#### **UNILORIN Law Faculty has** highest Ph.D. holders-Egbewole

he Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has stated that the institution's Faculty of Law has the highest number of Ph.D. holders among its peers in the country.

Prof. Egbewole stated this last Monday (June 16, 2025) during a Postgraduate Retreat organised by the Faculty at the University **Auditorium Basement**

s part of efforts targeted at promoting innovation, entrepreneurship and digital skills development in Nigeria, the University of Ilorin has been selected alongside some other tertiary education institutions to host digital innovation hubs.

The project is to be implemented as part of the country's participation in the Investment in Digital and Creative Enterprises (iDICE) programme.

According to a letter dated June 17, 2025 and addressed to the Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, by the Executive Secretary of the National Universities Commission (NUC), Prof. Abdullahi Yusuf Ribadu, the initiative is to be supported by the Federal Government through the Bank of Industry (BOI) in collaboration with the African Development Bank (AfDB), the Islamic Development Bank (ISDB) and the Agence Française de Development (AFD).

The letter, a copy of which was made available to UNILORIN Bulletin last Friday (June 20, 2025), explained that the project is targeted at fostering the emergence of job-creating enterprises and equip young Nigerians with 21st-century skills in the areas of technology, creativity and innovation.

The NUC's Chief Executive said that the shortlisting of the University is a reflection of its demonstrated potentials and readiness to contribute meaningfully to what he called a "transformative"

initiative".

Prof. Ribadu expressed conviction that the project will foster greater industryacademic linkages as it would also nurture talents, and drive enterprise development.

Meanwhile, the Vice Chancellor of the University, Prof. Egbewole, has welcomed the initiative, saying that it perfectly conforms to the vision of the University.

In a statement signed by the University's Director of Corporate Affairs, Mr Kunle Akogun, the Vice Chancellor thanked the Federal Government through the NUC for selecting the University for the project.

While saying that the institution was already planning to launch an appeal fund for an innovation hub project as part of its upcoming Golden Jubilee celebration, Prof. Egbewole described the selection of the University for the government's innovation hub project as a mid-year gift and an honour and privilege that would never be taken for granted.

The Vice Chancellor assured the Federal Government that the University will cooperate fully with stakeholders to ensure that the initiative is implemented swiftly for the benefit of its current and future students and the nation at large.

#### Social media crucial for corporate communication, says Omoniyi

n today's digital landscape, the social media has become an essential tool for corporate communication, offering unparalleled opportunities for direct engagement, brand building, and reputation management.

The Social Media Manager of the University of Ilorin, Mr Lukman Temitope Omoniyi, made this submission penultimate Thursday (June 12, 2025) while delivering a lecture at the Virtual Monthly Meeting and PR Clinic of the Nigerian Institute of Public Relations (NIPR), Kwara State Chapter.

In his Lecture, titled "Leveraging Social Media for Effective Corporate Communication", Mr Omoniyi noted that corporate organisations can no longer afford to overlook the potential of social media in building strong relationships with stakeholders and achieving their corporate objectives.

Sharing his experience since his assumption as Social Media Manager in 2023, Mr Omoniyi said it was very important for organisations to prioritise engagement and responsiveness, adding that "social media is about conversation. Respond promptly and thoughtfully to comments, messages, and mentions. Acknowledge feedback, address complaints professionally, and thank followers for their support."

Mr Omoniyi hinted that choosing the right platforms,

maintaining a consistent brand voice, and robust content strategy as some of the ways to achieve effective use of social media for corporate communication.

According to him, "Not all social media platforms are created equal. Select platforms that align with your objectives and where your target audience is most active. *LinkedIn* is ideal for professional networking, while X, formerly known as *Twitter*, excels for real-time news and public discourse."

He further stated that "social media should not operate in a silo. Integrate it with your website, email marketing, public relations efforts, and traditional media for a cohesive and impactful communication strategy. We have been able to achieve that at the University of Ilorin and we will continue to improve on our approach."

Mr Omoniyi, pointed out that embracing a strategic and proactive approach to social media, businesses can harness its power to foster strong relationships with stakeholders, navigate challenges, and achieve corporate objectives in the digital age.

