VC assures victorious UNILORIN Debate Team of more support









The Chairman explained that qualified candidate who applied for admission into the University would be considered based on the established yardsticks.

Prof. Muhammad-Lawal warned candidates and their parents not to bribe any one as he said that admission into the University is not for sale but for those who possess the required qualifications.

He added that candidates need not know anyone before being given the privilege to study in the University as he said that all that would be prioritised is their academic performance.

Prof. Muhammad-Lawal pointed out that merit, more than any other factor(s), would be given greater consideration as he said that candidates who obtained high scores/grades in the UTME/A'Level, and Post-UTME screening, and possess good grades in five relevant O'Level subjects would be given greater consideration before other yardsticks are put into consideration.

Prof. Muhammad-Lawal said that his committee is working round the clock to ensure that the admission process is smooth and efficient as charged by the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN.

The Chairman, therefore, enjoined candidates to constantly check their JAMB CAPS for necessary information regarding their admissions status.


The SSANU Chairman explained that his appeal is hinged on the

According to him, "The activities include the 50th Anniversary Challenge, X-Space with the Vice Chancellor moderated by the Advocates, a career and employability fireside chat, promotional video and other strategic interventions that highlight the University as a symbol of what is possible within Nigeria's tertiary education system."

Mr Awogbenle hinted that the Xspace, which would be held on Sunday,

While expressing hope that efforts of UNILORIN Advocates will go a long way to raise awareness around the celebrations for local and global audience, he said, "The promotional video and other strategic media interventions would tell a unique story and highlight the University's strong pedigree and its ability to lead the innovation of the future and create the human capital that would drive the growth".

The upcoming Golden Jubilee celebration of the University of Ilorin, scheduled to hold between 23rd and 28th November, 2025, will mark 50 years of excellence in education, research, and community impact of the institution since its establishment in 1975.


Pol. Science Dept holds public lecture on TETFund Sept. 30

Aremu advocates strategic leadership for institutional success

Management of Nigeria (ISMN) (Chartered) has inducted some staff members of the University of Ilorin with the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, conferred with its Fellowship.

Wednesday (September 10, 2025) at the Auditorium Basement, the President of the Institute, Mr. Alex Ndudi Enebeli, commended the foresight of the Vice Chancellor in seeking collaboration with the institute. He charged the new inductees to continue adding value to themselves wherever they are.

In his address, the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Egbewole, said that the University would continue to support developmental drives that would have a positive impact on staff and students. He stated that efforts are ongoing to ensure that interested students are also brought into the Institute.

Earlier, the Guest Speaker, Prof. Mukaila Aremu, Provost of the College of Education, Oro, Kwara State, described strategic leadership as foundational to institutional success.

In his lecture, titled "Strategic Leadership as a Foundation for Institutional Success", Prof. Aremu noted that strategic leadership is an ...as Egbewole bags ISMNC Fellowship



integral part of management and crucial to any institution's success. He acknowledged that leaders would continue to face challenges that cannot be resolved using formal authority and powers alone.

The Professor of Marketing noted that while leadership involves inspiring and motivating people, strategic leadership requires deeper vision and foresight.

He said, "Henry Ford dreamed of a car families could afford. Steve Jobs dreamed of an easy-to-use computer that would unleash creativity. Nelson Mandela dreamed of an integrated, prosperous South Africa. The leading institutions in our country will only rise when they are led by strategic leaders with vision."

The former Head of the Department of Marketing, University of Ilorin, lamented the alarming rate of institutional failures in the Nigerian education sector, which he attributed largely to governance gaps.

He said, "Over the past few years, education analysts have watched desperately as various collapses resulted in huge investment losses. Analysts have attributed this problem to leadership and governance issues."

Citing recent statistics from the National Universities Commission (NUC) and the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB), Prof. Aremu stressed the urgency of reform.

"Nigeria has over 260 universities, yet our system is overstretched. In 2025 alone, more than 2 million candidates sat for the UTME. The demand for higher education keeps rising, and this further calls for strategic leadership in the management of the university system," he said.

