#### **How UNILORIN saved 12th varsities debating championship from postponement - ANUDC**

he President of the All-Nigeria Universities Debating Championship (ANUDC), Dr Abdullateef Owoade, has commended the Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, and the management of the Institution for saving the 12th edition of the Championship from an imminent postponement.

The Championship, which was held from August 24 to 30, 2025, had initially faced uncertainty after the original host institution withdrew few weeks to the commencement date.

Dr Owoade said that the University of Ilorin, however, accepted the hosting rights at short notice and swiftly mobilised resources to ensure the tournament held successfully.

The ANUDC President revealed this last Friday (August 29, 2025) when he led other officials of the championship organising committee on a courtesy visit to the Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN.

He disclosed that within 24 hours of receiving the request, the UNILORIN Vice Chancellor set up the necessary structures, providing accommodation, transportation, and other logistics that facilitated the



smooth conduct of the event.

He said that this gesture made University of Ilorin the first university in Nigeria to host the championship three times, a feat he described as a major milestone in the history of the competition.

Dr Owoade expressed gratitude to the University for its timely intervention and unwavering support. He also appreciated the Vice Chancellor's long-standing passion and commitment to the project.

While receiving the team, the Vice Chancellor, who was represented by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research, Technology and Innovation), Prof. Muhtar Adeiza Etudaiye, said debating plays a critical role in building students' confidence,

sharpening their communication skills, and preparing them for future challenges, including job interviews and leadership responsibilities.

The Vice Chancellor pointed out that the championship was not just about producing winners but also about nurturing innovation, creativity, and excellence among Nigerian students.

He further assured the ANUDC Council that the University of Ilorin would continue to support initiatives that enhance the competitiveness of Nigerian students globally, as he reaffirmed the institution's readiness to host the event in the future if called upon.

### **UNILORIN Library embracing technology for global relevance – Omopupa**

he University Librarian, University of Ilorin, Prof. Kamaldeen Tunde Omopupa, has declared that the institution's library is "on track to success" through strategic deployment of modern technology to meet current and future academic needs.


Prof. Omopupa made this known last Tuesday (August 26, 2025) during an interview with UNILORIN Bulletin in his office.

He noted that the library is evolving rapidly to match global standards and remain relevant in the digital age

Highlighting some of the innovations, the University Librarian said the facility is equipped with a 24hour power supply, solar energy backup, comprehensive CCTV coverage for security, and access to multiple academic databases.

He added that the University also boasts of a robust E-Library and also E-Resources where staff publications are uploaded for global visibility.

"We are moving faster to be as

effective as libraries around the world. Beyond the traditional system, we are introducing self-service facilities, where users can borrow and return books without necessarily interacting with a librarian," Prof. Omopupa explained.

He emphasised that despite the digital shift, readership at the University Library remains strong, pointing out that many students and researchers still prefer traditional print resources.

Prof. Omopupa disclosed that the main library has the capacity to accommodate 1,800 users at once, while the E-Library provides seating for 800 users and operates round the clock.

He added that the digital library, complemented with free internet access, ensures unlimited usage for students, staff, and external researchers.

"The library plays a central role in the academic environment and the society at large. We support both staff and students to achieve their aspirations and also provide resources to people outside the University community," he stated.

Prof. Omopupa further urged students and staff to maximise the library's resources for assignments, research and community engagement.

He also expressed gratitude to the Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFund) and the University management for their continuous support in enhancing the growth of the Library.

### 21, 971 candidates jostle for 13,000 UNILORIN admisson slots

Disclosing this in an interview with *UNILORIN Bulletin*, the Director of the University Computer-Based Test (CBT) Centre, Prof. Kamilu Rauf, said that the exercise, which began with 26 under-age applicants, comprised 20,220 candidates for the Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) and 1,751 candidates for Direct Entry (DE).

Prof. Rauf disclosed that this year's figure reflects an increase over last year's 15,946 UTME and 1,175 Direct Entry candidates.

He said, "This year, we recorded an addition of over 4,200 UTME candidates and 576 Direct Entry applicants, which shows that more students are making the University of Ilorin their first choice of institution."

