established by virtue of this Act; and no person shall be subjected to any disadvantage or accorded any advantage in relation of the University, by reference to any of those matters:

Provided that nothing in this section shall be construed as preventing the University from imposing any disability or restriction on any of the aforementioned persons where such person wilfully refuses or fails on grounds of religious belief to undertake any duty generally and uniformly imposed on all such persons or any group of them which duty, having regard to its nature and the special circumstances pertaining thereto, is in the opinion of the University reasonably justifiable in the national interest.

20. Restriction on Disposal of Land by University

Without prejudice to the provisions of the Land Use Decree 1978, the University shall not dispose of or charge any land or an interest in any land (including any land transferred to the University by this Act) except with the prior written consent, either general or special of the President:

[Cap.L5]

Provided that such consent shall not be required in the case of any lease or tenancy at a rackrent for a term not exceeding 21 years or any lease or tenancy to a member of the University for residential purposes.

21. Quorum and Procedure of Bodies Established by this Act

Except as may be otherwise provided by statute or by regulations, the quorum and procedure of any body of persons established by this Act shall be such as may be determined by that body.

22. Appointment of Committees, etc.

- (1) Anybody of persons established by this Act shall, without prejudice the generality of the powers of that body, have power to appoint committees, which need not consist exclusively of members of that body, and to authorise a committee established by it:
 - (a) to exercise, on its behalf, such of its functions as it may determine;
 - (b) to co-opt members, and may direct whether or not co-opted members (if any) shall be entitled to vote in that committee.
- (2) Any two or more such bodies may arrange for the holding of joint meetings of those bodies, or for the appointment of committees consisting of members of those bodies, for the purpose of considering any matter within the competence of those bodies or any of them, either of dealing with it or of reporting on it to those bodies or any of them.
- (3) Except as may be otherwise provided by statute or by regulations, the quorum and procedure of a committee established or meeting held in pursuance of this section shall be such as may be determined by the body or bodies which have decided to establish the committee or hold the meeting.
- (4) Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this section shall be construed as-
 - (a) enabling statutes to be made otherwise than in accordance with section 10 of this Act; or
 - (b) enabling the Senate to empower any other body to make regulations or to award degrees or other qualifications.
- (5) The Pro-Chancellor and the Vice-Chancellor shall be members of every committee of which the members are wholly or partly appointed by the Council (other than a committee appointed to inquire into the conduct of the officer in question); and the Vice-Chancellor shall be a member of every committee of which the members are wholly or partly appointed by the Senate. [1993 No. 11.]

23. Retiring Age of Academic Staff of the University

- (1) As from the commencement of this Act, the compulsory retiring age for-
 - (a) academic staff in the Professorial cadre is 70 years; and
 - (b) non-Academic staff is 65 years".

[Inserted by Universities (Miscellaneous Provisions) (Amendment) Act, 2012)]

(2) A law or rule requiring a person to retire from the public service after serving for 35 years, shall not apply to an academic staff of the University.

24. Special Provisions relating to Pension of Professors

A person who retires as a professor having served-

- (a) A minimum period of fifteen years as a professor in the University or continuously in the service of a University in Nigeria up to the retiring age; and
- (b) who during the period of service was absent from the University only on approved national or University assignments, shall be entitled to pension at a rate equivalent to his last annual salary and such allowances, as the Council may, from time to time, determine as qualifying for pension and gratuity, in addition to any other retirement benefits to which he may be entitled.

25. Miscellaneous Administrative Provisions

- (1) The seal of the University shall be such as may be determined by the Council and approved by the Chancellor; and the affixing of the seal shall be authenticated by any member of the Council and by the Vice-Chancellor, Registrar or any other person authorised by statute.
- (2) Any document purporting to be a document executed under the seal of the University shall be received in evidence and shall, unless the contrary is proved, be deemed to be so executed.
- (3) Any contract or instrument which, if made or executed by a person not being a body corporate, would not be required to be under seal may be made or executed on behalf of the University by any person generally or specially authorised to do so by the Council.
- (4) The validity of any proceedings of anybody established in pursuance of this Act shall not be affected by any vacancy in the membership of the body, or by any defect in the appointment of a member of the body or by reason that any person not entitled to do so took part in the proceedings.
- (5) Any member of any such body who has personal interest in any matter proposed to be considered by that body shall forthwith

- disclose his interest to the body and shall not vote on any question relating to that matter.
- (6) Nothing in section 12 of the Interpretation Act (which provides for the application, in relation to subordinate legislation, of certain incidental provisions) shall apply to statutes or regulations made in pursuance of this Act; but the power conferred by this Act to make statutes or regulations shall include power to revoke or vary any statute (including the Statute contained in Schedule 3 of this Act) or any regulation by a subsequent statute or, as the case may be, by a subsequent regulation, and statute and regulations may make different provision in relation to different circumstances.

- (7) No stamp or other duty shall be payable in respect of any transfer of property to the University by virtue of section 9, section 20 or the Second Schedule to this Act. [Second Schedule]
- (8) Any notice or other instrument authorised to be served by virtue of this Decree may, without prejudice to any other mode of service, be served by post.

26. Interpretation

- (1) In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires-
 - "Campus" means any Campus which may be established by the University;
 - "College" means any College which may be established by the University;
 - "Council" means the Council established by this Act for the University;
 - "graduate" means a person on whom a degree (other than an honorary degree) has been conferred by the University;
 - "notice" means notice in writing;
 - "Minister" means the Minister charged with responsibility for higher education;
 - "officer" does not include the Visitor;
 - "prescribed" means prescribed by statute or regulations;
 - "**professor**" means person designated as a professor of the University in accordance with provision made in that behalf by statute or by regulations;
 - "property" includes rights, liabilities and obligations;
 - "Provisional Council" means the Provisional Council appointed for the University by the President with effect from 5th April 1978;

- "regulations" means regulations made by the senate;
- "Senate" means the Senate of the University established pursuant to section 2(1) (c) of this Act;
- "Statute" means a statute made by the University under section 9 of this Act and in accordance with the provisions of section 10 of this Act, and "the Statutes" means all such statutes as are in force from time to time;
- "**teacher**" means a person holding a full-time appointment as a member of the teaching or research staff of the University;
- "undergraduate" means a person in statu pupillari at the University other than-
 - (a) a graduate; and
 - (b) a person of such description as may be prescribed for the purposes of this definition;
- "University" means the University of Ilorin as incorporated and constituted by this Act.
- (2) It is hereby declared that where in any provision of this Act is laid down that proposals are to be submitted or a recommendation is to be made by one authority to another through one or more intermediate authorities, it shall be the duty of every such intermediate authority to forward any proposals or recommendations received by it in pursuance of that provision to the appropriate authority; but any such intermediate authority may, if it thinks fit, forward therewith its own comments thereon.

27. Short Title

This Act may be cited as the University of Ilorin Act.

SCHEDULES

FIRST SCHEDULE

[SECTION 2 (2)]

Principal Officers of the University

The Chancellor

- 1. The Chancellor shall be appointed by the President.
- 2. (1) The Chancellor shall hold office for a period of five years.
 - (2) If it appears to the Visitor that the Chancellor should be removed from his office on the ground of misconduct of inability to perform the functions of his office, the Visitor may by notice in the Federal Gazette remove the Chancellor from office.

The Pro-Chancellor

- **3.** (1) The Pro-Chancellor shall be appointed or removed by the Federal Executive Council on the recommendation of the Commissioner.
 - (2) Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Pro-Chancellor shall hold office for a period of four years beginning with the date of his appointment.

The Vice-Chancellor

4. (1) There shall be a Vice-Chancellor of a University (in this Act referred to as "the Vice-Chancellor") who shall be appointed by the Governing Council in accordance with the provisions of this section.

[As amended by Universities (Miscellaneous Provisions) (Amendment) Act, 2003]

- "(2) Where a vacancy occurs in the post of a Vice-chancellor, the Council shall -
 - (a) Advertise the vacancy in a reputable journal or a widely read newspaper in Nigeria, specifying
 - i. The qualities of the persons who may apply for the post, and
 - ii. The terms and conditions of service applicable to the post, and thereafter draw up a short list of suitable candidates for the post for consideration.
 - (b) Constitute a Search Team consisting of-

A member of the Council, who is not a member of the Senate, as Chairman:

- Two members of the Senate who are not members of the Council, one of whom shall be a professor;
- ii. Two members of Congregation who are not members of the Council,
- iii. one of whom shall be a professor, to identify and nominate for consideration, suitable persons who are not likely to apply for the post on their own volition because they feel that it is not proper to do so.
- (3) A Joint Council and Senate Selection Board consisting of -
 - (a) The Pro-Chancellor, as Chairman;
 - (b) Two members of the Council, not being members of the Senate;
 - (c) Two members of the Senate who are professors, but who were not members of the Search Team, shall consider the candidates and persons on the short list drawn up under subsection (2) of this section through an examination of their curriculum vitae and interaction with them, and recommend to the Council suitable candidates for further consideration".

"(4) The Council shall select and appoint as the Vice-Chancellor one candidate from among the three candidates recommended to it under subsection (3) of this section and thereafter inform the Visitor".

- "(5) The President may appoint as Vice-Chancellor, any one of the candidates recommended to him in accordance with the provisions of subsection (4) of this section".
- "(6) The Vice-Chancellor shall hold office for a single term of five years only on such terms and conditions as may be specified in his letter of appointment".
- "(7) For the avoidance of doubt the provisions of subsection (6) of this section shall -
 - (a) Only be applicable to those appointed to the office of Vice-Chancellor after the commencement of this Act;

(b) Not confer on a person serving a first term of office as Vice-Chancellor before the commencement of this Act, any right to renewal of the appointment for a further term of four years"

- "(8) The Vice-Chancellor may be removed from office by the Governing Council on grounds of gross misconduct or inability to discharge the functions of his office as a result of infirmity of the body or mind, at the initiative of the Council, Senate or the Congregation after due process.
- "(9) When the proposal for the removal of the Vice-Chancellor is made, the Council shall constitute a joint committee of Council and Senate consisting of:
 - (i) Three members of the Council one of whom shall be the Chairman of the committee, a
 - (ii) Two members of the Senate, provided that where the ground for removal is infirmity of the body or mind, the Council shall seek appropriate medical opinion".
- "(10) The Committee shall conduct investigation into the allegations made against the Vice-Chancellor and shall report its findings to the Council".
- "(11) The Council may where the allegations are proved remove the Vice-Chancellor or apply any other disciplinary action it may deem fit and notify the Visitor accordingly provided that a Vice-Chancellor who is removed shall have right of appeal to the Visitor".
- "(12) There shall be no sole administration in any Nigerian University."
- "(13) In any case of a vacancy in the office of the Vice-Chancellor, the Council shall appoint an acting Vice-Chancellor on recommendation of the Senate."
- "(14) An acting Vice-Chancellor in all circumstances shall not be in office for more than 6 months".

Deputy Vice-Chancellors

5. "(1) There shall be for each University such number of Deputy Vice-Chancellors as the Council may, from time to time, deem necessary for the proper administration of the University.

- (2) Where a vacancy occurs in the post of Deputy Vice-Chancellor, the Vice-Chancellor shall forward to the Senate a list of two candidates for each post of Deputy Vice-Chancellor that is vacant.
- (3) The Senate shall select for each vacant post one candidate from each list forwarded to it under subsection (2) of this section and forward his name to the Council for confirmation.
- (4) The Deputy Vice-Chancellor shall-
 - (a) Assist the Vice-Chancellor in the performance of his functions;
 - (b) Act in the place of the Vice-Chancellor when the post of the Vice-Chancellor is vacant or if the Vice-Chancellor is, for any reason, absent or unable to perform his functions as Vice-Chancellor; and
 - (c) Perform such other functions as the Vice-Chancellor or the Council may, from time to time, assign to him.

(5) The Deputy Vice-Chancellor-

- (a) shall hold office for a period of two years beginning from the effective date of his appointment and on such terms and conditions as may be specified in his letter of appointment; and
- (b) May be re-appointed for one further period of two years and no more.

- (6) "A Deputy Vice-Chancellor may be removed from office for good cause by the Council acting on the recommendations of the Vice-Chancellor and Senate;
- (7) Good cause" for the purpose of this section means gross misconduct or inability to discharge the functions of his office arising from infirmity of body or mind".
 [As amended by Universities (Miscellaneous Provisions) (Amendment) Act, 2003]

Office of the Registrar

6. (1) There shall be a Registrar, who shall be the chief administrative officer of the University and shall be responsible to the Vice-Chancellor for the day-to-day administrative work of the University except as regards matters for which the Bursar is responsible in accordance with section 6(2) of this Act.

- (2) The person holding the office of the Registrar shall by virtue of that office be secretary to the Council, the Senate, Congregation and Convocation". [No. 11, 1993]
- "(3) A Registrar shall hold office for a single term of five years only beginning from the effective date of his appointment and on such terms and conditions as may be specified in his letter of appointment; and
- "(4) Notwithstanding Subsection (3) of this Section, the Council may, upon satisfactory performance, extend the tenure of the Registrar for a further period of one year only and thereafter such Registrar shall relinquish his post and be assigned to other duties in the University."

[Inserted by Universities (Miscellaneous Provisions) (Amendment) Act, 2012)]

Other Principal Officers of the University

- 7. (1) "There shall be for each University the following principal officers, in addition to the Registrar, that is-
 - (a) The Bursar; and
 - (b) The University Librarian, who shall be appointed by the Council on the recommendation of the Selection Board constituted under paragraph 8 of this Schedule.
 - (2) The Bursar shall be the chief financial officer of the University and be responsible to the Vice-Chancellor for the day-to-day administration and control of the financial affairs of the University.
 - (3) The University Librarian shall be responsible to the Vice-Chancellor for the administration of the University Library and the co-ordination of the library services in the University and its campuses, colleges, faculties, schools, departments, institutes and other teaching or research units.

- "(4) A Bursar or Librarian shall hold office for a single term of five years only beginning from the effective date of his appointment and on such terms and conditions as may be specified in his letter of appointment; and
- (5) Notwithstanding Sub-Section (4) of this Section, the Council may, upon satisfactory performance, extend the tenure of the Bursar or

Librarian for a further period of one year only and thereafter such Bursar or Librarian shall relinquish his post and be assigned to other duties in the University".

Selection Board for other Principal Officers

8. (1) There shall be, for the University, a Selection Board for the appointment of principal officers, other than the Vice-Chancellor or Deputy Vice-Chancellor, which shall consist of-

- (a) the Pro-Chancellor, as Chairman;
- (b) the Vice-Chancellor;
- (c) four members of the Council not being members of the Senate; and
- (d) two members of the Senate.
- (2) The functions, procedure and other matters relating to the Selection Board constituted under subparagraph (1) of this paragraph shall be as the Council may, from time to time, determine.

Resignation and Re-appointment

- **9.** (1) Any Officer mentioned in the foregoing provisions of this Schedule may resign his office
 - (a) in the case of the Chancellor, by notice of the President; and
 - (b) in any other case, by notice to the Council and the Council shall immediately notify the Minister in the case of the Vice-Chancellor.
 - (2) Subject to paragraph 4 and 5 of this Schedule, a person who has ceased to hold an office so mentioned otherwise than by removal for misconduct shall be eligible for re-appointment to that office.

SECOND SCHEDULE

Transitional Provisions as to Property, Functions, etc.

Transfer of Property to University

- 1. Without prejudice to the generality of section 9(1) of this Act
 - (a) the reference in that subsection to property held by the Provisional Council shall include a reference to the right to receive and give a good discharge for any grants or contributions which may have been voted or promised to the Provisional Council
 - (b) all debts and liabilities of the provisional council outstanding shall become debts or liabilities of the University.
- **2.** (1) All agreement, contracts, deeds and other instruments to which the Provisional Council was a party shall, so far as possible and subject to any necessary modifications, have effect as if the University had been a party thereto in place of the Provisional Council.
 - (2) Documents not following within sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph, including enactments, which refer whether specially or generally to the Provisional Council, shall be construed in accordance with that sub-paragraph so far as applicable.
 - (3) Any legal proceedings or application to any authority pending by or against the Provisional Council may be continued by or against the University.

Registration of Transfers

3. (1) If the law in force at the place where any property transferred by this Act is situated provides for the registration of transferred of property of the kind in question (whether by reference to an instrument of transfer or otherwise), the law shall so far as it provides for alterations of a register (but not for avoidance of transfers, the payment of fees or any other matter) apply with the necessary modifications to the transfer of the property aforesaid; and it shall be the duty of the body to which any property is transferred by this Decree to furnish the necessary particulars of the transfer to the proper officer of the registration authority, and of that officer to register the transfer accordingly.

Transfer of Functions, etc.

- **4.** (1) The first meeting of the Council shall be convened by the Council shall be convened by the Pro-Chancellor on such date and in such manner as he may determine.
 - (2) The persons who were members of the Provisional Council shall be deemed to constitute the Council until the date when the Council set up under Third Schedule of this Act shall have been duly constituted.
 - (3) The first meeting of the Senate as constituted by this Act shall be convened by the Vice-Chancellor on such date and in such manner as he may determine.
 - (4) The persons who were members of the Senate immediately before the coming into force of this Act shall be deemed to constitute the senate of the University until the date when the date when the Senate as set up under Third Schedule of this Act shall have duly constituted.
 - (5) Subject to any regulations which may be made by the Senate after the date on which this Act is made, the Faculties, Faculty Board and Students of the University immediately before the coming into force of this Act shall on that day become Faculties, Faculty Boards and Students of the University as constituted by this Act.
 - (6) Persons who were Deans or Associate Deans of Faculties or Schools or members of Faculty Boards shall continue to be Deans or Associate Deans or become members of the corresponding Faculty Boards, until new appointments are made in pursuance of the statutes.
- 5. Any person who was a member of the staff of the University as established or was otherwise employed by the provisional Council shall become the holder of an appointment at the University with the status, designation and functions which correspond as may be to those which appertained to him as a member of that staff or as such an employee.

The Council

- **1.** (1) The composition of the Council shall be as provided in section 5 of this Act.
 - (2) Any member of the Council holding office otherwise than in pursuance of section 5 (a), (b), (c) or (d) of this Act may, by notice to the Council, resign his office.
 - (3) A member of Council holding office otherwise than in pursuance of section 5 (a), (b), (c), or (d) of this Act shall, unless he previously vacates it, vacate that office on the expiration of the period of four years beginning with effect from the 1st of August in the year in which he was appointed.
 - (4) Where a member of the Council holding office otherwise than in pursuance of section 5(a), (b), (c), or (d) of this Act vacates office before the expiration of the period aforesaid, the body or person by whom he was appointed may appoint a successor to hold for the residue of the term of his predecessor.
 - (5) A person ceasing to hold office as a member of the Council otherwise than by removal for misconduct shall be eligible for re-appointment for only one further period of four years.

- (6) The quorum of the Council shall be seven at least one of whom shall be a member appointed pursuant to section 5(d), (e) or (h) of this Act.
- (7) If the Pro-Chancellor is not present at a meeting of the Council, such other member of the Council present at the meeting as the Council may appoint as respects that meeting shall be the Chairman at that meeting, and subject to section 4 of the Act and the foregoing provisions of this paragraph, the Council may regulate its own procedure.
- (8) Where the Council desires to obtain advice with respect to any particular matter, it may co-opt not more than two persons for that purpose; and the persons co-opted may take part in the deliberations of the Council at any meeting but shall not be entitled to vote.

The Finance and General Purposes Committee

- **2.** (1) The Finance and General Purposes Committee of the Council shall consist of
 - (a) the Pro-Chancellor, who shall be the chairman of the Committee at any meeting at which he is present;
 - (b) the Vice-Chancellor and Deputy Vice-Chancellor;
 - (c) six members of the Council appointed by the Council, two of whom shall be selected from among the four members of the Council appointed by the senate and one member appointed to Council by the Congregation;
 - (d) The Permanent Secretary, Federal Ministry of Education or, in his absence, such member of his Ministry as he may designate to represent him.
 - (2) the quorum of the Committee shall be five.
 - (3) Subject to any directions given by the Council, the Committee may regulate its own procedure.

The Senate

- 3. (1) The Senate shall consist of-
 - (a) The Vice-Chancellor;
 - (b) The Deputy Vice-Chancellor;
 - (c) All professors of the University;
 - (d) All deans, provosts and directors of academic units of the University,
 - (e) All heads of academic departments, units and research institutes of the University;

- (f) The University Librarian; and
- (g) Academic members of the Congregation who are not professors as specified in the Laws of each University.
- (2) The Senate shall have powers in all academic matters including the organization and control of-
 - (a) Teaching and research;
 - (b) Admission of students;
 - (c) Award of degrees including Honoris Causa, Certificates and Diplomas;
 - (d) Promotion of research; and
 - (e) The exercise of other functions in accordance with the Laws and Statutes of its University".[1993 No. 11,]
- (2) The Vice-Chancellor shall be the Chairman at all meetings of the Senate when he is present; and in his absence such other member of the Senate present at the meeting as the Senate may appoint for that meeting, shall be the Chairman at the meeting.
- (3) The quorum of the Senate shall be one quarter (or the nearest whole number less than one-quarter); and subject to paragraph (2) of this Article, the Senate may regulate its own procedure.
- (4) An elected member may, by notice to the Senate, resign his office.
- (5) Subject to paragraph (7) of this Article, there shall be elections for the selection of elected members, which shall be held in the prescribed manner on such day in the month of May, or June in each year as the Vice-Chancellor may from time to time determine.
- (6) An elected member shall hold office for the period of two years beginning with 1st August in the year of his election, and may be a candidate at any election held in pursuance of paragraph (5) of this Article in the year in which his period of office expires, so however, that no person shall be such a candidate if at the end of his current period of office he will have held office as an elected member for a continuous period of six years or would have so held office if he had not resigned it.
- (7) No election shall be held in pursuance of this article in any year if the number specified in the certificate given in pursuance of paragraph (9) of this Article does not exceed by more than one the figure which is thrice the number of those elected members holding office on the date of the certificate who do not vacate office during that year in pursuance of paragraph (6) of this

Article; but for the avoidance of doubt it is hereby declared that no person shall be precluded from continuing in or taking office as an elected member by reason only of a reduction in the total of non-elected members occurring on or after 30th April in any year in which he is to continue in or take office as an elected member.

