

Unilorin unveils plan for Science and Tech Park

The University of Ilorin is advancing plans to establish a Science and Technology Park that aims to promote innovative ideas, attract global talents, and foster stronger collaborations among the academia, industry, and government.

This strategic initiative was announced last Tuesday (April 22, 2025) during a high-level meeting at the University Auditorium chaired by the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN.

Opay, UNILORIN sign N60m MoU to support indigent students

In a move aimed at promoting access to education by underprivileged students, a fintech and mobile money service provider, Opay, has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the University of Ilorin to provide scholarship support of N60 million for intelligent but indigent

students over a period of 10 years.

The MoU, which is for the company to sponsor 20 students annually, with each beneficiary receiving N300,000 to support their educational pursuits, was signed penultimate Wednesday (April 16, 2025) at a meeting held at the Vice Chancellor's Committee Room.

Olawumi tasks Nigerians on regular, voluntary blood donation

A former Head of the Department of Haematology, University of Ilorin, Prof. Hannah Oluwayemisi Olawumi, has encouraged Nigerians to cultivate the habit of regular blood donation in order to save lives as she described those who donate blood voluntarily as heroes.

Prof. Olawumi gave this advice last Thursday (April 24, 2025) while delivering the 279th Inaugural Lecture of the University, entitled "Heroes without Capes: The Life-Saving Power of Blood Sacrifice", at the institution's Auditorium.

2001 Medical alumni commend UNILORIN on academic standards

The Global President of the 2001 set of the University of Ilorin Medical graduates, Prof. Abidemi Omonisi, has commended the University's successive administrations on upholding academic and professional standards that continue to produce globally competitive medical graduates.

Prof. Omonisi, who gave the commendation during a courtesy visit to the Vice Chancellor last Tuesday (April 22, 2025), noted that members of the 2001 graduating class from the College of Health Sciences are making waves in leading medical institutions in the United States, the United Kingdom, and other parts of the world.

Prof. Omonisi, who is also the President of the Nigerian Cancer Society, announced that several members of the 2001 class, many of whom are now established professionals in medicine and academia, are ready to support the University through various interventions.

He said, "Some of us in academia, both in Nigeria and outside the country, are willing to partner with the University to be part of the Faculty on a pro bono basis. Some classmates in the UK and US are eager to come and contribute their quota to teaching the medical students of the University. There are many of our classmates who are very experienced in grantsmanship. They are willing to collaborate with the University and Faculty members. Three former students who are now top oncologists in the United States of America are coming to strengthen the field of oncology in the College."

The alumni leader also unveiled plans for a robust staff and student exchange programme aimed at exposing students to international best practices. He explained that "for the exchange programme for staff and students, we believe that instead of final-year students taking some elective courses, it would be beneficial for them to use that period for international exposure. I belong to many international organisations and I am part of the contract staff at Mayo Clinic in the United States. I also sit on two boards at Mayo. What we have done in this group is to create a platform for medical students to engage internationally. Luckily, one of the 500-level students of the University of Ilorin College of Health Sciences has been selected to join us in South Africa, where students from various countries will converge. We believe that kind of exposure will greatly benefit the medical students. We also want to extend the opportunity to



the University staff as well".

Speaking as the President of the Nigerian Cancer Society, Prof. Omonisi reiterated the need for increased attention to cancer prevention and early detection. He noted that while most university health centres offer general screening services, cancer screening is often not prioritised.

He, however, advocated the integration of cancer screening into regular healthcare services provided by the university, noting the importance of early detection, particularly in the case of cervical cancer, which typically gives a warning period of up to ten years.

The Anatomic Pathologist with special interest in Cancer Epidemiology and Molecular Pathology lamented the preventable loss of lives to cancer, especially among academics. He, thereby, called on the authority of the University of Ilorin to blaze the trail in this initiative as they have always been doing.

He used the meeting to announce that the National Executive Council of the Nigerian Cancer Society has approved the appointment of the Provost of the College of Health Sciences, Prof. Biodun Sulyman Alabi, as a member of its Board of Trustees, acknowledging the College's growing influence in national health policy advocacy.