The Professor of Mathematics attributed the surge in applications to the growing reputation of the University for academic excellence, uninterrupted academic calendar, and efficient administration.

According to him, "Our slogan is 'Better by Far,' and candidates know that when you come to UNILORIN, four years means four years, and five years means five years, without the disruptions of prolonged strikes."

Prof. Rauf added that the Post-UTME screening exercise commenced on August 28 with 26 underage candidates out of the 30 expected and will run until September 4, with the final day serving as a mop-up for absentees and candidates for Arabic Studies.

The CBT Director reminded candidates and their parents to adhere strictly to examination guidelines, including dress codes and the prohibition of gadgets such as mobile phones in the examination hall.

He urged parents to avoid crowding the examination venues, stressing that all necessary information is available on the University website: www.unilorin.edu.ng.

Prof. Rauf reassured candidates and parents that the University is fully prepared to conduct a hitch-free and



seamless exercise, urging all applicants to strictly adhere to the guidelines.

Also speaking, the Chairman of the

Also speaking, the Chairman of the University Admissions Committee, Prof. Abdulazeez Muhammad-Lawal, described the first day of the exercise as successful, noting that the candidates conducted themselves well.

Prof. Muhammad-Lawal said, "We were expecting 30 underage candidates to participate today, but 26 of them actually turned up. The examination went smoothly, and the students displayed commendable discipline."

He, however, cautioned parents against accompanying their wards to the examination venues, stressing that the process requires biometric verification and must remain strictly candidate centered.

He explained that while a few parents showed up on the first day, the University would not allow such practices during the main examinations.

In a related development, the University Admission Officer, Mr Abdulkareem Sanni, has assured the post-UTME candidates that they need not know anyone or pay any amount of money to any individual or organisation before they could be offered admissions to the University of Ilorin.

Mr Sanni stated this while featuring on 'Table Talk', a current affairs programme of UNILORIN 89.3 FM last Wednesday (August 27, 2025). The programme was anchored by Mr AbdulKadir Yinka Saliu (Magaji Nda).

The Admission Officer explained that all the candidates needed to do is to have all the requirements for their programmes of choice as he stressed the readiness of the University to give all the candidates equal opportunities.

Mr Sanni, who is a Principal Assistant Registrar, explained that admissions would be offered based on the consideration of the Ordinary Level results, Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) results and the ongoing Post-UTME Screening results.

He added that for a candidate to be eligible for admission into the University, he or she must score a minimum of 180 in UTME and five O'level Credits and must also pass the Post-UTME screening.

While saying that the five O'level Credits should not be from more than two sittings for most of the courses, the Admission Officer said that candidates who applied for Medicine and Surgery, Optometry and Vision Science, Pharmaceutical Sciences and Computer Engineering are expected to make their five O'level Credits at not more than one sitting.

Mr Sanni also enjoined all the candidates who are scheduled to sit the Post-UTME screening to be punctual for the exercise, dress responsibly and maintain decorum throughout.

About 12,856 candidates were admitted in the 2024/2025 academic session.

### Egbewole tasks students on leadership

he Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has charged Nigerian students to embrace critical thinking, leadership and purposeful action as they participate in the 12th All-Nigeria Universities Debating Championship (ANUDC) hosted by the University.

Declaring the event open last Monday (August 25,2025), Prof. Egbewole, represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Research, Technology and Innovation), Prof. Muhtar Adeiza Etudaiye, described the competition as more than a contest but a training ground for leadership, public speaking and lifelong friendships.

The Vice Chancellor said that the repeated hosting of the championship by UNILORIN underscored its high regard for the competition and its role in national development.

He said, "The All-Nigeria Universities Debating Championship is a particularly prestigious event, not just in terms of its reputation, but also in its longevity and the number of times UNILORIN has participated and hosted. Hosting up to four times shows how importantly we view this competition."

Prof. Egbewole noted that debating goes beyond oratory skills, stressing that it nurtures leadership qualities and prepares students for life after the university.

He urged participants not just to think but to translate thoughts into action.

