UNILORIN alumnus, Isiaka, wins Leverhulme Trust Fellowship

2016 First Class graduate of Biology Education from the Department of Science Education, University of Ilorin, Dr Abass Isiaka, has been awarded the prestigious Leverhulme Trust Early Career Fellowship to undertake an ambitious research project at the School of Education and Lifelong Learning, University of East Anglia (UEA), United Kingdom.

The highly competitive fellowship supports outstanding early career researchers to carry out independent, impactful, and publishable work at UK institutions for a period of three years.

Dr Isiaka, currently serving as a Senior Research Associate at the Centre for Higher Education Research Practice Policy and Scholarship at UEA, was selected based on his impressive academic credentials and innovative research proposal.

With his project, entitled "Disabling by Design: Recasting the Future of Higher Education Policies in Africa", this illustrious alumnus of the University of Ilorin aims to develop a social history of higher education in relation to disability inclusion, by tracing policy and institutional developments from 1940 to the present.

In a phone chat with *UNILORIN Bulletin*, Dr Isiaka said that his work will adopt a histo-futurist methodology, which is a combination of historical analysis and future-oriented thinking, to uncover how colonial legacies and contemporary policies have shaped the inclusion (or

exclusion) of persons with disabilities (PWDs) in West African higher education systems.

He stated that the research will involve archival and ethnographic work in both the UK and Nigeria and will be carried out in close collaboration with a leading Disabled People's Organisation (DPO), such as the Joint National Association of Persons with Disabilities in Nigeria (JONAPWD). According to him, this partnership will ensure that the study is coproduced with the disabled community, enriching its relevance and impact

Dr Isiaka expressed deep appreciation for the fellowship, describing it as a validation of his long-standing commitment to disability justice and inclusive education. He said, "This award will provide me with the opportunity to explore the connection between coloniality and disability and how it continues to shape disabled people's access to higher education in West Africa." He added that "it will also help us reflect on how similar patterns might be visible across other regions of Africa".

After graduating top of his class at UNILORIN in 2016, Dr Isiaka won the Commonwealth Scholarship in 2018, which enabled him to pursue a Master's degree in Education, Public Policy and Equity at the University of Glasgow, UK. He subsequently obtained a Ph.D. in Inclusive Education from the University of East Anglia in 2024 East Anglia in 2024.

Dr Isiaka has focused on widening participation, decolonising higher education, and improving access for marginalised groups, particularly persons with disabilities. His upcoming Leverhulme-funded study is expected to make a significant contribution to scholarship and policy debates around disability justice and inclusive education in Africa and beyond.

Reflecting on the essence of the project, he said: "It presents innovative approaches to gathering histories and making new possibilities, allowing for a future that acknowledge and attempt to avoid the violence of the past and the

He added that while substantial research exists on the colonial roots of higher education in Africa, little has been done to interrogate the enduring impact of (neo) colonial systems on disabled students' experiences and aspirations, especially in West Africa. "By uncovering the often-silenced histories of disabled people in the fight for independence and access to education, this project seeks to reimagine inclusive futures," he said.

Olorunshola bags CVSN Fellowship

he College of Veterinary Surgeons Nigeria (CVSN) has conferred its Fellowship award on a Senior Lecturer in the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, University of Ilorin, Dr Isaac Dayo Olorunshola.

A letter of award, signed by Dr Helen Chime Ego Oputa, the Interim College Secretary, stated that Dr Olorunshola's Fellowship award follows his successful completion of the professional postgraduate programme in the Faculty of Pathology of the College.

The letter stated, "This is to inform you that you have successfully completed the Fellowship programme in the Pathology Faculty of the College of Veterinary Surgeons Nigeria. And having satisfied all the requirements, you have been awarded Fellow of the College of Veterinary Surgeons, Nigeria (FCVSN) in Microbiology with effect from 17 November, 2023".

The Interim College Secretary further confirmed that Dr Olorunshola was admitted into the Fellow class in the Faculty of Pathology in 2018 and completed the programme in 2023, passing all seven

required courses within the three years allotted for the programme.