Earlier, the Chairman of the Kwara State Chapter of NIPR, Mr Gabriel Ogunade. expressed the Institute's dedication to providing professional development opportunities for its members through regular clinics, ensuring they remain up-to-date with industry developments.

Mr Omoniyi's commitment to using social media as a corporate communication tool is already yielding results, with the University receiving its well-deserved recognition at the 2025 National Spokespersons Awards in Abuja. In April, the University of Ilorin won the Best Corporate Share of Voice (Social Media) award, confirming the University's commitment to engaging with its community. Additionally, Mr Omoniyi was a finalist in the Outstanding Spokesperson (Education Sector) category of the award.

The training session was attended by members of the Institute including the Station Manager of *UNILORIN 89.3 FM*, Mr Idris Akintola Ibrahim (Alooma), and an Assistant Director (Information & Protocol), Mr Oluwasegun Alabi, who coordinates the Social Media Team, among others.

The don said that it was high time that marketers avoided unrealistic beauty standards, manipulative messaging, and social isolation tactics.

He said that they should instead develop campaigns that promote self-worth, healthy lifestyles, and social connections.

Prof. Gbadeyan also implored stakeholders to ensure that consumers are given the necessary knowledge and tools to critically assess marketing messages.

The don, who teaches at the Department of Marketing, suggested that digital, financial and media literacy should be integrated into the public education curriculum, saying that such would empower the society to resist manipulative marketing and assist them to make informed choices.

Prof. Gbadeyan also suggested that marketers should design campaigns that reflect diversity, heterogeneity and inclusivity.

He said that such a campaign should avoid discriminatory targeting, stereotyping, and cultural appropriation, but should promote respect for the dignity of all individuals.

He equally canvassed the introduction and implementation of policies that would ensure fairness and equity in consumer access to products and services, saying that such would encourage them to achieve some level of equality in the

The Inaugural Lecturer also said that there should be regular support for ethical marketing standards by professional bodies and regulatory agencies to address emerging concerns like algorithm bias, deceptive advertising, and pink/green washing.

He also implored professional bodies and regulatory agencies to apply stronger enforcement mechanisms that will penalise misleading or exploitative practices among advertisers, business organisations and marketers.

Prof. Gbadeyan also suggested the embrace of responsible use of digital marketing tools by marketers, most especially those that

exploit psychological vulnerabilities should be encouraged.

He equally encouraged marketers to engage in transparent data policies and ethical use of Artificial Intelligence (AI), adding that they should try to minimise digital addiction and protect consumer data.

Prof. Gbadeyan also encouraged companies to ensure that their marketing strategies shift from encouraging overconsumption and debt accumulation to promoting financial literacy, sustainability, and long-term value.

Speaking on Marketing as a field of study, Prof. Gbadeyan said that it should re- engage with fundamental questions of meaning, ethics, authenticity, and choice. He added that it should integrate philosophical inquiry, emphasising integrity, purpose, and respect for consumer freedom.

He also called for interdisciplinary collaboration for ethical innovation, pointing out that marketing innovations should be human-centered and socially responsible.

The don added that marketers, social scientists, technologists, ethicists, and policymakers must collaborate with one another, saying that interdisciplinary research should be explored to understand the far-reaching effects of marketing on the society.

He also suggested that organisations should establish independent ethics review boards for marketing campaigns, particularly those that will be targeting vulnerable populations such as children, the elderly, and low-income consumers.

Prof. Gbadeyan also encouraged academic institutions to prioritise and fund research that will examine the intersection of marketing with societal welfare, ethical implications, and long-term human development goals, most especially, beyond the profit maximisation objectives.

The Inaugural Lecture, which was presided over by the Vice Chancellor of the University, represented by Prof. Muhtar Etudaiye, was attended by Principal Officers, colleagues and students of the Inaugural Lecturer as well as other dignitaries, including traditional rulers from Oke Ero Local Government Area of Kwara State.



#### Stay away from drugs, Egbewole urges students

he Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has admonished students of the institution to steer clear of drug abuse and embrace purposeful living.

