he Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has reaffirmed the Institution's commitment to eradicating cultism among its students, saying the most sought-after University maintains zerotolerance for cultism.

he Chief Imam of the University of Ilorin Central Mosque, Prof. Nasir AbdusSalam, has advised Muslim faithful to reconcile their differences with fellow Muslims, tolerate their weaknesses, forgive their past and broker truce among themselves.

Egbewole charges Registry staff to uphold university culture

he Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has emphasised the importance of the Registry staff in sustaining the University's culture.

Prof. Egbewole, who stated this last Thursday (March 27, 2025) at the 2025 Registry's First Quarter In-house Seminar, noted that as custodians of the university tradition, the Registry staff should be at the forefront of championing the values of the University.

The Vice-Chancellor reminded the staff that promotions will be based on performance and competence, encouraging them to strive for excellence. He also suggested that the Registrar should consider issuing certificates to staff members who attend the quarterly seminar in recognition of their commitments to continuous learning.
The Seminar featured lectures

from two resource persons, the Deputy Registrar (Academic), Mr. John Aiyedun, who spoke on "Speech and Report Writing", and a Principal Assistant Registrar, Mr. Oluwole Leye, who spoke on "Understanding" Administrative Terminologies, Usage and Implication."

In his presentation, Mr Aiyedun emphasised that knowledge acquisition is essential for personal growth and success. He stressed the importance of developing a reading habit.

On his part, Mr Leye's presentation highlighted the need for administrative staff to be well-versed in relevant terminologies. He recommended a daily review of the conditions of service book for at least 15 minutes

Earlier in his speech, the Registrar, Mr. Mansur Alfanla, FCIML, urged staff members to embrace a culture of continuous development, stressing that up-to-date knowledge and skills are essential for remaining relevant and effective.

In his remarks, the Director of the Centre for Research Development and In-House Training (CREDIT), Prof. Abdulkarim Oloyede, praised the impact of the quarterly lectures on the performance of the Registry staff.

The Vice Chancellor attributed his Administration's success in maintaining a cultism-free institution and peaceful academic environment to the synergy between security personnel, management, students, and other stakeholders. He reassured the University community that the Administration remains committed to ensuring the safety of all students and staff.

Prof. Egbewole said, "As a University, we have our unique strategies. Since cultism is a security issue, our strategies remain dynamic. You will agree with me that we had exterminated cultism from our University for more than two decades, and it remains so because we have a security architecture that is working. We have a crop of responsible and responsive student bodies, a very effective Student Affairs Unit, and, of course, a zero-tolerance policy for cultism as a University".

The Vice Chancellor explained the significance of the 2025 Ramadan Iftar programme, noting its inclusivity in uniting all University stakeholders, regardless of religious affiliation. He stated that this year's event was particularly unique, as the University expanded its reach to engage not only with the media but also with the Muslim community, the Committee of Provost and Deans, Directors of various units, and other members of the University.

He stated further that the University provides accommodation for various religious groups, pointing out that "as a community, we provide accommodation for various religious divisions. Every religion is accommodated within our community, making our University unique."

Prof. Egbewole said, "I don't think there is any university in Nigeria that does what we do. Every Christmas, we felicitate with our Christian brothers and sisters, and during Ileya festival, they celebrate with the Muslim Ummah".

S p e a k i n g o n t h e internationalisation agenda of the University, Prof. Egbewole assured his audience that the process is well on course

and outlined key initiatives undertaken since he assumed office.

He mentioned efforts to sign more Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) with universities across the world, strengthen the



institution's immersion programme, and upgrade the Centre for International Education (CIE). He added that the University currently has over 100 MoUs with institutions across different continents.

In a sermon at the Iftar programme, the Chief Imam of the UNILORIN Central Mosque, represented by the Deputy Chief Imam, Dr Musa Siddiq Abdullahi, urged Muslims to sustain the lessons of Ramadan, which include endurance, fear of Almighty Allah, and always providing food for the needy.

Challenging the audience to reflect on their devotion beyond Ramadan, the Imam asked, "As we move away from the month of Ramadan, are we going to be

among those who fast only because of Ramadan, or among those who observe fasting because of their fear of Allah?" According to him, "during Ramadan, everyone observed the virtues as ordained by Allah, but true devotion is reflected in one's ability to sustain those good deeds beyond Ramadan".

Dr Abdullahi, who is a lecturer in the Department of Arts Education, urged Muslims to continue practicing self-discipline, guard their tongues, always speak what is good, share with the needy, refrain from fights, and avoid all forms of wrongdoing to ensure that their fasting is accepted.