UNILORIN alumna, Ojeahere, emerges first Nigerian Psychiatrist to bag GBHI Fellowship

n alumna of the University of Horin, Dr Margaret Isioma Ojeahere, has been selected as one of the Atlantic Fellows for Equity in Brain Health Programme, an initiative of the Global Brain Health Institute (GBHI), University of San Francisco.

The Atlantic Fellows for Equity in Brain Health are a unique cohort of highly networked interprofessional leaders that are experts in brain health and dementia prevention.

Dr Ojeahere, who graduated from the College of Health Sciences in 2004, is now the first Nigerian psychiatrist to get this fellowship, a highly competitive and selective programme.

In a post shared on the Institute's website, www.gbhi.org, Dr Ojeahere expressed the hope to "establish integrated brain health and memory clinics in Nigerian communities that use digital platforms, contribute to global

research by expanding African dementia data, and develop policies that improve overall dementia management."

She noted that Nigeria's dementia landscape is shaped by poor awareness, cultural beliefs, stigma, and resource shortages. She, however, expressed her commitment to leverage technology, strategic partnerships, and community services to promote prevention, early detection and improved care.

On completion of her medical training at the College of Health Sciences, University of Ilorin, Dr Ojeahere obtained her Master degree in Public Health from the National Open University of Nigeria (NOUN) and earned the Fellowship of the West African College of Physicians following completion of her residency in Psychiatry. She is currently a consultant psychiatrist and researcher with Jos University Teaching Hospital (JUTH).

Her work spans global mental health, psychogeriatrics, bioethics, and digital mental health, focusing on underserved populations.

Representing a diverse community of over 300+ individuals from over 65 countries worldwide, the Atlantic Fellows at GBHI aim to promote brain health and dementia prevention, reduce stigma, and improve the quality of life of people with dementia.

UNILORIN graduate wins N.3m at PIC contest

n alumnus of the Department of Biomedical Engineering, Mr Habeeb Akinsola, has won a cash prize of N300, 000.00 after emerging second at the Policy and Innovation Centre (PIC) Gender and Inclusion Summit 2025 Pitchathon competition.

The contest was held penultimate Thursday (September 4, 2025), at the Policy and Innovation Centre, Abuja.

Mr Akinsola, who competed against over 400 other contestants, impressed judges in the Health category with "Abiyamo", a solar-powered infant incubator. He disclosed that the project, which marks the fourth award he has won with the innovation, was developed as his final year project in 2023.

According to him, it tackles preventable infant deaths in underserved communities by providing reliable neonatal care independent of grid electricity and has further strengthened his growing record of innovation.

He previously won the Hult Prize On Campus Programme, representing Nigeria in Nairobi, selected for the Project I2M Incubator Programme and Startup Grant Competition, and also took third place at the ABCHealth Xcelerator Pitch Programme.

"Abiyamo", which originated as his undergraduate project, continues to benefit from UNILORIN's partnerships.

Mr Akinsola's innovation has received advisory support and mentorship from Dr Suleiman also commended the young innovator, Abimbola Yahaya, a former Head of the



Department of Biomedical Engineering, and Abdulafeez Adeyemo, a Senior Technical Officer at the University of Ilorin Teaching Hospital (UITH).

The innovation, which also aligns with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals and has the potential to save countless infant lives across underserved communities, has its pilot programmes also scheduled to begin in Nigeria in the first quarter of 2027.

In his reaction, the Dean of the Faculty of Engineering and Technology, Prof. Joshua Olanrewaju Olaoye, praised Akinsola's resilience and impact, stating, "This award underscores the Faculty's role in nurturing talents who can compete globally. We are proud of Habeeb's contributions and are committed to supporting more students with groundbreaking ideas."

The Head, Department of Biomedical Engineering, Dr Sani Saminu, also commended the young innovator, saying, "Habeeb has brought pride to our Department. His project not only demonstrates technical excellence but also reflects the Department's commitment to producing graduates who can transform communities through innovation."

While commenting, Dr Yahaya, described Akinsola's achievement as "a testament to the power of research-driven innovation at UNILORIN," noting that "his success is a proof that when students combine creativity with academic rigour, their work can solve real societal problems."

In his remarks, Mr Akinsola expressed gratitude to the University and his mentors, describing the award as "a humbling recognition of years of hard work and persistence."