Prof. Egbewole made this call recently at a sensitisation lecture, themed "Embracing Positive Lifestyle and Learning from the Failures of Others", organised by the Counselling and Human Development Centre at the University Auditorium.

The Vice Chancellor congratulated the Centre for sustaining its mandate of promoting student wellbeing, reiterating that indulgence in drug use often leads to regret and wasted potentials.

He also reminded students that the University's reputation must not be brought to disrepute, noting that students caught abusing drugs whether on or off campus may face expulsion. He added that university life is not about unhealthy friendships but meaningful academic pursuit.

In her remarks, the Director of the University of Ilorin Counselling and Human Development Centre (UCHDC), Dr Foluke N. Bolu-Steve, reaffirmed the institution's zero-tolerance policy on drug abuse as she urged students to uphold the values of discipline, integrity, and responsibility.

Dr Bolu-Steve stressed that drug abuse not only ruins academic potentials but also poses serious

threats to mental and physical health.

The Director encouraged students facing personal or emotional challenges to seek help through the Centre rather than resorting to drugs.

In his presentation, the Ag. Dean of Student Affairs, University of Ilorin, Dr. Alex Morenikeji Akanmu, expressed concern over the increasing involvement of students in drug use, describing the trend as disheartening and dangerous.

Dr Akanmu applauded the Counselling Centre for organising the programme, noting that many students are unaware of the real reason they are in the University. He warned that drug abuse among students could lead to lifelong negative consequences, including mental health challenges and expulsion.

According to Dr Akanmu, who is the Chairman of the University's Branch of the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU), the management has observed disturbing trends such as the abuse of substances including dried pawpaw leaves, burnt tyres, cannabis, mentholated spirit mixed with soft drinks, and even stored urine.

He, therefore, advised students to avoid the negative influence of peer group and be deliberate in their lifestyle choices. He added that there are no friends in the University; everyone is a colleague.

The Dean appealed for student cooperation in eradicating drug abuse on campus and encouraged them to learn from the mistakes of others.

The Kwara State Commander of the National Drug Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA), Mrs Fatima Popoola, in her presentation, advised students to make good use of the University Counselling Centre and avoid drugs.

Mrs Popoola underscored the dangers of underestimating drug influence, warning students never to assume that someone close to them is not engaged in negative behaviours. She stressed the importance of early intervention and counselling to curb the growing menace of substance abuse.

The NDLEA boss commended the University of Ilorin on its proactive stance and collaborative efforts in fighting drug abuse. She urged students to make wise decisions, resist bad influences, and report suspicious activities.

He also urged the Faculty to develop the curriculum in ways that would make the learning process more impactful to the society.

According to him, this will inspire and encourage students to return for their Ph.D. and thereby foster stronger academic ties and continuous learning.

Prof. Egbewole further described the retreat as an epoch-making event, aligned with the ongoing efforts to enhance the quality and efficiency of the University's Postgraduate School.

He also emphasised the importance of ensuring that postgraduate programmes are completed within the stipulated timeframes and that everything must be done to avoid unnecessary extensions and delays.

In her welcome address, the Dean of the Faculty, Prof. Nimah Modupe AbdulRaheem, described the event as a critical juncture for rethinking the structure, delivery, and supervision of postgraduate programmes.

Prof. AbdulRaheem asserted that everything must be done to standardise the

MPhil/Ph.D. framework and enhance research methodology across the various Departments.

Prof. AbdulRaheem called on academic staff and postgraduate students to use the opportunity to engage deeply with the pressing academic and administrative issues facing the Faculty.

She highlighted the importance of harmonised supervision standards, curriculum reform, and collaborative innovation in ensuring that the postgraduate programmes of the Faculty remain globally competitive.

The Dean of the Postgraduate School, University of Ilorin, Prof. Bamidele Victor Owoyele, emphasised the urgent need for regular curriculum reviews, AI integration, and stricter supervision standards in postgraduate programmes.

Prof. Owoyele noted that aligning postgraduate training with global best practices is key to maintaining the reputation of the University and attracting both local and international students.

He cited recommendations from the Committee of Provosts and Deans of Postgraduate Colleges and Schools (CPDPGCS), which advocate for AI training inclusion, ethical supervision, and stricter programme timelines.