- (8) If so requested in writing by any ten members of the Senate, the Vice-Chancellor, or in his absence a person duly appointed by him, shall convene a meeting of the Senate to be held not later than the tenth day following that on which the request was received.
- (9) In this article "total of non-elected members" means, as respects any year, such number as may be certified by the Vice-Chancellor on the 30th April of that year to be the number of persons holding office as members of the Senate on that day otherwise than as elected members.

Congregation

- **4.** (1) Congregation shall consist of-
 - (a) the Vice-Chancellor and the Deputy Vice-Chancellor;
 - (b) the full-time members of the academic staff;
 - (c) the Registrar;
 - (d) the Bursar; and
 - (e) every member of the Administrative Staff who holds a degree of any University recognised for the purposes of this statute by the Vice-Chancellor, not being an honorary degree.
 - (2) Subject to section 4 of the Act, the Vice-Chancellor shall be the Chairman at all meetings of Congregation when he is present; and in his absence such other member of Congregation present at the meeting as Congregation may appoint for that meeting, shall be the chairman at the meeting.
 - (3) The quorum of the Congregation shall be one third (or the whole number nearest to one-third) of the total number of members of the Congregation or fifty, whichever is less.
 - (4) A certificate signed by the Vice-Chancellor specifying-
 - (a) the total number of members of Congregation for the purpose of any particular meeting or meetings of Congregation; or
 - (b) the names of the persons who are members of Congregation during a particular period; shall be conclusive evidence of

that number or, as the case may be, of the names of those persons.

- (5) Subject to the foregoing provisions of this article, Congregation may regulate its own procedure.
- (6) Congregation shall be entitled to express by resolution or otherwise its opinion on all matters affecting the interest and welfare of the University and shall have such other functions in addition to the function of electing a member of the Council, as may be provided by statute or regulations.

Convocation

- **5.** (1) Convocation shall consist of—
 - (a) the Officers of the University mentioned in First Schedule to the Act;
 - (b) all teachers within the meaning of the Act; and
 - (c) all other persons whose names are registered in accordance with paragraph (2) of this Article.
 - (2) A person shall be entitled to have his name registered as a member of Convocation if-
 - (a) he is either a graduate of the University of a person satisfying such requirements as may be prescribed for the purposes of this paragraph; and
 - (b) he applies for the registration of his name in the prescribed manner and pays the prescribed fees;
 - (c) and regulations shall provide for the establishment and maintenance of a register for the
 - (d) purposes of this paragraph and, subject to paragraph (3) of this Article, may provide for the
 - (e) payment from time to time of further fees by persons whose names are on the register and
 - (f) for the removal from the register of the name of any person who fails to pay those fees.
 - (3) The person responsible for maintaining the register shall, without the payment of any fees, ensure that the names of all persons who are for the time being members of convocation by virtue of paragraph (1)(a) or (b) of this Article are entered and retained on the register.
 - (4) A person who reasonably claims that he is entitled to have his name on the register shall be entitled on demand to inspect the register, or a copy of the register at the principal office of the University at all reasonably times.

- (5) The register shall, unless the contrary is proved, be sufficient evidence that any person named therein is, and that any person not named therein is not, a member of Convocation; but for the purpose of ascertaining whether a particular person was such a member on a particular date, any entries in and deletions from the register made on or after that date shall be disregarded.
- (6) The quorum of Convocation shall be fifty or one-third (or the whole number nearest to one-third) of the total number of members of Convocation, whichever is less.
- (7) Subject to section 4 of the Act, the Chancellor shall be Chairman at all meetings of Convocation when he is present, and in his absence the Vice-Chancellor shall be the chairman at the meeting.
- (8) Convocation shall have such functions, in addition to the function of appointing a member of the Council, as may be provided by statute.

Organisation of Faculties and branches thereof

6. Each faculty should be divided into such number branches as may be prescribed.

Faculty Boards

- 7. (1) There shall be established in respect of each faculty a faculty board, which, subject to the provisions of this Statute, and subject to the directions of the Vice-Chancellor, shall-
 - (a) regulate the teaching and study of, and the conduct of examinations connected with, the subjects assigned to the faculty;
 - (b) deal with any other matter assigned to it by the statute or by the Vice-Chancellor or the Senate; and
 - (c) advice the Vice-Chancellor or the Senate on any matter referred to it by the Vice-Chancellor or the Senate.
 - (2) Each faculty board shall consist of-
 - (a) the Vice-Chancellor;
 - (b) the persons severally in charge of the branches of the faculty;
 - (c) such of the teachers assigned to the faculty and having the prescribed qualifications as the board may determine; and
 - (d) such persons whether or not members of the University as the board may determine with the general or special approval of the Senate.

(3) The quorum of the board shall be eight members or one quarter (whichever is greater) of the members for the time being of the board; and subject to the provisions of this statute and to any provision made by regulations in that behalf, the board may regulate its own procedure.

The Dean of the Faculty

- **8.** (1) The Dean of a faculty shall be a Professor elected by the faculty board and such Dean shall hold office for a term of two years. He will be eligible for re-election for another term of two years after which he may not be elected again until two years elapsed.
 - (2) If there is no Professor in a faculty, the office of the Dean of the faculty shall be held in rotation by members of the faculty holding the ranks of reader of senior lecturer on the basis of seniority as determined by the Senate.
 - (3) The Dean shall be the Chairman at all meetings of the faculty board when he is present and he shall be a member of all committees and other boards appointed by the faculty.
 - (4) The Dean of a faculty shall exercise general superintendence over the academic and administrative affairs of the faculty. It shall be the function of the Dean to present to Convocation for the conferment of degrees to those who have qualified for the degrees of the University at examinations held in the branches of learning for which responsibility is allocated to that Faculty.
 - (5) There shall be a Committee to be known as the Committee of Deans consisting of all the Deans of the several faculties and that Committee shall advise the Vice-Chancellor on all academic matters and on particular matters referred to the University Council by Senate.
 - (6) The Dean of a faculty may be removed from office for good cause by the faculty board after a vote would have been taken at a meeting of the board, and in the event of a vacancy occurring following the removal of a Dean, an acting Dean may be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor provided that at the next faculty board meeting an election shall be held for a new Dean.
 - (7) In this article, "good cause" has the same meaning as in section 16 (3) of the Act.

Selection of Director of Works

- **9.** (1) When a vacancy occurs in the office of the Director of Works, a selection Board shall be constituted by the Council and shall consist of:
 - (i) the Pro-Chancellor
 - (ii) the Vice-Chancellor
 - (iii) two members appointed by the Council, not being members of the Senate; and
 - (iv) two members appointed by the Senate.
 - (2) The Selection Board, after making such inquiries as it thinks fit, shall recommend a candidate to the Council for appointment to the vacant office, and after considering the recommendation of the Board the Council may make an appointment to that office.

Creation of Academic Posts

10. Recommendations for the creation of posts other than those mentioned in article 9 of this Statute shall be made by the Senate to the Council through the Finance and General Purposes Committee

Appointment of the Academic Staff

11. Subject to the Decree and the statutes, the filling of vacancies in academic posts (including newly created ones) shall be as prescribed from time to time by statutes.

Appointment of Administrative and Professional Staff

- **12.** (1) The administrative and professional staff of the University, other than those mentioned in article 9 of this Statute, shall be appointed by the Council or on its behalf by the Vice-Chancellor or the Registrar in accordance with any delegation of powers made by the Council in that behalf.
 - (2) In the case of administrative or professional staff who have close and important contacts with the academic staff, there shall be Senate participation in the process of selection.

Interpretation

13. In this Statute, the expression "the Act" means the University of Ilorin Act 1979 and any expression defined in the Act has the same meaning in this Statute.

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SHORT TITLE

14. This Statute may be cited as the University of Ilorin Statute No. 1.

ADDENDUM

Students Participation

- "7AAA. Students shall -
- (a) be represented in the University's Students Welfare Board and other committees that deal with the affairs of students;
- (b) participate in various aspects of curriculum development;
- (c) participate in tile process of assessing academics staff in respect of teaching; and
- (d) be encouraged to be more self-assured as part of the national development process".

INTERVENTION IN EMERGENCY SITUATIONS STATUTE No. 3 of 2001

In the exercise of the power conferred by Section 9(i)(a) and (b) and Section22(6) of the University of Ilorin Act, Cap. 455 Laws of the Federation of Nigeria, 1990, and all other powers enabling it in chat behalf, the following Statute is issued as Statute No.3 of 2001 and shall come into force on the date on which it duly approved by Council after having been duly approved by Senate or on the date it is duly approved by Senate after having been duly approved by Council.

- 1. (a) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any statute of the University and without prejudice to the right of the Faculty Board to also exercise its power of removal of a Dean any staff holding an elective or appointive academic post (other than his/her primary duties of research and teaching) may be removed from the said elective or appointive academic post, by the Vice-Chancellor, Senate or Council.
 - (b) Where a person who is holding an academic position is removed pursuant to the provisions of 1(a) above, it shall be legitimate for the Vice-Chancellor to appoint another person in acting capacity for the post.
 - (c) Any person removed pursuant to the foregoing provisions shall immediately upon the appointment of an acting holder of the position hand over all the perquisites of the office to the acting holder.
- **2.** (a) The removal in pursuant of l(a) above should be reported to Council within three months of such removal.
 - (b) Where the Council ratifies the action in l(a) above, the electing or appointing body shall be required to, not later than six months from the date of the removal, elect another person to fill the

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vacancy in an election at which the removed person shall not be eligible to contest.

- (c) Nothing in this section shall prevent the University or Council from exercising disciplinary action against the removed officer.
- (d) Where the Council does not approve the removal in accordance to 2(a) above, the electing or appointing body shall be required to within four months of removal, appoint or elect the removed officer or any other qualified person it deems fit.

(e) Where the removed officer is reappointed or re-elected in accordance with (d) above, he shall be eligible to complete the residue of his tenure.

UNIVERSITY OF ILORIN STATUTE No.4 ON THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE COLLEGE OF MEDICINE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF ILORIN

UNIVERSITY OF ILORIN ACT (CAP 455, 1990) College of Medicine of the University of Ilorin Statute UNIVERSITY OF ILORIN STATUTE No.4

Commencement:

In the exercise of the powers conferred by section 10 of the University of Ilorin Act, Cap. 455, 1990, and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the University of Ilorin has made the following statute:

College of Medicine

- 1. (1) In further exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 3, subsection 1 of the University of Ilorin Act, the University hereby establishes as an integral part of the University, a college to be known as the College of Medicine of the University of Ilorin (hereinafter in this Statute referred to as "the College"), which shall be a body corporate with perpetual Succession and a Common seal and power to sue and be sued in its corporate name.
 - (2) Without prejudice to the provisions of subsection (2) of section I of the University of Ilorin Act, the College shall-
 - (a) provide courses of instruction leading to the award of degrees, diplomas, certificates and other University distinctions in the medical and such allied professions as the Council may prescribe;
 - (b) provide special training courses, whether leading to university distinctions or not, for such persons as the Council may prescribe, taking into account at all times the requirements of the Federal Ministry of Health;
 - (c) conduct research, with particular reference to research in the field of medical Science: and
 - (b) (d)arrange conferences, seminars, study groups and other similar activities in the field of medical science.
 - (3) Subject to the provisions of the University of Ilorin Act (relating to the functions of the Visitor, the Council, the Senate and the Vice-Chancellor); the College shall -
 - (a) as respects academic matters, be responsible to the Senate;

- (b) as respects non-academic matters, be subject to the overall control of the Council; and
- (c) as respects its financial affairs, be self-accounting but responsible through the Vice-Chancellor to the Council.

Provost

- **2.** (a) There shall be a Provost of the College who shall be the Head of the College.
 - (b) The Provost shall be a Professor elected by the Academic Staff Assembly of the College and formally appointed by the Vice-Chancellor.
 - (c) The Provost shall hold office for four years beginning with the first day of August of the year in which he is elected. He shall thereafter not be eligible for re-election until at least another four years have elapsed since he last held such office as defined by the Act of the University, Cap 455, 1990.
 - (d) The Provost may be removed from office for good cause after a vote to that effect by not less than two-thirds of the entire Academic Staff Assembly. Following the removal of a Provost as herein provided, one of the Deans in the College, who is medicallyqualified shall be appointed the Acting Provost by the Vice-Chancellor, provided that at the next Academic Staff Assembly meeting an election shall be held for a new Provost. The normal term of the Provost so elected shall commence on the 1st August of the year of his appointment.
 - (e) The Provost shall in relation to the University, take precedence before all Deans in the University

Faculties and Deans

- **3.** (a) The College shall consist of Faculties which shall be made up of Departments and other Academic Units established in accordance with the procedures prescribed by the Senate for the creation of new Faculties and other academic Units of the University.
 - (b) The following two faculties and Service Units shall constitute the foundation components of the College.

The Faculties are:

- (i) Faculty of Basic Medical Sciences; and
- (ii) Faculty of Clinical Sciences

The Units are:

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- (i) Community Based Experience and Service (COBES) Unit; and
- (ii) Medical Educational Resources Unit (MERU).
- (c) The Deans of Faculties of the College shall be of the same status with the Deans of other Faculties of the University.

All relevant laws and regulations in the University relating to Faculties and Deans shall apply except in the presentation of results at Convocation where the Provost shall carry out this function.

Responsibilities of the Provost

- **4.** (a) The Provost shall be Chairman of all meetings of the Academic Staff Assembly of the College when he is present and shall be a member of all Committees and other Boards appointed by the College.
 - (b) In the absence of the Provost, the immediate past Provost, if present, shall normally preside. Otherwise, one of the Deans present shall preside.
 - (c) The Provost shall exercise general superintendence over the Academic and Administrative Affairs of the College. It shall be the function of tile Provost to present to Convocation for the conferment of degrees of the University at examinations held in the branches of learning for which responsibility is allocated to the College.

College Secretary

- **5.** (a) There shall be a Secretary to the College who shall, under the general superintendence of the Registrar of the University, be responsible to the Provost of the College for the day-to-day administration of the affairs of the College.
 - (b) The College Secretary shall be appointed like Faculty Officers in consultation with the Provost of the College. He shall not be below the status of a Deputy Registrar.
 - (c) The person holding the Office of the Secretary shall by virtue of that Office be the Secretary to the Court of Governors, the Academic Board and the Academic staff Assembly.

Finance Officer

6. (a) There shall be a Finance Officer of the College who shall, under the general superintendence of the Bursar, be responsible to the

Provost for the day-to-day administration of the financial affairs of the College.

(b) The Finance Officer shall not be lower in status than that of Deputy Bursar.

College Librarian

- **7.** (a) There shall be a College Librarian who shall, under the general superintendence of the Librarian, be responsible to the Provost for the day-to-day administration of the College Library.
 - (b) The College Librarian shall not be below the status of a Deputy Librarian.
 - (c) The College Librarian shall, by virtue of that Office, be a member of the Academic Board, Boards of Faculties and Staff Assembly.

College Superintendant of Works

- **8.** (a) There shall be a. College Superintendent of Works who shall be responsible to the Provost for the day-to-day administration of the utilities of the College.
 - (b) The College Superintendent of Works shall not be below the status of Deputy Director of Works.

Court of Governors of the College

- **9.** (i) There shall be a Court of Governors of the College which, subject to the overall control of the Council of the University, shall-
 - (a) control the property and expenditure of the College;
 - (b) be responsible to the University Council for the submission of financial proposals relating to the College through the Vice-Chancellor to the Council;
 - (c) employ such junior non-academic staff in consultation with the Registrar within the frame work of the conditions of service governing the appointment of such staff in the University; and
 - (d) perform such other functions of the College as the University Council from time-to-time delegate to it.
 - (ii) The Court of Governors of the College shall consist of:
 - (a) The Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of Council of the University as its Chairman
 - (b) The Vice-Chancellor
 - (c) The Deputy Vice-Chancellors

- (d) The Chairman of the Board of Management of the University of Ilorin Teaching Hospital
- (e) The Provost of the College
- (f) Chief Medical Director of the Teaching Hospital;
- (g) 2 members of the University Council who are not members of staff of the University
- (h) 2 members of Senate who are not members of the College Staff
- (i) 1 member of the Academic Staff Assembly of the College
- (j) 1 member of College Academic Board
- (k) 1 representative of the Federal Ministry of Health
- (iii) A member of the Court appointed under paragraph 9(ii) subparagraph (i) above, shall hold Office for such period not exceeding four years as may be determined by the appointing authority.
- (iv) A member whose term of Office has expired shall be eligible for re-appointment for another term of four years.

The quorum of the Court shall be one-third of the membership.

The Court shall, subject to any directive given by Council, regulate its own procedure,

College Academic Board

- **10.** (i) There shall be an Academic Board of the College, which shall control the academic affairs of the College. It shall also exercise such powers of Senate as may be delegated to it by Senate.
 - (ii) The Academic Board of the College shall comprise of:
 - (a) The Vice-Chancellor Chairman
 - (b) The Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic)
 - (c) The Provost of the College
 - (d) The Deans of the Faculties of the College of Medicine
 - (e) The Dean of Science, or his Nominee
 - (f) The Dean of Engineering and Technology or his nominee who shall not be below the rank of a Professor.
 - (g) The Professors in the College.
 - (h) All Heads of Departments in the College
 - (i) The University Librarian
 - (j) The Medical Librarian

- (k) The Director of the Institute of Postgraduate Medical Sciences
- (l) Two members, not below the rank of Senior Lecturer, representing each Faculty in the College elected from amongst the academic staff of the Faculty, on the Faculty Board. Such elected member shall hold office for a period of two years beginning with the first day in August in the year of his election.
- (iii) The quorum of the Academic Board shall be one-third of the membership.
- (iv) The Provost of the College shall be the Chairman at all meetings of the Academic Board of the College except when the Vice-Chancellor is present. When the Provost is not present, one of the Deans present shall be elected as Chairman for the meeting.
- (v) Regulations shall prescribe the procedure for electing members in pursuance of sub-paragraph (ii) above and such an elected member of the Academic Board shall hold Office for a period of two years beginning with the first day in August in the year of his election.

Faculty Board

- 11. (i) The Board of each Faculty shall consist of:
 - (a) The Dean (Chairman)
 - (b) All teachers in the Faculty
 - (c) One representative each from the Faculties in the University
 - (d) Such persons not exceeding four in number, whether or not members of the University, as may with the specific or general approval of the Academic Board, be appointed by the Faculty Board to be members of the Faculty Board.
 - (ii) The quorum of 'the Board shall be one-third of the members.
 - (iii) It shall be the function of each Board to:
 - (a) elect Dean and Sub-Dean of Faculties;
 - (b) advise and report to the Academic Board on all matters relating to the organisation of education, teaching and research in the subjects of the Faculty, including curricula and examinations;
 - (c) consider the progress and conduct of students in that teaching unit and report thereon:
 - (d) recommend to the Academic Board persons for appointment as examiners; and

- (e) deal with any academic matters referred to it by the Academic Board; and
- (f) the Faculty shall elect its own representatives of various bodies.
- (iv) The Dean shall be the Chairman at all meetings of the Board except when the Vice-Chancellor is present; in his absence any acting Dean shall preside.

Academic Staff Assembly

- 12. (i) The Academic Staff Assembly shall consist of:
 - (a) The Vice-Chancellor (ex-Officio)
 - (b) The Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) (ex-Officio)
 - (c) All full-time academic members of the College
 - (ii) The quorum of the Assembly shall be one-third of the members
 - (iii) It shall be the function of the Assembly to:
 - (a) (i) elect the Provost by Secret ballot
 - (ii) elect COBES Chairman
 - (b) elect representatives of Academic Staff to the Court of Governors
 - (c) elect representatives to various bodies on 'which the academic Staff of the College is specifically required to be represented;
 - (d) perform such other functions as the Academic Board may, from time to time, refer to it;
 - (iv) The Provost shall be the Chairman at all meetings of the Academic Staff Assembly except when the Vice-Chancellor or Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) is present. In their absence, one of the Deans of the Faculties/School shall be the Chairman as may be mandated by the Provost.
- 13. Representation of the College on Statutory University Bodies.

The Provost of the College shall be a Statutory member of the University Council Development Committee and Appointments and Promotions Committee.

- (vii) Medical Records

The functions of this Faculty shall include:

- (a) Undergraduate training of MB;BS students in the Basic Medical Sciences (i-vi)enumerated above.
- (b) Undergraduate training for the B.Sc. degree in Anatomy, Physiology, Medical Radiography and Laboratory Sciences.
- (c) Postgraduate Academic training for the M.Sc., M.Phil., Ph.D. and MD degrees in the Basic Medical Sciences.
- (d) Diploma courses in Laboratory Sciences.