In his response, the Vice Chancellor, expressed strong support for the alumni's initiatives and reaffirmed the Administration's commitment to formalising and facilitating such collaborations.

While praising the alumni's dedication, the Vice Chancellor underscored the value of international exposure for students, noting that real-world experience significantly shapes the lives and careers of young professionals.

Prof. Egbewole also commended

members of the 2001 class for their consistent engagement with the University and encouraged them to make a significant impact during their 25th anniversary celebrations, which will coincide with the University's 50th anniversary. He noted that the University's alumni remain its greatest asset and called on other alumni sets to emulate the example of the 2001 Medical class.

Referencing the remarkable progress recorded in the Faculty of Law through alumni intervention, the Vice Chancellor expressed optimism that similar outcomes could be achieved across other Faculties, including Engineering and Agriculture, with the support of dedicated alumni.

Touching on the issue of cancer, the Vice Chancellor called on medical experts, especially members of the Nigerian Cancer Society, to intensify efforts towards finding more permanent solutions to the disease.

While acknowledging that modern medicine has made significant strides in early detection and management, Prof. Egbewole expressed concern over the physical and emotional toll that treatments such as chemotherapy can take on patients. He urged the medical community to look beyond treatment toward more sustainable solutions that would significantly reduce cancer mortality rates.

Also at the meeting were the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Research, Technology and Innovation), Prof. Muhtar Adeiza Etudaiye; the Provost of the College of Health Sciences, Prof. Biodun Sulyman Alabi; and the Dean, Faculty of Clinical Sciences, Prof. Lukman Olajide Abdur-rahman, among

The meeting, which was attended by the Principal Officers, the Provost of the College of Health Sciences, Deans, and Directors, deliberated on the modalities for the establishment of the Park.

In his address, the Vice Chancellor said that the most sought-after University in Nigeria needs a Science and Technology Park to encourage innovative ideas, attract talents from across the globe and foster strong partnership among the University, industries and government.

Prof. Egbewole, who disclosed that efforts are underway to provide essential infrastructure at the proposed site, including electricity supply and road construction, said that the University's Department of Architecture is expected to contribute to the planning and design phase of the Park.

He further said that the anticipated Science and Technology Park is envisioned as a potential revenue-generating venture, especially within the context of the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA) and ECOWAS trade provisions, which may offer significant advantages to such an initiative.

In a presentation, entitled "Establishment of a Science and Technology Park in Ilorin, Nigeria: Fostering Innovation and Economic

Growth", a distinguished scholar from the School of Mechanical and Industrial Engineering at the Addis Ababa Institute of Technology, Addis Ababa University, Ethiopia, Prof. Daniel Kitaw, outlined an ambitious vision to transform the University of Ilorin into a hub of technological innovation and economic development.

Prof. Kitaw, who is currently a visiting scholar at the University of Ilorin, described the proposed Science, Technology, and Innovation Park (STIP) as a transformative initiative aimed at converting academic research into commercially viable products and services.

While speaking on a proposed strategic model based on global best practices, Prof. Kitaw, who is also the President of AfricaLics Scientific Board, proposed a hybrid model tailored to Nigeria's socio-economic context.

He said that the Park would integrate elements of South Korea's reverse engineering and SME-focused industrial growth, Egypt's startup incubation and talent development strategies, Japan's sustainability-centered development frameworks, China's supply chain integration and infrastructure, and Turkey's model of university-industry collaboration. He added that these models will not only benefit the University of Ilorin but will also help Nigeria leverage its human and material resources for long-term, sustainable development.

According to Prof. Kitaw, "The

proposed STIP will encompass Techno-Parks, Science Parks, and Incubation Parks, each serving as a foundation for fostering creativity, competitiveness, and technological advancement. These facilities will nurture startups, promote innovation-based companies through spin-offs and incubators, and offer high-quality space and services needed for cutting-edge research and development".