Prof. Owoyele expressed concern over the uneven quality of Master programmes, which affects graduates' eligibility for Ph.D. admissions elsewhere. He called for standardised academic processes and timely programme completion. He emphasized the right of Ph.D. students to choose supervisors and the need for foreign external examiners. He also urged ethical academic practices, while warning that extortion, coercion, and delays, must be eliminated.

Prof. Owoyele praised the Faculty of Law for its strong enrolment in LL.M and Ph.D. programmes and the development of three new curricular frameworks. He advocated for specialised degrees in fields like Environmental, International, and Intellectual Property Law. He also lauded the Faculty for its contributions to the University's selection for the prestigious TETFund Academic Staff Training programme, awarded to just 18 universities nationwide.

#### Egbewole mourns ex-CJN, Uwais

he Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has commiserated with the nation's legal community on the death of a former Chief Justice of Nigeria, Justice Muhammad Lawal Uwais, GCON. Justice Uwais, who died penultimate Friday (June 6, 2025), was the Chief Justice of Nigeria between 1995 and 2006.

In a statement signed by the University's Director of Corporate Affairs, Mr Kunle Akogun, the Vice Chancellor described the late Justice Uwais as an outstanding jurist and a phenomenal statesman who served the nation and humanity with absolute dedication and in several capacities for many decades.

The Vice Chancellor, who is a Professor of Jurisprudence and International Law and a renowned legal luminary, added that Justice Uwais' tenure as the nation's number one judicial officer was not only very long but also fruitful with a lot of accomplishments.

Prof. Egbewole, who is the

Secretary-General of the Association of West African Universities (AWAU), said that the tenure of the late Justice Uwais as the Chief Justice of Nigeria would continue to be celebrated for so many positive developments, which deepened the nation's jurisprudence.

The Vice Chancellor also recalled Justice Uwais' contributions to national development after his retirement from the bench, particularly as the Chairman of the Electoral Reform Committee, which was

constituted by the late President Umaru Musa Yar'Adua, GCFR, in 2007. He said that the reports of the Committee stood him and other members of the Committee out as genuine patriots who wanted the nation's democracy to continue to grow.

He added that Nigeria would miss the counsel and forthrightness of the late jurist, particularly at this period when all hands ought to be on deck towards rescuing the nation from its contemporary challenges.

Prof. Egbewole commiserated with the Chief Justice of Nigeria, Justice Kudirat Kekere-Ekun, and the other colleagues of Justice Uwais on the bench of the highest court in the land on the sad loss of an illustrious predecessor. He also commiserated with the people and government of Kaduna State and particularly members of his immediate family

While praying to Allah to console all the bereaved, the Vice Chancellor prayed for the forgiveness of his shortcomings and the admission of his soul to Aljanat Fridaouz.

#### KWASU don canvasses responsible use of AI in journalism

he Dean of the Faculty of I n f o r m a t i o n a n d Communication Technology, Kwara State University (KWASU), Malete, Prof. Isiaka Zubair Aliagan, has called for responsible use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in journalism.

Prof. Aliagan made this call last Tuesday (June 17, 2025) while presenting a paper at the 2025 edition of the Annual Doyin Mahmud Memorial Lecture held at the CIS Lecture Theatre. The event was organised by the Association of Mass Communication Students of Nigeria (AMSCON), University of Ilorin Chapter.

Delivering the lecture titled "Journalism in the Era of AI-Generated Contents and Deep Fakes," Prof. Aliagan emphasised the pressing need for journalists and media scholars to critically evaluate the ethical implications of AI tools in news production.

Prof. Aliagan, who is a former Deputy Director of Information, University of Ilorin, warned that while AI can enhance efficiency in journalism, it also carries the risk of eroding public trust through the proliferation of misleading contents such as deep fakes and machinegenerated disinformation.

He further urged communication students and professionals to adopt a balanced approach by combining AI innovation with journalistic integrity. According to him, the future of journalism lies not only in embracing technological advancements but also in safeguarding the core values of truth, responsibility,

and accountability that define the profession.