He added, "Abiyamo was born out of a desire to save lives, and each award reminds me that innovation must always serve humanity. I am grateful to UNILORIN for giving me the platform to dream and to my mentors for guiding me along the way."

Prof. Aremu, who has authored over 70 academic publications, shared his leadership experience, stating that "at the Kwara State College of Education, Oro, we have been able to sponsor staff for trainings, conferences, and workshops. Over 20 staff members attained their Ph.D. during my tenure. This is a proof that with purposeful leadership, human capital development can be achieved," he stated.

He also urged the new inductees not to see leadership as a matter of title alone. "Leadership has nothing to do with titles. Just because you have a Clevel title does not automatically make you a leader. In fact, you can be a leader in your place of worship, in your neighbourhood, in your family, all without a title," he said.

Prof. Aremu said that strategic leadership is the key to solving Nigeria's institutional and national challenges.

He said, "Countries do not recover from recession, deindustrialisation, or educational decline in weeks and months. It takes time and persistent effort, but we must have the appetite to take every positive step as soon as it is available. Strategic leadership is, therefore, the key for unlocking these challenges and restoring our institutions and our country to past glory."

Prof. Aremu commended ISMN for organising the induction, describing it as "a right step towards raising a new generation of leaders capable of repositioning institutions for sustainable growth."

Maiden Media Workshop: Egbewole hails UNILORIN NUJ

he Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has expressed profound satisfaction with the emerging dispositions of the institution's Chapel of the Nigeria Union of Journalists (NUJ), saying that the Chapel has become very active and vibrant.

Prof. Egbewole stated this last Tuesday (September 9, 2025) while speaking at the closing ceremony of a two-day maiden workshop organised by the Chapel at the Auditorium Basement.

The Professor of Jurispudence and International Law said that he was delighted that the Chapel organised the talkshop for its members and their colleagues from sister organisations.

Prof. Egbewole, who is the Vice President (West Africa) of the Association of African Universities (AAU), said that the workshop has undoubtedly announced the chapel as a critical player in the field of journalism in Nigeria with the potential of raising the flag of the University higher.

While expressing the hope that the "big ideas" generated at the workshop would impact positively on the practice of journalism on the campus, Prof. Egbewole said that he would also expect that the knowledge imparted would reflect positively on the production of the weekly UNILORIN Bulletin, the UNILORIN 89.3 FM and UNILORIN TV as well as on the institution's social media team for the University's alluring image to remain shining.

Earlier in his presentation, a veteran journalist, Mr AbdulRaheem Adebayo Adedoyin, warned journalists against over-reliance on Artificial Intelligence (AI) in the discharge of their professional responsibilities.

Mr Adedoyin, whose paper was delivered last Monday (September 8, 2025), explained that as good as AI is, no serious journalist should rely exclusively on it for information gathering, processing and dissemination.

The renowned journalist, who is a member of the Board of the International Press Institute, said that while journalists and news organisations must adapt AI as it has become inevitable in the contemporary media practice. The former Commissioner for Information in Kwara State, said that journalists must be very meticulous in the usage of AI so that they would not be misled by it. As he said, AI, just like other technological devices, is meant to guide humans and not to control them.

In the second paper delivered by a former Head, Department of Mass Communication, University of Ilorin, Dr Mahmud Abdulraheem, broadcasters and their managers were enjoined to always







ensure quality assurance in the information they serve the public in order to project and protect public sanity.

"Ethics in the Digital Age" was delivered last Tuesday (September 9, 2025), said that adherence to ethics is not an option as he explained that journalists who are exposed to quality home training would not find it difficult to adhere strictly to professional ethics. The renowned broadcaster, who is a former General Manager of the Kwara State Broadcasting Corporation (Radio Kwara), Ilorin, said that the preservation of quality assurance in media practice would not only enhance peace and development but also make journalists and their organisations standout among their peers.

While encouraging journalists to be familiar with the laws of the land in order to avoid committing infractions, Dr Abdulraheem enjoined journalists to be self-regularory as he advised them to always leave out any information that they are not sure of its veracity.

