

he Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof Wahab Olasupo Egbewole (SAN), has said that Level Advisers are the backbone of student guidance, saying that "their ability to uphold ethical standards and provide informed academic support directly influences our students' success

and the reputation of our institution."

Prof. Egbewole stated this last Thursday (March 20, 2025) while declaring open a training programme for Level Advisers organised by the Centre for Research, Development, and In-House Training (CREDIT) at the University Auditorium.

RIVERS EMERGENCY RULE

Egbewole, others call for constitution amendment

n a bid to prevent a recurrence of the controversy that trailed the recent proclamation of a State of Emergency in Rivers State and the subsequent suspension of all elected officials in the state, legal experts and law scholars, including Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, have called for an urgent amendment to the Constitution to include an express provision for clearly defined scope of the President's powers in such emergency situations.

The experts made the call last Friday (March 21, 2025) at a roundtable debate on the "Constitutionality of the Declaration of a State of Emergency in Rivers State" organised by the Judicial Resource Cluster (Unilorin) and the International Society of Public Law, Nigeria Chapter (ICON-S NG).

The debate, which was held virtually, and monitored by *UNILORIN Bulletin*, was moderated by Prof. Azubike Omuora-Oguno and Dr. Oluwatosin Igbayiloye, both of the Faculty of Law, University of Ilorin.

In his opening remarks, the Chairman of the group and Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, stressed the need for a critical and objective analysis of the issue, free from political or sentimental influences. He urged participants to focus on legal and academic discourse rather than partisan debates.

Prof. Egbewole said, "We must not be unmindful of what led us to this point, and we must also be mindful of how we navigate this moment to ensure that our democracy survives. We must put our best efforts forward as academics."

The Vice Chancellor further said that the discussion should not devolve into a blame game. Instead, he called for a well-reasoned analysis of the circumstances surrounding the Rivers State crisis and a concerted effort to prevent a similar situation in the future. He expressed the hope that the deliberations would result in a working document to aid Nigeria's democratic development.

While contributing to the debate, Prof. Joshua Kayode Olatoke, SAN of the Department of Jurisprudence and International Law, University of Ilorin, pointed out that the President's actions were constitutional when examined within the framework of Sections 305, 45, and 11 of the Nigerian Constitution. He noted that the declaration of a state of emergency in Nigeria is not unprecedented, citing historical examples dating back to 1960.

According to Prof. Olatoke, Governor Siminalayi Fubara was becoming uncontrollable at the time the President made the proclamation. While noting that there were reports of pipeline bombings and escalating unrest, the Senior Advocate of Nigeria said the President had to act in the interest of national security.

While highlighting the role of godfatherism in the Rivers State crisis, which necessitated the need to address this issue to prevent similar conflicts in the future, Prof. Olatoke urged politicians to prioritise the welfare of the people rather than their personal integrate.

Similarly, a Professor of Energy and Electricity law at the University of Lagos, Yemi Oke, SAN, defended the President's decision, arguing that it was legally justified under the constitution. He explained that Section 305 exists to address national exigencies, and in the case of Rivers State, all prior attempts to resolve the crisis had failed.

"If we put aside sentiments, there is nothing in Section 305 that the President has not fulfilled. Those opposing the action have not proposed a viable alternative. Allowing politics to override national security concerns would have been irresponsible," he said.

Prof. Oke, however, advocated a constitutional amendment that would clearly outline emergency powers, including provisions that allow the President to assume executive functions without necessarily suspending elected officials.

Another participant, Prof. Iyabode Ogunniran, from the Department of Public Law, University of Lagos, argued that while the President's actions might have been necessary, there is no explicit constitutional provision that allows the suspension of a governor or legislature under a state of emergency.

While citing Section 305(1)(d), which permits the President to declare a state of emergency when there is an actual breakdown of law and order requiring extraordinary measures, the Law scholar said, "The crisis in Rivers State, which began in

2023, has seen significant developments, including the governor demolishing the House of Assembly complex and presenting a budget to only four members instead of the required number against the provision of the constitution. There were also reports of pipeline bombings amid the political crisis. Given these factors, the President's action appears justified".