2. Faculty of Clinical Sciences

This shall comprise 10 academic departments, namely:

- (i) Anaesthesia
- (ii) Behavioural Sciences
- (iii) Epidemiology and Community Health
- (iv) Medicine
- (v) Obstetrics and Gynaecology
- (vi) Ophthalmology
- (vii) Otorhinolaryngology (ORL)
- (viii) Paediatrics and Child Health
- (ix) Radiology
- (x) Surgery

The functions of this Faculty shall include:

- (a) Undergraduate Clinical Training to MB;BS level
- (b) Intern training for Registration by the Medical and Dental Council of Nigeria
- (c) Postgraduate Residency training for Board Certification by the National Postgraduate Medical College of Nigeria and the West African College of Physicians and Surgeons.
- (d) Postgraduate training for the M.Sc., M.Phil., Ph.D. MD and M.Sc. Degrees.
- (e) Diploma Courses in Epidemiology and Community Health.
- (f) Community Health Officer (CHO) Training

3. Community Based Experience and Services (COBES) Unit

COBES programme is the most innovative feature and a major pillar of the College's Medical curriculum. It was conceived in recognition of a general dissatisfaction with the hitherto orthodox process and outcome of Medical Education in Nigeria. It was designed in response to a new set of demands for Health Services, teaching and research. Its aims and objectives are:

- (a) To make Medical Education relevant to Community Health needs by focusing on priority health problems.
- (b) To orientate medical students to Community needs early in their medical training.
- (c) To train doctors who could be fully equipped to work in any Community in any part of Nigeria without compromising their knowledge of Pathophysiological processes, and make them comparable to their counterparts nationally and internationally.
- (d) To train doctors who can work as members of a health team (i.e., the health team approach to health care delivery).
- (e) To sharpen the problem-solving skills of students so that when they qualify, problem-solving would have become internalized in them.
- (f) To encourage the students to begin to render health-related and public services in various communities early in their career.

4. Medical Education Resource Unit (MERU)

MERU is based in the Office of the Provost. Its role includes:

- (a) Medical illustration and Photography
- (b) Audio-visual resources
- (c) Computer utilization
- (d) Internet, E-mail and Fax Services



ACADEMIC & OFFICIAL COSTUMES



OFFICIAL ROBES

The University's official costumes are as follows:

1. The Chancellor

The Chancellor's robe is of Indigo Blue Silk Damask with closed long pointed sleeves. It has 6" facings of heavy gold wire embroidery with four University Crests in gold in each top panel of facing and the addition of looped embroidery on each side of facings. The 6" facings are edged ½" gold lace. A talking drum form is on the label below the crests. The drum straps are in grey wire, while the face of drum is in white. The locust bean flowers are in maroon silk embroidery with the flower stalk in dull silver (grey) wire strands. Background to embroidery is the same as colour of robe (extra-heavy embroidery).

Hat- The hat is dark blue velvet bonnet of mortar board shape, trimmed with gold lace and with golden cord-tassels.

2. The Pro-Chancellor

Robe as for the Chancellor but with three crests in each top panel of facings, and the addition of a double line of ½" loops on each side of facings, but without edged facings (heavy embroidery).

Hat-The hat is dark blue velvet bonnet of mortar board with golden lace trimming and golden cord-tassels.

3. The Vice-Chancellor

Robe as for the Pro-Vice Chancellor, but with 5" facings of gold wire embroidery, two crest in each top panel of facings and the addition of ½" loops on each side of facings (moderate embroidery).

Hat-The hat is dark blue velvet bonnet of mortar board shape, trimmed with 3/4" gold lace and with golden cord-tassels.

4. Deputy Vice-Chancellors

Robes as for the Vice -Chancellor but with 5½" facings of gold wire embroidery, a talking king flower drum form on the midsection of lapel and a locust bean flower in maroon silk embroidery with the stalk in dull silver (grey) wire strand on the lapel below the talking drums (light embroidery on facings).

Hat-The hat is dark blue cloth bonnet, with long black silk cord and golden tassels.

5. Registrar

Robe as for the Vice-Chancellor, but with one crest in each top panel of facings (Light embroidery on facings), and the addition of ½" gold lace edged facings as for the Chancellor.

Hat-The hat is dark blue velvet bonnet of mortar board shape, trimmed with (gold lace and with golden cord-tassels).

6. Bursar

Robe as for the Vice-Chancellor and the panel of facings as for the Deputy Vice-Chancellors.

Hat-The Hat is dark blue cloth bonnet, with long block silk cord and golden tassels.

7. University Librarian

Robe as for the Vice-Chancellor and panel of facings as for the Deputy Vice-Chancellors.

Hat-The hat is dark blue cloth bonnet, with long black silk cord and golden tassels.

8. Academic Costumes

i. Higher Doctorates (D.Sc., D.Litt., LL.D., etc) Gowns

Robes: These are in scarlet lightweight terylene worsted cloth with 5" facing of dark blue silk. The edge of facings are trimmed with 1" Faculty ribbon.

Hoods: These are of white Art silk, lined with white satin. The top edge of hood is bound with Faculty silk inside and outside.

Hats: Rigid Mortar Board of dark blue smooth textured cloth, with gold silk button and tassels.

ii. Doctoral Degrees-Gowns

Robes: Robes are in light weight maroon cloth with 3" facings of University colour on the lapels. The sleeves are closed and pointed. The robe is uniform for all Faculties.

Hood: Full shape of Dark blue material, fully lined with white silk, top edge of hood and top of band edged inside and outside

with maroon ribbon.

Hat: Dark blue cloth bonnet, with long maroon silk cord and tassels.

iii. Masters' Gown

Robe: Same as Bachelors', but without badge and with the addition of 21/2" facing of Faculty silk

Hood: Full shape indigo blue polyester material. Fully lined Faculty silk and edges bound inside and outside with 1" maroon ribbon

iv. Bachelors' Gowns

Robe: Bachelors robe of Indigo blue polyester material, cape sleeves with University woven crest on left breast of robe.

Hood: Bachelors' hoods of indigo blue polyester material faced inside with 4" Faculty coloured silk.

Faculty colours for the inner lining of the hood are as follows:

Faculty of Agriculture Spring green with canary yellow taping Faculty of Arts Silver grey

Faculty of Business & Social Sciences -Purple with orange taping

Faculty of Communication & Information -Deep Brown

Hat: Hats of dark blue smooth textured cloth, black tassels and braid (flexible skull).

v. Undergraduate Gowns

Robe: Robes is of dark blue, cape sleeves, facing machined down, University crest woven on left breast of gown.

Hat: Hat is of dark blue smooth textured cloth, with black button tassels (flexible skull).



INAUGURAL LECTURES (UPDATE)

An Inaugural Lecture is an Academic Tradition inherited from some of the ancient renowned Universities of the world. The objective of an Inaugural Lecture is to initiate, among others things, a Professor into a Professorial chair and afford him the opportunity of telling the world in lucid, digestible and scholarly language how he has arrived as a Professor.

In pursuance of this objective, the University of Ilorin commenced, in 1979 its University Lectures consisting of a series of 2 to 3 lectures per session. However, in March 1982, an Ad-hoc Committee was set up to formulate guidelines on upgrading University Lectures to Inaugural Lectures. A series of 5 lectures per session to be given by persons appointed to Professorial chairs in the University was recommended. So far 110 of such lectures have been delivered in the following order:

UNIVERSITY SERVICES



UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

General

The Library is primarily responsible for selecting, acquiring and organising books, periodicals, documents, newspapers, maps and other materials that are required for the teaching and research activities of the University. The responsibility for book selection is jointly shared with members of the teaching staff. Readers wishing to suggest books and periodicals for addition to the collections may do so by completing appropriate slips which can be obtained on request from the Acquisitions Librarian and the Loan's Desk.

Presently, the Library's book collections numbered about 100,000 in volumes after extensive weeding exercises for relevance and currency. It also as an estimated number of periodicals of about 330 titles and about 6000 theses. A total of 4662 periodicals including journals, Magazines and Newspapers. The Library presently subscribe to a maximum of 12 newspaper titles daily and there are 11,166 pieces of government publications, 2,707 rolls of microfilms, 18,895 sheets of microfiches, 75 gramophone records, 300 audio cassettes, 57 video cassettes and 799 slides. The Library has resources including books

and journals in both hard and electronics copy in all the disciplines and programs offered in the University. The Library provides a wide range of services including interlibrary loans and photocopying. Machines are available for consulting microfilm and audio-visual materials. Detailed instruction in library use is provided to undergraduates as part of the General Studies Programme. Advanced bibliographic courses are available on request by lecturers for final year and postgraduate students preparing for their long essays and dissertations. The Library also provides carrel services, which affords individual users the opportunity for a serene, private and conducive apartment for studying within the Library. Interested users are expected to request for this service at the circulation unit of the Library. All enquiries regarding reader instruction, either on individual basis, or in groups are made to the Readers' Services Librarian. This and other Library service are being provided by a wide ranging cadres of work force numbering 109 staff members including 24 professionals, 64 para professionals, 21 non-professionals.

The Electronic Library, which started off over a decade ago in a facility donated to the University which is a far distance from the main Library has been recently relocated back to the new extension of the main Library. The newly completed extension of the Library is a one story building whose first floor as been solely dedicated as the new E-Library with complete networking which prepares it for the development of a virtual environment for service provision. Also, instructive is that the Library Extension building came along with it furniture namely reading tables and chairs, as well as book shelves. At the beginning of it computerized process the Library adopted TINLIB and Alice for window software which has since been changed to KOHA. There are presently 220 desktop computers which are fully networked. There are 18 computers at the On-line Public Access Catalogue Section (OPAC).

Currently, there are 17 subscribed and non-subscribed databases in all. Prominent among which include *EBSCOHOST*, *SCIENCEDIRECT*, *EMERALD*, *PROQUEST*, *LAWSCOPE AND HEINOLINE*. The unsubscribed databases include *Agora*, *HINARI*, *OARE*, *ARDI*, *GOALI*, *JSTOR*, among others; some of which are general in scope while others are discipline-specific. They are used for carrying out searches in different fields for both staff and students.

The Library also manages the Universities institutional repository (IR), using *DSPACE* software which represent the reservoir of the intellectual productivity of the University. In the IR all publications and other research output of the senior members of the University particularly those of the Professorial cadres are uploaded as an important requirement for promotion. Information on the contents of the University Library, its arrangement and the services it provides, is found in a pamphlet, 'Guide to the University Library' obtainable at the main Library.

Membership

Membership is open, on completion of registration forms, to the following:

- 1. All students of the University;
- 2. All members of the Senior Staff;
- Such persons as may be determined from time to time by the University Librarian. Applications in writing to the Librarian should state the particular reason for which use of the library is desired.

Registration of Readers

Each member, on registration, is issued with a library ticket, which is valid for the current academic year only and must be renewed thereafter. Loss of a borrower's ticket must be reported to the Library immediately and an application made to the Readers' Services Librarian for replacement.

The Library must be notified of any change of address immediately. Reference tickets giving access to Library collection but not granting borrowing privileges will be issued to approved bona fide persons for periods of one day or longer as appropriate on application to the Readers' Services Librarian.

Loans

- 1. Books will normally be issued for a period of two weeks, but members of the teaching staff may borrow books for four weeks at a time.
- 2. A loan may be renewed on request for another period of two weeks (for students) and four weeks (for staff) after which the book must be returned to the Library. Such renewals can only be allowed if no one else has reserved the book.
- 3. Students are allowed to have in their possession only four books at a time, while senior staff may have up to six.
- 4. Periodicals, whether bound or unbound, may not be borrowed from the Library except by special permission.
- 5. Books in heavy demand are restricted to one week loan. Any loan is subject to immediate recall in cases of urgency.
- 6. Undergraduate students must return all books in their possession on or before the Monday of the last week of the semester or within three days of date of recall. All books on loan must be returned for the annual stock check upon notification to borrowers by the Library.
- 7. Students may be permitted to have up to two books on loan during the semester break on making special application to take them away from the campus. Such loans, approved by the Librarian, must be returned on the date specified.
- 8. Borrowers will greatly help other library users and also the library staff if they will return books as soon as they have finished with them and never later than the date stamped inside each book.
- 9. No book may be removed from the Library until the loan has been duly recorded and the date-due slip stamped illicit removal of books from the Library will be treated as a serious offence.

Books on Reserve

These are of two categories:

1. Day Reserve:

These are recommended texts which are in great demand. To ensure that all readers have equal chance, they are kept on day reserve. Students wishing to use them should apply at the Circulation Desk. They must be used in the Library and returned before the close of the day.

2. Two-hour Reserve:

These are texts and particularly journal articles which are in greater demand and are thus kept on reserve for the benefit of all users. Application for their use should be made at the Circulation Desk. They must be used in the Library for a two-hour period at a time, at the end of which someone else may take them. Your cooperation in the use of materials placed on reserve will be greatly appreciated.

Regulations

The purpose of the following regulations is to enable all users of the University Library make the fullest use of the collections. Students are reminded that the library regulations have the force of University regulations for discipline.

- 1. Members must show their Library Ticket on entering the Library, when borrowing a book and at other times if asked to do so by any member of the Library staff.
- 2. Library Tickets are not transferable. Readers are advised to keep their tickets securely. They are valuable documents and a reader is held responsible for the books issued against his ticket.
- 3. Books must be returned immediately on demand by the Library. (They are issued out only with this strict understanding).
- 4. Books may not be taken out of Ilorin without the special permission of the University Librarian.
- 5. Before leaving the University finally, each member must return all books on Loan to him from the Library as well as surrender his Library ticket. Failure to do so may result in delay in issuing of clearance certificates required by the Bursary for refund of the deposit or meeting other claims.
- 6. Mutilation of Library books, marking or tracing of any kind on Library books is strictly forbidden.

- 7. Smoking is not permitted in any part of the Library.
- 8. No food items are allowed in the Library.
- 9. Seat may be reserved for 15 minutes only after which other readers may occupy them.
- 10. Brief cases, umbrellas, bags, etc. must be left in the cloak room. It is advisable not to leave valuables in bags or unattended on reading tables within the Library.
- 11. Readers must show all books in their possession to the porter at the exit when leaving the Library as well as submit themselves for body search to ensure that all library books have been properly issued out.

Discipline

- 1. A fine of ten naira (NIO.00) is charged for each day a book is kept overdue for the first fifteen days and twenty naira (N20.00) per day thereafter.
- 2. A fine of five naira (¥5.00) per day is charged for failure to return a book recalled by the library from the third day of the recall notice.
- 3. Students who persistently fail to return Library books or settle library fines shall:
 - (a) be reported in writing to their Deans,
 - (b) have their names published on the Library and Faculty Notice Boards,
 - (c) be refused registration in subsequent semester or year (if they are non- graduating),
 - (d) have their certificates withheld (if they are graduating students).
 - (e) be caused to pay three times the current price of the book(s).
- 4. Lost or damaged book(s) should be reported to the Library immediately. The borrower shall be required to pay for the replacement.
- All cases of stealing, mutilation or defacement of Library books shall be regarded as serious offences and shall be referred to the Students' Disciplinary Committee for appropriate disciplinary measures.
- 6. Staff who fail to pay fines or replacement costs shall have the amount involved deducted from their salaries after such staff

would have been given a month's notice.

- 7. Persistent staff defaulters shall be suspended from using the Library and refused borrowing facilities for periods to be decided by the University Library and Publications Committee.
- 8. The Library reserves the right to suspend or withdraw all Library privileges from persons who contravene Library regulations. Such cases shall also be reported to the appropriate University authority for further disciplinary action.

Library Deposit

The Library has been made a depository for two copies of all works published in the KwaraState of Nigeria. Publications received under the Kwara State Publications Edict are separately organised as a special collection for research purposes and for preservation. Three copies of the examination question papers and learned conference papers should be deposited in the Library.

University Staff Publications

The Library maintains a special collection of staff publications and reprints. Staff publications and reprints are welcome for this purpose.

Donations

Gifts of books and cash donations are welcome from individuals and institutions. The Library is particularly interested in private papers of distinguished persons who have made significant contributions to development at Local, State or Federal levels.

UNIVERSITY HEALTH SERVICES

The University Health Services caters for the health needs of the University Community. It provides curative and preventive/community health services. The services provided include:

- 1. Medical care for registered students and staff who have chosen the University clinic under NHIS as their service provider.
- 2. Medical Examination for the new students and staff of the University.
- 3. Public Health Nursing Services, which include child welfare and maternal health services with particular attention to immunisation of children and education on child care.
- 4. Environmental Sanitation Services with collection and disposal of refuse, inspection of hostels, canteen- 'Bukateria', bakery, staff quarters etc and pest and insect control.
- 5. Inoculation for purpose of international travels.
- 6. Counselling services on HIV/AIDS and orientation health issues.

The two clinics at the Main Campuses run twenty-fours services daily. The two clinic admit students and staff for observation for a maximum of 72 hours. The University Health Services continues to enjoy the assistance and cooperation of the University Teaching hospital both the General Hospital and Maternity Wings - in attending to the Health Services' referral cases and to some special laboratory investigation and X-Ray when necessary.

7. Foster collaboration with:

- (i) Government and Non-Government Organisation (NGO) on health issues-like immunization of students against Hepatitis B. Cancer screening of students and staff.
- (ii) Foster collaboration with faculties and departments in the University on health and non-health related issues for examples-there is collaboration with microbiology department on laboratory attachment for postgraduate students in the department.

Social work department on internship observation of undergraduate student etc.

ABUJA LIAISON OFFICE

The Abuja Liaison Office under the Office of the Vice-Chancellor was created 2011. The creation of the office has enhanced and fast tracked the response to requests between the University and the educational agencies within Abuja and its environs. The office reports directly to the Vice- Chancellor with the Liaison Officer as the Administrative Head. The office is saddled with the following responsibilities:

- 1. Preserving an effective relationship between the University, the public and projecting the image of the University within Abuja and its environ.
- Providing information on University Admission, Matriculation, examination, convocation, guidelines to issuance of certificate, transcript and all related communique of the University activities.
- 3. Functioning as a public relations/protocol officer to any of the principal officers on official visit to Abuja and also logistics is being handled if need be.
- 4. Liaising with the foreign missions/embassies for the procurement of visa, air tickets and other traveling documents for any university staff.
- 5. Management and maintenance of the university properties within Abuja.
- 6. The office serves as a representative of the university at University Alumni branch meetings held within the premises of liaison office.
- 7. The office attends to needs and enquiries of the public.

LAGOS LIAISON OFFICE/GUEST HOUSE

The University of Ilorin has a Lagos Liaison office. It is a unit under the Vice-Chancellor's Office; and was at its inception structured under two arms - an office and a guest house. The office moved out of its 4 bedroom duplex accommodation at No. 13/15 Toyin Street, Ikeja, in March 1988 to a 4-bedroom apartment, located at No. 50/52 Adelabu

Street, Surulere, Lagos given generously to the University by Prince (Dr.) Samuel Adedoyin on a (5) five years rent moratorium, till June 2006. The office is currently located at No. 39 Okeho, Ire-Akari Estate, Isolo, Lagos. The University has also acquired a 3-bedroom flat at Wuse, Abuja, as the Abuja Liason Office. The office reports directly to the Vice-Chancellor with the liaison officer as the administrative head. The office is saddled with the following responsibilities:

- (a) Maintaining an effective relationship between the University and the public and projecting the image of the University in both Lagos and Abuja. This is done by liaising with the Federal Ministry of Education and its parastatals.
 - (b) Providing information on University admission, matriculation, examination, convocation, closure and resumption dates to the public.
 - (c) Functioning as a public relations/protocol, admission officer to any of the principal officers who might be in Lagos, as it affects hotel reservation and appointment with the University benefactors.
 - (d) Liaising with the foreign missions/embassies for the procurement of visa, air ticket and other travelling documents for any University staff.
 - (e) Signing on behalf of the Registrar the students' scholarship and Bursary forms, air-ticket rebate, and issue of introduction letters to students who intend to enjoy library services in Lagos and Abuja environments.

UNILORIN SECONDARY SCHOOL

Established in October 1982, the Unilorin Secondary School (U.S.S.) is one of the best private secondary schools in Kwara State with a student enrolment of 1,074. There are 59 all of whom are graduates and 21 non-teaching staff. With many ultramodern classrooms, highly dedicated teachers, two well-equipped Science Laboratories, a Computer Laboratory, an Home Economics Laboratory and an up-to-date Introductory Technology Labratory, it stands out as one of the best equipped schools providing

qualitative secondary education in the State. The teachers are highly motivated and dedicated, while it is blessed with a Parents Teacher Association (P.T.A.) that supports the school variously to maintain its enviable standard in scoring 100% pass in the SSCE/NECO Examinations every year since 1985.

This is an institution that caters for the children of University staff as well as children from the locality where academic excellence is extolle.it adopts the concept of 'total' as its philosophy in moral training. The academic performance of the U.S.S. students is the envy of similar institutions in the community. The financial support given by the University, which has put in place a dynamic and efficient Board of Governors, and the commitment and complementary support of the parents are sources of the strength and success of the school. The U.S.S is a model Secondary School of which the University is justifiably proud.