He said that the target sectors of the Park include manufacturing, agriculture, and Information and Communications Technology (ICT), areas deemed critical to Nigeria's economic diversification and industrial growth.

Prof. Kitaw expressed confidence that the establishment of the STIP, if successful, would elevate the University of Ilorin to the status of a fully entrepreneurial university, one that promotes a culture of innovation, encourages student and staff entrepreneurship, and provides an enabling environment for business incubation and commercialisation of research.

To bring the vision to life, Prof. Kitaw identified several potential funding avenues which include Government Funding, Private Sector Investments, International Grants and Partnerships, and Public-Private Partnerships (PPP).



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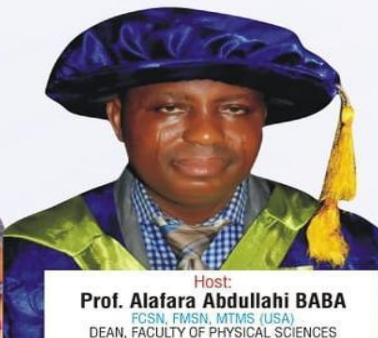
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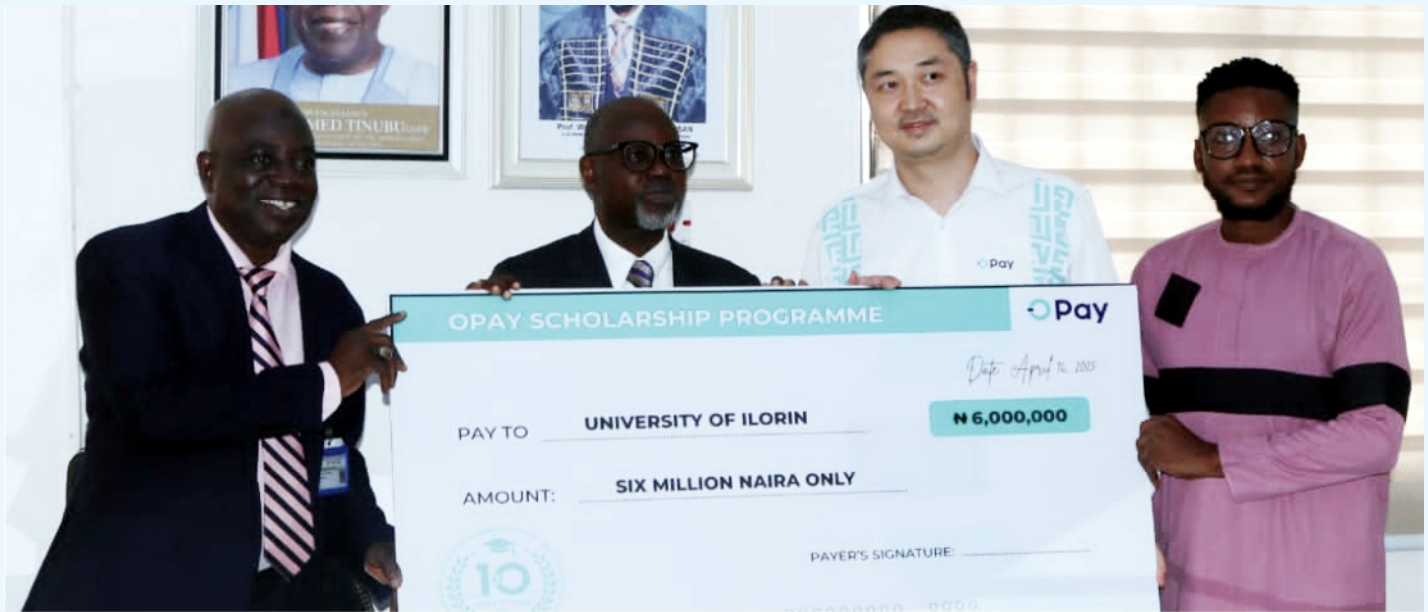

Speaking during the meeting, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, expressed appreciation to Opay for selecting the University of Ilorin as a key partner in its corporate social responsibility initiative, describing it as a strategic intervention that aligns with the University's core values and mission to provide access to quality education.