She, however, stressed the urgency of amending the constitution to provide clarifications on the scope of emergency powers and the options available to the President in such situations. She called on the National Assembly to legislate on the matter to prevent future controversies.

Other participants in the debate, however, argued that the President had exceeded his constitutional powers by declaring a state of emergency in Rivers State. They pointed out that the constitution does not explicitly allow for the suspension of democratically elected officials except through impeachment.

The Head of Litigation at Gbenga Ojo & Co, Mr. Olugbenga Ojo, contended that the provision of the Emergency Acts, Section 11(3), which empowers the President, cannot override the Constitution, nor can it be subservient to its provisions. He warned that the lack of explicit constitutional provisions could lead to further legal disputes and instability.

While calling for an immediate convention of legal and political stakeholders to amend the constitution and include clear provisions for emergency governance, Mr Ojo stated that the supremacy of the constitution must be upheld. "If there had been an express provision that allows the President to remove an elected official under emergency conditions, we wouldn't be facing this controversy," he stated

Similarly, the Head of Chambers at KB & Company, Mr Kayode Ajiboye, underscored the need for constitutional amendments. He also urged legal professionals who work with the politicians to guide their political leaders based on the dictates of the law rather than personal interests. "What happened in Rivers State is a result of a personality clash. Politicians must understand that leadership is about serving the people, not personal gain," he said.

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He also emphasised the commitment of the organisation to enhancing standardisation in Nigeria, saying that this is important for the preservation of the health and greatness of the country.

Prof. Okeke stressed the need for continuous training and certification programmes, pointing out that standards generally undergo modifications every four to five years due to evolving technologies and regulatory adjustments.

The Director-General cited the Tobacco Act as a case study, noting the ongoing debates on flavored tobacco and emerging regulatory considerations, such as the implementation of graphic warnings alongside text warnings on the packaging.

To address these concerns, Prof. Okeke said that SON and UNILORIN would set up a joint research committee that will involve industry stakeholders, regulators, and academic experts.

In his remarks, the Vice Chancellor, University of Ilorin, Prof.

Wahab Egbewole, SAN, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Research, Technology, and Innovation), Prof. Muhtar Etudaiye, appreciated SON for choosing the University as a strategic partner.

Prof. Egbewole noted that the collaboration would offer immense benefits to the University with assured impacts across multiple Faculties such as Engineering, Science, Pharmacy, and Medicine.

He also said that the partnership would also afford researchers and students of the University the possibility of making use of quality assurance facilities in Lagos and that the joint research and development will enhance research output and contribute significantly to Nigeria's industrial and economic growth.

The Vice Chancellor also pointed out that the Centre for Open and Distance Learning (CODL) of the University would benefit from hands-on industry experience, while SON professionals will contribute as visiting lecturers.

He also explained that laboratories of SON and those of the University will be utilised for product testing and certification, adding that this would reinforce UNILORIN's leadership in technical partnerships.

The Vice Chancellor was accompanied by an Associate Professor at the Department of Chemical Engineering, Dr George Adeniyi. The don, who is also a one-time Researcher of the Year, played a key role in the presigning negotiations.

With this collaboration, UNILORIN is poised to set new benchmarks in standardisation and innovation, reinforcing its position as a leader in academic-industry engagement.

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RUDN University, Faculty of CIS collaborate on training workshop

he RUDN University, Moscow, has organised a training workshop for students and staff of the University of Ilorin to boost their academic learning, research, and community service.

The programme, organised in collaboration with the Faculty of Communication and Information Sciences, University of Ilorin, aimed at equipping participants with essential skills in academic research, manuscript writing, and publication ethics.

The two-day training workshop held at the Auditorium Basement last Monday and Tuesday (March 17-18, 2025). with sessions covering key topics such as structuring research papers, avoiding plagiarism, and navigating high-impact journal submissions.

In his opening remarks, the Dean of the Faculty of Communication and Information Sciences, Prof. Lukman Azeez, emphasised the importance of strong academic writing skills in advancing research output and global academic recognition.

