
The Summit, which was attended by chief executives of universities and policy makers from member-countries, was held between 6th and 9th October, 2025. (Contd. on page 3)

VCN, NVMA laud UNILORIN for upholding excellence in veterinary training

he Veterinary Council of Nigeria (VCN) and the Nigerian Veterinary Medical Association (NVMA) have commended the University of Ilorin for her firm commitment to excellence in veterinary education and for producing professionals who continue to make remarkable impacts within and outside the country as the University produces a new set of 33 new Veterinary doctors.

The two bodies gave the commendation last Monday (October 6, 2025), when their leaders visited the Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin ahead of their participation at the 7th Induction and Oath-Taking Ceremony for the 2024/2025 graduating class of the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine.

Prof. Egbewole added that sustainable development in the Global South must be knowledge-driven and collaboratively achieved as he said that the University of Ilorin would be particularly interested in joint research, staff and students exchanges, policy dialogue and technological transfer that can directly impact communities.

On the sideline of the Summit, the representative of the Vice Chancellor also held interactions with the Vice Chancellor of the Universiti Tecknologi Malaysia, Prof. Dr Mohammed Shafry Bin Mohammed Rahim in the course of which Letters of Intent for collaboration between the two Universities were also exchanged.

In his address, the Dean of the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, University of Ilorin, Prof. Saliu A. Ameen, charged the new veterinary doctors to uphold the virtues of compassion, integrity, and service to humanity as they embark on their professional journey.

The Dean described the occasion as a defining moment of transition from learning to service, urging the graduands to see their calling as one that safeguards not just animal health but the nation's food security and public wellbeing.

Prof. Ameen noted that the veterinary profession occupies a strategic place in national development, contributing immensely to public health, agricultural productivity, and biomedical advancement.

He lauded the unwavering support of the University management under the leadership of the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Egbewole, SAN, whose commitment, he said, has kept the Faculty's programmes nationally and internationally competitive.

The Guest Speaker, Dr Bala Mohammed, a specialist in small animal orthopedic surgery from the College of Veterinary Surgery, Nigeria, spoke on the significance of the One-Health approach.

Drawing from his experience, which included the performance of nearly 200 surgical procedures, including minimally invasive surgeries, Dr Mohammed emphasised the need for collaboration across medical disciplines, noting that animal and human health are deeply intertwined.

He reflected on his professional journey, recalling how his late mentor pushed him beyond conventional veterinary boundaries, exposing him to plastic surgery techniques and interdisciplinary learning at Shika.

Dr Mohammed further stressed that, with about 60% of emerging infectious diseases in humans originating from animals, the world must

embrace integrated health systems.

Citing global examples such as mass dog vaccination campaigns in Asia and improved pasture management in the Sahel, he underscored how veterinary expertise continues to shape public health outcomes.

The highlight of the event was the presentation of awards to Dr Faith Seun Ajani, who emerged best graduating student and received a cash prize of ₹300,000. She also bagged 10 different other awards, while Dr Karimot Abisola Babalola followed closely with five awards.

In attendance were the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Research, Technology and Innovation) Prof. Mukhtar Adeiza Etudaiye; the Registrar, Mr Mansur Adeleke Alfanla; the University Librarian, Prof. Kamaldeen Tunde Omopupa; the Bursar Mr Abiodun Lawal; and the immediate past Deputy Vice Chancellor (Management Services), Prof. S. F. Ambali, among others.





Unilorite wins AFCONE awardEqbewole rejoices

1983 alumnus of the Department of Physics, University of Ilorin, Prof. Sunday Jonah, has won the African Nuclear Energy Outstanding Performance award.

The award was conferred on Nigeria's leading Nuclear Energy Scientist by the African Commission on Nuclear Energy (AFCONE) recently in Pretoria, South Africa, during the 16th anniversary celebration of 'Pelindaba Treaty'. It was the first of its kind conferred on any African Nuclear Energy Scientist.

AFCONE, which was formed in 2009, is to the African Union what the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) is to the United Nations. It is the nuclear energy watchdog of the African Union Commission.

Prof. Jonah, who is also the Director of Ahmadu Bello University's Centre for Energy Research and Training (CERT), is the lead author of 117 Journal articles and co-author of 130 others. With the current citation of 1828 h-index of 22 and i-10 index of 64 on Google Scholar, Prof. Jonah has been recognised twice – in 2024 and 2025 at the Ahmadu University, Zaria, as one of its most cited authors.

This award-wining Unilorite would also be remembered for being the brain behind the design and

development of a Neutron Reflection Set Up for the determination of Hydrogen content and C+O/H in different materials, which is a project that was recognised as the best material in a 2010 Science Innovation Fair, and continues to be a vital tool for teaching neutron Physics.

Aside from the above, Prof. Jonah is also a contributor to the Oxford Handbook on Nuclear Security (2025) where his incisive and detailed perspective on the conversion of a Research Reactor from HEU to LEU in Nigeria was published, an achievement that earned him recognition and commendation of the Department of Energy of the National Nuclear Security Administration, Washington DC, in December, 2018.

For several years and in different capacities, Prof. Jonah also played frontline roles in the effective

utilisation of NIRR-1 at the Centre for Energy Research and Training, where, as the Director, from 2021 to date, his leadership provided a new momentum for the Centre's achievements of its mandate of research and education in nuclear Science and Technology.

Prof. Jonah is a winner of several outstanding awards including Outstanding Contributions Award by First Nigerian Universities Research and Development Fair.

A 2021 Senior Member of the Institute of Nuclear Materials Management, Prof. Jonah was recognised and awarded the Fellowship of the Nigerian Institute of Physics in 2013.