Also speaking, the Kwara State Commissioner for Communications, Hon. Bolanle Olukoju, who was represented by Dr Fatimah Amuda, emphasised the role of AI in modern journalism.

She explained that AI has the potential to revolutionise newsrooms by improving productivity and data analysis, but maintained that the credibility of journalism must be rooted in transparency and public trust.

Hon. Olukoju commended the organisers of the lecture for initiating such an intellectually enriching programme. She noted that engaging young communicators on contemporary issues such as AI would better prepare them for ethical challenges and professional demands in the evolving media landscape.

In his goodwill message, the Commissioner for Education, Kwara State, Dr Muhammad Lawal Olohungbebe, appreciated the Department of Mass Communication for its continued excellence in academic mentorship and research. He

praised the efforts of the Department in raising a generation of responsible communicators who are prepared to navigate the digital age.

Earlier in his opening remarks, the Ag. Head of the Department of Mass Communication, Dr Patrick Udende, described the lecture series as a significant tribute to the legacy of the late Mr Nureni Adedoyin Mahmud, the pioneer Coordinator of the Department.

Dr Udende also emphasised the importance of continuous dialogue on emerging trends shaping the media landscape, particularly the rise of AI in journalism.

He urged students to see the lecture not just as an academic event, but as a call to action to uphold ethical standards and professional excellence in their future careers.

Also speaking, the Dean of the Faculty of Communication and Information Sciences, Prof. Lukman Azeez, appreciated all participants for honouring the memory of the late Mr Mahmud and acknowledged the consistent support of Late Mahmud's family, who have sponsored an annual award for the best graduating student in the Department for over a decade.

Highlights of the event included the unveiling of the latest edition of *The Lens* Magazine, which was anchored by a former Head of the Department, Prof. Saudat Salah Abdulbaki. The magazine was officially unveiled by Dr Mahmud Abdulraheem, the Chief Promoter, *Geri FM*, Ilorin, who was represented by Prof. Abdulquadri AbdulRasaq Owolabi of the Faculty of Law.

#### We 'll make UNILORIN @ 50 colourful - Alafara

s the Golden Jubilee celebration of the University of Ilorin approaches, the Dean of the Faculty of Physical Sciences, Prof. Baba Abdullahi Alafara, has pledged the readiness of the staff and students of the Faculty to be part of all the events being planned to mark the anniversary, promising that his Faculty would make the anniversary colourful.

Prof. Alafara gave this assurance last Monday (June 16, 2025) while speaking with *UNILORIN Bulletin* in his office.

He explained that the upcoming "anniversary is a monumental milestone and a unique moment in the history of the University", which deserves to be marked elaborately, saying that 50 years in the life of an institution is truly a long period that must be assessed and appreciated.

The Dean pointed out that as one of the three founding Faculties of the University, his Faculty would not be left out in celebrating the achievements of the University in the last five decades. He explained that the Faculty is one of the two Faculties that emerged from the former Faculty of Science at the beginning of the 2013/2014 academic session.

Prof. Alafara added that some of the Departments that constitute the Faculty such as Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry are among the oldest in the University, which had produced several outstanding alumni whose contributions to national and human development cannot be glossed over.

Other Departments in the Faculty that have equally produced distinguished alumni for the University, according to Prof. Alafara, are Geology and Mineral Sciences, Geophysics, Industrial Chemistry and Statistics.

He recalled that his Faculty was the first that was moved from the minicampus to the permanent site about 40 years ago, noting that the sacrifice made by members of the Faculty and students of the period would remain imperishable in the annals of the University.

Prof. Alafara, who described his Faculty as second to no other in the University, recalled that the Faculty was ranked the first of all the 16 Faculties and won the maiden "Best Faculty of the Year Award" at the University in October, 2024.

He said that the Faculty, in terms of staff and students population, is also bigger than some universities, pointing out that the Faculty has no fewer than 130 academic staff and has produced over 25,000 alumni in the last five decades.

The Dean said that many of the academic staff of the Faculty have won different scholarships/awards and grants nationally and internationally, an achievement, which he said, had

broadened the fame of the University.