Earlier in his address, the President of the ANUDC Council, Dr A. A. Owoade of the Faculty of Law,



University of Ilorin, described the gathering as "a story of resilience."

Dr Owoade recalled that the event had faced uncertainty just two weeks earlier, but the University of Ilorin rose to the challenge and turned "setback into strength."

He lauded the Vice Chancellor and the Dean of Student Affairs for their support, saying, "By accepting to host us at such a short notice, you have not only given us a home but reminded us of why UNILORIN is called "Better by Far."

Dr Owoade stressed that the championship was more than winning a trophy, but about shaping leaders and building communities.

"Every debate sharpens critical thinking. Every quiz strengthens knowledge. Every speech nurtures courage. What we do here is training for leadership, a rehearsal for the Nigeria we all dream of," he said.

He also called on corporate organisations and philanthropists to support the championship as "an investment in Nigeria's future."

Also speaking, the Dean of Student Affairs, Dr Alex Akanmu, said that the University felt privileged to host the championship for a record third

consecutive time, adding that facilities and accommodations were put in place to make participants comfortable.

He commended students and organisers for sustaining the culture of intellectual competition, urging them to be "fair and firm" throughout the contest.

"When you have a fair system, you can be sure of an excellent product. The whole world is waiting to celebrate the champions, and more eager to celebrate our University for putting this together even at short notice," Dr Akanmu said.

The Chairman of the UNILORIN Quiz, Debate and Education Committee, Prof. Oluyinka Ajibola Iyiola, also described the hosting as a privilege, praising the Vice Chancellor for his support in overcoming logistical challenges such as accommodation, transportation and venues.

Prof. Iyiola confirmed that more than 24 universities registered for the debating and public speaking segments while 16 universities took part in the quiz competition.

He urged students to see the championship as an opportunity to acquire knowledge, build networks and expand their intellectual horizons.

### No physical clearance for students at UNILORIN GNS Division-Mustapha

### **NUC commends UNILORIN postgraduate programmes**

he Ag. Director of Accreditation at the National Universities Commission (NUC), Engr. Abraham Chindusu, has commended the quality of postgraduate education at the University of Ilorin, describing the Institution as a model for other universities in Nigeria.

Engr. Chindusu gave the commendation last Monday (August 25, 2025) while presenting the report of the NUC/TETFund Postgraduate Accreditation Team to the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Egbewole (SAN), at the Council Chamber of the University.

The Director said that the University demonstrated an exceptional level of support and cooperation during the accreditation exercise, noting that the facilities, infrastructure, and resources available across Faculties were impressive and of international standard.

At the Faculty of Law, Engr. Chindusu noted that the team observed a dedicated building for professors, where each office is equipped with conveniences and secretarial support. He described this as a rare development in Nigerian universities and a clear affirmation of the University's "Better by Far" slogan.

The leader of the accreditation team further stated that the Department of Chemistry at the Faculty of Physical Sciences was equipped with newly acquired instruments, a development the team considered vital to advancing postgraduate research. He said that a new building for Home Economics and modern equipment were seen at the

Faculty of Agriculture, which he described as evidence of the University's preparedness for postgraduate studies in the field.

Commenting on the stable electricity supply at the University, Engr. Chindusu applauded the management for providing alternative sources of power for students and staff, despite the institution's direct connection to the national grid from Osogbo. He noted that stable electricity is central to effective and quality research in the academia.

While also commending the University Library, which he described as spacious and well-stocked with both physical and electronic resources, the accreditation team leader noted that the functionality of the e-resources was verified and adjudged excellent and it aligned with modern students' preference for digital materials.

The NUC's Ag. Director of Accreditation also commended the UNILORIN Postgraduate School, describing its building as befitting and equipped with modern facilities. Engr. Abraham Chundusu noted that he and his team members observed that all Faculties had representatives at the school, a system that enhances smooth information flow between the Faculties and the Postgraduate School. He further confirmed that admission and graduation records were centrally managed and fully digitised, allowing easy access to accurate data.