Prof. Azeez noted that the training would assist postgraduate students of the University in understanding the rules and regulations guiding academic research writing, as it is now mandatory for Master's students to publish at least one article before graduation.

The Dean expressed gratitude RUDN University for the collaboration and reiterated the

commitment of the Faculty to fostering research excellence. He encouraged participants to apply the skills learned to improve their academic work and contribute to global scholarship.

Speaking on behalf of RUDN University, Prof. Muhammad Jamiu Mustapha, highlighted the institution's dedication to international partnerships that promote knowledge exchange.

He added that "the collaboration between RUDN University and the CIS Faculty marks a significant step in strengthening research capacity and academic excellence within the institutions."

The first day of the training featured Prof. Mustapha discussing publishing in high-index journals, review work, editing, and essential guidelines. Prof. Gregory Simon from Russia joined via Zoom to explain understanding the industry and what works in each country regarding academic research writing.

Prof. Saudat Abdulbagi of the

Department of Mass Communication, University of Ilorin, discussed 'Writing for Journals'. She emphasised the importance of maintaining attention to detail throughout the writing and submission process to increase the chances of being accepted by the journal.

Prof. Abdulbaqi encouraged young researchers to persevere, restrategise, and not give up if their paper is rejected.

On his part, Dr Rasaq Adisa of the Department of Mass Communication, University of Ilorin discussed qualitative data management, coding, and analysis using NVivo and AI. He explained how students and researchers can utilize different available Artificial Intelligence tools for data analysis based on their field of study.

Dr Adisa noted that "technology has made research writing easy, however, students should use it wisely."

Uphold media ethics, Mustapha urges journalists

former Ag. Head of the Department of Mass Communication, Faculty of Communication and Information Sciences, University of Ilorin, Prof. Kayode Lambe Mustapha, has urged journalists to uphold the ethics of contemporary journalism by ensuring that the information they dish out is factual and serves the interest of the general public.

Prof. Mustapha gave the advice last Wednesday(March 19, 2025) while delivering a lecture on Entrepreneurial Journalism at a programme organised by the Department of Mass communication in collaboration with the RUDN University, Russia, at the University Auditorium Basement.

The don noted that journalists, as the fourth estate of the realm, are expected to discharge their responsibilities without allowing their personal interests to compromise the ethics of the profession.

He emphasised that these ethics include upholding factual information and accuracy, truthfulness, independence, fairness, balance, and social responsibility, among others.

Prof. Mustapha described ethics as the branch of Philosophy that deals with questions of morality.

He defined media entrepreneurship as harnessing resources and capabilities to successfully establish and manage a media enterprise, pointing out that it involves creating and managing media ventures including digital platforms, news outlets,

entertainment company and content-driven businesses.

The Mass Communication scholar maintained that the trajectories of media enterprise include personal, partisan, populist, corporate and contemporary press. He added that contemporary journalism has to do with digital transformation and multimedia journalism, independent and entrepreneurial journalism and data driven and AI assisted reporting.

Prof. Mustapha said that the challenges of contemporary journalism include misinformation and fake news, financial sustainability, political pressure and journalistic freedom, and audiencecentric approach, among others.

He advised journalists to uphold their professional ethics so they would continue to soar higher in the profession.





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Egbewole urges Muslim faithful to shun moral decadence

he Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has urged Muslim faithful to shun moral decadence and embrace decency in all their dealings.

Prof. Egbewole gave this charge penultimate Saturday (March 15, 2025) in his remarks at this year's edition of the annual Ramadan Lecture organised by the Ilorin Emirate Staff Association (IESA), University of Ilorin, held at the University Auditorium.

The Vice Chancellor, who was represented on the occasion by the Director of the Joint Preliminary Examinations Board (JUPEB), Prof. Ibrahim Kayode Adam, emphasised the importance of moral uprightness and encouraged Muslims to avoid immoral bahaviour, noting that moral decadence can be attributed to various factors, including the social media and negligence by parents towards child upbringing.