Prof. Alafara also said that many staff and students of the Faculty have over 70,000 total Google Scholar Citations and total average H-index of 1400. He said that these efforts have equally won multi-billion US dollar research grants including Erasmus Mondus scholarships by Julius Akinribido of the Department of Industrial Chemistry at the Universite Paris Saclay, France, and University of Porto, Portugal.

He added that the Faculty had produced a Vice Chancellor for the University in person of the late Prof. John Otunola Oyinloye, who headed the University from 1992 to 1997 as its fifth Vice Chancellor. He equally recalled that the Faculty also produced Prof. G. A. Olatunji, who served as Deputy Vice Chancellor (Research, Technology and Innovation) between 2014 and 2018.

In addition, the Dean also said that the Faculty has produced two Emeritus Professors and they are Prof. T. O. Aro and Prof. O.S. Adegboye.

Prof. Alafara, who earned all his degrees from the institution, described himself as a total product of the University as he said that this imposes on him the responsibility of mobilising everything within his province to celebrate his alma mater, which has also become his place of work in the last 25 years.

He also explained that the Faculty has also produced two Fellows of the Academy of Science through Prof. S. O. Akande of the Department of Geology and Mineral Sciences, who headed the Old Faculty of Science from 2000 to 2002; and Prof. F. A. Adekola, who teaches at the Department of Industrial Chemistry and was the Dean between 2018 and 2020

The Dean added that his Faculty is one of those that has continued to bring glory to the University across its annals as he said that the second person in the University community to secure a place in the Guinness World Book Record is a final year student of the Department of Mathematics.

He added that the achievement of Mr Sanusi Akanbi Kazeem, who was recently inducted into the Guinness World Book of Records, has placed and would continue to make the University to rank among the best.

Apart from Mr Sanusi, the Dean also

explained that the Faculty is also proud of the fact that it produced an elected State Governor, saying that the immediate past Governor of Kwara State, Alhaji Abdulfatai Ahmed, graduated from the Department of Chemistry about 40 years ago.

Other prominent products of the University from the Faculty, according to Prof. Alafara, are Dr Julius Adeleke, who is the Chief Executive Officer of Aradel Holdings PLC and Justus PetrolConsult, Aberdeen; Dr Olugbenga Lufadeju, a retired Director at the Department of Petroleum Resources and Chief Executive Officer, GL Dynamic Solutions Ltd.; Mr Arisekola Tunde Muritala, African Representative on Mineral Resources, United Nations; Dr Dele Oyeku, a Director at FIIRO and Dr Henry A. Adimula, who is the Rector, Federal Institute of Petroleum and Training Institute, Effurun, Delta State.

Also mentioned among the outstanding products of the Faculty are the newly appointed Executive Director of the Nigerian National Petroleum Company PLC, Mr Babs Omotowa; Prof. Olusegun Omoniyi Ige, the Director-General of the Nigerian Geological Survey Agency (NGSA); his immediate predecessor, Dr AbdulRazaq Abubakar Garba; Dr Adetoyese O. Adekola, who is a Senior Education Specialist at the World Bank and Mr Ibigbemi Oloruntobi, the Chairman/ Chief Executive Officer, Item 7 Restaurant, Ilorin, among others.

Prof. Alafara said that many of the alumni have been very supportive of the Faculty through donations/endowments as he said that all of them would be mobilised towards playing active role in the celebration.

While congratulating the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, and the entire members of the University community on the milestones achieved by the University, Prof. Alafara said that the anniversary would also offer his Faculty the privilege of playing its characteristic leading role in the University.

Earlier, the Dean of Student Affairs, Dr Alex Akanmu, commended all stakeholders for the orderly conduct of the elections.


He urged students to maintain peace even after the declaration of results.

#### Unilorites warned against exam malpractices

Professor at the Department of Mathematics, University of Illorin, Yidiat Omolade Aderinto, has urged students of the University, particularly those of the Faculty of Environmental Sciences, to steer clear of examination malpractice, warning that such offenses could lead to expulsion from the institution.

Prof. Aderinto gave this advice last Wednesday (June 18, 2025) while speaking at the Faculty's Examination Sensitisation Talk organised by its Quality Assurance Committee at the Faculty's Board Room.