Also speaking, the Dean of the Faculty of Communication and Information Sciences, University of Ilorin, Prof. Saudat Salah Abdulbaqi, commended the UNILORIN Chapel of the NUJ for organising the workshop.

he University of Ilorin has revealed its top 10 most cited academics on Google Scholar.

Leading the list is an Associate Professor at the Department of Veterinary Public Health and Preventive Medicine, Dr Ismail Odetokun, with an impressive 11,826 citations.

Also listed are, Dr Afisu Basiru of the Department of Veterinary Physiology and Biochemistry, who has 11,755 citations; Prof. Olugbenga Odebode of the Department: of Neurosurgery with 11,073 citations; Dr Adewale Adeniyi of the Department of Chemical Engineering with 10,617 citations and Prof. Olugbenga Mokuolu of the Department of Paediatrics and Child Health, who has 9,033 citations.

Others are Prof. Musa Toyin Yakubu of the Department of Biochemistry with 7,734 citations; Prof. Adeyinka Tella of the Library and Information Science Department with 7,577 citations; Prof. Lukman Abdur-Rahman of the Department Paediatric Surgery, who has 6,964 citations; Prof.

Folahan Amoo Adekola of the Department of Chemistry with 6,942 citations and Prof. Kolawole Wasiu Wahab of the Department of Medicine with 6379 citations.



Lawal calls for purposeful education reforms


former Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic) of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Raheem Adebayo Lawal, has called for purposeful educational reforms as he cautioned Nigerians against equating literacy with education.

Prof. Lawal made the call last Thursday (September 11, 2025) while featuring on a radio programme organised by the National Association of Sea Dogs (NAS) as part of the 2025 International Literacy Day, themed "Promoting Literacy in the Digital Era: Bridging the Gap through Mass Literacy".

According to him, literacy must be understood as the foundation for continuous learning.

"It is after you learn to read that you can read to learn. You can be literate without being educated, but literacy enables education and lifelong learning," he explained.

The don warned that Nigeria faces a deeper crisis from what he described as "higher illiterates.", saying that, while "lower illiterates" are those who cannot read or write, "higher illiterates" are individuals who possess reading and writing ability but fail to use such skills for critical thinking, creativity, and problem-solving.

Prof. Lawal further said, "When literacy cannot be used to think critically and solve problems, then literacy is not functional," noting that such higher illiteracy can be found even among postgraduate students and in leadership circles.

He stressed that "the world shapes those who cannot read," adding that those cut off from functional literacy are easily misled.

Prof. Lawal further argued that Nigeria's repeated attempts at curriculum reform have produced little impact because they lacked clear direction.

"Our curriculum reviews have been

like two steps forward and one step backwards," he said, lamenting that the reforms have failed to provide a defined purpose for education.

He, therefore, called for deliberate and purposeful reform that aligns literacy and education with national goals.

Citing Singapore's transformation under Lee Kuan Yew, Prof. Lawal observed that the country's rise to first-world status within thirty years was possible because of clearly defined educational objectives.

"Singapore's model of 'education for thinking hands' was a deliberate focus on functionality and purpose," he explained, urging Nigeria to learn from that model.

The renowned educationist stressed that literacy should not be limited to English alone, pointing out that children who are literate in their indigenous languages can help transfer knowledge to their families and communities.

He also encouraged Nigerians to embrace the principle of "each one, teach one" as a means of spreading literacy at the grassroots.

Reflecting on the United Nations Sustainable Development Goal (SDG)-4, which promotes inclusive and equitable quality education, Prof. Lawal noted that literacy is a collective responsibility that requires coordinated efforts across different levels of society.

Alabi shares tips on communication skills

n a bid to empower young leaders with effective communication skills, Lan Assistant Director in the Directorate of Corporate Affairs, Mr. Oluwasegun Alabi, has shared valuable insights on effective communication and presentation skills at the JCI Kwara Protem Public Speaking Academy.

At an online lecture titled "Mastering the Lectern", penultimate weekend, Mr Alabi focused on helping participants overcome stage fright and deliver powerful presentations.

Mr Alabi, who is also the Protocol Officer to the Vice Chancellor, emphasised the importance of audience analysis, noting that understanding the needs of the audience is crucial to tailoring a speech effectively.