While, urging the University to expand hostel provisions specifically for postgraduate students in order to further strengthen its postgraduate programmes, the team lauded the serene, clean, and well-landscaped environment of the University, describing it as psychologically beneficial to academic productivity.

In his response, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Egbewole, reaffirmed the commitment of the University to excellence.

Prof. Egbewole, who was represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Management Services), Prof. Adegboyega Adisa Fawole, stated that the University has a culture of doing things right without compromise, adding that this continues to guide its operations and developmental strides.

On the issue of postgraduate accommodation, the Vice Chancellor assured the accreditation team that the University was mindful of the pressing need and had already begun to take steps to expand and improve both the quality and quantity of postgraduate hostels.

He further stated the University's strong culture of collaboration, noting that UNILORIN has signed numerous Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) with institutions both within and outside Nigeria.

The Vice Chancellor disclosed that locally, the University is in partnership with the French Village in Badagry, the International Institute of Tropical Agriculture (IITA), Ibadan, and the Standards Organisation of Nigeria (SON), among others. He added that there is also a record of Faculty and students traveling widely as part of the implementation of these MoUs.

While acknowledging the commendation from the NUC accreditation team, Prof. Egbewole noted that the University is conscious of the areas where improvements are still needed and assured the team that the University Management would not relent in addressing them.

#### **UNILORIN WINS 12TH NIGERIAN VARSITIES DEBATING CHAMPIONSHIP**

he 12th All-Nigeria Universities Debating Championship (ANUDC) ended last Friday (August 29, 2025) with the host institution, the University of Ilorin, emerging overall champions in Public Speaking and winner of the Novice Debate stream.

In the Debate Mainstream category, Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile-Ife, clinched the championship title, while the Federal University of Technology, Owerri, and Veritas University, Abuja, placed second and third respectively.

In the Novice Debate, UNILORIN came first, ahead of the University of Nigeria, Nsukka, and the Federal University of Technology, Akure.

The University also celebrated individual brilliance, with Olafisoye

Alexander and Tivlumun Alexander ranking among the Top 3 Best Speakers of the Championship.

In the Quiz Challenge, the University of Uyo emerged champions, Michael Okpara University of Agriculture, Umudike, came second, while UNILORIN secured third place.

The competition drew participants from universities across the country, including the University of Ibadan; University of Nigeria, Nsukka; University of Uyo; Michael Okpara University of Agriculture, Umudike; Lagos State University; Al-Hikmah University, Ilorin; Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria; Bayero University, Kano; Nile University of Nigeria; and the University of Maiduguri, among several others from both northern and southern states.

In their closing remarks, members of the Organising Committee described the Championship as a platform for nurturing critical thinking, leadership, and intellectual exchange among Nigerian youths. They commended the University of Ilorin for successfully hosting the 12th edition and urged participants to carry the lessons of teamwork, excellence, and constructive dialogue into their future engagements.

According to him, the Faculty is determined to build on the solid foundation laid by past Deans, with a renewed focus on innovation, collaboration, and excellence.

"Our plan is anchored on academic excellence," Prof. Jawondo said. adding, "We have restructured some programmes to meet international standards. History and International Studies has become History and Diplomatic Studies; the Department of Arabic is now Arabic and Transnational Studies; and Performing Arts has been expanded to Performing and Film

Arts. These changes reflect our progress and readiness to compete globally."

The Professor of History and International Studies added that the Faculty is also committed to promoting a culture of humanity by engaging students through both curricular and extracurricular activities to ensure their relevance in diverse spheres of life.

He further highlighted ongoing and prospective international collaborations, including a standing Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Mississippi State University, a new partnership with the French Embassy, and a planned collaborative conference with Georgia University scheduled for November.

Prof. Jawondo also appealed to the University Administration for external funding to construct a 1,500capacity lecture theatre, noting the rising population of students within the faculty.

The Dean expressed appreciation for the management's continuous support, and also urged staff to remain prudent in managing available resources and adhere strictly to university and national regulations.

### **UNILORIN ASUU** calls for urgent action to avert looming industrial crisis

he Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU), University of Ilorin Branch, has appealed to the Federal Government to urgently address unresolved issues in the nation's public universities to avert another round of industrial unrest.