The event was themed "Consolidating the Quality of Our Examination Process: Review of the Roles of Stakeholders."

The don stressed the importance of upholding academic integrity and encouraged students to adhere strictly to the University's examination guidelines. She said, "Enter the examination hall 30 minutes before the start of the exam, come with a valid ID card and course registration form, sign the attendance register, and avoid entering with any electronic device."

She further cautioned against impersonation, saying, "Never write exams on behalf of another person. You borrowed your surname, it doesn't belong to you. Build it right."

Prof. Aderinto also reminded students to comply with the University of Ilorin's dress code, emphasising that discipline in conduct and appearance

contributes to the institution's image.

Addressing other stakeholders, Prof. Aderinto called for commitment to credibility and quality assurance in the examination process.

She urged staff to prevent exam leakages by ensuring that only authorised personnel handle sensitive materials. "Ensure excellence in service delivery," she said, appealing to level advisers to be more accommodating towards students.

In his opening remarks, the Dean of the Faculty, Prof. Ganiyu Amuda-Yusuf, commended the efforts of the Quality Assurance Unit for its dedication to institutional development and educational standards.

The Dean encouraged staff to continue to contribute meaningfully to the actualisation of the Vice Chancellor's agenda for the University.

Prof. Amuda-Yusuf also charged students to share key takeaways from the event with their peers who could not attend.

In his welcome address, the Chairman of the Faculty's Quality Assurance Committee, Dr S. A. Olaniyan, reaffirmed the committee's commitment to enhancing academic excellence.

He noted that the decentralisation of Quality Assurance activities to Faculties and Departments allows for more effective checks and feedback mechanisms.

"We must ensure that all graduates of the University of Ilorin leave with the right values and are impactful wherever they go," he said.

Also speaking, the Director of the University's Quality Assurance Unit, Prof. AbdulRazzaq AbdulMajeed Alaro, mni lauded the introduction of lecture-free weeks by the University's management and commended the Faculty for using the period productively.

"Quality is what sets a University apart," he said, urging both staff and students to play their parts in maintaining Unilorin's reputation as a topnotch institution.

Also speaking, the Sub-Dean of the Faculty, Dr S. B. Oladimeji, thanked all stakeholders for their participation and encouraged students to remain disciplined and focused in all their academic pursuits.

#### **UNILORIN Clinic is fully prepared for adequate healthcare-Odunola**



#### Don urges NAHE to promote health literacy, personal responsibility

he Vice Chancellor of Lagos State University of Education, Prof. Bidemi Lafiagi-Okuneye, has called on the Nigerian Association of Health Educators (NAHE) to broaden its strategies for delivering health promotion messages, emphasising the need to reach diverse segments of the population in order to combat widespread health ignorance.

Prof. Lafiagi-Okuneye made this call last Monday (June 16, 2025), while delivering a keynote address at the 27th Annual National Conference of NAHE hosted by the Department of Health Promotion and Environmental Health Education, University of Ilorin. .The theme of the event was "Dimensions and Adaptation to Health and Illness Behaviours: Repositioning Health Education in Nigeria's Health Care System.'

The Vice Chancellor said, "Information is essential, but health education goes beyond sharing systematic knowledge, adding, "It is about driving behavioral change, challenging harmful cultural norms, and empowering communities to take control of their health outcomes."

Prof. Lafiagi-Okuneye emphasised the critical role of health education in improving health literacy, promoting disease prevention, facilitating early detection, and building community engagement and trust.

She also urged Nigerians to take full responsibility for their personal health and not delegate that duty to others. "Your health is your responsibility," she stressed, saying, "No one else can manage it for you."

Prof. Lafiagi-Okuneye stressed that health education should be seen as foundational, not optional. She urged policymakers and government leaders to prioritise health literacy as a national development imperative.

"Primary healthcare should precede secondary and tertiary interventions," she noted, adding, "We must view health education as a

cornerstone of our development strategy."

Echoing similar sentiments, the Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, urged the Federal Government to reposition health education to become a primary choice for students, not a fallback option.

He said that no matter how expensive education is, it is still unavoidable. "If you think education is expensive, try ignorance," he said.