Prof. Egbewole assured Opay of the institution's commitment to nurturing and sustaining the partnership, saying that UNILORIN, as the most sought-after University in Nigeria, remains open to productive collaborations. He explained that the University plans to deepen the relationship further by involving Opay in some of its major initiatives, especially, the forthcoming 50th anniversary celebration.

The Vice Chancellor also used the meeting to introduce the U-Inspire project, an initiative that offers students an additional certificate by connecting them directly with industries to gain practical exposure. He said that Opay's involvement in this scheme would enrich students' understanding of current technologies and business practices in the fintech sector.

Prof. Egbewole also shared plans to develop an Innovation Hub on a five-hectare land identified for the project on the campus. He explained that the hub is envisioned to include a science laboratory and technology park that will provide companies with the opportunity to establish a presence on campus. He added that the setup would enable students to gain firsthand industry experience, thereby bridging the gap between academic knowledge and

practical application.

While addressing concerns about transparency in the selection of scholarship beneficiaries, the Vice Chancellor explained that the University has a well-established system that has been in operation for over two decades. He said, "In this University, for more than 20 years, we have created a column for scholars, that is, students who are the best in their various Departments. We have the best scholar in each Faculty, we have the best scholar in each department and of course the best student in each programme. With this, selecting the beneficiary is going to be a lot easier".

On the broader role of private organisations in supporting education, Prof. Egbewole commended Opay for its efforts in easing the financial burden on students. He highlighted the importance of such support, noting that it can significantly reduce the struggles many students face, including food insecurity and data costs, among others. He described the N300, 000 yearly scholarship per student as a meaningful contribution that should be applauded and encouraged.

Prof. Egbewole further observed that Opay's philanthropic gesture aligns perfectly with the University's vision of becoming an international centre of excellence through active collaboration with the industry.

The Vice Chancellor added that the new partnership with Opay brings the number of industry collaborators with the University to 20, as the institution continues to expand its engagement with corporate bodies in order to create more opportunities for its students.

Earlier in his remarks, the Chief Public Affairs Officer of Opay, Mr Justin Zhang, said that the company, which is a trusted financial technology institution with a widely used mobile application, serves a predominantly youthful customer base. He noted that this demographic focus has inspired the company to direct its corporate social

responsibility (CSR) efforts towards supporting young Nigerians in tertiary institutions across the country.

Mr Zhang stated that Opay is particularly interested in empowering smart, ambitious, and passionate students who may lack the financial resources to complete their education. According to him, the scholarship programme was launched last year as part of the company's broader mission to bridge the gap between talent and opportunity.

He pointed out that Opay is entering into a formal agreement with the University to sponsor 20 students annually, with each beneficiary receiving N300, 000 to support their educational pursuits. He said that the initiative was designed to create a consistent support system that will alleviate financial burdens and allow students to focus on their academic and personal development.

Mr Zhang explained that Opay's decision to commit to a decade-long partnership with the University of Ilorin underscores the company's confidence in the institution's values and operational integrity. He also hinted at the possibility of upward reviews of the scholarship amount in the future, taking into account prevailing economic realities. He noted that this is to ensure that students continue to receive meaningful support that addresses their core academic and living expenses.

The Vice Chancellor was joined at the MoU signing ceremony by the Registrar, Mr Mansur Adeleke Alfa and the Ag. Director of Legal Unit, Mrs Faridah Funmilayo Sheriff. They were joined by the CSR Project Manager of Opay, Mr Ito Udo.

Olawumi tasks Nigerians on regular, voluntary blood donation

The renowned medical scholar explained that blood donation is not only essential for the survival of those who are suffering from life-threatening illnesses and the injured but also has positive effects on the health of the donors.

The Inaugural Lecturer said in every two minutes someone around the world needs blood, which makes him or her to depend on the kindness of strangers for survival, hence, the description of such voluntary donors as heroes.