In a formal communication to the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, Dr Olorunshola expressed appreciation for the permission granted him to attend the part-time professional training.

Dr Olorunshola's achievement marks a significant milestone in his professional journey and reflects the University's commitment to staff development through continuous academic advancement.

The Inaugural Lecturer explained that research has confirmed that animal diseases often affect human beings, pointing out that more than 70% of the emerging and re-emerging diseases that have affected humans over the past two decades came from animals.

Prof. Elelu advised Nigerians to give greater consideration to the quality of meat they consume to safeguard their health, saying that safeguarding the health of the population must be the watchword of all.

The Inaugural Lecturer, who is a former Head of the Department of Veterinary Public Health and Preventive Medicine, said that every effort must be made to prevent disease in animals to ensure that the health of human beings is not negatively impacted by what they consume from animals.

As a result of the relationship between human and animal health, Prof. Elelu said that health professionals must adopt multi-disciplinary health strategies to ensure effective and sustainable improvement in service delivery.

She explained that the suggestion is even more plausible among resource-poor countries as she noted that the multidisciplinary approach such as exemplified by one health strategy would serve the intended purpose.

The Inaugural Lecturer pointed out that public health, unlike other fields of medicine, is not about doctors treating individual patients but about an entire population.

Prof. Elelu, who is also the Executive Secretary of the Kwara State Primary Healthcare Development Agency, recalled that the success recorded in the control of the avian influenza epidemics in Nigeria between 2006 and 2010 was largely due to the coordinated efforts of the human and veterinary medicine professionals.


She explained that some diseases such as Zoonotic TB cannot be checked by the human health sector alone, saying that veterinarians and other stakeholders in the public health sector must work together by carrying out joint nomadic vaccination, targeting both their livestock and children.

Prof. Elelu, who has won

Prof. Elelu, who has won several awards and recognitions, also canvassed integrated human and animal health surveillance through a sustainable programme involving veterinary and medical experts both nationally and internationally for a successful disease control programme.

For food safety and to address the role of animals in maintaining and transmitting the disease and in view of the absence of effective preventive vaccinations or chemotherapy, Prof. Elelu called for strengthened joint human and animal health surveillance at the hospitals and meat inspection in the abattoirs.

Prof. Elelu, who is also the first female Professor of Veterinary Medicine from Kwara State, also called on stakeholders in animal husbandry to ensure that farmers are duly educated on good farm management practices such as biosecurity, vector control, animal vaccination, and waste management. She explained that



The Inaugural Lecturer also called for an improved health information and communication, saying that it is important to strengthen and sustain prompt health communication between human health and animal health sectors in a joint public health strategy, as the timely sharing of information will allow prompt identification of geographical areas or patient groups with a high risk of zoonotic disease exposure. This, according to her, will facilitate a targeted response for prevention and control.

Prof. Elelu, whose Inaugural Lecture was the first from her Department and the third from the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, also called for massive awareness campaigns on animal diseases. She said that awareness campaigns, fortified with content-specific messages to target audiences, especially amongst those most at risk of contracting infections, would be of great assistance in reducing the spread of the diseases.

She noted that public enlightenment campaigns against the consumption of pasteurised dairy products should be intensified. This, she said, should be complemented with continuous engagement of the people with individually tailored messages. She said that would also be more beneficial.

Prof. Elelu also suggested that the dissemination of health information must be regulated, especially on social media platforms, limiting health-related postings to only qualified medical professionals.

She recalled that during the 2020 pandemic, everyone became a doctor with a lot of misguided viral social media health messages.

Speaking on veterinary medicine, Prof. Elelu described the discipline as a unique career that benefits both animals and humans.