In his welcome address, the NAHE National President, Prof. Raheem Adaramaja Shehu, expressed gratitude to participants who came from allover the country for the conference.

Prof. Adaramaja, who is also the Executive Chairman of the Kwara State Universal Basic Education Commission, reaffirmed the Association's mission to play an active role in addressing Nigeria's healthcare challenges.

On his part, the Governor of Kwara State, Mallam AbdulRahman AbdulRazaq,CON, who was represented by the Deputy Governor, Mr Kayode Alabi, reiterated the state government's commitment to equipping health centres and training healthcare practitioners.

The Governor commended NAHE's efforts in improving healthcare delivery and public awareness.

Also speaking, the Dean of the

Faculty of Education, University of Ilorin, Prof. Lasiele Alabi Yahaya, emphasised the importance of prioritising health. "Our health is our wealth. Before we get involved in anything, health must come first," he

The Head of the Department of Health Promotion and Environmental Health Education, Prof. S.O. Oniyangi, expressed pride in hosting health educators from across the nation.

Prof. Oniyangi thanked NAHE leadership for their unwavering contributions to health development.

Also speaking, the Chairman of the Local Organising Committee (LOC) of the event, Prof. O.L. Olaitan, hailed the visionaries behind NAHE as he described the body as a strategic platform for public enlightenment and health improvement.

"You can only give what you have," he reminded participants, urging them to keep advancing their professional knowledge.

#### Alooma canvasses responsible journalism

he Station Manager of *UNILORIN* 89.3 FM, Mr Idris Akintola Ibrahim (Alooma) has called for the proper use of the media landscape to enhance national peace and development.

Mr Alooma stated this last Tuesday(June 17, 2025) while speaking at the maiden edition of the Law Student Society (LSS).

Speaking on the theme of the event "The Power of Public Pressure: How Social Technology and Journalism are Driving Change Beyond the Courtroom,' the ace broadcaster underscored the pivotal role of journalism and social media in civic engagement.

Mr Alooma noted that these platforms have transformed ephemeral outrage into sustained national reform movements, citing the EndSARS protests and the #BringBackOurGirls campaign as prime examples. He described social media as a potent tool for engagement and public mobilisation, emphasising that journalism is a divine act of communication

The media practitioner, who highlighted the growth of radio stations in Nigeria from one to about 1,000 and in Kwara State from 1 to 28, cautioned against "yellow journalism" (sensationalism) and uninvestigated citizen journalism reports.

He encouraged students to view journalism as a mission driven by passion



academic pursuit.

The renowned broadcaster added that media practitioners set agendas and hold those in positions of authority accountable to the people.

Recalling that the UNILORIN 89.3 FM has trained over 5,000 students since its establishment in 2009, Mr Alooma invited interested participants to join the internship programme of the station as a way of taking a voyage into the world of journalism.

The veteran journalist emphasised that young journalists can positively influence and reshape society through various media platforms, including radio, blogs, and podcasting.

Also speaking, the Editor-in-Chief of the LSS Press, Miss Faidat Oluwapelumi Adio, a 400-Level Common Law student, and dedication, rather than just an expressed joy at the successful hosting of the maiden edition of the Press Week.

She described the day as a celebration of student journalism and its relevance to legal education and advocacy.

Miss Adio encouraged students to continue using journalism as a tool for awareness, advocacy, and accountability, emphasising the importance of passion and commitment in reporting facts and shaping opinion.

A lecturer at the Department of Public Law, University of Ilorin, Mr Adebayo Seye Thompson, warned that if social media continues to go unchecked, it could escalate into a significant societal challenge.

Mr Thompson stressed that while technology offers opportunities for awareness and mobilisation, it must be used responsibly.

He explained that journalism remains an ethical obligation and must not be distorted by misinformation or abuse of public platforms.

He further emphasised that the right to know is inseparable from the right to the truth, cautioning that journalists must balance speed with accuracy. He encouraged the students to treat journalism not just as a course of study but as a civic duty to society. "Information is power," he said, "but only when it is verified and used correctly.'

The highlights of the event included the unveiling of the maiden edition of its annual publication, Lex Vox, titled "Unfiltered Truth" alongside the launch of its official website.
