Stop discriminating against people with disability, Olawuyi charges Nigerians

Professor at the Department of Social Sciences Education, University of Ilorin, Bolanle Olabisi Olawuyi, has charged Nigerians, particularly stakeholders, to stop all forms of discrimination against individuals who are living with one form of disability or the other, to ensure proper integration.

Prof. Olawuyi made this charge last Thursday (April 25, 2024) while delivering the 255th Inaugural Lecture of the University titled "People with Disabilities and the Celebration of Life Beyond Limits" at the University Main Auditorium.

While fieldling questions at the sidelines of the event, Prof. Zulum noted that the earning of his state is not different from that of other states in Nigeria but that the Borno State Government stands out because it gets its priorities right and that ordinary people are the priority of the Government.

He also noted that the government of the state keeps rebuilding and it is neither deterred nor distracted even as insurgents continue to destroy some of the new buildings.

In a similar gesture towards the CPSS, the Director, Projects, Rural Electrification Agency of Nigeria, Engr Suleiman Bolakale Kawu, who was represented by Engr Kale Yusuf, pledged to donate a researchers fund and also institute the best student prize at the Centre.

Earlier in his welcome address, the Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Research, Technology and Innovation), Prof. Adegboyega Adisa Fawole, underscored the importance of peace in the world, especially at the moment, which, according to him, "is full of trial, hatred, violence and war".

Also speaking, the Chairman of the occasion, Prof. Sulyman Olatunji Adeyemi, commended the Vice Chancellor for his support for the programme, noting that peace practice is not exclusive to peace scholars but it is rather everybody's business.

He posited that Nigerians are noted for peace building and cited one of the awardees, Prof. Ibrahim Agboola Gambari, CFR, whom he described as his

childhood friend, as someone whose career has been dominated by peace-making around the world.

The Director of the Centre for Peace and Strategic Studies, Prof. Ibrahim Abdulganiyu Jawondo, in his address, asserted that the Peace Ambassadors were carefully selected among people who have contributed to peace building in Nigeria, noting that just like education, which is no longer exclusive to governments, peace building is the business of all and developing countries no longer run to the developed countries to find peace, rather, everyone now has to find home-grown solutions to crises.

Speaking in response to the award of Peace Ambassador, Professor of Law Practice, Mallam Yusuf Olaolu Ali, SAN, noted that he has a long history of support and partnership with different units of the University of Ilorin.

Mallam Ali, who was represented by Mallam K. K. Eleja, SAN, pledged to deepen the existing support and expand its areas of support in the University.

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In her response to the appointment as a Peace Ambassador, an Osogbo-based business mogul, Hajia Fatimah Toyin Shuaibu, promised to uphold the value of peace, compassion and empathy in all her endeavours while continuing to work tirelessly for every voice of peace to be heard and all conflicts resolved through dialogue.

Other awardees at the occasion were former Chief of Army Staff, Lt. General Tukur Buratai, who was represented by a former Chairman of the Kwara State Branch of the Association of Nigerian Authors, Colonel Oladele Babajamu (rtd); the Governor of Kebbi State, Mohammed Nasir Idris and Senator Adamu Aliero of Kebbi State.

The award-winning researchers, who are from different Faculties and Departments and with varied number of publications, included lecturers from the Department of Chemical Engineering such as Dr George Adewale Adeniyi, who has eight articles; Dr Mary Adejoke Ajala, one article; and Dr Esther Olubunmi Babatunde, who has two articles to her credit. Also from the same Department of Chemical Engineering are Dr Ajala Elijah Olawale, who has two articles; and Dr Tunmise Latifat Adewoye, with one article; Dr Hambali H. Umar as well as Dr Aderibigbe Fatai Alade, both of whom

have two articles each.

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Also on the list of the awardees are Dr Orosun Muyiwa Michael of the Department of Physics, who has seven articles; Dr Hussein Kehinde Okoro of the Department of Industrial Chemistry who recorded three articles; Dr Wasiu Olanrewaju Raji of the Department of Geophysics, who has four articles and Dr Omoniyi Peter Olorunleke of the Department of Mechanical Engineering, who has one article to his credit.

From the Department of Communication Sciences are Dr Naeem Atanda Balogun, Dr Mudathir Okuwaseyi Oloyede and Dr Rafiat Ajibade Oyekunle with one article each. Two of the honources from the Department of Religions are Prof. Oyeronke Olademo and Dr AbdulGafar Olawale Fahm with each of them contributing one article. UNILORIN reiterates zero tolerance for social vices

he management of the University of Ilorin has reiterated its zero tolerance for all forms of antisocial behaviours.

The Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, stated this penultimate Friday (April 19, 2024) while speaking at the maiden matriculation ceremony of students of the Centre for Open and Distance Learning (CODL).