She urged students to give whatever course of studies they are pursuing all seriousness, pointing out that greatness awaits those who are determined and industrious in whatever legitimate cause they pursue

The Inaugural Lecture, which was presided-over by the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor(Management Services), Prof. Adegboyega Adisa Fawole, was also attended by several dignitaries including the Emir of Ilorin, Alhaji (Dr) Ibrahim Sulu-Gambari, CFR, who was represented by the Balogun Alanamu of Ilorin, Dr Usman Abubakar Akanbi-Jos; a former Chief Justice of Nigeria, Justice Saliu Modibbo Alfa Belgore, GCON; the Grand Khadi of Kwara State, Justice Abdulateef Kamaldeen; the Chairman of National Health Insurance Authority, Senator Ibrahim Yahaya Oloriegbe; the National President of Ilorin Emirate Descendants Progressive Union (IEDPU), Alhaji Abdulmumini Ayo Abdulmalik; a former Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. AbdulGaniyu Ambali, OON; and the Kwara State Commissioner for Tertiary Education, Mrs Saadat Modibbo Kawu, among several others from far and near.

While Prof. Hyeon Tae Kim, the Chief of the Institute of Smart Space Agriculture (ISSA), signed on behalf of the South Korean University, the Dean of the Faculty of Engineering and Technology, University of Ilorin, Prof. Jamiu Kolawole Odusote signed on behalf of Nigeria's most soughtafter University.

T h e collaboration is aimed at enhancing knowledge

exchange, promoting student and faculty mobility, and supporting research in smart farming, which is an emerging area of technological innovation in agriculture.

Speaking at the event, the Dean of the Faculty of Engineering and Technology, Prof. Jamiu Kolawole Odusote, said that the objective of the memorandum is to establish a collaborative relationship between the two institutions and to support a studentship programme aimed at achieving smart farm initiatives.

"The collaboration aims to promote knowledge sharing and support studentship programmes towards achieving a smart farm, the Dean said, noting that the collaboration would facilitate the progress of both institutions.

In his remarks, the Director, Centre for International Education (CIE), University of Ilorin, Prof. Lateef Onireti Ibraheem, described the MoU as another milestone in the University's growing list of international academic partnerships.

Prof. Onireti said, "This MoU between the South Korean University and the University of Ilorin is another connection to our series of MoUs. Since the inception of this Administration, we have signed more than 50 MoUs, and most of them are active"

"We hope that this MoU will cement the collaborations between us and the South Korean University. Both universities stand to benefit immensely, especially in Engineering and Agriculture, which are the core focus areas of this MoU."

The Director, who teaches at the Department of Arabic, emphasised the importance of global partnerships in driving institutional development.

According to Prof. Onireti, "a University must be universal. A University without internationalisation as a priority is not a University. A University without international staff, students, or collaborations is not a University".

He said, "We have organised and established links and partnerships with other



universities across the world so that we will be complete. A University in itself cannot be complete without having partners across the globe. The University of Ilorin is getting better by far, day by day."

In the memorandum, the two institutions agreed to promote the exchange of knowledge, expertise, and best practices in smart farming. This includes sharing research findings, technological innovations, and successful implementation strategies aimed at enhancing the understanding and application of smart farming practices.

Both parties are also committed to facilitating student exchange programmes where students from UNILORIN's Faculty of Engineering and Technology will have the opportunity to visit ISSA in South Korea to gain practical experience, while South Korean students will study and conduct research at UNILORIN to understand Nigeria's unique agricultural challenges.

The memorandum also provides for the initiation of joint research efforts to tackle specific agricultural problems through innovation. These projects may include collaborative studies, development of new smart farming technologies, and pilot programmes that address region-specific issues.

The agreement equally encourages Faculty and staff exchange between both institutions as academic and administrative personnel will participate in teaching, training, and research activities at the partner institution for the purpose of promoting mutual professional development.

A joint committee comprising representatives from both universities will also be set up to implement and monitor the MoU's activities. The committee will meet regularly to assess progress, address challenges, and recommend initiatives to strengthen the partnership.

The MoU takes effect from the date of signing and will remain active for an initial period of five (5) years. It may be renewed or revised through mutual written consent.

Both institutions also acknowledged the importance of protecting confidential and proprietary information and that all shared data and intellectual property will be managed according to institutional policies and applicable legal frameworks.