In sports and related co-curricular activities, Unilorin Secondary School is marching on unrivalled. Many products of the school are now in such professions as Medicine, Law, Accounting, Engineering, Teaching, etc.

UNIVERSITY SCHOOL

University School (at inception known as University Staff School) was established on 19th September 1977.

It was established as a Nursery/Primary School taking pupils from (3½ years), three and half years of age to 11 years of age.

The then University Staff School was established a year after the commencement of University College, Ilorin. It was established to provide good and sound primary education for the children of the staff and non-staff alike.

The school commenced on a temporary site at Sabo-Oke with a population of hundred and seventeen (117) pupils. But presently, we have a population of three hundred and thirty-eight (338) pupils.

Comprising (192) of University Staff children and 146 non-staff children at Lower Middle and Upper Basic Classes.

The Upper Basic Class, that is basic 7-9 was accredited in February, 2014 by the National Examination Council (NECO) following the thorough accreditation inspection by the Kwara State Ministry of Education and Human Capital Development in June, 2013. Consequently, the school is, qualified and has been writing both state JSCE and NECO examinations since 2013.

The curriculum comprises the Basic School subjects: Mathematics, English Studies, National Values, Religious Knowledge, French, Business Studies, Cultural and Creative Arts, Yoruba and Arabic Studies. School opens at 8:00 a.m and closes at 1.00 p.m for Reception section and Basic 1-6 and 2:00 p.m for Basic 7-9. An optional lesson runs between 1:30 p.m -3:00 p.m for the Primary section and 2:00 p.m -3:00 p.m for the Upper Basic from Monday to Thursdays.

The performance of our pupils in NECO examinations between 2011 – 2015 had been heartwarming. This feat is largely attributed to the teachers who were hard working, dedicated and committed to their duties.

The school's academic calendar for 2017/2018 session has three terms of 14 weeks (1st term), 12 weeks for the 2nd term and 14 weeks for the third term that ends on 27th July, 2018.

POST OFFICE

A Postal Agency with relevant trained staff started operating on the Mini Campus of the University in May, 1978. An ultra-modem but compact Post Office, built on the Main Campus of the University by the Federal Ministry of Communications commenced operation on 12th March, 1985. This has now been moved to a more accessible location in the Academic area of the University. All postal services are provided to members of staff and students of the University as well as visitors and the University community.

TEACHING AND RESEARCH FARM

The Teaching and research Farm was established more than three decades ago with the primary objective of acting as the field laboratory for the students, and staff field researches as well as application of research findings to food and raw materials production.

The two field-oriented Departments in the Faculty carry out research in the areas of arable crops, tubers, vegetables, fruits, etc. Research in the area of livestock was limited to the Department of Animal Production where animals such as ruminants, monogastrics and poultry are used.

Students go through the mandatory and comprehensive one-year Farm Practical Training Program. The farm also rendered technical services to interested farmers in and around the University, provide gainful employment for both skilled and unskilled workers. Farm produce are also made available from time to time to the University community. These include; fresh table eggs, fresh lean pork, culled layers, beef, cheese, rams, improved seeds and seedlings (e.g. oil palm seedlings). Apart from the teak, jatropha and the moringa plantations, another 147ha of oil palm plantation has been established while an area of land has also been set aside for expansion of the cashew plantation.

THE BIOLOGICAL GARDEN

The Biological Garden was established in 1976 as part of the Department of Biological Sciences. Between 1976 and 1984, the Garden operated essentially on the Mini Campus on a small plot of land containing a few animals and plants. This satisfied, to a large extent, the teaching needs of the Department and indeed of some colleges and schools in and around Kwara State.

The garden moved to its present location at the University Main Gate in December, 1984. The Biological Garden was officially declared open to the general public on Monday October 21st, 1985 by the then Vice-Chancellor of the University - Prof. S. A. Toye -who himself as a Zoologist and lover of nature gave the Garden much interest and support.

The Biological Garden was established to serve the function of teaching and research at undergraduate and postgraduate levels as well as service advanced research being carried out within and outside the University particularly in the field of animal behaviour/habits and plant ecology. In addition to its fundamental objective of teaching and research, the Garden is being developed to cater for educational, cultural and recreational interests of staff, students and community. The garden is usually open to the public as from 6am upon payment of the prescribed fees.

With a total of 48 animals of different species and various kinds of plants and flowers, the Department considered it necessary to allow public viewing of the Garden on payment of a nominal fee especially as recreational amenities of this kind are presently inadequately provided in Kwara State.

UNILORIN DAM

The construction of the main dam was started by the Petroleum Trust Fund in 1994. Although work stopped in July 1999, the Federal Government in 2004 released fund for its completion. The dam has a capacity of 1.8 million cubic reservoir while the water treatment plant has an installed capacity of 100 cubic meters per hour. The complex was commissioned in May, 2007 by the then visitor to the University, President Olusegun Obasanjo. With the dam and treatment plant in place, the University has been enjoying stable water supply.



THE UNILORIN SUGAR RESEARCH INSTITUTE

The Unilorin Sugar Research Institute was established by the Council of the University of Ilorin in January, 1980. It is the only Institute of its kind in Nigeria, and indeed in the West African sub-region. Its sole mandate is to conduct research on sugarcane production and processing. The idea for the establishment of the Institute emanated from the deliberations of a workshop organized by the Faculty of Science of the University of Ilorin in 1978 on "Scientific Research and Nigerian Industries". At the end of the workshop, which drew participants from other Universities, the Industrial Training Fund, Federal and State Ministries, Industrial establishment and private organizations, it was resolved that the Faculty should explore the possibility of establishing a Sugar Research Institute. The first set of academic staff in the Institute assumed duty in August, 1980.

The broad objectives for which the Institute was established are:

- i. Conducting research into problems associated with sugarcane cultivation, processing and utilization, including utilization of by-products;
- ii. Training of undergraduate, postgraduate students and sugar factory/estate workers in biology/agriculture, processing and utilization of sugarcane and its byproducts.
- iii. Rendering of consultancy services on sugarcane cultivation, processing and utilization.

The research activities of the Institute have been mainly in the area of sugarcane agronomy with specific emphasis on the development of effective field management strategies for high yields of sugarcane.

The short-term research activities have yielded some useful results in the area of weed management, disease control and information on the suitability of different imported sugarcane varieties for commercial cultivation in the sugarcane estates.

The long-term research activities of the Institute centre on the development of new and improved sugarcane varieties with wide

adaptation to the local conditions, high cane yields and resistance to the common pests and diseases of the crop. This effort had commenced since the 1983 growing season and the progenies obtained from that year's hybridization are currently at an advanced stage of evaluation. This modest effort has resulted in the release of first two indigenous sugarcane varieties developed by the Institute (ILS-001 and ILS-002) with high yield potential across the sugarcane growing ecologies of Nigeria.

The institute has also been involved in externally funded collaborative research activities with National bodies such as Agricultural Research Council of Nigeria (ARCN) and National Sugar Development Council (NSDC) under which germplasm enhancement, characterization and utilization as well as Biofuel (ethanol) research activities were undertaken. Four (4) of the progenies emanating from these activities are currently being multiplied for further evaluation prior to their being recommended for release by the National Variety Registration and Release Committee.

As part of its continued collaboration with National bodies, the Institute along with two other Institutes in Nigeria and Cote d'ivore, under the aegis of West Africa Sugar Development Project, evaluated 40 improved sugarcane varieties in different agro-ecologies of the two countries. The projects was sponsored by the Common Funds for Commodities (CFC) with the supervision of the International Sugar Organization (ISO). The best five varieties identified in two rainforest ecologies (Ikenne, Ogun State and Agenebode, Edo State, Nigeria) are currently being multiplied for uptake by the emerging sugar industries and sugarcane out-growers associations.

Furthermore, the Institute is also involved in other collaborative research activities on varietal evaluation, advancement and germplasm enhancement. These projects are funded by the NSDC, Abuja. With the revitalization of the Research Associates, it is expected that the scope of research activities in the Institute will be expanded.

UNILORIN CONSULTANCY SERVICES AND REVENUE YIELDING PROJECTS

HUMAN RESOURCES MANAGEMENT BOARD

As part of its desire to generate revenue to supplement the lean and declining government subventions, Universities were encouraged to try some measures of revenue yielding ventures. As a follow-up, the University, in November 1982, set up the Governing Board of Consultancy Services and Revenue Yielding Projects under the Chairmanship of the Vice-Chancellor.

The Governing Board held its inaugural meeting on 8th November, 1982. It is this body that formulates policies on consultancy services and revenue yielding projects. The Governing Board, through its Chairman, in its bid to fulfil its aspirations, formed Management Boards for the various projects, with the sole aim of generating revenue by charging for services rendered. Most of these projects had hitherto operated as mere service-oriented ventures.

The projects were later constituted into a limited liability company (The Unilorin Holdings Ltd, UHL). The UHL is presently centralised with each project having its own independent committee which reports to the Governing Council through the Human Resources Management Board and the Council Monitoring Committee on Revenue Yielding Units/Outfits (CMOCRYUO). The Management Committees are for these Units:

UNILORIN BOOKSHOP

Following the disengagement from the University Bookshop (Nig.) Ltd., which had hitherto, under a special relationship been running a branch of its establishment on the University Mini Campus, the Unilorin Bookshop was established in July, 1982. The objective was to provide a profit yielding enterprise, without sacrificing its efficiency in serving the academic needs of the University Community. The main office of Unilorin Bookshop is located on the Mini Campus.

The Bookshop is presently on lease to a private organisation. The Unilorin Property Management Board and the Vice-Chancellor's Representative on the Management Board of the Bookshop oversee the running and operation of the Bookshop on behalf of the University.

UNILORIN GUEST HOUSES

The Unilorin Guest House is made up of fourteen chalets. The available accommodation includes double- room chalets with air conditioners at attractive rates.

ILORIN BUSINESS SCHOOL

Ilorin Business School was established by the University Management as an autonomous unit to handle all programmes of the former faculty Professional Programmes (FAPP) of the old Faculty of Business and Social Sciences. The School pursues its statutory mandate of graduate training and research through an online application and admission processes after conducting its qualifying examinations.

Some departments are in the process of proposing innovative professional programmes for the school to further boost the prospect of the school. The School is in the process of reaching out to Faculties and Departments on the need to propose innovative professional programmes to Ilorin Business School.

2. Professional Training and Certification Centre

Asides the degree programmes, the school is equally better placed to undertake professional trainings and certifications in all careers.

3. Lecture Series and Conferences

The school has the potential to drive lecture series, conferences and seminars for the purpose of gathering more initiatives from other business schools both within and abroad.

The change in the required industrial skills and knowledge as a result of the emerging technology-driven society opened ways for many professional programmes across all disciplines to be housed by Ilorin Business School.

STUDENTS' REGISTRATION

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE FOR FRESH STUDENTS

STEP1: BIO-DATAREGISTRATION

- 1. Once you have been cleared, visit the University of Ilorin Website (www.unilorin.edu.ng) and click on the **Undergraduate Portal** link.
- 2. Click on the **Login** link on the Portal and login using your JAMB Registration Number as Login ID and Surname as your default password.
- 3. Fill the displayed Bio-data template carefully. You will be required to change your initial Password from your Surname to a new one which should be confidential and known to you alone. You are advised to choose a password that is difficult to guess but easy for you to remember. In case you forget your password, the password recovery is available online after payment of necessary charges. Please ensure that the spellings and arrangements of your names are correct because no change is allowed after Matriculation.

STEP2: COURSE REGISTRATION

4.

- a. After the completion of the Steps above, click on **Course Registration** link to proceed with your course registration.
- b. Print out your preliminary course registration form and forward to your Level Adviser, who should authenticate the courses you have selected before payment. Once you register for wrong courses you will need to use Add/Drop form to make amendment(s).

NOTE: Any Student who fails to authenticate the selected courses with the Level Adviser **before payment**, does so at his own risk.

c. After authentication, go back to the website and register as advised by your Level Adviser.

d. Your customized charges and levies would be displayed and you would be requested to make online payment for approved charges, using your ATM Verve or Master Card.

NOTE: Students are expected to pay the prevailing bank charges in addition to the main University charges and therefore, must ensure that there is enough balance in their bank account to accommodate the charges.

- e. If payment is successful, you are to print the payment receipt and four copies of the final course form.
- f. Present the copies to your Level Adviser and Faculty Officer for appropriate signatures and collect the original copy from the Faculty Office. Keep your copy safely as you would need it for your Examinations.

PLEASE NOTE THAT YOUR REGISTRATION IS INCOMPLETE EVEN AFTER SUBMISSION ONLINE UNTIL YOUR FORMS ARE ENDORSED BY YOUR LEVEL ADVISER AND FACULTY OFFICER WITHIN THE REGISTRATION PERIOD.

ADD AND/OR DROP FORM

NOTE: The form can be accessed after 3 weeks of registration. Processing of ADD/DROP Form is done on Semester basis and all procedures for actualizing ADD/DROP must be completed within the stipulated period.

PROCEDURE FOR ADD/DROP

Students who have concerns regarding registration (e.g., error in registration) can add or drop courses. This should be done online without downloading any form by the affected students. The concerned students are required to pay online and effect changes as recommended by their Level Adviser and as approved by the Head of Department. Students should note that ADD/DROP of courses should be done within the period stipulated online by the University as lateness will not be condoned.

1. Adding of Courses

A student may add a course by completing the Add and Drop Form before the end of the third week of the semester in which the course is being offered.

2. **Dropping of Courses**

A student may drop a course or courses by completing the Add and Drop Form before the end of the fifth week of the Semester in which the course(s) is being offered. Any student who withdraws from a course without acceptable explanation after half of it has been given, shall be deemed to have failed the course.

All Registration and Add and Drop Forms must be duly signed by the Dean of the Faculty, the Head of Department and the Faculty Officer.

PAYMENT PROCEDURE

Students are to note that all payments **shall be online** and shall be through the use of ATM cards as indicated on the University Portal.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE FOR RETURNING STUDENTS

- 1. Visit the Unilorin Website (www.unilorin.edu.ng) and click on the **Undergraduate Portal** link.
- Click on Login link on the Portal and login using your Matriculation Number as Login ID and Surname as your Default password.
- 3. You are required to change your initial Password from your Surname to a new one which should be confidential and known only to you. You are advised to choose a password that is difficult to guess but memorable to you. In case you forget your password, the password recovery is available online after payment of necessary charges.
- 4. Please be mindful of the spellings and arrangements of your names during registration.

NOTE: If you are a student of the University of Ilorin and your name does not appear on the Good Standing List, interact with your Level Adviser to confirm your status.

GOOD STANDING

- If you are in Good Standing or on Probation, click on Course Registration link and register for appropriate and relevant courses. You are to register for courses failed before registering for current level courses. Seek guidance from your Level Adviser.
- 2. Print out preliminary Course Registration Form and present to your Level Adviser, who should authenticate the courses you have selected before you make payment.
- 3. After authentication, go back to the website and register as advised by your Level Adviser.
- 4. Your customized charges and levies would be displayed and you would be requested to make online payment for approved charges, using your ATM Verve or Master Card.

NOTE: Students are expected to pay the prevailing bank charges in addition to the main University charges and therefore, must ensure that there is enough balance in their bank account to accommodate the charges.

5. If payment is successful, you are to print the payment receipt and four copies of the final course form.
6. Present the copies to your Level Adviser and Faculty Officer for appropriate signatures and collect the original copy from the Faculty Office. Keep your copy safely as you would need it for your Examinations.

NOTE: Any Student who fails to authenticate selected courses before payment does so at his own risk. Once you pay and register for courses you are not expected to offer, you will need to use the Add/Drop form to make amendment(s).

IF NOT IN GOOD STANDING

If you are not in good standing, further instructions would be displayed as you may no longer be able to continue with your current programme. You are then advised to download a change of course form, on account of not being in good standing (where applicable). This attracts an online payment of Two Thousand Naira (\$\frac{1}{2}2000.00)

only or as may be reviewed by the University.

Steps on Change of Course(s)

- 1. Click on **Change of Course** link
- 2. Make online payment for Change of Course form on account of not being in good standing (provided you are qualified)
- 3. Download the form
- 4. Complete the form manually
- 5. Submit duly approved Transfer Form to the Directorate of Academic Support Services for processing and subsequent registration.
- 6. Applicants from the following Faculties with less than the required CGPA may transfer, on account of not being in good standing, to programmes for which they qualify:

 - b. Clinical Sciences (Nursing), and

ADD AND/OR DROP FORM

NOTE: The form can be accessed after 3 weeks of registration. Processing of ADD/DROP Form is done on Semester basis and all procedures for actualizing ADD/DROP must be completed within the stipulated period.

Procedures for ADD/DROP

There are two procedures involved. The first is for students who are still within the range of 48 maximum credits and the other is for those seeking to register above 48 credits per session.

(A) Students Within the Approved Maximum of 48 Credits

students who have concerns regarding registration (e.g., error in registration) can add or drop courses. This should be done online without downloading any form by the affected students. The concerned students are required to pay online and effect changes as

recommended by their Level Adviser and approved the Head of Department. Students should note that ADD/DROP of courses should be done within the period stipulated online by the University as lateness will not be condoned.

1. Adding of Courses

A student may add a course by completing the Add and Drop Form before the end of the third week of the semester in which the course is being offered.

2. Dropping of Courses

A student may drop a course or courses by completing the Add and Drop Form before the end of the fifth week of the Semester in which the course(s) is being offered. Any student who withdraws from a course without acceptable explanation after half of it has been given, shall be deemed to have failed the course.

All Registration and Add and Drop Forms must be duly signed by the Dean of the Faculty, the Head of Department and the Faculty Officer.

(B) Procedure for Additional Credit(s) Above the 48 Credits Limit

- 1. Payment for the Additional credit(s) is done at the prevailing cost, which must be online.
- 2. The form is printed online from the portal and manually completed.

Note that the permission of the Head of Department and approval of the Dean are required when you are adding above the maximum of 24 credits allowed per semester.

- 3. The form is to be forwarded to the Deputy Registrar (Academic Support Services) through the Dean with a copy of Course Registration Form and payment receipt attached to the form and the approval of the Dean, as in (2) above.
- 4. After approval by Academic Support Services, changes requested will be effected and an alert will also be sent to the concerned student who should print a new Course Registration Form from the portal. This form supersedes the earlier one.

- The approved Additional Credit Form; Payment Receipt and old Course Form must be attached to the new Course Form and forwarded to the Level Adviser and Faculty Officer for endorsement.
- 6. Please note that the Academic Support Services will not treat any request for more than 24 credits per semester, if all the requirements in (2) and (3) are not met.

PLEASE NOTE THAT YOUR REGISTRATION IS NOT COMPLETE EVEN AFTER SUBMISSION ONLINE UNTIL YOUR FORMS ARE ENDORSED BY YOUR LEVEL ADVISER AND FACULTY OFFICER WITHIN THE REGISTRATION PERIOD.



- **1.** Instruction shall be by Courses, except the MB;BS in the Faculty of Clinical Sciences.
- 2. The Courses are quantified into credits: Courses shall be assigned 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6 credits. No Course shall carry more than 6 credits except with special permission of Senate on the recommendation of the Faculty Board concerned.
- **3.** (a) One credit shall be a series of 15 one-hour lectures or tutorials, or two hours of seminar, or three hours of Laboratory or field work.
- **4.** A session consists of 2 semesters, each of 15 weeks of lectures
- 5. Long vacation period is 12 weeks
- **6.** (a) Undergraduate Courses shall be numbered as follows:

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101	-	199
201	-	299
301	-	399
401	-	499
501	-	599

Students admitted through UTME or Remedial shall normally start with 101 – 199 courses, while those admitted with GCE "A" Level or approved equivalent shall normally start with 201 – 299 courses. Students admitted into the B. Agric. Extension and Community Development programme in the Faculty of Agriculture shall normally start from 301 – 399 courses.

- (b) However, Direct Entry students may be required to take 100 level courses to satisfy specific programme requirements.
- (c) Senate may, on the recommendation of the Faculty Board, permit a student to start at any other level.
- **7.** Appropriate Pre-requisite and/or Concurrent requirements may be prescribed for courses.
- **8.** A student shall take courses prescribed for his degree programme and approved by Senate on the recommendation of the Faculty Board.
- 9. (a) Every full-time student may register for not less than 15 or more than 24 credits per semester. However, after due consideration, the Dean upon the recommendation of the student's Academic Adviser may approve not more than 2 extra credits per semester for a student.
 - (b) Students who have any outstanding credits at the end of Their Final Year should, in any subsequent semester during which they are enrolled in the University, register for not less than a minimum of 5 credits per semester including those allotted to any compulsory and /or required courses they might have failed
- **10. Deferment of Admission:** The University does not defer admission for candidates.

11. Graduation Requirements

To be eligible for the award of a degree, a student, including MB;BS., must pass all prescribed courses including those earned in GNS 111, 112, 211, 212 and 311, and GSE 301.

12. Final Year Screening Exercise

- (i) The screening exercise should commence at the 300 level so as to enable students have enough time for screening before graduation;
- (ii) The screening committee should present its report at least two weeks before the commencement of each semester examinations;
- (ii) A new verification fee of №3,500 or such amount as agreed to at the parley between the University Administration and

representatives of the students' Union, as directed by Senate, be approved;

- (iii) All copies of external results obtained for screening purpose be kept centrally in the Admission Office;
- (iv) A late verification fee of №1,500 shall be paid by students who are late for verification;
- (v) The time line during which a student should conclude verification shall not exceed one academic session following a student's completion of academic graduation requirements.