Speaking at a press conference last Tuesday (August 27, 2025) at the Union's Secretariat, the Branch Chairman, Dr Alex Akanmu, said the calm experienced in recent months is largely due to the patriotism of lecturers who have continued to work in hope that government would fulfill its promises.

Dr Akanmu outlined the key concerns of the Union, saying, "Our demands remain clear: the immediate renegotiation of the 2009 FGN/ASUU Agreement, sustainable funding and revitalisation of universities, respect for university autonomy, settlement of withheld salaries, payment of promotion arrears, and the mainstreaming of earned academic allowances. These issues cannot continue to suffer delays."

He lamented that allocation to education in Nigeria remains below 7% of the national budget, far short of



UNESCO's recommended 15-26%.

According to Dr Akanmu, "the chronic underfunding has left laboratories empty, lecture rooms in disrepair, and students in poor accommodation."

"While countries like Kenya and Ghana invest heavily in education, our institutions are struggling to survive," he said.

The Union also expressed concern over the erosion of university autonomy, reminding the government of the outstanding three and a half months' salaries withheld during the 2022 strike, the balance of N10 billion still owed as earned academic allowance, and the yet to be paid promotion

arrears in some universities for over four years.

While acknowledging the Federal Government's planned meeting with ASUU, Dr Akanmu urged sincerity and swift action, noting that academics are growing weary of endless negotiations.

"This is not about confrontation but about the survival of our universities. We are peace loving patriots, but the sacrifices of our members must be respected. The time to act is now," he stressed.

### Farm practical training 'Il enhance our learning, say Agric students

cross-section of 400 level students of the Department of Animal Production, Faculty of Agriculture, University of Ilorin, have described the ongoing Farm Practical Training (FPT) as a rare opportunity to bridge theoretical knowledge and practical experience.

The students, numbering in their hundreds, disclosed this last Tuesday (August 26, 2025) while sharing their experiences with *UNILORIN Bulletin* during the conclusion of their first two-week rotation.

Speaking on behalf of the Group, Miss Olalekan Azeezat Yetunde said that the exercise has been both fulfilling and rewarding.

She explained that the past two weeks involved pasture and forage cultivation, animal interaction, and exposure to different sections of the department, including poultry and ruminants.

Mrs Olalekan said, "It has been fulfilling and satisfying to finally put into practice what we had only studied in theory. We rotated through different sections, including poultry, turkeys, chickens, and ruminants. Though it was challenging, especially at the beginning when we struggled with water access, the Department has now provided a permanent irrigation source to support our work. We are grateful for the knowledge gained, and it has been a beautiful and rewarding experience."

She also appreciated the Department of Animal Production, and

the University management while also commending the lecturers, the farm manager, Dr Kamarudeen Kolawole Safiyu, the Head of Department, Prof. A. T. Yusuf, and other staff who made the experience practical and enriching.

Also speaking, the FPT Coordinator, Dr Safiyu, said that the farm practice programme is structured in modules across the Faculty of Agriculture, ensuring that every student rotates through all Departments.

He explained that for the Animal Production component, students were trained in ruminant and poultry management, while the swine unit was suspended due to technical challenges.

Dr Safiyu highlighted innovations introduced into the programme, particularly the establishment of a ranching model for ruminants.

According to him, the students cultivated one hectare of pasture, subdivided into three groups, where they planted elephant grass (Pennisetum purpureum), guinea grass (Panicum maximum), and intercropped with lablab (Lablab purpureus), a forage legume, and these crops have already begun sprouting.

"This training is meant not only to prepare our students for life after graduation but also to position the University as a contributor to national food security. By engaging students in forage production and ranching, we are teaching sustainable solutions to challenges such as the farmers/herders crisis, which is worsened by the scarcity of year round forage," he said.

Dr Safiyu added that the programme for the 2025/2026 session involves 404 students and is divided into six components spanning the academic year.