In the event of any dispute related to the MoU—including issues of breach, interpretation, or termination—the matter shall be resolved through final and binding arbitration in the country of domicile of the respondent. The arbitration shall be conducted in English and overseen by a mutually agreed arbitrator.

Each institution will also bear its own costs relating to the implementation of the collaboration, including travel, accommodation, and research expenses.

However, both parties will actively seek external funding through grants, scholarships, or other sources to support joint programmes and exchanges.

The MoU may be terminated by either party with a six-month written notice. However, existing collaborative activities or commitments made prior to the termination date will not be affected.

The agreement was signed on behalf of the Faculty of Agriculture and Life Sciences, Gyeongsang National University, South Korea, by Professor Hyeon Tae Kim, Chief of the Institute of Smart Space Agriculture (ISSA), and on behalf of the Faculty of Engineering and Technology, University of Ilorin, by Professor Jamiu Kolawole Odusote, Dean of the faculty.

The signing of this MoU marks a significant step toward building a global research network for sustainable agriculture and smart technology development. It reinforces the University of Ilorin's position as a forward-thinking institution committed to solving societal challenges through international cooperation, research excellence, and capacity building.



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Always be mindful of your health, Fawole urges colleagues

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

head of the upcoming 50th anniversary of the University of Ilorin, the Dean of the Faculty of Agriculture, Prof. Oluyemisi Fawole, has expressed the readiness of the Faculty to mark the milestone in a special way, saying that the management, staff and students are looking forward to the events.

Prof. Fawole stated this penultimate Wednesday (May 21, 2024) while speaking with *UNILORIN Bulletin* in her office.

The Dean explained that the Faculty would stage an agricultural exhibition where produce and products of its various Departments as well as journals of the Faculty would be displayed for all to admire as part of the events marking the anniversary.

Prof. Fawole, who is the 16th Dean of the Faculty, which was established during the 1982/1983 academic session, added that the programme would also be highlighted with financial support to be given to four agripreneurs who were unsuccessful at the British-American Tobacco of Nigeria Foundation awards given to six of their colleagues earlier in the year. This, according to her, is to enable the four Unilorites to also go into various agricultural businesses on the University campus.

She also said that a workshop that would bring the town and gown together on best agricultural practices would be organised to mark the upcoming anniversary.

Prof. Fawole explained that the workshop, which would be dedicated to highlighting the inevitability of "smart agriculture", would come up a week or two before the main events. She explained that the workshop would enable experts in the Faculty and practising farmers to exchange ideas on modern farming with a view to enhancing agricultural productivity.

The Dean explained that the Faculty is one of those that have brought remarkable traffic to the University in terms of sponsorships and collaborations with various local and international or g a n i s a t i o n s.

Prof. Fawole, who teaches at

Prof. Fawole, who teaches at the Department of Agronomy, said that the Faculty has also placed the University in the front burner in innovative agricultural practices, saying that the recent development of Ilomaz 2 and Ilomaz 3, which are maize varieties that are tolerant to multiple stresses, including drought and Striga

hermonthica, attracted huge applause from agricultural stakeholders across the world.

She also said that 22 distinguished Professors from the various Departments of the Faculty have delivered thought-provoking Inaugural Lectures at the University over the years, saying that most of the lectures have made impressive impacts on food security in Nigeria and beyond.

The Dean, who is the third female scholar that would head the Faculty since its inception, said that alumni of the Faculty across the world are being mobilised to celebrate with the University.

She explained that the alumni of the Faculty have been most encouraging and impactful as she said that arrangements have almost been concluded by them to buy a tractor and a plough for the Faculty to enhance teaching and learning as well as agricultural production.

Prof. Fawole, who said that the farm equipment would cost the alumni about №33,000,000, said that more than №13,000,000 had been generated so far from the contributions of distinguished alumni of the Faculty who have also done so many things for the Faculty over the years.

Speaking on the magnitude and quality of alumni produced by the Faculty, the Dean explained that it had produced no fewer than 3000 graduates since 1987.