13. Waivers for Overstayed Students with not more than two Outstanding Courses (not applicable to students who matriculated after 2011/2012 session)

Any student who had exhausted his year(s) of stay in the University but still falls short of normal graduation requirements, by <u>NOT MORE THAN TWO COURSES</u> will be processed for graduation with a Pass Degree irrespective of his CGPA.

14. Status of a Course

A course shall be classified as "Compulsory", "Required" or "Elective" in a given degree programme of the University.

(a) Compulsory Courses:

These are courses within the student's discipline which must be taken and passed. Marks scored will count towards graduation and student cannot graduate without passing them.

(b) Required Courses:

These are courses outside the student's discipline, i.e., a Subsidiary course that must be taken and passed.

(c) Elective Courses:

These are courses within and/ or outside a student's discipline from which a student may select a number for the purpose of fulfilling the requirements for the award of the Degree. However, in order to graduate, a student must pass enough elective courses to meet the minimum number of Credits required for the award of the degree.

15. Course Requirements

Each student shall satisfy the specific requirements of his Degree Programme as contained in the Faculty entries.

16. Transfer Cases

(a) The University will entertain cases of students wishing to transfer from the University as a normal expression of their choice.

- (b) The University also welcomes request(s) from candidates for transfer into her Programmes on the following conditions:
 - Suitability based on the prevailing Unilorin admission requirements at the year of admission into his previous University;
 - ii. Minimum CGPA of 3.00;
 - iii. Payment of the prevailing Transfer/Acceptance fee;
 - iv. Good conduct; and
 - v. Spend a minimum of two sessions in the University before graduation.

17. Admission to and Withdrawal from Courses:

(a) Registration of Courses

Registration for course or courses must be done during the first two weeks of the first semester. There is penalty for late registration.

(b) Late Registration

Late Registration closes at the end of the 4th week of the first Semester after which a student is deemed to have voluntarily withdrawn.

18. Intra-University Transfer

Only students who are not in good academic standing at the end of a Session shall be allowed to transfer to other programmes within the University, subject to the following guidelines.

- (a) The maximum number of years a transferred student can spend on a programme shall be counted from the time he/she starts the new programme.
- (b) The number of transfers a student can enjoy within the University shall not exceed one.
- (c) A student transferring to a new programme must satisfy the basic admission requirements for the new programme at time of first registration, and take the package of courses prescribed for the new programme in order to meet the requirements for the award of the degree.
- (d) Transfer shall only take place at the beginning of a new academic session.
- (e) On the approval of a transfer (change of major subject) by the Head(s) of Department(s) and Dean(s) concerned, a letter shall be issued by the Registrar to the student and copied to the relevant Head(s) of Department(s) and Dean(s) indicating the transfer (change of major subject) that has been approved.

19. Continuous Evaluation

- (a) Continuous assessment shall constitute at least 30% in theoretical questions and 40% in practical questions of the marks assigned to the course, except in some programmes (MB; BS., DVM. etc.) where the progressive assessment carries 50% of the overall marks assigned to a subject/course. However, Continuous Assessment which should be conducted at least twice before the Examination, will now carry a minimum of 40% with effect from 2015/2016 academic session.
- (b) Continuous Assessment should be carried out at least two (2) weeks before the commencement of Examination, this would ensure that students have a good opportunity to improve on their grades.

20. Examinations

- (a) Each course shall normally be examined at the end of the semester in which it is completed. Not more than one course shall be examined in one paper.
- (b) Examination shall last a minimum of one-hour (except for computer based courses which may vary as appropriate) and not more than three courses can be examined at the same level in a day.
- (c) A pass letter grade in any course shall be one of the letters A, B, C, D and E while F denotes failure except in peculiar programmes.
- (d) (i) A student can only repeat a course if he/she failed it on an earlier occasion, and
 - (ii) Where a course has been repeated, the Grade Points earned at all attempts shall count towards the Cumulative Grade Point Average.
- (e) All grades must be uploaded onto the University portal and submitted through the Dean's Office to the Academic Support Services not later than four (4) weeks after the examinations.
- (f) Results of all courses including Computer Based

- Examinations (CBE) that involve External Examiners shall be released only after they have been approved by the External Examiner(s).
- (g) For the regulations governing the conduct of examinations in the University, see relevant
- (h) section on Conduct of Examination in this Academic Programme.
- (i) Official Transcripts of examination shall be issued to students on request and payment of prescribed fees

21. Scoring and Grading System for 2014/2015 intake

- (a) One of the letter grades A, B, C, D, E and F shall be used in reporting a student's performance in a course.
- (b) Letter grade, where applicable, shall be assigned to percentage scores and carry grade points as tabulated below:

- (c) Every course lecturer shall report a student's performance in both marks and letter grades at the end of each semester.
- i. Commencement of full implementation of the Four (4) Point Grading System as prescribed by NUC is with effect from the 2015/2016 academic session. Consequently, the pass mark for all courses including GNS and GSE will be 45% as well as a minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 1.50 for good standing. However, there are exceptions as contained in sections 22 and 23.
- ii. The new 4 Point Grading System will be reflected as follows:

(d) Grade Point Average (GPA)

A student's semester Grade Point Average (GPA) shall be computed by multiplying the Grade Point (GP) attained in each course by the course credit(s), and then summing these up and dividing by the total credits taken for the semester, where applicable.

(e) Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)

Where applicable, a Student's Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is the up-to- date grade point based on all previous results. To compute the CGPA for a student, the Grade Points multiplied by the respective course credits for all the Semesters are added and then divided by the total credits of all courses registered for by the student.

22. Examiners

(a) (i) For each course, there shall be a panel of not less than three Internal Examiners.

One of them shall normally be the Head of Department, who shall be designated

the Chief Examiner and shall have overall responsibility for Examinations within the Department.

- (ii) The Panel shall set, moderate the questions and mark the answer scripts. The computer-based examinations shall also be moderated. Panel members shall also jointly sign the draft question papers and the examination results before the latter are submitted to the Dean of the Faculty.
- (iii) The absence of one member of a Panel shall not affect the validity of a draft question paper or an Examination Result.
- (b) External Examiners shall be appointed to participate in the evaluation of all final year as well as other levels where applicable and submit a report on the same to the Vice-Chancellor coping both the Dean of Faculty and the Head of Department concerned.

23. Good Academic Standing

(a) For 100 Level Students

For a 100-level student to remain in good academic standing (i.e., not be advised to withdraw from the University) the following conditions must be satisfied:

- i. Student in the Faculties of Agriculture, Arts, Communication & Information Sciences, Education, Environmental Sciences, Law, Life Sciences, Management Sciences, Physical Sciences and Social Sciences as well as Nursing Science in the Faculty of Clinical Sciences must maintain a Grade Point Average (GPA) of at least 1.50 at the end of the academic year.
- ii. Students in Faculty of Engineering and Technology must have a Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.00 and in addition must have passed at least 75% of the credit loading in each of Physics and Mathematics and at least 60% of the Credit loading in Chemistry.
- iii. Students in the Faculty of Basic Medical and Nursing Science must obtain a GPA of 2.00 at the end of academic year, except MB;BS students who must obtain a GPA of at least 3.00 as well as obtaining a weighted average of 50% in all subjects offered. However, students who scored less than 50% in not more than two courses, but still obtain a GPA of 3.00 will be deemed to still be in good standing.
- iv. At 100 Level, students of Optometry and Vision Science programme must have a GPA of 3.00 to be in good standing.
- v. The pass mark for 200 Level courses and above is 50%, except for GNS and GSE courses which have 45% as pass mark. However, for a student to be in good standing, he must not fail more than two courses and must have a minimum CGPA of 3.00.
- vi. Any student with GPA less than 3.00 at the end of the academic year will be asked to withdraw from the department. Any failed course from 200 Level can be carried over to the next level as long as the credit load limit allows. However, a student in Optometry will not be allowed to register for clinical courses without passing all the carried over course(s).

- vii. At 100 Level, students of Nursing Science Programme must obtain Pass grades in Chemistry, Biology, Mathematics and Physics, plus any two other Science courses to qualify for 200 level (pre-Clinical courses)
- viii. Students in the Faculties of Pharmaceutical Sciences and Veterinary Medicine must obtain a GPA of 2.40 at the end of the academic year. Students in Pharmacy must obtain 60% in PCP 403(Pharmacy Jurisprudence, Regulation & Control), PCP 402 (Pharmacy Management), PCP 504 (Ethical Dispensing Practical), PCT 303 (Theory of Dispensing) and PCT 304 (Dispensing Practical). However, students who scored less than 50% in not more than two courses, but still obtain a minimum GPA of 2.40 for B.Pharm. will be deemed to still be in good standing.

(b) For 200, 300, 400, 500 and 600 Level Students

For a student to be in good academic standing in the Faculties of Agriculture, Arts, Basic Medical Sciences, Communication & Information Sciences, Education, Engineering and Technology, Environmental Sciences, Law, Life Sciences, Management Sciences, Physical Sciences and Social Sciences a minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 1.50 must be maintained at the end of each academic year. A student in the Doctor of Optometry and Vision Science (OD) programme must obtain at least 50% in all courses offered and maintain a minimum CGPA of 3.00.

24. Probation

For 200,300 and 400 Level Students

- (a) A fresh student in the Faculties of Agriculture, Arts, Basic Medical Sciences, Clinical Sciences (Nursing Sciences), Communication & Information Sciences, Education, Engineering and Technology, Environmental Sciences Law, Life Sciences, Management Sciences, Physical Sciences and Social Sciences whose Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is below 1.50 at the end of a particular session shall be on probation for one academic year. For other Faculties/Programmes probation is as follows:
 - i. Pharmaceutical Sciences and Veterinary Medicine CGPA less than 2.40
 - ii. Optometry & Vision Sciences CGPA less than 3.00

Fresh 200/300 level students, (including transferred students) shall not be on probation and shall be required to withdraw from the University.

- (b) A student on probation shall be so informed in writing by the Registrar through the Faculty Officer indicating the number of extra Grade Points the student needs to remove the deficiency in his academic records in order to be in good academic standing at the end of the "probationary period".
- (c) A student whose Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is found to be at least 1.50 at the end of a probationary period, shall be restored to normal student status and be informed in writing by the Registrar through the Faculty Officer.
- (d) In the Faculty of Clinical Sciences, a medical student is allowed to repeat the year and

subjects failed at all levels except 100 level.

25. Clarification

- (i) A fresh 100 level student who is not in good academic standing as specified in 22 above at the end of his 100 level shall be advised to withdraw from the University.
- (ii) A fresh 200 or 300 level student who is not in good academic standing as specified in 22 above at the end of his first year shall be advised to withdraw from the University.
- (iii) A fresh student who has been advised to withdraw from the programme because he/she fails to satisfy some other requirements for good academic standing and is absorbed into another programme at 200 level, shall be on probation if he/she is not in good academic standing at the end of his first year in the new programme.
- (iv) In the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, a student cannot carry over any course from 100 and 200 levels (i.e., pre-Clinical phase) to 300 or 400 level (i.e., Para-Clinical phase) and from Para-Clinical phase to 500 or 600 level (i.e., Clinical phase).

26. Withdrawal

A student whose Cumulative Grade Point Average is below 1.50 or 2.40 (as applicable to different programmes) at the end of the probationary period shall be advised to withdraw from the

programme to which he was admitted.

Faculty of Clinical Sciences

- i. Having repeated the year and the examinations, a student who fails the examinations will be required to withdraw from the medical programme at 200, 300 and 400 Final MB;BS Part I, Part II and Part III Resit Examinations:
 - (a) A student who fails in any subject in each of these final examinations shall be required to write the papers failed within three months of the initial attempt.
 - (b) Any student who fails the second attempt shall be required to repeat the year (including Clerkship and Progressive Assessment in the subject failed) before the third and final attempt.
 - (c) Thereafter if the student fails, he shall be required to withdraw from the Medical Programme. However, a student at Parts II and III shall be allowed an additional Resit Examination. Thereafter, if the student fails, he then withdraws from Medical programme.

Clarification

Withdrawal here means withdrawal from a Programme rather than from a Faculty (except for fresh students who shall be advised to withdraw from the University) in accordance with the NUC directive on Minimum Academic Standards. This means that a student who is advised to withdraw from a programme may be absorbed into another programme even within the same Faculty/Department.

27. Maximum Time Permitted for a Degree

A maximum period of 5, 6, 7 or 8 years (as the case may be) is allowed for a 3-, 4-, 5- or 6-year's degree programme respectively for the award of a classified degree or unclassified degree (as the case may be). In the Faculties of Clinical Sciences, Life Sciences (OD. Optometry) and Veterinary Medicine, a maximum period of 11 years is allowed.

28. Classification of Degrees

Four classes of Degree shall be awarded based on the Cumulative Grade Point Average as follows:

Second Class Honours	2.40 - 3.49
Third Class Honours	1.50 - 2.39

The MB;BS, B.Pharm., B.NSc., OD and D.VM degrees are not classified.

29. Absence from University Examinations

- (a) A grade of Incomplete (I) shall be awarded in a course to a student who completed the course except that he/she was absent from final examination in that course. However, upon a written application, a student who has been absent from an examination with reasonable excuse (supported by a certificate issued by the Director of Health Services if it is on the grounds of ill-health **or any proven cases of emergency**) may obtain permission of the Faculty Board to write a make-up examination.
- (b) Any student who obtains permission of the Faculty Board to write a make-up examination must take the examination before the end of third week of the following Semester, thereafter change of grade from incomplete result would be made to reflect his new grade.

A grade of Incomplete (I) shall revert to a Failure (F) by the end of the third week of the following Semester if the student has not applied for or has failed to obtain the permission of the Faculty Board for a make-up examination

30. Regulations Governing Students' Continuous Absence from the University

- (a) A student, who absents **himself** from the University for upwards of six weeks in a semester without written official permission, shall normally be deemed to have withdrawn from the University.
- (b) A student's actual attendance at lectures, tutorials, practical etc. is to be recorded. Any student who fails to attend up to 75% of any of the above shall not normally be allowed to sit for the examination in that course.

Absence from an examination shall normally result in failure of the Course. However, upon a written application, a student who has been

absent from an examination with reasonable excuse (supported by a certificate issued by the Director of Health Services, if it is on the grounds of ill-health **or proven cases of emergency/accident**) may obtain permission of the Faculty Board to write a make-up in the subsequent examination.



REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE CONDUCT OF UNIVERSITY EXAMINATIONS

GENERAL

Preamble

The University of Ilorin Act, Cap. 455, Laws of the Federation of Nigeria, 2010 (as amended) provides that it shall in particular, be the function of the Senate to make provision for the organisation and control of courses of study at the University, and of the examinations held in relation to those courses, including the appointment of Internal and External Examiners.

Definition of Terms

(a) University Examinations

University Examinations include **semester**, **professional** and other **examinations** involving the participation of the Department, Faculty and the Examinations Office.

(b) Continuous Assessment/Progressive Assessment

The term continuous assessment means course tests, practical works, tutorial and Other graded assignments done within the Department/Faculty where the course is being taught.

(c) Semester

A semester is one-half of an academic year as determined by Senate.

(d) Session

A Session consists of two semesters otherwise referred to as an Academic Year as determined by Senate.

(e) Course Credit

One Credit represents 15 hours of lecture/tutorial or 45 hours of practical work per semester.

Two Credits represent 30 hours of lecture/tutorial or 90 hours of practical work per semester.

Three Credits represent 45 hours of lecture/tutorial or 135 hours of practical work per semester and so on.

There are courses that are purely theoretical or practical, while some others are a combination of both

ORGANIZATION OF EXAMINATIONS

A. Internal Examiners

For each course, there shall be a Panel of Examiners, which shall consist of not less than three (3) Internal Examiners. The Head of Department shall be designated the Chief Examiner. A Part-time Lecturer may be appointed an Examiner based on a special case made by the Head of the Department concerned. The Internal Examiners, for all courses in each semester, shall be appointed by Senate on the recommendation of the Head of Department and the Faculty Board concerned.

- (i) The panel shall set and moderate the questions and mark the examination answer scripts. Panel members shall also jointly sign the draft question papers and the examination results before they are submitted to the Examinations Officer.
- (ii) Each Faculty shall set up a Board of Examiners consisting of the Dean of the Faculty all the members of the Panel of Examiners in the Faculty and the External Examiners (where applicable). The Dean shall be the Chairman of the Board of Examiners and shall sign the provisional results.
- (iii) The Departmental Examination Committee including the external examiner (where applicable) shall consider the results before forwarding same to the Faculty Board of Examiners.
- (iv) Duties enumerated in (i-iii) above apply also to Computer Based Tests and Examinations

The **Departmental Examination Committee**, having received and considered reports of the panel of examiners, shall advise Senate through the Faculty Board of Examiners, on the results of the examinations in the Faculty and matters arising therefrom.

B. External Examiners

(i) Early in the Harmattan Semester of each Session, Senate shall, on the recommendation of the Faculty Board concerned, appoint at least one External Examiner for courses taken in the final year of a Degree, Diploma or Certificate Programme. In the case of the Faculty of Clinical Sciences, External Examiners shall be required to moderate the First Professional and Final MB;BS. Examinations (Part I, Part II and Part III).

For Veterinary Medicine – External Examiner shall be required to moderate questions and conduct Oral Examination for completed courses at both Harmattan and Rain semesters for 200 – 600 Levels.

For Pharmaceutical Science – External Examiners shall also be appointed for oral examination of 400(PCP 401 and PCP 404) and 500 (PCP 503 and PCP 506) level courses.

For the B.NSc, External Examiners shall be required to moderate the Registered Nurse Certificate (RN Examinations), Registered Midwife Certificate (RM Examinations) and Registered Public Health Nurse Certificate Examinations as provided by the relevant Professional Bodies. In addition, External Examiners shall be appointed by the University to moderate the final B.NSc. Examinations.

- (ii) External Examiners shall be appointed annually and shall not serve for more than two years in the first instance renewable once. At the time of nomination of External Examiners, their titles and/or current academic appointments, degrees, relevant professional qualifications, and/or current University appointment shall be stated.
 - An External Examiner shall normally be a Professor or in any case not below the rank of a Senior Lecturer or its equivalent from a recognized University/Research Institute.
- (iii)There shall be at least one External Examiner from outside Nigeria per Faculty.
- (iv) The External Examiners shall be paid such remunerations for their services as may be determined from time to time by Senate.
- (v) The duties of External Examiners shall be to:
- (a) participate in the evaluation of all courses examined in the final year and other levels of a degree programme as applicable;
- (b) satisfy themselves as to the appropriateness of the question papers, having regard to the approved course contents and the level of the examination;
- (c) mark, or to revise, where applicable, the marking of scripts of candidates in consultation with the Chief Examiners of the courses:
- (d) attend such practical or oral examinations, where applicable, as they may themselves determine in consultation with the Chief Examiners of the courses;
- (e) participate in the proceedings of the meeting of the Departmental/Faculty/College Board of Examiners (as appropriate) in the determination of results; and

(f) submit a report to the Vice Chancellor and copy the Dean and Head of Department at the completion of the examination.

C. Duties of Examinations Officer

The Examinations Officer (who shall be based in the Registry) shall:

- i. call for lists of External Examiners from the Faculties for the approval of Senate at the beginning of each session;
- ii. call for lists of Internal Examiners from the Faculties at the beginning of each semester for the approval of Senate;
- iii. write letters of appointment to approved External Examiners and make **arrangements** for their accommodation and payment of remuneration;
- iv. convene as early as possible in the semester, at the instance of Chairman of Time-Table and Room Usage Committee, a meeting of Faculty Sub-Deans and Examinations Coordinators for coordination purposes, such as avoiding timetable and room usage clashes;
- v. call for the order of examination materials at the beginning of each semester, acquire sufficient examination materials as required by Faculties and ensure sufficient stock for at least one Semester at any given time;
- vi. acquire sufficient examination materials as required by Faculties and ensure sufficient stock for at least one semester at any given time:
- vii. inform the Director of Health Services of the dates of **examinations** and request **him** to arrange for at least one University Medical Officer to be on call, for the purpose of attending to candidates for the whole period of the examinations;
- viii.monitor the conduct of Entrance/Qualifying examinations for admission into relevant Certificate and Diploma Programmes;
- ix. attend each Faculty Board of Examiner's meeting to ascertain correctness of marks and application of University Regulations governing the Degree/Certificate/Diploma classification;
- x. transmit the recommendations of the Faculty Board of Examiners on the results and matters arising therefrom to Senate for consideration
- xi. issue comprehensive transcripts on behalf of the University to students and graduates of this University;
- xii. make available to students and Chief Invigilators/Invigilators appropriate portions of the examination regulations through the Faculty Officer before each semester examinations;

- xiii.request for, and publish the name of students who, even though duly registered for certain courses, are not eligible to take the examinations in those courses (see section on Eligibility);
- xiv.oversee the general conduct of all examinations;
- xv. Inform the Director of Security of the dates and venues of examinations and request him to arrange for adequate security.

D. Sub-Dean/Faculty Examinations Co-ordinator

Each Faculty shall have a Faculty Examination co-ordinator, who shall be elected/appointed by the Faculty, provided such elected or appointed Officer shall not be below the rank of a Senior Lecturer.