"The first three months, from August to October, are dedicated to school-based farm practice. The next three months, beginning in September, are for industrial training with external organisations. Upon returning in February, students will commence another three to four months of farm practice, including advanced training", he added.

Dr Safiyu explained that subsequent sessions will introduce students to silage and hay production for forage conservation, as well as broiler and layer poultry production.

He said that it will ensure that every graduate is well-grounded in livestock management and feed production techniques.

"At the end of this training, our students will know how to handle cattle, sheep, goats, and poultry. Beyond animal management, they will also understand how to grow and conserve the feed required for these animals throughout the year. This guarantees that UNILORIN graduates will be well equipped, globally relevant, and proud ambassadors of the University," he said.

The Head of the Department, Prof. Eunice Shola-Ojo, said that the news of the students' impressive performance has already spread, showcasing the dedication and innovation of the FPT 2025/2026 set.

She added that the Department would continue to improve on the practical training to ensure students graduate with the competence required to contribute meaningfully to the agricultural sector.

### Dean of Agric vows to link research with industry

he new Dean of the Faculty of Agriculture, University of Ilorin, Prof. Israel Ogunlade, has pledged to prioritise the linkage between agricultural research and industry to ensure that innovations from the University are adopted by end users.

Prof. Ogunlade made this known last Thursday (August 28, 2025) in his office in an interview with *UNILORIN Bulletin*, where he outlined his vision for the Faculty. He stressed that his administration would focus on research relevance, student entrepreneurship, and staff mentorship as pathways to societal impact.

The Dean disclosed that he also plans to encourage fellows who had studied abroad to bring back their experiences and present them to the Faculty, which will birth the adaptability of their knowledge to our local environment.

On students' development, Prof. Ogunlade said his interest lies in seeing them become entrepreneurs. He added that the foundation had already been laid by the immediate past Dean through Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with industry partners, and promised to follow it up to ensure that students gain hands-on training and emerge as business-minded professionals.

Prof. Ogunlade further emphasised that "lecturers should play a critical role in mentoring students. He also said that undergraduates must be taught to research into the problems of our society and produce meaningful solutions. while lecturers should guide students into impactful research that will make a difference in the world."

He also promised to celebrate academic staff who are contributing to the growth of the Faculty. He revealed

that the Faculty has its own recognition package for PhD graduates beyond what the University provides at convocation. He added that the Faculty wants the world to know that the Faculty of Agriculture is monitoring their progress and that we are producing PhDs who will hold positions in society and give back to the University."

The Dean disclosed that the Faculty is strengthening its Town and Gown Committee to organise workshops and short-term training for members of the public, to enable the society to see what we are doing and to benefit directly from our research outputs.

He also spoke on the Faculty's Farmers' Market, which sells produce from the teaching and research farm, noting that the initiative would be expanded. He said that his Faculty would "increase staple food production for the University community so that people can feel the impact of our research."

Prof. Ogunlade said the Faculty would also promote backyard farming, encouraging staff and students to cultivate

crops around their offices and residences for personal use.

On infrastructure, the Dean lamented the inadequacy of farm equipment. He explained that the Faculty only managed to refurbish a 30-year-old tractor, which is insufficient for its operations. He said the Faculty urgently needs strong and functional tractors as well as other implements to boost teaching and research activities.

The Dean disclosed that efforts are underway to introduce more equipment and improve mobility for staff and students. He said the Faculty is considering acquiring tricycles for transportation to and from the farm, adding that with better logistics, the farm will become a place people will want to visit and learn from."

Prof. Ogunlade praised the University administration for supporting farm practical training but emphasised the need for more investment. "The University has tried by releasing funds for training, but we still need additional facilities to meet the demands of modern agriculture," he observed.

According to him, the Faculty is committed to aligning with the Federal Government's renewed hope agenda. "We want the government and society to see that we are doing things differently. Our aim is to make affordable food crops and animal produce available to the University community while equipping students with entrepreneurial skills," he

The Dean concluded by expressing confidence that the Faculty would make the University proud. "We will strengthen our linkages with the outside world and ensure that our students leave here as competent entrepreneurs and innovators," he affirmed.