Prof. Fawole said while some of the alumni are pursuing their livelihood and doing well in agriculture-related enterprises, she noted that a number of them have branched off to other areas of human endeavours where they are also making huge impacts.

The Dean recalled the outstanding contributions of alumni like Dr Olajumoke Ojo, who now has a Ph. D. in Nursing Science; Dr Adekunle Omotosho, who is the Chief Executive of a Lagos-based Aristech solutions company; and the late Dr Mustapha Ayodele Popoola, who was a

former Special Assistant to the current Minister of Agriculture and Food Security, Senator Abubakar Kyari.

Other outstanding alumni of the Faculty as recalled by the Dean are Dr Olabode Ezekiel Adebiyi, a leading businessman and former Commissioner for Agriculture and Food Security in Ekiti State; Hon. Kehinde Boluade, who is a Special Assistant to the Ekiti State Governor and Hon. Ebenezer Olamide Boluwade, an ex-banker, who is currently an Agricultural Assistant to the United States Agency for International Development's Special Mission in Nigeria.

Prof. Fawole also said that the Dean of the Faculty of the Faculty of Agriculture, University of Abuja, Prof. Hakeem Oyerinde; is a proud product of the Faculty. She also mentioned Prof. Ayo Toye, Prof. O. S. Balogun, Prof. A.K. Musa, and Prof. Sola Ojo as well as Dr Usman Dipo Akanbi, who is the current President of the Association of Nigerian Authors (ANA), among others, as some of the alumni of the Faculty who are also working at the Faculty as lecturers in various Departments.

The Dean also said that the Faculty has produced very active members who have held key leadership positions in the nation's most sought-after University such as Prof. O. O. Balogun, Prof. Luke Ayorinde and Prof. Abayomi Omotesho, who served as Deputy Vice Chancellors at various times.

Prof. Fawole added that the Faculty also produced about five Vice Chancellors for other sister universities among its staff such as Prof. O. O. Balogun, who served at the Federal University of Agriculture, Abeokuta; Prof. Luke Ayorinde, who served at various times at Kola Daisi University, Ibadan, and Thomas Adewumi University, Oko; as well as Prof. Bashiru Raji, Prof. Popoola and Prof. Olabisi Ramota Karim, who also served as Vice Chancellors of the Fountain University, Osogbo, at various times.

As a way of creating more impacts, the Dean said that her Faculty is working towards embarking on large scale commercial farming to enhance teaching and learning and assist members of the University community and the general public on food security.

Prof. Fawole congratulated the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, and other Principal Officers of the University and the generality of the members of the University community on the upcoming celebration. She wished the University more accomplishments worthy of celebrations.

"Fulfill your part in life by embracing digital literacy," she said. "No need to search for a job, you are already self- employed as a student."

He also said that, "entrepreneurship is not just about making money, but making halal income. That should be the goal of every Muslim entrepreneur."

Lt. Elemosho stressed that intention, transparency, and accountability are essential in any business pursuit, adding that the ultimate objective should be to please Allah while positively impacting the community.

Also speaking at the event, Mallam Abdulsalam Aladodo, the founder of Mobile Cap Moll, cautioned students against compromising their faith for fame or wealth.

"Your portion of wealth is already written by Almighty Allah," he said. "Be honest, trustworthy, and uphold integrity. These are the keys to long-term success in any venture."

He warned about the misuse of social media and Artificial Intelligence, stating, "AI will make brilliant people more brilliant and the foolish more foolish. Use it wisely to enhance your business and not for negative purposes that can destroy the society."

Speaking earlier, the Head of the Department of Religions, Prof. A.G. Alamu, who was represented by Dr A.O. Meleki, encouraged the students to diversify their skills and not be confined to traditional paths.

In his closing remarks, a Deputy Chief Imam of the University of Ilorin Central Mosque, Prof. Yahaya Oyewole Imam, thanked the guest speakers for their insightful contributions and urged the students to "think beyond being local champions" by stepping out of their comfort zones.

The event, which featured poetry rendition and presentation of awards of recognition to deserving individuals, was aimed at bridging faith based values with emerging technology and business opportunities.