Prof. Olawumi, who described blood as an essential ingredient for medical treatments, explained that it is often unfortunately in short supply, especially for some categories of patients.

She added that transfusion of blood and blood products help in saving millions of lives each year, enhance life expectancy and improve the quality of life for patients facing life-threatening conditions.

Prof. Olawumi, who is an expert in blood transfusion, said that it is unfortunate that Nigeria has not been able to meet its minimum blood requirements as stated by the World Health Organisation (WHO).

She noted that Nigeria only boasts of about 1.2 million units of donated blood annually against two million units it requires for efficient health care delivery.

Prof. Olawumi noted that 5 per cent of the total blood donated in Nigeria comes from voluntary donors while the rest is sourced from commercial and family replacement donors.

Against the backdrop of unfounded fear being peddled in some quarters, Prof. Olawumi explained that donation of blood by healthy individuals have no negative effects whatsoever on them.

She said that even in the process of blood donation some illnesses hitherto unknown to the carriers are often discovered by experts who will then encourage such individuals to seek help.

In order to encourage the act of voluntary blood donation, the Inaugural Lecturer charged national health authorities to facilitate the establishment of well-coordinated blood programmes backed by appropriate legislations.

She added that sufficient funds should also be provided for more intensive

advocacy that would be targeted at the encouragement of voluntary blood donation among the populace.

Prof. Olawumi said that more intense advocacy specifically aimed at youths, promotion of peer education and motivation, and the broadening of the educational curriculum should be embarked upon to instill a sense of civic responsibility at a young age so as to catalyse increase in voluntary blood donation among youths in Nigeria.

Drawing from her over three decades of experience, Prof. Olawumi pointed out that specific and focused capacity-building initiatives should also be introduced to foster a paradigm shift in the attitude of hospital staff, particularly those in the blood bank, towards their work.

She noted that the attitude of some of the staff in blood banks often discourage people from donating, saying that those who will donate needed to be encouraged and stimulated to do so.

Relying on statistics that show poor level of desire for blood donation among women, the Inaugural Lecturer said female-targeted donor education and awareness programmes should also be implemented in Nigeria to enhance women's participation in blood donation.

She also suggested that the National Orientation Agency (NOA)

should engage in donor education and advocacy to alleviate fears and dispel myths about blood donation among Nigerian men and women of all ages.

Prof. Olawumi also said that donor selection criteria should be periodically reviewed to ensure that there is no discrimination of any kind, including gender, race, nationality, or religion, and to prevent the unnecessary deferral of suitable donors.

She equally encouraged the sustenance of more efforts that would be focused on encouraging interested individuals to become regular voluntary donors, thereby improving and sustaining the blood supply in our blood banks.

The Inaugural Lecturer, who noted that but for the insistence of her father she would have pursued a different professional calling other than Medicine, encouraged parents to always give their children close monitoring.

She said that children, particularly those who are in primary and secondary schools, require greater counseling for them to have an enviable future.

The Inaugural Lecture, which was presided over by the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, was well attended by relations, friends, students and colleagues of Prof. Olawumi from far and near.

In a memo dated April 24, 2025, and addressed to all graduates of the University, the Registrar, Mr Mansur Alfania, declared that the management has decided to suspend the weekly penalty increment of ₦3,000 for a period of six weeks, effective from April 22 to June 2, 2025.

He noted that this followed the review of the “avalanche of appeals from well-meaning individuals, parents, friends as well as some alumni of the University, requesting a review of the weekly penalty of Three Thousand Naira (₦3,000.00) only imposed on graduates who failed to collect their certificates following the deadline of 17th January, 2025.”

Mr Alfania added that as a responsible institution, the University Management “at its meeting held on

Tuesday, 22nd April, 2025, deliberated extensively on the appeals and noted that a sum of Thirty-Nine Thousand Naira (₦39,000.00) only was due as additional charge as at Tuesday, 22nd April, 2025.”