Prof. Egbewole warned the new students to be wary of the fact that the University has zero tolerance for frivolities, indiscipline, and academic fraud as he urged them to imbibe the UNILORIN spirit.

The Vice Chancellor, who spoke through the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Management Services), Prof. Suleiman Funsho Ambali, encouraged the new students to use the opportunity of their admission judiciously.

While encouraging the students to embrace diversity as they engage with their peers, Professors, and other staff members of the University in meaningful ways, the Vice Chancellor explained that the University prides itself as Better By Far through the fostering of a supportive and welcoming environment for all students, regardless of backgrounds, cultures or beliefs.

He reminded them that they are

now part of a diverse and vibrant community of scholars that values innovation and collaboration, stating that this spirit has made the University stand out among its peers on the continent.

The Vice Chancellor, however, said that the management of the University would continue to support the CODL in realising its mandates. He noted that "the centre, established two years ago, is now beginning to fulfill its mandate of making university education available to all through the open and distance learning programme. We are proud of this stride."

In an interview with the **UNILORIN BULLETIN**, the Director of the Centre, Prof. Oyeronke Ogunlade, revealed that a total of 105 students were matriculated.

Prof. Ogunlade explained that the CODL programme offers students a dual opportunity to enroll in one of the world's top universities while managing their work or other private ventures without interference.

Prof. Ogunlade encouraged members of the public, particularly the working class, who want to pursue university education, to consider the programme as an option and assured them that many other courses will be made available soon.

The CODL Director stated that the programme commenced with Computer Science students for the 2022/2023 academic session and announced plans to introduce additional accredited programmes in the future.

Joining the Vice Chancellor at the ceremony were the Registrar and Secretary to the Council, Mr Mansur Adeleke Alfanla; and the University Librarian, Dr Kamaldeen Tunde Omopupa.







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Stop discriminating against people with disability, Olawuyi charges Nigerians

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The don canvassed that more accessibility and accommodation should be extended to persons with disability in order to ensure adequate and even human capital development.

Prof. Olawuyi noted that several forms of discrimination are being perpetrated against people living with disability, saying that some of them who struggled to obtain quality education and earned respectable qualifications are more often than not denied the job of their choice because of their physical disability.

The don explained that those who are living with disability are not less human and so there is need for deliberate efforts to be made for them to live a useful life, adding that concerted efforts must be made for this category of citizens not to become liability to the society.

To start with, Prof. Olawuyi advised parents not to hide their children who have one form of disability or another. She explained that when such a category of children and wards are brought out on time they will be able to access quality education.

She also suggested that more "assistive" and adaptive technologies should be injected into the system to be able to include and assist people with disability properly.

Prof. Olawuyi also canvassed for the renaming of the University of Ilorin's Centre for Supportive Services for the Deaf to a more encompassing name, which would reflect the great work it is doing and to also give a sense of belonging to people with other types of disability. She, therefore, suggested that the name of the Centre should be changed to "Disability Support Centre."

While noting that the proper ratio for interpreters is two interpreters to a deaf person, the inaugural lecturer charged the University to effect this in order to be able to take care of the peculiar situations of the people with that type of disability.

Prof. Olawuyi also implored the authorities of the University of Ilorin to establish a Department of Special Education as a matter of urgency. She explained that the

University has enough manpower to run the proposed Department successfully.

She also called on stakeholders to ensure that awareness on the characteristics of autism disorder syndrome are created and sustained so as not to mislabel such children.

In order to be able to handle every category of learners adequately and professionally, the Inaugural Lecturer said that every teacher training programme in Nigeria should compulsorily include elements of Special Education.

She similarly canvassed the inclusion of Special Education in the General Studies programme of institutions of higher learning. Prof. Olawuyi explained that the inclusion would enable the society to be aware of their counterparts with disabilities and the causes of disabilities.

Justyfing the reason why employers of labour should always consider qualified and competent people

with disability for suitable employment in their various organisations, Prof. Olawuyi urged stakeholders to employ other professionals that would be helpful in providing inclusive education for people with disability.

Prof. Olawuyi also encouraged parents and guardians to always be conscious of the causes of disabilities and take necessary and swift precautions, especially for the adventitious causes that can be controlled to an extent.

Drawing lessons from her personal professional career, the don appealed to senior members of the academia to always mentor and assist younger ones to grow in the interest of the nation.

The inaugural lecture was attended by Principal Officers of the University as well as friends, colleagues, students and relations of Prof. Olawuyi from far and near.



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Focus research on solution to societal problem, Egbewole urges PG students

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he Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has urged postgraduate students of the institution to direct their research efforts towards addressing societal challenges.

Prof. Egbewole made this call last Monday (April 22, 2024) while declaring open the "POGSASS Research Training Workshop" organised by the Postgraduate Students Association (POGSA) at the Basement of the University Main Auditorium.