Prof. Egbewole, who was the Chief Host of the programme, pointed out that the society would be healthy and free of crime and criminality if children are groomed based on Islamic tenets, saying that it was high time that the evading glory of the Emirate, particularly the Ilorin city, was reclaimed from those who are bent on smearing it.

Vice Chancellor recalled that one of the most attractive unique selling points of Ilorin several decades back was its complete harmony, which stemmed from its fascinating culture characterised by learning, peaceful coexistence, hard work and contentment, among others.

He added that this fascinating aspect of the city is being vigorously threatened by some of its indigenes and residents as he said that it was not too late to get the deterioration arrested in the interest of the present and future generations.

As the University's host community, the Vice Chancellor asserted that the culture of Ilorin would surely impact on the University.

The Vice Chancellor condemned the unbridled pursuit of materialism and



emerging tendencies for ritual killings, which are in contrast with what the city was hitherto known for.



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
UNILORIN marks International Social Workers Day



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UNILORIN to pioneer accelerometrics research in Nigeria -- Dominic

former Director of Sports, University of Ilorin, Prof. Olufunmilola Dominic, has stated that the University would soon begin the study of physical activity and sleep behaviour research, otherwise known as accelerometrics.

Prof. Dominic stated this last Tuesday (March 18, 2025) while speaking at a Workshop jointly organised by the Exercise and Sports Science Research Group (ESSRG) and the Department of Human Kinetics Education, University of Ilorin in collaboration with Coventry University, United Kingdom.

She said that it was high time that

the magnitude and qualities of physical activities, sleep patterns and sedentary lifestyles of people are objectively measured as part of efforts towards determining their state of health and to provide comparative African data and norms.

Prof. Dominic explained that this is the first time this type of training is organised in Nigeria as she expressed happiness that the University provided the platforms needed to organise the research training within the institution.

The renowned sports scientist, who is the Group Leader of the ESSRG, thanked the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, for his support for the programme.

Stressing that the training would be established at the University of Ilorin with the assistance of the University of Coventry, England, Prof. Dominic said that everything would be done between the two universities to concretise the collaboration.

The don, who teaches at the Department of Human Kinetics Education, also thanked Dr Faatihah Niyi-Odumosu of the University of The West England who linked the University of Ilorin with Coventry University, and the Resource Person, Dr Nduka Okwosu thereby promoting UK research collaborations with the University among others.

She also appreciated the Director of the Centre for International Education (CIE), Prof. Lateef Onireti Ibraheem, for his role in the MOUs processes.

In his address, the Dean of the Faculty of Education, University of Ilorin, Prof. Lasiele Alabi Yahaya, appreciated the University Administration, the Organising Committee of the training and the facilitator for their various efforts.

He encouraged the Resource Person, Dr Nduka Okwosu of Coventry University to go beyond the academic training he provided by ensuring other forms of empowerment for interested individuals and groups such as admission, provision of equipment and other relevant

opportunities for exchange programmes.

In his presentation, Dr Okwosu, said that every physical activity must be restricted at every stage of life based on the health status of the individual, especially in relation to cardio metabolic diseases and heart attack cormobidies, hence researches in such vulnerable groups' interventions should include not only physical activity experts, but also their physicians and psychologists for proper monitoring.

Dr Okwosu explained that this is not an age of withdrawing from exercise but that of involvement in physical activities and exercises to improve the health of the patients/participants.

He added that efforts must also be made to minimise the level and quantity of cholesterol in our body systems through programmed exercise.

Dr Okwosu emphasised the challenges from lack of experts' collaborative treatment to lack of motivation, '*Japa'* syndrome of experts, and non-availability of professional exercise prescriptions, among others.

He warned young people against unbridled pursuit of greener pasture, saying that if they stay in Nigeria they can still make it as they would also be contributing their quotas to national progress.

Dr Okwosu appreciated the University Management and everyone for the mutual contributions and future-elaborate MOUs.

Also speaking, the Ag. Head of the Department of Human Kinetics Education, Dr Memunat Ajadi, thanked the University Administration and everyone who made the workshop a huge success.

Participants at the training session included academic staff and other professionals from various departments of the Faculty of Education, University of Ilorin and sister universities within and outside Kwara State.