He, however, warned that the penalty will be re-activated after a grace of six weeks, which will end on Monday, June

2, 2025.

The University's decision aims to provide relief to graduates who have been unable to collect their certificates due to various reasons.

It will be recalled that the Registrar had in a memo on December 18, 2024, advised all graduates of the University who are yet to collect their certificates to do so on or before Friday, January 17, 2025, failing which a fine of ₦3,000 per week would be imposed on unclaimed certificates after the deadline.

Also in January this year, in a bid to adopt international best practices, the University of Ilorin introduced a courier service for the collection of unclaimed certificates.

The Registrar, stated that this move allows prospective collectors to receive their certificates through courier delivery, a departure from the University's previous policy of not allowing third-party collection.

Prof. Omotesho, who has been a member of the Committee as Dean of the Faculty of Agriculture, Dean of Student Affairs, and Chairperson of the CoPD, noted that his involvement in the very significant committee had given him a unique perspective on the inner workings of the University and helped shape his leadership philosophy.

While acknowledging the Vice Chancellor for granting him the opportunity to serve as Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic), Prof. Omotesho expressed appreciation for the trust and confidence reposed in him during a critical period of institutional development. Despite these challenges, he observed that the CoPD remains one of the most strategic and influential committees within the University, given its direct involvement with student affairs and academic leadership.

He, however, urged current members of the CoPD to continue supporting the Provost, the committee, and the university system as a whole. He reminded them that their collective role is central to the success of the institution, as the University's primary focus is the students and the CoPD provides the leadership that shapes their academic experience.

immediate past Deputy Vice Chancellor, the immediate past Provost, Prof. Olanrewaju Timothy Adedoyin, and 17 exited Deans.

Prof. Adekunle expressed satisfaction with the experience, stating that such practical engagements are vital for exposing students to the realities of the profession.

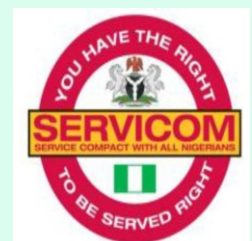
He reaffirmed the need for agricultural extension students to embrace the media as a powerful tool for rural development and agricultural transformation.

The University Librarian said that the institution's Main Library and other branch libraries are there to assist students to get proper exposure to their various fields of studies.

He advised students not to wait for examinations before getting themselves prepared ahead as he said that knowledge assimilation is a gradual process.

He noted that available evidence shows that students who use the library effectively often perform far better than those who don't.

Prof. Omopupa, who is a former Head of the Department of Library and Information Sciences, said that any student that doesn't utilise the library would have limited knowledge,

saying that the knowledge they acquire from the lecture rooms would be further enhanced when they consult relevant books, journals and other physical and electronic information sources that are readily available in the library.

He noted that the more they visit and use the university libraries the greater their knowledge and the more confident they become to give account of themselves anywhere they may find themselves.

The University Librarian assured the students and other library users of the

readiness of the Library staff to assist them in locating information resources they desired.

He added that the staff of the UNILORIN Library are individuals who are well trained and motivated to discharge their duties with finesse.

Speaking on the available facilities, Prof. Omopupa said that the University Main Library is stocked with relevant books and journals on each of the courses being run by the University. He added that in addition to books and journals and databases, the University Library also has in its stock periodicals that connect the learners to great and accomplished minds in their respective fields.

Prof. Omopupa, who is the eighth head of the Library services of the nation's most sought-after University, added that the Library is also stocked with newspapers and magazines for students and other library users to be kept abreast of unveiling developments in all areas of human endeavour.

He, however, appealed to students and other library users to always ensure careful use of the library materials in the interest of others, saying that they should always remember that if others had mutilated or tampered negatively with those materials they wouldn't be there for them to consult.

Ex-Rep member commends UNILORIN on transparency in NELFUND implementation

A former member of the House of Representatives, Hon. Bosun George Oladele, has commended the Management of the University of Ilorin, led by Prof Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, on its transparency in implementing the Nigerian Education Loan Fund (NELFUND).