He also highlighted common errors to avoid in speech making and stressed the need for speakers to be sensitive to their audience's reactions.

Participants also learned about different types of speeches, navigating speech types, and modes of presentation to overcome stage fright.

The event, attended by members of JCI Kwara Protem led by its Presiding Officer, Raliat Kofoworola Oke, was aimed at equipping participants with the skills and confidence needed to excel in public speaking.

Let's change narrative on suicide - Mustapha

he Ag. Director of the Counselling and Human L Development Centre (UCHDC), University of Ilorin, Dr Mulikat L. A. Mustapha, has called for collective actions against suicide by breaking the silence, reducing stigma, and promoting hope.

Dr Mustapha made the call last Wednesday (September 10, 2025) in an interview with UNILORIN Bulletin on the commemoration of the 2025 World Suicide Prevention Day with the theme "Changing the Narrative on Suicide", which was observed globally.

Dr Mustapha, who is also an Associate Professor at the Department of Educational Guidance and Counselling, explained that the theme underscores the need for empathy, open dialogue, and systemic support in addressing suicide.

"Changing the narrative means moving from silence and stigma to compassion and support. Suicide is not

a moral failing but a cry for help. By telling stories of resilience and showing empathy, we can make it clear that hope is always possible," she said.

Highlighting the Nigerian context, Dr Mustapha expressed concern over the rising cases of suicide, particularly among

young people.

She said, "Mental health awareness is growing in Nigeria, but cultural taboos and stigma still prevent many from seeking help. Among our youths, academic pressure, unemployment, and social isolation are serious risk factors. We must break these barriers and encourage honest, nonjudgmental conversations about mental health."

Speaking on the role of UNILORIN, Dr Mustapha explained that the Counselling and Human Development Centre provides confidential counselling services, crisis intervention, peer support training, and awareness campaigns designed to empower students to look out for one another.

"Schools must prioritise mental health support as part of their core responsibility. Beyond academics, we must create safe spaces where students feel seen, heard, and supported," she noted.

Dr Mustapha also stressed the role of families and communities in suicide prevention.


"When judgement is replaced with compassion, more lives can be saved. Families must listen more, friends must check in on one another, and communities must provide safe spaces for people to open up. Sometimes, simply listening and showing care can make the difference between life and death," she emphasised.

On the way forward, she urged the government and stakeholders to strengthen suicide prevention efforts nationwide.

According to her, "Government must provide toll-free helplines, integrate counselling services in schools and workplaces, train frontline health workers to identify early signs of distress, and promote responsible media reporting. Suicide prevention is everyone's responsibility from health professionals to religious leaders, policymakers, and the media."

Reflecting on her counselling practice, Dr Mustapha reaffirmed that suicide is preventable.

"I have seen people emerge from very dark times and go on to find new meaning in life. Human beings are far more resilient than they often realise. Our strongest weapon against suicide is hope, and hope grows when people feel connected and supported," she concluded.



n Associate Professor at the Department of Chemical Engineering, University of Ilorin, Dr Adewale George Adeniyi, has emerged as the most ranked researcher from the University on Scopus (h-index) with 254 documents.

Dr Adeniyi is followed by Dr Joseph Bamidele Awotunde of the Department of Computer Science with 277 documents while Prof. Folahan Adekola of the Department of Chemistry emerged as the third most highly ranked researcher on Scopus with 162 documents as at last Thursday (September 11, 2025).

The list also includes with Prof. Musa Toyin Yakubu of the Department of Biochemistry, who has 104 contributions with Prof. Kolawole Wahab, who teaches at the Department of Medicine, credited with 127.

Others are Prof. Lukman Abdur-Rahman of the Department of Paediatric Surgery, who has 92; Dr Ismail Odetokun from the Department of Veterinary Public Health and Preventive Medicine with 96; Prof. Adenike Temidayo Oladiji of the Department of Biochemistry with 57 and Emeritus Professor Musbau Akanji, a former Vice Chancellor of the Federal University of Technology, Minna, who retired from the Department of Biochemistry, with 66 while Dr Olubunmi Atolani of the Department of Chemistry has 89.