The Vice Chancellor, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Research Technology and Innovation), Prof. Adegboyega Adisa Fawole, explained the need for research outputs to contribute to solving pressing issues within the community, adding that commercialising research becomes significantly easier when it addresses tangible societal problems.

Acknowledging the economic realities of the country, Prof. Egbewole encouraged researchers to focus on areas where their expertise can make a meaningful difference.

He said that global recognition and university rankings increasingly hinge on the calibre of research produced by both the Faculty and students.

While applauding the POGSSAS executives for the initiative, the Vice Chancellor said that the training was in line

with the vision 1:10:500 of the present administration, adding that, "What you are doing is noble; we want it to become a regular practice, and we believe it will fast-track our progress."

Highlighting the role of postgraduate students as the flagship of academic research, Prof. Egbewole shared his optimism about their potential to drive innovation and generate solutions to complex societal problems.

In his remarks, the Dean of the Postgraduate School, Prof. Bamidele Victor Owoyale, joined the Vice Chancellor to call on the postgraduate students of the institution to prioritise problem-solving in their communities through research endeavors. While noting that, research output should transcend mere academic exercises, the Professor of Physiology underscored the importance of commercialising research outputs, noting that this approach aligns with the vision set forth by the Vice Chancellor, which is aimed at positioning the University as the premier institution in Nigeria.

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Also acknowledging the contemporary economic realities, Honourable Mukthar Tolani Shagaya, a member of the House of Representatives from Kwara State, in his keynote address, explained the critical role that research plays in driving innovation and fostering economic growth.

He emphasised that in today's rapidly evolving world, innovation is the key driver of progress and the importance of research cannot be overstated as development around the world has demonstrated that research, when effectively harnessed, has the power to unlock new insights, spur technological advancements, catalyse economic development and societal change.

Honorable Shagaya, who was represented by his legislative aide, Dr Abdullah Ibrahim, encouraged participants to learn from experts in their fields, exchange ideas and forge partnerships that will drive meaningful impacts.

He urged them not to pursue knowledge for its own sake but to translate learning into tangible solutions that address real world challenges.



COMSIT restructured for efficient service delivery - Jimoh By Abubakar Imam

he management of the Computer Services and Information Technology (COMSIT), University of Ilorin, has announced the reorganisation of the Directorate to ensure efficient service delivery.

This is contained in a memo signed by the Director, Prof. Rasheed Gbenga Jimoh, a copy of which was made available to *UNILORIN BULLETIN*.

The Director explained that the reorganisation was embarked upon "in line with global best practices in managing Information Technology (IT) within an enterprise like ours coupled with the ongoing digital transformation agenda of the

current Administration".

The Directorate, according to Prof. Jimoh, is now segmented into 12 Units with each headed by a Deputy Director.

The Administration and Operations Unit, which coordinates all activities of other units in addition to handling administrative matters of the Directorate, is headed by Dr Rasheed Ademola Tomori while the Software and Applications Unit, which is saddled with

the responsibility of gathering and validation of requirements of any proposed solution/automation, is headed by Dr Aderinola Dunmade. The Portal Unit, whose responsibility is seeing to the day-to-day operations of all portals of the University, is headed by Mr Yekeen Suleiman.

Mr Aliyu Bolakale Yusuf is the Head of the Digital Innovations and ICT Ideation Unit. The Unit coordinates the digital innovations drive of the University from conception to implementation and evaluation stage.

The Web Services Unit, which is responsible for planning, designing and managing the main website of the University and other web services to achieve desired visibility and ranking, is headed by Mrs Shakirat Oyeleke; while the Mail Services and Help-Desk Unit, which is in charge of general mail services for students and staff of the University, has Mrs Medinat Salman as its Head.

Also among the newly created Units is Cybersecurity and Multimedia Unit whose duty entails the overseeing of the security and protection of the University's digital assets and it is headed by Mr Abdulkadir Bola Saka while Mr Hussein Akande emerges as the Head of the Network Operations Unit, which is responsible for the smooth running of the University's Network Operations Centre (NOC).

> Similarly, the Training Unit, whose duty revolves around the coordination of all ICT training and certifications within the University. Driving the new innovative ICT short courses is headed by Mr Tunde Olanrewaju while the IT Officers Coordinating Unit, which sees to efficient delivery of services at Faculties, Centres and Units through effective monitoring of performance of the appointed IT Officers, is headed by Mrs Serah Alabi.

The Electronic Learning and Assessment Unit, which is headed by Mrs Florence Omodunke Fatoki, is charged with the responsibility of coordinating digital learning and assessment processes including the Computer-Based Test (CBT) within the University from conception through implementation and to the impact assessment stage while the last but not the least is the Software and Hardware Installation, Repair and Maintenance Unit, which ensures in-house installation, repair, and maintenance of computer software and hardware, is headed by Mrs Medinat Ayodeji.