Prof. AbdulsSalam urged the faithful to tolerate one another's weaknesses, forgive the past and broker truce among yourselves."

He also urged Muslims not to be too joyful but be obedient to Allah, as there is no real joy in this life as compared to the joy of the hereafter awaiting the believers only.

"The only lasting joy in this life is

the inner joy of the heart whenever it discovers Allah. That explains the readiness of believers to keep on fasting, endure long standing in Qiyaamullail, recitation of the Qur'an despite the associated hardship with these acts because they hope for the joy of the hereafter. There is no joyful occasion in this life that is free from trial and tribulation", he said.

Theatre Arts can heal wars, hunger, poverty, mental illness, others -- Oyewo

Prof. Oyewo, who is the Head of the Department of Performing and Film University of Ilorin, made this submission last Thursday (March 27, 2025) while delivering the 276th Inaugural Lecture, titled "Imagine a World without Theatre and its Realities on the Stage and the Environment in Nigeria", at the University Auditorium.

According to the renowned thespian scholar, whose lecture is the 7 from the Department, "a major rationale for theatre in both local, national and in cultural relations is predicated on the firm belief that the theatre can be one means of healing the tragic situations, such as wars, hunger, poverty, confronting the world."

Quoting a foremost thespian, Goethe, the Inaugural Lecturer said, "An artless society is a heartless society", pointing out that the arts in general and theatre in particular, is instrumental in bringing emotional depth, empathy, and humanity to a society". He added that "without art, a society risks becoming soulless and disconnected.

Prof. Oyewo, whose academic journey had been interspersed with practical professional participation, said that theatre can heal mental illness, based on his earlier study titled, "Psychometamimesis: Drama and Theatre In the Therapeutic Intervention and Management of Mental illness". He said, "The assumption is that psychometamimesis has a strong potential for treating mental illness because the world of theatre is controlled in its own reaction to disequilibrium created in the universe

The Inaugural Lecture further highlighted the therapeutic nature of theatre to the practitioners of Theatre Arts. According to him, "the use of physical body to present, perform and enact before an audience promotes wellness of artistes, because the use of body movement, gesture, and exercise involves muscular movement, and burning of fat among others.

Prof. Oyewo, whose spread of contributions to the Theatre cover all areas of specialisation like dance, drama, theatre, music and the media as well as the social media, also said that theatre "is an essential

tool for education, promoting critical thinking, creativity and emotional intelligence."

To ensure that humanity continues to benefit from the sundry roles of Theatre, the In a u g u r a l Lecturer made some recommendations to enhance the Stage, Environment, Arts and Cultural Management within the thespian industry, saying that "It is unimaginable for theatre to die, because its death will bring great cataclysm to the

Prof. Oyewo called for the 'establishment of a performing company (by universities) to compliment the academic arm and its tight academic schedule", pointing out that this could emerge around three main concepts: teaching/academic support unit, research and community services, and

revenue generation.

He also called for the establishment of finishing schools to enhance the employability of Theatre Arts graduates. This, according to him, will serve as "buffer zone between the classroom and the field after graduation.'

Prof. Oyewo also challenged Professional Theatre Associations to "exhibit proper control in enforcement of moral values beneficial to society" and to also "serve as regulatory bodies to address the issue of the liberal arts nature of conventional theatre schools to enhance the engageability and employability of Theater Arts graduates.

The don, who is a former visiting

Professor, Pennsylvania State University, and the foundation Head of the Department of Theatre Arts, University of Africa, Toru-Oma (UAT), also stressed the need to exploit the window of cultural diplomacy offered by Theatre Arts "in exploring links and connections within the African Diaspora, for the preservation of African culture, by signing MoU among theatre departments, organising inter-university cultural and theatre competitions, making African cultural studies compulsory for all categories of students in African university curricular to make the theatre embody the spirit of unity in diversity within the categories of African diasporas."

Prof. Oyewo, who is a former Chairman of the National Association of Nigerian Theatre Arts Practitioners (NANTAP), urged the relevant governmental and non-governmental organisations, to "regularly embark on the digitisation of theatre production resource materials and cultural festivals exhibiting them in schools, youth centres and museums of arts and antiquities to promote and transmit culture."

The lecture, which was well attended by senior academics and friends of Prof. Oyewo, was held under the Chairmanship of the University Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN.