Duties

The Faculty Sub-Dean, in conjunction with the Faculty Officer, shall;

- i. be responsible for the proper conduct of examinations taken in the Faculty;
- ii. request Heads of Departments to submit, on prescribed forms, information on the examinations, including the list of courses to be examined during the semester for the purpose of preparing the examination time-table;
- iii. request examination materials from the Examination Officer as soon as possible and take delivery of them at least two weeks before the commencement of the examinations;
- iv. liaise with other Faculty Sub-Deans within the Time-Table & Room Usage Committee where necessary, for the purpose of coordination, such as avoiding examination time-table clashes for courses that cut across Faculties and making arrangements for examination venues:
- v. prepare the time-table for examinations to be held in the Faculty. The Final Time-table shall be published on Notice Boards and the University/Faculty website for students' information, at least three weeks before the commencement of the examinations. Where any alterations are made, affected students must be duly informed latest three (3) working days before the examination is held;
- vi. obtain a list of academic staff from Heads of Departments, and prepare invigilation Schedule for the examinations in the Faculty and circulate it at least two weeks before the commencement of the examinations;
- vii. mobilize Faculty and Departmental non-academic staff to assist in the day- to-day conduct of examinations in the Faculty;

viii.receive answer scripts from Chief invigilators and ensure that examiners sign for the answer scripts on collection.

E. Duties of Chief Examiner

The Head of Department, who shall normally be the Chief Examiner for all the courses to be examined in the Department, shall:

- be the Chairman of the Departmental Panel of Examiners to consider results of all examinations conducted by the Department before they are forwarded to the Faculty Board of Examiners.
- ii. be responsible for the production of question papers for courses to be examined in his Department in accordance with the regulations. Questions of all final year examinations in Degree Programmes shall be moderated by the External Examiners before Examinations can be conducted. At the end of each examination, the Chief Examiner shall deposit, with the Departmental Examinations Officer the moderated question papers.
- iii. ensure that drafts are written legibly on the prescribed forms supplied by the Examinations Officer. The draft must contain all the necessary information and must be signed by at least one of the Internal Examiners concerned and the Chief Examiner;
- iv. seal securely and keep custody of question papers until they are required.
- V. Oversee the computation and loading of Final Year Results, prepare and publish the results of all courses, taught by the department for presentation to the Faculty Board of Examiners; and
- vi. submit to the University Librarian three copies of each examination question paper at the end of each semester examinations, where applicable.

F. Question Papers

- i. All examiners shall strictly preserve the secrecy of question papers at all stages until the examination.
- ii. All courses shall normally be examined at the end of the semester in which they are offered except in the Faculty of Clinical Sciences.

iii. The duration of written examinations shall range from a minimum of one hour to a maximum of three hours with the exception of practical courses.

The security of examination question papers shall be the joint responsibility of the Internal Examiners, Chief Examiner and the Faculty Sub-Dean.

G. Eligibility

- i) All students who are duly registered for courses in a given semester are eligible to sit for examinations in those courses except students in the following categories:
- a) a student who absents himself from the University for upward of six weeks in any semester without official permission. Such a student shall normally be deemed to have voluntarily withdrawn from the University:
- b) **a** student who fails to attend up to 75% practical/lecture hours; and
- c) a student on suspension for one reason or another.
- **ii**) The Examinations Officer shall request from Heads of Departments the names of students who are not eligible under the above regulations and the titles and code numbers of the courses concerned.

The information must be received by the Examinations Officer for the semester and must be published by him to the students within one week of receipt.

H. Examination Time-Table

- i) Examination time-table shall be prepared by the Faculty Sub-Deans in liaison with the Examinations Officer within the Time-Table & Room Usage Committee
- ii) All Faculty Examinations Officers shall meet to prepare a workable Time table within the Time-Table & Room Usage Committee.
- iii) As far as possible, examinations for the same Faculty shall be scheduled for the same hall.
- iv) As far as possible, not too many courses shall be scheduled, to hold simultaneously in one hall.

As far as possible, a student shall not normally be required to sit for more than two examinations on the same day.

I. Examination Accommodation

- i. All University Examinations shall be held in halls, rooms or laboratories approved by the University.
- ii. All Faculty Examinations Officers/Sub-Deans shall meet to arrange the usage of available halls, lecture rooms and laboratories/lecture theatres among the Faculties.
- iii. Sitting arrangement should be made in such a way to make possible for the invigilators to reach candidates with ease.
 - i. A large clock or clocks from which time for the examination shall be determined shall be prominently displayed before and visible to all candidates.

J. Examination Materials

(a) The Examinations Officer shall arrange to supply and/or allow the use of the

following materials:

i. formats for drafting examination questions;

ii format for score sheets;

iii. **answer** booklets and supplementary sheets, including graph papers, shall be regarded as security materials and treated as such. Answer booklets and supplementary answer sheets shall be perforated at the top left-hand corners;

- iv. strings, stapling machines, pins, large envelops and jackets;
- v. a list of students registered for each course to be provided with the assistance of COMSIT:
- vi. attendance register (to be endorsed by Invigilators); and
- vii. **four**-figure table, statistical tables, chart tables, design aids and other authorized materials.

viii Staff, students and any other persons found in unauthorized possession of these materials shall be liable to disciplinary action.

CONDUCT OF EXAMINATIONS

A. Invigilation

${\bf (i)}\ Appointment\ of\ Chief\ Invigilators/Invigilators:$

A list of academic members of staff in each Department shall be prepared by the Faculty Officer who shall forward same to the Faculty Examination Coordinator (**Sub-Dean**) who shall in turn prepare the Invigilation Schedule in such a way that for every examination venue there shall be a Chief Invigilator, preferably a Professor.

(ii) Duties of Chief Invigilators

The Chief Invigilator shall:

- a) be responsible for the conduct of all the courses for examinations put under his care at any particular examination venue;
- b) collect from the Sub-Dean (Faculty Examination Co-ordinator) or Departmental Examination Officer as the case may be, the question papers in sealed packets at least half an hour before the examination is due to start. The sealed packets of examination papers shall be opened in the presence of the students at the time appointed for the commencement of the Examination;
- c) allow Examiners into the Examination Hall for as long as may be necessary in the first 30 minutes of the examination to correct possible error on the question papers;
- d) ensure that students are properly searched before or during any University examination for items, materials, etc., which are prohibited;
- e) ensure orderliness in the Examination Hall with the assistance of other Invigilators. Seats shall be arranged and numbered according to the number of groups taking examinations at each particular time and candidates shall be in the hall 30 minutes earlier than the commencement of each examination. He, with the assistance of other Invigilators, shall ensure that candidates keep strictly to the seating arrangements to avoid confusion;
- f) ensure that Invigilators exercise constant and vigilant supervision over the candidates:
- g) ensure, with the assistance of the invigilators, that the attendance sheet is duly signed by each student;
- h) ensure that silence is maintained by the students throughout the period of the examination. The only permissible way of attracting the attention of the invigilator shall be students' show of their hands:
- i) call the attention of students to the time, thirty minutes and five minutes before the close of the examination;
- j) at the end of each examination, check with the assistance of other Invigilators, the students' scripts against the signed attendance sheet and seal the scripts together with the attendance sheet and at least four copies of the question papers in special envelopes provided by the Senate and Examinations Office at the end of each examination. These packets shall be clearly identified as indicated on the envelopes. He shall deliver the sealed packets to the Faculty Examination Co-ordinator/Departmental Examination Officer (as

the case may be) duly signed for;

- k) make a report (using the prescribed forms) of cases of examination misconduct and other problems to the Dean concerned immediately such misconduct is detected. However, students involved in such acts of examination misconduct should normally be allowed to complete writing the examination(s) while appropriate indications are entered down the front page of the answer scripts immediately after the examination; and
- arrange, with the assistance of an invigilator, or any authorized person, to send any student who falls sick during examination to the Clinic for treatment and submit a report (using the prescribed form) to the Sub-Dean on the incidence.

iii. Duties of Invigilators

Invigilators shall:

- a) report to the Examination Hall thirty minutes before the commencement of the examination;
- b) assist the Chief Invigilator in the discharge of his duties;
- c) distribute question papers and necessary examination materials to candidates;
- d) constantly watch the candidates to prevent any malpractice;
- e) provide any legitimate aid immediately to any candidate who raises his hand to request for assistance;
- f) ensure that no candidate enters the venue of the examination with materials other than those allowed for that examination;
- g) search, with the assistance of Security Personnel, students before or during any University examination; and
- collect answer scripts from the students, arrange, count, crosscheck with the attendance register and hand them over to the Chief Invigilator for counter-endorsement.

iv) Disciplinary Action Against Erring Invigilators

Absence from or lateness to the examination hall by scheduled invigilators without permission or reasonable excuse, shall be a serious misconduct and shall attract appropriate disciplinary action.

A report of such absence or lateness shall be made by the Chief Invigilator to the Dean of the Faculty through the Sub-Dean.

v) Instructions to Students

a) Students shall always ensure that they acquaint themselves with

the examination regulations and instructions;

- b) Students shall attend the examinations punctually. Admittance into the examination hall more than half an hour after the examination has started shall only be at the discretion of the Chief Invigilator.
- c) Students shall bring with them to the examination hall their own ink, pen, ruler, erasers and pencils and any other materials which are permitted by these regulations (as stated here under). Accordingly, students are warned in their own interest to ensure that lecture notes, text-books, jotters, bags, handsets and other prohibited items are not brought anywhere close to the examination venue.
- d) Students must sign the attendance register at the beginning of each paper.
- e) Having signed the attendance register, no student shall leave the examination hall without submitting his answer script.
- f) No student shall leave the examination hall for whatever reason without informing the invigilator
- g) While the examination is in progress, communication of any kind between **students** shall strictly be prohibited and any **student** found to be giving or receiving irregular assistance commits a misconduct, **which shall attract appropriate sanction.**
- h) Silence shall be observed in the examination hall. The only permissible way of attracting the attention of the Invigilator is by a show of the hand.
- i) Smoking in and around the examination hall is strictly prohibited.
- j) The use of scrap paper is prohibited. All rough work shall be done in the answer booklet and crossed neatly through. Supplementary answer sheets which shall not be supplied until at least half-anhour after the commencement of the examination shall be stapled to the main answer booklet.
- k) Students taking Mathematics or Engineering Drawing and similar courses shall bring their own mathematical or drawing instruments, which should include compass and dividers, protractors, diagonal scales and set squares. Personal copies of Mathematical Tables may be allowed in the examination hall provided there are no inscriptions on them.
- 1) Before submitting their scripts at the end of the examination, students shall satisfy themselves that they have inserted at the

appropriate places their matriculation numbers and the numbers of the questions answered. Except for the question paper and any other materials, they may have legitimately brought with them (as indicated in rules (iii) and (viii) above), students shall not be allowed to remove or mutilate any paper or materials supplied by the University.

- m) Students shall use their matriculation numbers for all examinations. Students shall not be allowed to submit their answer scripts in the first thirty minutes and last fifteen minutes of any examination.
- n) Students shall remain seated while Invigilators organize the collection of answer scripts.
- o) Students must sign out on the attendance sheet at the submission of their answer scripts.
- p) Students intending to use calculators in any University Examination should comply with the following regulations:
 - (i) electronic calculators only as specified by their respective Department;
 - (ii) such calculators must be small (hand-held) and battery/solar-operated;
 - (iii) should not borrow another student's calculator as this practice shall be construed as giving or receiving irregular assistance during the examination;
 - (iv) instruction manuals including calculator packets and containers are prohibited in the examination hall as these often contain useful mathematical formulae and methods;
 - (v) Only one calculator per student is allowed in the examination hall:
 - (ii) Students shall make available for inspection by invigilators, their calculators on entry into the examination hall and any time during the examination.

A contravention of any of these regulations will be treated in the same way as cheating in an examination.

vi) Examination Offences and Penalties

1. Code of Conduct

Students shall:

i. use or consult during an examination only such books, papers, instruments or other materials or aids as are specifically

- permitted or provided by the Department in which the examination is being held;
- not introduce or attempt to introduce into examination venue hand bags, books, notes, instruments (handsets, i-pad/i-pod, flash drives and any other storage device) or other materials or aids that are not permitted;
- iii. not enter any examination venue with any inscription on any part of the dress or body e.g., palm, arm, thigh, etc. if such inscriptions bear any relevance to the examination;
- iv. not pass or attempt to pass any information from one person to another during an examination;
- v. neither act in collusion with any other candidate(s) or person(s) nor copy nor attempt to copy from another candidate, nor engage in any similar activity;
- vi. not disturb or distract any other candidate(s) during the examination;
- vii. only use their matriculation **numbers** for examination, (no names should be written);
- viii. not be allowed to leave an examination venue until after 75% of the time allocated for that particular paper has expired;
- ix. not write any University examination on behalf of others, nor other people write any university examination for them; and
- x. ensure that he submit the answer script and any extra sheet to the invigilator before leaving the examination hall.

Failure to observe any of the rules (i) to (x) above, shall prima facie constitute examination misconduct.

2. Procedure for investigating Alleged Examination Misconduct

- (a) At the discretion of the Chief Invigilator, a student may be required to leave the examination venue when his conduct is adjudged to be disturbing or likely to disturb the examination. The Chief Invigilator shall report immediately any such action taken to the Dean, through the Faculty Examination Coordinator (Sub-Dean), after the completion of the examination by the other students.
- (b) Any student suspected of any examination irregularity shall be required to sign and submit to the Chief Invigilator a written statement in the Examination Hall. Failure to make a written statement shall be regarded as an admission of the charge

against such a student. In any case, the students shall be allowed to finish his examination;

- (c) The Dean shall, within 48 hours of receipt of a report, send it to the Faculty Examination Malpractice Committee comprising not less than three academic staff to investigate the charge(s) and make available a report along with their records of proceedings and all other exhibits within four (4) weeks through the Deputy Registrar (Academic Support Services) to the Registrar who shall forward same to the Students' Disciplinary Committee; and
- (d) The Students' Disciplinary Committee shall within six weeks of receiving such a report, investigate and recommend the penalty in cases of proven misconduct to the Vice-Chancellor in accordance with section 17 of the University Act.

3. Penalties

- (i) Any candidate found cheating or aiding and abetting cheating in any examination shall be expelled from the University;
- (ii) In a situation where an individual, not registered for a particular course writes an examination on behalf of a **student**, **he** shall be handed over to the Law Enforcement Agents, if **he** is from outside the University, while the student so helped shall be **expelled** from the University. Where the individual is a student or staff, **he** and the **student** so helped shall be **expelled** or dismissed from the University (as the case may be)
- (iii) In a situation where a student sits for **an** examination in a course not registered **for**, **no score** shall be recorded for such a student.

vii. Examination Leakage

Where the Dean has reason to believe that the nature of any question or the content of any question paper may have become known before the date and time of the examination to any person(s) other than the Examiners and any Official of the University authorized to handle the question paper, he may order the suspension of the examination or the cancellation of the question paper or the setting of a new paper. He shall then investigate the leakage and report the matter to Senate through the Vice-Chancellor.

viii. Absence from Examinations

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- (i) Students shall present themselves at such University Examinations for which they have registered under these Regulations. Students who fail to do so, for reasons other than proven ill-health, accident or any proven emergencies shall be deemed to have failed that examination. Mis-reading/ignorance of the Time-Table and such other excuses shall not be accepted as a satisfactory explanation for absence.
- (ii) A student who falls ill during an examination period should report in writing to the Dean of his Faculty through his Head of Department.
- (iii) A student who is absent from an examination on account of ill-health confirmed by medical report from the Director of University Health Services may be given a make-up examination in the course(s) missed, based on guidelines approved by Senate. Otherwise, he shall take the regular examination on the following occasion as his make-up.
- (iv) Approval for make-up examination shall be by the Faculty Board, provided:
 - (a) the ill-health has been reported to the Dean through the Head of Department; and
 - (b) the student has obtained a written report from the Director of Health Services or his designate which either is dated prior to the end of the examination, or provides evidence that the student was hospitalized during the examination.
 - (v) Application for make-up examinations shall normally be made immediately at the end of the semester examinations.
 - (vi) make-up examination shall normally be concluded within the first five (5) weeks of the semester following the application for the make-up.

ix. Determination of Result

a. General

A student shall be deemed to have passed a first-degree examination if he has satisfied Senate in all the requirements for the examinations (including all **GNS& GSE** courses). A student who had been referred in any of these requirements shall be deemed to have passed that examination when he has fulfilled the requirements.

b. Pass Mark

The pass mark shall be 40% in all Faculties, except the MB;BS. and B.NSc. Programme of College of Health Sciences, DVM Programme in the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, B.Pharm. Programme in the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences and Doctor of Optometry (OD) programme in the Faculty of Life Sciences where it shall be 50%.

x. Make-up Examination

A Make-up Examination is an examination specially arranged for a student or group of students who could not sit for the normal examination due to ill-health or any other unavoidable circumstances as specified in d(i) above. Each case will, however, be treated on its merit. Following the conclusion of such examinations (normally within the first five (5) weeks of the new semester) the updated good standing result of such candidate shall be processed through the Deputy Registrar (Academic Support Services) to Senate for approval.

xi. Procedure for Result Verification

- (a) The student completes online "Result Verification Form" available on the University website.
- (b) The student submits the form to his Head of Department for onward transmission to the Deputy Registrar (Academic Support Services)
- (c) The HOD, within one week, shall issue to the student, the verified result either confirming the old score or reflecting the new one. A copy shall also be forwarded to the Deputy Registrar (Academic Support Services).
- (d) Where a review occurs, the HOD is under obligation to give reasons and forward a copy of the Verification Report through the Dean to the:
 - Director of Academic Planning and Deputy Registrar (Academic Support Services)
- (e) In case the student is still not satisfied with the result, he shall obtain a Re-mark Request Form from the Deputy Registrar (Academic Support Services). The Form shall be filled and submitted to the same office.
- (f) The Deputy Registrar (Academic Support Services) shall request for the Marking Scheme of the Course from the HOD concerned and forward it, together with all the scripts of the Course and the

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- Student's "Script Re-mark Request Form," to the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic).
- (g) The Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) shall pick at random, scripts including that of the complainant, and oversee the process of re-marking.
- (h) The Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic) shall submit a report to the Vice-Chancellor not later than four weeks from the submission of the "Scripts Re-mark Request Form".
- (i) The Vice-Chancellor, and the under-listed shall meet to consider the final report on the remark and forward same to Senate:
 - i. Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic)
 - ii. Dean of the concerned Faculty
 - iii. Director of Academic Planning
 - iv. Chairman, Committee of Provost and Deans
 - v. Dean, Student Affairs
 - vi. Head of Department concerned
 - vii. Deputy Registrar (Academic Support Services)
- (j) Where an examiner is found to have wilfully and deliberately victimized a student, the matter shall be referred to the Staff Disciplinary and Appeals Committee, otherwise the original result shall be upheld.

SENATE DECISIONS ON IMPROVEMENT OF THE CONDUCT OF EXAMINATIONS IN THE UNIVERSITY

A. Short-Term Measures

(i) Investigation of and Penalties for Examination Misconduct

- a. Any student established to be in possession of incriminating materials at the examination or involved in any other examination malpractice before, during or after an examination, including impersonation, shall be expelled from the University.
- b. The procedure of investigation shall be reviewed to ensure prompt treatment of all cases of examination malpractice to avoid delay in disposing reported cases. In this connection, each Faculty shall properly set up a Standing Committee to investigate reported cases of examination misconduct immediately after each Semester Examination such that all reports are received by the Registrar four weeks after examination.
- c. The Students' Disciplinary Committee shall treat prima facie cases within six weeks of receipt of reports from Faculties.
- d. All students suspected to be in any examination misconduct during any semester examination shall be required, in writing, to remain on campus after the semester examination to facilitate the process of investigation.

(ii) Handling of Answer Booklets

- (a) Every Faculty must ensure that all answer sheets for examinations carry the Faculty stamp and date of the examination. Any extra sheets given out must also be stamped as well. All Faculties must ensure that all answer scripts must carry the Faculty names.
- (b) Answer booklets shall be treated as security materials and shall be numbered serially, while it shall be an offence for anyone whether staff or students to put it to other use than it is meant for.
- (c) Invigilators must ensure that students write their matriculation numbers clearly on the answer booklets immediately before the commencement of the examinations to prevent swapping of booklets during and after the examination.
- (d) All answer sheets for examination are those produced for the Faculty and bears the Faculty's name.

(iii) Examination Invigilation

- a) Course Lecturer shall not normally be made to invigilate the examinations of their courses.
- b) Invigilators must properly check-in students to the examination hall and be satisfied that no student brings prohibited materials into the examination hall/room.
- c) Chief Invigilators must report through the Faculty Sub-Dean all cases of examination misconduct to the Dean within forty-eight (48) hours.
- d) There shall be at least two Invigilators per hall/room and at no time should they both leave the hall or room at the same time.
- e) Erring Invigilators shall be administratively dealt with.

(iii) Other Precautions

- (a) After all students have been seated in the examination hall and question papers distributed, no student shall be allowed to leave the examination hall without being accompanied by a staff member.
- (b) No student shall be allowed to leave the examination hall within the first thirty minutes of the examination or fifteen minutes to the end of the examination.
- (c) Students shall be required to place on the table, their Faculty examination card and University Identity Card for Invigilators' inspection at any time during the examination.
- (d) Sitting arrangement in the examination hall shall be at the discretion of the invigilators who shall engage means of breaking up organized sitting arrangements.
- (e) The services of University Security Personnel shall be enlisted during the period of examinations to prevent unauthorized visitors from roaming about the examination halls/venues.