Hon. Oladele gave the commendation last Tuesday (April 22, 2025) while speaking on a UNILORIN FM radio's popular Yoruba programme, "*Oro to n lo*," anchored by the Station Manager, Mr. Idris Alooma.

He praised the University for publicly announcing that NELFUND payments have been made to the University's account.

Hon. Oladele, who represented Irepo, Oorelope and Olorunsogo Federal Constituency of Oyo State, emphasised

that this level of transparency is commendable, especially compared to other tertiary institutions in Nigeria that still charge students fees without clear disclosure.

He noted that NELFUND is a significant relief for both parents and students, helping to curb crimes, cyber bullying, and improve the quality of education.

According to the former lawmaker, quality education is key to reducing crime rates and building a better Nigeria.

Hon. Oladele, who is also a former Commissioner for Information in Oyo State, also commended the Supreme Court's judgment extending the Freedom of Information Act to all state governments to promote openness and transparency in governance.

He commended President Bola Ahmed Tinubu's decision to remove fuel subsidies, citing the positive impact on governance and the economy. He emphasised the importance of unity and teamwork in moving the nation forward.

FG selects Unilorin for Green Money Scheme

Prof. Egbewole said, "This existing foundation aligns perfectly with the objectives of the Green Money project and provides a strong platform for its successful implementation. At present, the University has a Memorandum of Understanding with the British American Tobacco Nigeria Foundation, through which our alumni are being supported with agricultural tools and funding to launch their own agribusinesses. Additionally, we have a Public-Private Partnership (PPP) with Oriental Energy Farms, which plans to develop 4,000 hectares of land for maize and soybean cultivation, with value-added processing. These initiatives not only contribute to hunger reduction but also serve as practical training opportunities for our students.

The Vice Chancellor revealed that UNILORIN had previously secured a ₦600 million loan from the Central Bank of Nigeria to establish a poultry farm in demonstration of the University's proactive approach. He said that the initiative has already yielded significant results, with the University now producing over 3,000 eggs daily.

He, however, sought the consideration of the Federal Government to convert the loan from the CBN into a grant for the University, saying, this would further strengthen the University's agricultural capacity and consolidate its alignment with the objectives of the Green Money Scheme.

The Project Coordinator, Mr Charles Olufemi Folayan, said that President Tinubu is deeply concerned about the growing threat of hunger in Nigeria and is fully committed to tackling it head-on through strategic partnerships and innovation-driven policies.

He explained that the scheme was initiated under the guidance of the Office of the Special Assistant to the

President on Agriculture and it has received presidential approval and the backing of several relevant government ministries, departments, and agencies, which include the Federal Ministry of Education, the Federal Ministry of Youth Development, the Federal Ministry of Agriculture, the Federal Ministry of Marine and Blue Economy, and the Federal Ministry of Livestock Development.

In recognising the University of Ilorin as a strategic partner, the Project Coordinator, said his team observed the University's strong academic reputation, availability of infrastructure, committed leadership, and an existing agricultural base as major factors in its selection. He added that the institution's long-standing contributions to agricultural education and food production align with the objectives of the Green Money initiative.

Mr. Folayan noted that one of the major concerns addressed by this new scheme is the disconnect between agricultural studies and career uptake by graduates. According to him, "Many students who study agriculture do not pursue careers in the field, resulting in a gap between academic knowledge and national agricultural development needs."

The Project Coordinator explained that the scheme aims to reverse this trend by making agriculture a viable and attractive path for young people. It will do so by equipping them with mechanised farming tools, providing agricultural inputs, offering practical training, and facilitating zero-interest loans to support agribusiness startups.

While calling on stakeholders across sectors to support its implementation and success, Mr Folayan added that President Tinubu has declared a state of emergency on food security, which signals the urgency and importance of projects like the Green Money Scheme.

Meanwhile, the Project Consultant, Prof. Musa Isiyaku Ahmed, said with over 60,000 students, vast expanse of

arable land, and a proactive administration already investing in agriculture, the University of Ilorin is an ideal pilot location.