Prof. Egbewole, who described the Ramadan fast as an opportunity for personal attitudinal transformation and communal rebirth, urged Muslims to always reflect the lessons learnt during the season in other aspects of their lives.

NIPOST seeks enhanced collaboration with



Professor of Biochemistry at the University of Ilorin, Elizabeth Abidemi Balogun, has said that leadership at all levels must foster an environment that supports career growth, employee development and staff wellbeing.

Prof. Balogun made the call last Wednesday (March 26, 2025) while delivering her Valedictory Lecture at the New Science Lecture Theatre 1, (NSLT1).

Christians and Muslims, emphasising that God is one and desires unity among all people.

He encouraged both Muslims and Christians to come together and pray for Nigeria, stressing that prayers can achieve remarkable results.

Dr. Osaji further admonished those engaging in sinful activities such as kidnapping, ritualism, and robbery to repent and make restitution during this holy month.

He attributed the peaceful atmosphere in the University of Ilorin to religious harmony, prayers, purposeful leadership, and academic excellence.

The cleric expressed pride in the achievements of graduates from the Department of Religions, University of Ilorin, noting that many of them had excelled in various fields locally and internationally.

He encouraged leaders and followers in Nigeria to turn to God, seek forgiveness, and emulate the example of the Israelites, who received God's mercy after repenting from their sins.

UNILORIN PhD student produces yoghurt from cashew nut milk

External examiner seeks project commercialisation

Ph.D student at the Department of Home

Economics and Food Science, University of Ilorin, Victor Ephraim Edem, has successfully produced yoghurt from cashew-nut milk.

In his Ph.D. research project, titled "Optimisation of Extraction and Fermentation of Cashew (Anacardium Occidentale) Nut Milk for Yoghurt Production," Edem, who was supervised by Prof. Rowland Monday Kayode, highlighted the possibility of utilising state-of-the-art methodology to produce yoghurt from cashew kernel using indigenous starter culture of lactobacillus species.

The External Examiner at the Ph.D. Oral Examination, held last Tuesday (March 25, 2025), Prof. Cornelius O. Orishagbemi, urged the Management of the University of Ilorin to explore the commercial potential of the research project.

Prof. Orishagbemi, who is from Prince Abubakar Audu University, Ayangba, Kogi State, described the project work as innovative and outstanding research work that demonstrated expertise in cashew-nut yoghurt production.

According to him, "What makes it

unique is the local starter culture; which Edem used to ferment cashew-nut milk to produce plant based-yoghurt".

He said, "The methodology employed mathematical equations to analyse the results, with major findings including extraction time, extraction temperature, and the ratio of cashew kernel to water", adding that "Edem optimised these variables to achieve the best results."

Prof. Orishagbemi stated further that "Edem's research also explored alternative uses of cashew-nut, including the production of chinchin and a meal that can replace Egusi soup. These innovations have the potential to generate internal revenue for the university and create export products."

Prof. Orishagbemi appreciated the University Management, including the Dean of the Faculty of Agriculture, the Head of the Department, and the Dean of the Postgraduate School, for inviting him to examine Edem's Ph.D. presentation.

During his presentation, Edem highlighted the significance of the product to the University community, including the provision of healthier food options for students and staff, addressing specific dietary needs, and positioning the university as a leader in research.

He recommended that optimised mixture formulations of cashew-based yoghurt could serve as a standard for industrial applications.

In his remarks, the Dean of the Postgraduate School, Prof. Bamidele Victor Owoyele, who was represented by the Sub Dean, Prof. Sijuwade Adebukola Adebayo, congratulated

He urged students to come up with innovative findings, emphasising that research in the Faculty of Agriculture should be practical and value-adding.

The Dean of the Faculty of Agriculture, Prof. Oluyemisi Fawole, expressed excitement about the maiden oral defense. She congratulated the Supervisor, Prof. Rowland Monday Kayode, the Head of Department, and staff members for this milestone achievement.

The Head of the Department of Home Economics and Food Science, Prof. Olufunmilayo Adunni Abiodun, thanked Almighty God for the success recorded during her tenure, promising to sustain the training of Ph.D. students and describing the achievement as a landmark success for the Department, institution, and Nigeria.

In his remarks, the Supervisor of the first Ph.D. student in the Department, Prof. Rowland Monday Kayode, expressed happiness about the Department's breakthrough.

Prof. Kayode, who is the Director of SIWES, appreciated the University administration for its consistent support to the Department and announced plans to patent the work after approval of the Ph.D. result by the University Senate.