B. Long Term Measures

- i) Provision of adequate accommodation and furniture for examination will be looked into:
- ii) Efforts will be made to provide adequate number of equipment and specimen to discourage sharing:

- iii). Each course Lecturer shall be provided information as to the number of students who have registered for course(s) assigned to him or her. This measure will allow the Lecturer to have the correct number of students who registered for a course and are expected to write examination in the course. It will also prevent students who are not properly registered for the course or fake students from sitting examination in the course. Also, regular attendance at lectures shall be closely monitored in order to encourage regular class attendance.
- iv) Where it is needed, Senior Non-academic staff could be considered for examination invigilation with appropriate remuneration.

THE GUIDELINES ON SUSPENSION OF STUDIES BY STUDENTS

- a. student can be allowed to suspend his study for a semester or session;
- b. application for suspension of study shall normally be made before the commencement of the semester or session for which approval is sought.
- c. a student wishing to suspend his study shall obtain the designated application form for Suspension of Study from the University Portal;
- d. Such application for suspension of studies shall be processed through the Faculty Board for Senate approval
- e. following Senates approval of the Faculty Board's recommendation, the Registrar shall communicate the decision to the candidate:
- f. no student can have his study suspended for more than one session at a time. However, upon expiration of the first session the student can re-apply on proven conditions e.g., national assignment; and
- g. Upon the expiration of the period for which the study has been suspended, the candidate shall be required to obtain and fill the appropriate Reactivation of Study Form from the Academic Office.

(k) Faculty of Life Sciences:

- (i) Postgraduate Diploma in Biochemistry
- (ii) Master of Science (M.Sc.) in Biochemistry; Plant Biology; Microbiology; Zoology.
- (iii) Master of Philosophy (M.Phil.) in all the above fields of specialization
- (iv) Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) in all the above fields of specialization.

(1) Faculty of Physical Sciences:

- (i) Postgraduate Diploma in Chemistry
- (ii) Postgraduate Diploma in Statistics (PGDS)
- (iii) Master of Science (M.Sc.) in Industrial Chemistry; Chemistry; Physics; Geology; Statistics; Mathematics;
- (iv) Master of Philosophy (M.Phil.) in all the above fields of specialization
- (v) Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) in all the above fields of specialization.

(m) Faculty of Management Sciences

- (i) Master of Science (M.Sc.) in Accounting; Business Administration; Finance.
- (ii) Master of Business Administration (M.B.A.)
- (iii) Master of Public Administration (M.P.A.)
- (iv) Master in Health Management Information
- (v) Master of Industrial Labour Relations (M.I.L.R.)

- (vii) Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) in all the above fields of

REGULATIONS GOVERNING HIGHER DEGREES AND POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA PROGRAMMES IN THE UNIVERSITY

The following are eligible to apply for registration as candidates for postgraduate programmes:

I. POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA PROGRAMMES

A. Postgraduate Diploma in Education (P.G.D.E.)

This is offered by the Institute of Education within the Faculty of Education. The programme is designed mainly as a professional course for graduate teachers to enable them acquire competence in various teaching skills as well as imbibe ingredients of administrative and counselling capabilities in Secondary and Training Colleges.

i. Admission Requirements

A graduate without teaching qualifications from a recognised university or a person with a qualification adjudged to be equivalent to a first degree.

ii. Duration of Programme

The P.G.D.E. shall be run on Sandwich basis which shall normally last for two long vacations/periods of a total of 20 weeks. Before the expiry of the minimum period, a candidate may apply for a 12-month extension through the Academic Board of the Institute to the Board of Postgraduate School, and thereafter at yearly intervals for two more years.

iii. Arrangement of Courses

- (a) Each student shall be required to register for a minimum of 15 and a maximum of 18 course credits in each long vacation period.
- (b) Courses shall be numbered 600 649 to be preceded by the letters DED. A course shall be a series of 15 one-hour lectures or tutorials or a series of 15 three-hour laboratory or practical classes or other assigned study or practical experience, or an equivalent combination of these types of

instruction.

- (c) Each course shall be examined by a continuous assessment of 30% and an end-of-course Examination of 70%. Candidates will be credited with the numbers of credits assigned to the course in which they have scored a minimum of 50%.
- (d) A student may be allowed to repeat any course at the next available opportunity if he fails any of the courses and if he satisfies the examiners at the second attempt, he shall be credited with the marks scored at the second sitting, but the marks obtained at the first sitting shall also be entered in his transcript.
- (e) A student shall normally be required to withdraw from the programme if he fails to acquire a minimum of 15 course credits at the expiration of the original time limit.
- (f) A student who has acquired 15 or more credits but has not met the requirement for the award of the Postgraduate Diploma will be required to repeat the examination in the appropriate course(s) during the following long vacation to fulfil the requirement.

iv. Conditions for the Award

- (a) For consideration for an award of the PGDE, a student must have a minimum of 30 course credits, including all compulsory courses.
- (b) The final determination of an award will be based on the over-all weighted average marks scored in all courses and have the following classification:

Distinction 70% and above Credit 60.0% - 69.9% Pass 50.0% - 59.9%

(c) A student who has taken more than two long vacations to complete the programme shall not normally be eligible for distinction.

B. Diploma in Medical Radiologic Diagnosis (D.M.R.D.)

This is offered in the Department of Radiology within the Faculty of Clinical Sciences.

(i) Admission Requirements

A graduate in the Sciences from a recognised university or a

person with a qualification adjudged to be equivalent to a first degree in Science.

(ii) Duration of Programme

The Diploma in Medical Radiologic Diagnosis programme shall be run on full-time and shall last for 24 calendar months after which a candidate may apply for a 12-month extension through the Faculty Postgraduate Committee to the Board of Postgraduate School for approval.

(iii) Arrangement of Courses

- (a) Each student shall be required to register for a minimum of 30 and a maximum of 36 course credits for the programme.
- (b) Candidates shall be required to take course work and instructions in Medical Physics, Radiation Physics, Ultrasonography and other imaging modalities. Courses shall be numbered 600 649 to be preceded by the letters DMR. A course shall be a series of 15 hours of lectures or 45 hours of practical (or a proportional combination of the two).
- (c) A course shall last one or two semesters and shall be examined at the end of the semester in which it is completed. The pass mark in each course shall be 50%. A candidate may be allowed to repeat any course at the next available opportunity. If he fails any of the courses and if he satisfies the examiners at the second attempt, he shall be credited with the mark scored at the second sitting but the marks obtained at the first sitting shall also be entered in his transcript. A candidate who again fails the Physics examination after repeating the course shall be required to withdraw from the programme.

(iv) Conditions for the Award

- (a) For consideration for an Award of the D.M.R.D., a student must have a minimum of 30 course credits including all compulsory courses.
- (b) In addition to course work, each candidate is expected to present, in a bound form, a minimum of 10 case reports of unusual clinical or technical problems complete with current bibliography.
- (c) The final qualifying assessment for D.M.R.D. certification shall consist of two parts.

- (i) Defence of Book of Case Reports.
- (ii) Film Review/Practical Session.
- (iii) A candidate must obtain not less than 50% in each of the parts in (iv)(c), (a) above.
- (iv) A candidate who fails to obtain a pass mark in both(iv)(c), (b) above will repeat both parts of the examination 6 months later.
- (v) The final examination result will be based on the overall weighted average marks scored in all courses and have the following classifications:

Distinction 70% and above Credit 60.0% - 69.9% 50.0% - 59.9%

(C) Postgraduate Diploma in Computer Science (PGDCS)

This programme is offered by the Department of Computer Science in the Faculty of Communication and Information Sciences. The programme is designed mainly as a professional course to provide participants from computer installations departments as well as officers from both public and private sectors, a highly intensive training programme in computer and information science.

(i) Admission Requirements

A graduate with a minimum of Second-Class Lower degree from a recognised university preferably in any of Science, Engineering or Social Science disciplines. However, candidates with third class or a pass degree with at least two years post qualification cognate experience may also be considered. G.C.E. 'O' Level Credit Pass in Mathematics is compulsorily required.

(ii) Duration

(a) The Postgraduate Diploma in Computer Science (PGDCS) which shall be run on Full - Time, Part - Time and Sandwich basis, has a duration of minimum of 9 calendar months and a maximum of 13 months for Full - Time students and a minimum of 15 calendar months and a maximum of 30 months for Part - Time. For the Sandwich students, it shall be a maximum of 3 contact sessions of 10 weeks duration each.

(b) Notwithstanding regulation C (ii) (a) above, at the expiry of the required period for Full-time, Part-Time students respectively, a candidate may apply for extension of 9 months if it is a Full-Time, 15 months if it is a Part-Time and for one contact session if the candidate is a Sandwich student to the Postgraduate School.

(iii) Arrangement of Courses

- (a) Each student shall be required to register for a maximum of 48 course credits consisting of 25 credits from the compulsory courses and at least 5 credits from the elective courses.
- (b) Courses shall be numbered 600 649 to be preceded by the letters PDC. A course shall be a series of 15 one hour lectures or tutorials or a series of 15 three hour laboratory or practical classes or other assigned study or practical experience, or an equivalent combination of these types of instruction.
- (c) Each course shall be examined by a continuous assessment of 30% and an end of course examination of 70%. Candidates will be credited with the numbers of credits assigned to the course in which they have scored a minimum of 50%.
- (d) Candidates may be required to take prescribed undergraduate courses to make up specific credits.

(iv) Condition for the Award

- (a) For consideration of an award of the Postgraduate Diploma in Computer Science (PGDCS), a student must have a minimum of 30 course credits consisting of compulsory and elective courses.
- (b) The final examination result will be based on the overall weighted average marks scored in all courses and have the following classification.

D. Postgraduate Diploma in Geographical Information System (PGDGIS)

(i) Objectives

The objective of the postgraduate diploma in GIS is to provide career opportunities for graduates of Geo Science and Environmental Science in work environment that has been affected by development in information technology. It is also aimed at assisting existing personnel in environmental related discipline, convert from analogue to digital orientation and improved there productivity by using the modern production technique made available through development information technology.

(ii) Admission Requirements

Admission to professional postgraduate diploma in G.I.S. is open to graduates of this University and other approved Universities and Institutions recognized by Senate with a B.Sc. Degree Hons H.N.D. or its equivalent in Geography, Environmental Science, Sciences, other Social Sciences, Forestry, Engineering, Architecture, Town Planning etc.

Notwithstanding the above, candidates with substantial work experience who have attained managerial positions in public and private organisation may still be considered for admission on individual merit.

(iii) Duration of Course

The PGDGIS programme which shall be run on full-time and part-time basis has duration of minimum of 2 semesters (12 calendar months) and a maximum of 3 semesters (18 calendar months) for full-time students, and a minimum of 3 semesters (18 calendar months) and a maximum of 4 semesters (24 calendar months) for part-time students.

(iv) Graduation Requirement

For the award of the Postgraduate Diploma, a candidate is required to pass all the courses including the research project.

The final examination result will be based on the overall weighted average marks scored in all courses and have the following classification:

E. Postgraduate Diploma in Statistics

(i) Introduction and Objectives

A programme of course shall be provided by the Department of Statistics leading to the Postgraduate Diploma in Statistics which may be awarded with Distinction, Credit or Pass.

The major objective of this programme is to teach and train: Non-Statistics graduates who are employed in Statistics Departments and wish to become a Professional or a Career Statistician and Those who want to prepare for Higher Studies in Statistics but cannot be admitted to higher degrees in Statistics e.g., HND holders in Statistics.

(ii) Motivation and Contribution

- a. This programme is designed as both a professional and a foundation course to provide students from statistics Departments, and other public and private institutions an intensive training programme in statistics.
- b. At the end of the course, students who passed the course would have benefited from it and they can be referred to or called in their places of work a career statistician. This can lead to higher promotion in their places of work.
- c. Those who passed can also be admitted to read MSC degree in Statistics.

(iii) Admission Requirements

Candidates for admission to the Course shall be selected from amongst those who hold:

- (i) A Bachelor's degree in Science and relevant Allied Basic or Social Science disciplines (e.g. Agriculture, Engineering, and Economics) from a recognized University and at least 100 Level University Mathematics.
- (ii) A Higher National Diploma in Statistics with 5 credit passes at GCE/O Level including English Language and Mathematics.
- (iii) Any other qualification adjudged by Senate to be equivalent to a first degree e.g., Graduate of Institute of Statisticians.

(iv) Duration of Programme

The postgraduate Diploma in Statistics programme shall be on full-time and part-time basis, for a full-time student a minimum of 9 calendar months and a maximum of 12 months and a maximum of 24 months is allowed. A candidate may apply for an extension of not more than 9 months if it is a full-time, or 15 months if it is part-time after the expiration of the maximum period.

(v) Arrangement of Courses

- (i) A student shall be required to register for a minimum of 30 credits and a maximum of 36 credits.
- (ii) Courses shall be numbered 600-649 and be preceded by the letters STA. Courses shall be evaluated in terms of course credits. A credit shall be a series of 15 one-hour lectures or tutorials or a series of 15 three-hour practical classes or a combination of both.

The pass mark shall be 50%. Candidates will be credited with the number of course units in which they have scored a pass mark.

(vi) Condition for the Award

- (i) To be eligible for the award of the Postgraduate Diploma in Statistics, University of Ilorin, a student must have been credited with a minimum of 30 credits including all core and required number of elective courses.
- (ii) Classification of Postgraduate Diploma in Statistics, the Diploma may be awarded with:
- (a) DISTINCTION to candidates who attain a CGPA of 4.5 and above in the examination;
- (b) CREDIT to candidates who attain CGPA of between 3.0 and 4.49; and
- (c) PASS to candidates who attain a CGPA of between 1.0 and 2.99
- (iii) A student shall not be eligible for the award of the Diploma with DISTINCTION if he/she has spent more than 12 calendar months as a Full-time student or 24 months as a part-time student for the Diploma.

(F) Postgraduate Diploma in Education Management

(i) Introduction

Preamble

The postgraduate Diploma Programme in Educational Management (PGDEM) is designed for degree and Higher National Diploma (HND) holders in the school system at local, state and federal levels; and other interested individuals who did not study Educational Management during their first-degree programme.

It is to introduce them to basic courses in the principles and practice of Educational Management.

It has been noted that graduates who were being exposed to Educational Management for the first time at the Masters level, often find it difficult to adjust to the programme within the one-year duration. The proposed postgraduate diploma in Educational Management is therefore expected to cater for the deficiencies of non-graduates in Educational Management who later decided to teach and aspire to school principal-ship.

The programme will also cater for the needs of Administrators of School (Principals and Vice-Principals) and personnel in the Ministries of Education who require a general exposure to Educational Management without embarking on the present highly academic Masters Programme. For this group of clients, a general introductory course in Educational Management will serve their needs rather than a thesis-oriented Masters Programme.

Postgraduate Diploma in Educational Management PGDEM Programme differs from the Postgraduate Diploma in Education (PGDE) in the sense that PGDE is a programme that deals with pedagogical aspects of teaching for non-professional graduate teachers in the school system, while PGDEM is a specialist course which focuses on capacity building in school planning, administration and management. PGDEM is packaged for school

administrators in the school system and generally in the educational system, and those who have studied education but not educational management.

Both PGDE and PGDEM could run concurrently because they have different clienteles. The two programmes have different orientation.

Rationale:

PGDEM is purely a professional course.

The proposed programme, therefore is:

- (a) to introduce candidates to basic courses in the principles and practice of Educational Management;
- (b) expected to cater for the deficiencies in Educational management task performance noticeable in some graduates who specialized in the teaching subject areas but did not study educational management;
- (c) to cater for the needs of Educational Administrators (Principals, Vice-Principals, Heads of Departments etc) and personnel in the Ministries of Education (Federal and State) Teaching Service Commission, Primary Educational Boards etc. who require general exposure to fundamentals of Educational Planning and Administration. For those groups of clients, a general introductory course in Educational Management will serve their basic needs.

(ii) Programme Objectives:

It is expected that the programme will assist in capacity building for graduates involved in teaching, planning and administration of education at federal, state and local levels.

(iii) Admission Requirements:

The course is open to (i) graduates of the University of Ilorin and those of any other recognized University approved by Senate; and (ii) Higher National Diploma (HND) holders with Upper Credits.

Candidates seeking admission shall obtain the prescribed postgraduate form which shall be processed for the purpose of determining the eligibility of such applicants.

(iv) Duration and Mode of Study:

The programme is expected to cover a period of two years of ten weeks duration per year by sandwich study.

(v) Programme Requirements and Certification

- (a) A programme of courses leading to a Postgraduate Diploma in Educational Management shall be provided. The Diploma shall be awarded with Distinction, Credit, or Pass grades;
- (b) Instruction shall be by the Course/Credit system and students shall be required to take a number of courses from a list approved by the Senate for that purpose;
- (c) Courses shall be coded EMA and numbered from 601 to 649;
- (d) A student shall register for not less than 25 credit units and not more than 37 units for each semester for part time.
- (e) In order to qualify for the ward of the Post-Graduate Diploma in Educational Management, a student must pass all the core (compulsory) and Required Courses, submit an accepted project and acquire a minimum of 30 credit-units including the unit for the project.
- (f) Courses shall be graded with scores as follows:

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70 – 100% (A) - 70% and above - Distinction
60 – 69 (B) - 60% to 69% - Credit
50 – 59 (C) - 50% to 59% - Pass
0 – 49 (F) - 0% to 49% - Fail
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- (g) Each course shall be examined in the semester or contact session in which it is taken. The final grade of a student in a course shall be a combination of continuous assessment grades and end of course examination grades;
- (h) The final grade of a student shall be the simple weighted mean of the scores in the best 30 units except that the Compulsory and Requirement courses units and the project shall be included in determining this final grade;

- (i) The final results of students shall be subjected to existing Departmental, Faculty and Senate procedures and regulations;
- (j) Postgraduate Diploma Certificate in Educational Management shall be issued to successful students in accordance with grades of their performances at the end of the programme.

(G) Postgraduate Diploma in Strategic Management

(i) Preamble

The programme is proposed by the Department of Business Administration in the Faculty of Business and Social Sciences, University of Ilorin. The programme is designed mainly as a professional course for graduates of Universities, Polytechnics and professional qualification holders to enable them acquire necessary managerial skills and competence in different spheres of management as well as imparting administrative capabilities to managers in both private and public sectors.

This course would serve as a conversion programme for those who were hitherto not qualified for the MBA programme as a result of perceived inadequacy. The programme will provide opportunity for University graduates whose class of degrees are less than Second Class Lower, Higher National Diploma graduates with Upper Credit and those with professional qualifications such as ACCA, ACA, AIB or any equivalent (without the requirement 5 years working experience).

(ii) Objective of the Study

This course of study is primarily designed for managers in either the public or private sectors of the economy. It is a comprehensive, intensive and rigorous course of study intended to provide both the conceptual, theoretical and practiced framework for integrating the various aspects of management at the higher level of the organization. It is expected that officers from both the public and private sectors of the economy will constitute the clientele for this course.

(iii) Admission Requirements

Entry qualification is at least bachelor degrees from any recognized University. However, candidates with professional qualifications such as ICAN or Higher National Diploma (with at least Lover Credit) may be considered.

(iv) Duration of the Programme

The PGDSM will be run on part-time basis. It will last 2 academic sessions. Lectures would normally take place in the evening – between 4 and 7pm.

(v) Arrangement of Courses

- (a) Each student shall be required to register for 24 course credits for the first session (i.e., 12 course credits each for the two semesters).
- (b) In the second session, each student shall be required to register for at least 6 course credits in addition to Seminar paper and project writing.
- (c) Courses shall be numbered 600 650 to be preceded by the letter DSM.
- (d) Continuous assessment of 30% and an end-of-course examination of 70% shall examine each course. Candidates will be credited with the number of credits assigned to the course in which they have scored a minimum of 50%.
- (e) A student may be allowed to repeat any course at the next available opportunity if he fails any of the courses and if he satisfies the examiners at the second attempt, he shall be credit with the marks scored at the second sitting, but the marks obtained at the first sitting shall also be entered in his transcript.

(vi) Conditions for the Award

- (a) For consideration for an award of PGDSM, a student must have a minimum of 34 course credits, including all compulsory courses.
- (b) The final determination of the ward will be based on the overall weighted average marks scored in all courses and have the following classification:

Distinction - 70% and above
Credit - 60% - 69.9%
Pass - 50% - 59.9%
Fail - 0 - 49.9%

(H) Postgraduate Diploma in Conflict and Peace Studies

(i) Introduction

The study is chosen in the light of present happenings in and around the world. These happenings (conflicts) have manifested themselves in social economic, political, religious and environmental matters. Indeed, the need to seek for peace in all its ramifications cannot be controverted. Recent research studies have amply shown that in the post war era and especially since the end of the Cold War, most African and third world countries have known no peace. Most of the major crises and low-level wars have been confined to these states.