While pointing to the University's existing agricultural value chain initiatives as evidence of readiness and alignment, the Consultant noted that funding allocated for the project would be most impactful in institutions and would be easy to trace as a result of existing strong governance structures where accountability is ensured.

Prof. Ahmed, who is a former Vice Chancellor, Federal University of Agriculture, Zuru, also said that the University's Technical and Entrepreneurship Centre (TEC) was highlighted as a critical component in the implementation of the scheme, because it offers a platform for practical training, innovation, and student involvement. He added that the project will adopt a model that prioritises academically stable students, to ensure that participation does not compromise their primary academic responsibilities.

The Project Consultant, who has previously served as the Director of the Computer Services and Information Technology (COMSIT) Unit, University of Ilorin, presented a questionnaire to the Vice Chancellor, saying that it is to better understand the University's specific needs and areas for alignment. He added that the responses would guide further evaluation and inform the team's final report to the Presidency.

The Vice Chancellor was joined to receive the team by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Research, Technology and Innovation), Prof. Muhtar Adeiza Etudaiye; the Registrar, Mr Mansur Adeleke Alfa; the University Bursar, Mr Abiodun Lawal; the University Librarian, Prof. Kamaldeen Tunde Omopupa; the Dean of the Faculty of Agriculture, Prof. Oluyemisi Fawole; the Ag Head of the Department of Agronomy, Dr Kehinde Olayemi Affinnih; and the Director of UNILORIN GGMAX Farm, Prof. Suleiman Olawoye Salami.



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FG selects Unilorin for Green Money Scheme

The Federal Government has selected the University of Ilorin as one of the pilot institutions for 'The Green Money Project', a Presidential Initiative commissioned to tackle youth unemployment and food insecurity by empowering young Nigerians in agriculture and ensure national food security.

The Special Assistant to President Bola Ahmed Tinubu on Agriculture, Mr Abiodun Yinusa, disclosed this last Thursday (April 24, 2025) when he visited the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, in his office.

Represented by Engr Hakeem Olugbode, the Special Assistant described the Green Money initiative as a transformative movement to reposition agriculture as a viable and attractive sector for young Nigerians.

He explained that the Green Money scheme is more than a federal initiative, it is a national movement to restore dignity to farming, to empower our youths and secure the food system for generations to come.

The Presidential Special Assistant stressed that the university system, particularly institutions like the University of Ilorin with strong academic reputations, will play a pivotal role in this movement. According to him, "the University of Ilorin has a reputation as a beacon of academic excellence and national relevance. Your legacy in research, discipline, and societal impact makes this institution a natural partner for the Green Money project. We want you to stand with us as a strategic partner in this movement."

Engr Olugbode explained that the initiative aims to attract, train, and support young individuals by equipping them with modern agricultural skills, including mechanisation, smart

farming, and digital agricultural technologies. He said that the goal is to not only reduce youth unemployment but also create a new generation of agripreneurs who will drive innovation and growth in Nigeria's agricultural sector.

He noted that the programme will be implemented across all six geopolitical zones of the country, with each participating institution receiving adequate support in terms of training, equipment, and technical resources. He added that partnerships will also be forged with key government ministries, agencies, and departments, alongside collaborations with non-governmental organisations, donor agencies, and development partners.

Welcoming the team to UNILORIN, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Egbewole, pledged the University's full support for the Green Money Agriculture Scheme, describing it as a timely initiative that aligns with the University's vision for food security and youth empowerment.

While noting the institution's readiness to provide the necessary infrastructure, including access to land, to support the successful implementation of the scheme, Prof. Egbewole assured that the University would actively mobilise and sensitise students on the importance and benefits of the project.

He noted that the Faculty of Agriculture at the University already engages students in practical farming activities where the farm produce cultivated by students is regularly sold to members of the University community. With additional support from the Green Money initiative, the Vice Chancellor expressed confidence that these efforts would be significantly enhanced.