Evidently, most post-colonial African state have experienced serious conflicts since the attainment of independence. Notable among these were civil wars, borders conflicts, sectarian and ethnic clashes, coups, labour unrest etc. As a result the governments of these countries have expended huge human and material resources in the pursuance of peace and the settlement of conflicts

The postgraduate diploma degree programme in conflict and peace studies would attempt the examination of the main trajectories of conflict situations and pace building process from both theoretical and practical points of view. It will identify in a comprehensive manner the various sources of conflicts and provide an overview of conflict resolution mechanisms from historical perspective. The programme will identify the latent threats to national integrity and corporate existence in detail and explores remedial measures. It seeks to evolve a system that supports effective decision-making and enhance the feelings of nationhood.

The programme is strictly targeted towards laying specific emphasis on the significance of peace and the resolution of crisis in African in general and Nigeria in particular. This is very important because there can hardly be any meaningful development in the State devoid of peace. The programme is designed as an inservice training to impart the necessary theoretical and

practical knowledge to officers in the civil service, Local Government, Private organizations, Government Agencies, Military and Para-military establishments, the Police, National Orientation Agency, Labour Unions, Technical Aids Corps, as well as members of the Diplomatic corps and all organizations involved in matters dealing with the pursuit of peace and crisis management.

(ii) Admission Requirements

Admission into the postgraduate diploma degree programme in conflict and peace studies shall be opened to graduates of the University of Ilorin or any other approved University with appropriate degree Bachelor in any discipline. Candidates holding the Higher National Diploma in Law. Administration, Journalism, etc with upper credit shall also be eligible for admission. Candidates with similar qualification but with a lower credit shall also be eligible for admission provided they satisfy the Board of Postgraduate School by scoring a minimum of 50% in a qualifying examination administered by the University, may still be considered on individual merit.

(iii) Duration of Course

The duration of the programme shall be a minimum of 12 calendar months and a maximum of 24 calendar months for full time study and a minimum of 24 calendar months and maximum of 36 calendar months for part-time study.

(iv) Graduation Requirements

(a) To graduate, candidates must register for courses carrying not less than 36 credits and not more than 40 credits and must earn a minimum of 36 credits including all compulsory and required courses. In addition, candidates must score not less than 50% in the weighted average of the best 36 credits which must include all compulsory and required courses.

(b) The final determination of the award will be based on the overall weighted average marks scored in all courses and have the following classification:

Distinction - 70% and above
Credit - 60% - 69.9%
Pass - 50% - 59.9%
Fail - 0 - 49.9%

II. MASTER DEGREE PROGRAMMES

(i) Admission Requirements

For the M.A., M.Ed., M.Eng. and M.Sc., graduates of the University of Ilorin or any other approved university with appropriate degree of Bachelor and at least a Second Class (Upper Division) Honours or equivalent.

However, graduates of the University of Ilorin or any other approved university who achieved a lower classification of the degree of Bachelor less than a Second Upper may be admitted provided they satisfy the Board of Postgraduate School by scoring a minimum of 55% in a qualifying Examination administered by the University.

In the case of MBA/MPA Programmes, graduates of the University of Ilorin or any other approved university of any field who satisfy the Board of Postgraduate School by scoring a minimum of 60% in a qualifying Examination administered by the University. Notwithstanding the above, for the MBA Programme, candidates with professional qualifications such as HND (Upper Credit) with a minimum of five years post qualification experience are admissible provided they score a minimum of 60% in a qualifying Examination administered by the University.

Candidates for the MBA (Executive) programme are required to possess a degree from a recognised University or hold professional qualifications approved by Senate e.g. HND (Upper Credit), ICAN, ACCA, ACMA, AIB, ACIS, etc and have at least five (5) years post qualification experience in the case of degree holders and at least eight (8) years for HND and other approved professional qualifications. All candidates for this programme (MBA Executive) must be in Full - Time

employment in relatively senior management positions.

(ii) Duration

For the M.A, M.Ed., M.Eng., M.Sc., the duration shall be a minimum of 12 calendar months and a maximum of 24 calendar months for full - time students; a minimum of 24 calendar months and a maximum of 36 calendar months for part - time students.

In the case of MBA/MPA, the duration shall be a minimum of 18 calendar months and a maximum of 30 calendar months for Full – Time; and a minimum of 30 calendar months and a maximum of 60 calendar months for the Part - Time, and the MBA (Executive) students.

On the expiration of the maximum duration, a candidate may apply for not more than a 12-month extension to the Board of Postgraduate School and thereafter for one more year.

(Note: MILR, MIS admission requirement duration)

(iii) Arrangement of Courses

- (a) Course work and Instruction for all Master's Degree Programmes shall be by courses quantified in terms of credits and numbered 651 750.
- (b) A credit shall represent 15 hours of lectures or 45 hours of practical (or a proportional combination of the two).
- (c) Notwithstanding (b) above, in the case of courses which, instead of lectures or practical, consist of Seminars, Projects, Field work, Oral or Written reports and Discussion groups, course outlines shall clearly set out such requirements and the appropriate credit value subject to the approval of Senate.
- (d) Courses shall last one or two Semesters and shall be examined at the end of the Semester in which they are completed.
- (e) For every Master's Degree Programme, there shall be Compulsory, Required and Optional courses provided that the number of compulsory and required courses shall not be less than 20 or more than 25 credits.
- (f) Every course shall be examined by continuous assessment of 40% and an End of Course Examination of 60%.

(iv) Conditions of the Award

Candidates for the M.A., M.Ed., M.Eng., M.Sc. must register for courses carrying not less than 30 credits and not more than 36 credits and must earn a minimum of 25 credits including all compulsory courses. In addition, candidates must score not less than 50% in the weighted average of the best 30 credits which must include compulsory and required courses.

For the MBA/MPA, to graduate, candidates must register for courses with a minimum of 46 and 45 Credits and a maximum of 52 and 51 credits, respectively.

- (a) Subject to (iii)(c) above and in addition to course work, each Master's Degree candidate is required to submit a Research Project Report on a topic approved by the Department.
- (b) The work of each candidate shall be examined by a Panel of Examiners consisting of the Head of Department who shall be Chief Examiner, the Supervisor for the student's project, other postgraduate teaching staff as may be appropriate and the External Examiner approved by the Board. In the event of a disagreement among examiners, the External Examiner's decision shall be final.
- (c) Where necessary, composition of examiners for Master's Degree Oral Examination shall include the External Examiner, the Head of the Department (as chairman) and the supervisor (or one other member of staff where the Head of Department is Sole Supervisor) and the Departmental Postgraduate Programme Coordinator. In the event of a disagreement among examiners, the decision of the External Examiner shall be final.
- (d) For all Master's degree programmes by course work, there shall be a Compulsory course designated Research Project carrying 5 or 6 credits and another Required course designated Seminar, carrying 1 or 2 credits. Candidates must satisfy examiners in both courses. The pass mark shall be 50% in all cases.
- (e) Four unbound quarto size copies of the Dissertation Report shall be submitted to the Head of Department in

preparation for Examination. If so advised, the Report shall be corrected in line with the decision of the Panel of Examiners before the final hard - binding of 5 copies which must be in any colour other than black. After due processing, the Faculty shall submit the Examiner's Report along with the copies of the hard - bound dissertation to the Secretary of the Postgraduate School. Copies of the Report so submitted shall become the property of the University.

III. Master of Philosophy (M.Phil.)

THE DEGREE OF MASTERS PHILOSOPHY / DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY (M.Phil./Ph.D.)

Candidates with a weighted score of between 55.90% and 59.90% are eligible for the M.Phil./ Ph.D. programme. Candidates can convert to the Ph.D. Programmes on the satisfaction of the Department and faculty Postgraduate Committee at two Seminar Presentations. A terminal M.Phil. degree shall be awarded, where the candidate failed to score an aggregate of 60% in the two Seminars presented.

THE DEGREE OF DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY (Ph.D.)

(i) Admission Requirements

Candidates with Masters Degree from the University of Ilorin and other recognised Universities must have scored at least 60% or its equivalent in their final Masters Degree Examination to qualify for admission to the Doctor of Philosophy Programmes.

In addition, all such candidates shall appear for an interview to be conducted by the Department. Final admission depends on the outcome of the interview.

(ii) **Duration**

- (a) The duration of the programme shall be a minimum of 30 calendar months, a maximum of 42 calendar months, for full-time students; a minimum of 42 months and a maximum of 54 months for part time students.
- (b) On the expiration of the maximum duration, a candidate may apply for extension of not more than two consecutive

periods of 12 calendar months after which the programme lapses.

(iii) Arrangement of Courses

- (a) Candidates for the Ph.D. degree programme may be required to take appropriate courses in which they must obtain a satisfactory level of performance. Where there are formal courses, they are numbered 751-799.
- (b) Where necessary, a candidate may be required to demonstrate an acceptable level of competence in the use of tool or a language.
- (c) Candidates for the Ph.D. degree shall be assessed within twelve months of registration by means of a Comprehensive Examination or Seminar.
- (d) Candidates who fail to attain a satisfactory level of performance shall be advised to withdraw from the programme.
- (e) The level of performance shall be determined by the Departmental Postgraduate Committee.

(iv) Condition of the Award

- (a) A candidate for the Ph.D degree shall prepare and submit a thesis which shall embody his original research carried out substantially during the period of his registration and making definite contribution to scholarship.
- (b) The Title of Thesis shall be submitted through the Faculty Board to the Board of Postgraduate School for approval at least three months before the Examination.
- (c) The Thesis shall be examined by a Panel of Examiners comprising an External Examiner, the Head of Department as chairman, at least one Supervisor, one other Internal Examiner selected from a related department in the University and the Departmental Postgraduate Programme Co-ordinator. Where the Head of Department is the Sole Supervisor, a suitable academic staff of the Department shall be selected as a member of the Panel of Examiners. The Postgraduate School shall be represented in all Oral Examinations.
- (d) The Department shall send a report of the outcome of the examination to the Postgraduate School not later than five (5) working days after the Oral Examination.
- (e) Where a thesis is referred, it must be submitted for re-

examination within one calendar year. It may only be resubmitted once.

- (f) Where a Panel of Examiners recommends minor corrections to be effected in a thesis, subject to the satisfaction of the Internal Examiners, such corrections should be effected within three months.
- (g) Six soft bound quarto-size copies of Research thesis shall be submitted to the Head of Department in preparation for Oral Examination. If so advised, the thesis shall be corrected in line with the decision of the Panel of Examiners before a final hardbinding which must be in black colour with gold lettering.
- (h) After due processing, the Faculty shall submit the Examiner's Report along with three hard-bound copies of the thesis to the Secretary of the Postgraduate School. Copies of the thesis so submitted shall become the property of the University, two of which shall be deposited in the University library and one in the Postgraduate School.

A. MASTER OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (MBA)

The Philosophy

The philosophy of the MBA programme of University of Ilorin is to develop highly skilled professional managers for the Public, Private and International Organisations.

Aims and Objectives

The Master Degree in Business Administration is aimed at:

- Providing students with knowledge and skills to enhance their performance and to enable them to assume broader responsibility in the rapidly changing business environment.
- The provision of knowledge required for understanding and practical analysis of problems related to management/ and administration of public, private and international organizations.
- Producing managers who are capable of applying appropriate management principles and techniques to problem solving in the Nigerian environment and the world at large.
- Producing socially responsible managers who are mindful of accepted norms and ethics.
- Producing managers who are equipped with relevant ICT knowledge and skills.
- Producing managers with entrepreneurial skills and leadership qualities .
- Providing interested individuals with the necessary competencies and skills to function effectively as academics in Business Administration.

Eligibility

Candidates for admission into MBA programme should normally possess recognized Bachelor's degrees from an approved University with a minimum of Second Class Lower Division. Holders of professional qualifications of ACA, ACMA, AIB, ACI, CIBN, ACTS or HND (Upper Credit) must possess a Post-Graduate Diploma Certificate in Strategic Management from University of Ilorin with a minimum average score of 60%. All candidates should have at least Five (5) credits at the Ordinary Level (O/L), including English Language and Mathematics, irrespective of field of study.

Course Duration

— UNIVERSITY OF ILORIN CONDITIONS OF SERVICE

- i. The full-time MBA programme runs for a minimum of four 4 semesters (24 calendar months) and maximum of six 6 semester (36 calendar months).
- ii. The part-time MBA programme runs for a minimum of six 6 semesters (36 calendar months) and maximum of ten 10 semesters (48 calendar months)
- iii. The MBA Executive programme runs for a minimum of six 6 semester (36 calendar months) and maximum of ten 10 semesters (60 calendar months).
- iv. For extension beyond the maximum period, a special permission of the senate shall be required.

Course Structure

A candidate must have fulfilled the following condition to be awarded the MBA Degree:

- i. Pass a minimum of 72 credit units, including all compulsory courses. The requirement is broken down as follows:
 - 16 core courses of 3 credits each
 - 6 elective courses of 3 credits each (chosen from the areas of specialization)
 - = 18
 - MBA project of 6 credits = 06 = 72
- ii. Submission of a satisfactory written report of Industrial Attachment
- iii. Presentation of at least, one seminar paper at the Staff/Student Departmental Seminar series.
- iv. Conduct and submit a satisfactory research report in the area of specialization.

B. MASTER OF INDUSTRIAL AND LABOUR RELATIONS (MILR)

The Philosophy

The Master of Industrial and Labour Relations (MILR) was established to meet the growing needs for specialist in labour and industrial relations, both in the public and private sectors of the economy. It is designed as an interdisciplinary professional Master's Degree programme.

Aims and Objectives

The major objectives of the MPA Programme are to:

- Broaden the participants' knowledge of personnel management
- Enhance the professional ability of the participants in managing the country's industrial relations, and
- Expose the participants to the state-of-the-art practices in the industrial relations, international labour standard and theories so as to make accurate predictions on national industrial relations matter in tandem with international practices.

Eligibility

Candidates for admission into MILR degree programme must normally possess a honours degree of the University of Ilorin, from any other approved university.

Course Duration

The duration of the programme (full-time only) shall be a minimum of 3 semesters (18 calendar months) and a maximum of 5 semesters (30 calendar months).

Course Structure

The MILR degree is awarded to students who successfully complete at least, 45 credit, inclusive of successfully defending a seminar presentation and project work.

C. MASTER OF INTERNATIONAL STUDIES (MIS)

The Philosophy

The philosophy of the programme is to develop the skills and expertise of students that will enable them to be innovative and use international relations concepts in addressing developmental issues.

Aims and Objectives

The programme is geared towards meeting the academic and professional needs of students. That is, to provide students with the necessary training to embark on successful career in the public and private sectors in national and international environments.

Eligibility

Candidates for admission into MIS Professional degree should normally possess Bachelor's Degrees in any discipline with at least a Second Class Honours from the University of Ilorin, or any other approved university.

Course Duration

The duration of the programme shall be a minimum of 3 semesters (18 calendar months) and a maximum of 5 semesters (30 calendar months). Lectures hold on weekends fortnightly.

Course Structure

The Master of International Studies degree is awarded to students who successfully complete at least, 46 credit, inclusive of successfully defending a seminar presentation and project work.

D. MASTER OF GEOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION SYSTEM (MGIS)

The Philosophy

The Master of Geographical Information System (MGIS) is specially designed to meet the urgent demand locally, for GIS professionals who would help to integrate GIS concepts and technology into spatial decision-making processes in the country.

Aims and Objectives

The MGIS programme is aimed at training suitable candidates to become professionals who will be capable of applying GIS concepts and technique in solving various environmental problems. In order to achieve this goal, the course contents, methods of instruction and instructional materials have been specially designed to lay emphasis on both scientific and policy-oriented applications. Consequently, each student will be required to develop proficiency in the use of a set of GIS systems and put such into practice by producing an individual research project.

Eligibility

Candidates for admission into MGIS programme should normally possess Bachelor's degrees from an approved University, minimum of Second Class Lower Division. Holders of professional qualifications such as HND (Upper Credit) with a minimum five years post-qualification experience are also eligible to apply.

Course Duration

The duration of the programme shall be a minimum of 3 semesters (18 calendar months) and a maximum of 4 semesters (24 calendar months) for Full-Time students. The Part-Time programme on the other hand, runs for a minimum of 4 semesters (24 calendar months) and a maximum of 5 semesters (30 calendar months).

Course Structure

The MGIS degree is awarded to students who successfully complete at least, 45 credit, inclusive of successfully defending a seminar presentation and project work. Candidates must pass all compulsory and required courses.

E. MASTER OF PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION (MPA)

The Philosophy

The programme is specially designed to suit mid-career officers/managers who have had several years of practical experience and who are reaching the higher levels of administrative management.

Aims and Objectives

The major objectives of the MPA Programme are to:

- Provide an advanced and specialized course in public administration and management.
- Develop the skills and expertise of managers and would be managers in both public and private organizations.
- Meet the professional needs of students for successful career in management.

Eligibility

Candidates for admission into the MPA degree programme must have honours degrees in any discipline from the University of Ilorin, or any other approved university.

Course Duration

The duration of the programme (full-time only) shall be a minimum 0f 3 semesters (18 calendar months) and a maximum of 4 semesters (24 calendar months).

Course Structure

A total of forty-eight (48) credits must be offered by all students. The MPA degree is awarded to the students who successfully complete/pass

at least forty-five (45) credits including the compulsory and required course as well as submit an acceptation project work. The project work must be a report of the student's experience gained during the three-month industrial attachment which all MPA students must undergo. The pass mark shall be 50% in all cases. A graduate seminar is also expected to be presented.

F. POST GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN GEOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION SYSTEM (PGDGIS)

The Philosophy

The PGDGIS degree is specially designed to meet the urgent demand locally, for GIS professionals who would help to integrate GIS concepts and technology into spatial decision-making processes in the country.

It is to eve as a conversion programme for those who were hitherto not qualified for the MGIS programme as a result of perceived inadequacy. The programme provides opportunity for University graduates whose class of degrees are less than Second Class Lower, HND graduates with Upper Credit and those with relevant professional qualifications.

Aims and Objectives

The objective of the postgraduate diploma in GIS is to provide career opportunities for graduates of Geo-Science and Environmental Science in work environment that has been affected by development in information technology. It is also aimed at assisting existing personnel in environmental related discipline, convert from analogue to digital orientation and improved their productivity by using the modern production technique made available through development information technology.

Eligibility

Candidates for admission into the GIS Postgraduate diploma programme must normally possess a recognized Bachelor's Degree with at least Third-Class Honours or HND (Lower Credit) or their equivalent, in Geography, Environmental Science, Sciences, other Social Sciences, Forestry, Engineering, Architecture, Town Planning, etc. Notwithstanding the above, candidates with substantial work experience who have attained managerial positions may still be considered for admission on individual merit

Course Duration

The PGDGIS programme which shall be run on full-time and part-time basis has duration of minimum of 2 semesters (12 calendar months) and a maximum of 3 semesters (18 calendar months) for full-time students, and a minimum of 3 semesters (18 calendar months) and a maximum of 4 semesters (24 calendar months) for part-time students.

Course Structure

For the award of the Postgraduate Diploma, a candidate is required to pass all the courses including the research project.

G. POST GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS AND DIPLOMACY (PGDIAD)

The Philosophy

The philosophy of the programme is to develop the skills and expertise of students that will enable them to be innovative and use international relations concepts in addressing developmental issues.

Aims and Objectives

The programme is geared towards meeting the academic and professional needs of students that is, to provide students with the necessary training to embark on successful career in the public and private sectors in national and international environments.

Eligibility

Candidates for admission into Post Graduate Diploma in International Affairs and Diplomacy (PGDIAD) programme must normally possess Bachelor's Degrees in any discipline with a minimum of Pass grade from the University of Ilorin or any other approved University or HND with at least Lower Credit.

Course Duration

The duration of the programme shall be a minimum of 3 semesters (18 calendar months) and a maximum of 5 semesters (30 calendar months). Lectures hold on weekends fortnightly.

Course Structure

To qualify for the ward of PGDIAD, candidates must pass not less than 35 credits including compulsory courses.

H. POST GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN STRATEGIC MANAGEMENT (PGDSM)

The Philosophy

The programme is designed mainly as a professional course for graduate of university, polytechnics and professional qualification holders to enable them acquire necessary managerial skills and competence in different spheres of management as well as imparting administrative capabilities to managers in both private and public.

It is to serve as a conversion programme for those who were hitherto not qualified for the MBA programme as a result of perceived inadequacy. The programme provides opportunity for University graduates whose class of degrees are less than Second Class Lower, HND graduates with Upper Credit and those with professional qualifications such as ACCA, ACA, AIB or any equivalent (without the requirement of 5 years working experience.

Aims and Objectives

This course of study is primarily designed for managers in either the public or private sectors of the economy. It is a comprehensive, intensive and rigorous course of study intended to provide both the conceptual, theoretical and practical framework for integrating the various aspects of arrangement at the higher level of the organization. It is expected that officers from both the public and private sectors of the economy will constitute the clientele in this course.

Eligibility

Candidates for admission into Post Graduate Diploma in Strategic Management (PGDSM) should normally possess Bachelor's Degrees or Professional qualifications such as ICAN or HND certificate with a minimum of Lower Credit from approved institutions.

Course Duration

The duration of the programme (part-time only) shall normally be a minimum of 2 semesters (12 calendar months) and a maximum of 3 semesters (18 calendar months).

Course Structure

A candidate must have fulfilled the following condition to be awarded the PGDSM degree:

Each student shall be required to register for 24 course credits for the two semesters (i.e., 12 course credits for the first semesters, and for the second semester, at least 6 course credits in addition to seminar paper and project writing.