Reacting to the development, the Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, welcomed the award, saying that it is a good development as the honouree's alma mater celebrates its Golden jubilee.

In a statement signed by the University's Director of Corporate Affairs, Mr Kunle Akogun, the Vice Chancellor described the honouree as a pride to his alma mater.

Prof. Egbewole, who is also the Secretary-General of the Association of West African Universities (AWAU), expressed optimism that other alumni, staff and students of the University would continue to make the institution very proud.

Scholars advocate mentorship, leadership, ethical values in academia

Scholars from the Faculty of Education, University of Ilorin, have emphasised the need for mentorship, ethical conduct, and responsible leadership as the foundation of academic excellence and professional integrity in Nigerian universities.

The call was made last Tuesday (October 7, 2025) at the Faculty of Education Talk Shop held at its New Education Lecture Theatre.

In his presentation entitled "Mentorship and Allied Academic Leadership Functions in the University," a former Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic), University of Ilorin, Prof. 'Raheem Adebayo Lawal, underscored the vital role of mentorship in developing effective academic leaders.

He described mentorship as a lifelong relationship that enables experienced lecturers to guide younger ones towards professional competence and personal growth.

Recounting a personal encounter with a junior colleague who sought his mentorship, Prof. Lawal said the episode illustrated the power of guidance and influence. He noted that every young lecturer requires a mentor who can serve as a role-model, guide, and protector.

He explained that mentorship is both a professional and moral duty that promotes belonging, collaboration, and continuous learning within the academic community.

The Professor of English Language Education, who identified different models of mentorship, such as traditional, team, and group mentoring, urged Departments to adopt structures suited to their staff composition.

Prof. Lawal, who also served as Vice Chancellor of the University of Offa, described mentorship as the pinnacle of leadership in academia, preparing younger scholars to take on greater responsibilities.

He stressed that when junior lecturers are properly mentored, they become effective advisers and role models to their students.

Highlighting the importance of student advisement, Prof. Lawal noted that lecturers must help students make informed decisions about their academic progress and career goals.

He added that the Faculty is already working on a paper to ensure that the mentorship drive is institutionalised and sustained within the University system.

Prof. Lawal urged lecturers to show empathy, maintain regular communication with their students, and integrate technology to strengthen advisory relationships.

Presenting another paper, entitled "Upholding Ethics and Professional Conduct in Academia," Prof. Alfred Akinbo Adegoke of the Department of Guidance and Counselling urged university lecturers to uphold integrity, fairness, and accountability in the discharge of their academic responsibilities.

He described the University as a moral community committed to the pursuit of truth and the development of responsible citizens.

According to him, academics have two major responsibilities: to generate and safeguard reliable knowledge, and to educate future professionals with integrity and moral purpose.

Prof. Adegoke, who identified honesty, fairness, respect, and professional competence as the moral pillars of ethical conduct, warned that unethical practices such as plagiarism, data falsification, and abuse of power undermine public trust and the quality of scholarship.

The scholar called on universities to strengthen their codes of conduct and establish independent offices to oversee research integrity, staff discipline, and ethical compliance.

He further urged institutions to provide regular ethics training for lecturers and supervisors and to design transparent evaluation and supervision systems.

"Ethical behavior is shaped by everyday actions, leadership examples, and shared values within the university community," he said.

Prof. Adegoke also called on administrators to reward good conduct, promote open discussions about ethics, and involve students in integrity education.

While describing ethical leadership as a moral vocation rather than a legal obligation, Prof. Adegoke said, "We must renew our commitment to truth, fairness, respect, and service. The true scholar must have the courage to do what is right, even when it is difficult", he said.

Declaring the event open, the Vice Chancellor of the University, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole (SAN), represented by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Management Services), Prof. Adegboyega Adisa Fawole, commended the Faculty for organising an intellectually-stimulating and morally-significant programme.

He described the Talkshop as a timely initiative that aligns with the strategic vision of the University of producing graduates and scholars who are not only intellectually sound but also ethically upright.

Embrace Al for relevance, Abdulbaqi tasks staff, students

he Dean, Faculty of Communication and Information Sciences. University of Ilorin, Prof. Saudat Salah Abdulbagi, has encouraged staff members and students of the Faculty and the University at large to embrace Artificial Intelligence(AI) in all their academic and professional endeavours for them to remain relevant.

Prof. Abdulbaqi gave this advice last Tuesday (October 7, 2025) while speaking at the closing ceremony of a two-day workshop titled "AWS Cloud and Generative AI For Teaching and Research" at the Laboratory Room of the Faculty. The workshop was jointly organised by the Faculty and Arthurite Integrated.

The Dean, who is also a Council Member of the Nigerian Institute of Public Relations(NIPR), said that AI has become an indispensable phenomenon in contemporary life, particularly in the academic field.

Prof. Abdulbagi explained that

the fear that AI will displace humans as being circulated in some quarters, is unfounded, saying that it is only those who are indifferent to it that would be eventually displaced.

The scholar of Mass Communication said that the Faculty would organise more of such training for all to be conversant with AI and how it can be effectively and positively deployed.

Presenting a paper at the event, an Information Technology expert, Mr Goodluck Adiole, urged participants to ensure that they acquire and develop the ability to control AI, saying that they should never allow it to control them.

Mr Adiole said that users of AI should also learn how to converse and ask the machine the right questions to ensure that appropriate responses are provided.

He said that users must always converse with the AI in a desirable context, saying that the context in which questions are asked would determine the quality of responses to be generated.

The workshop attracted staff and students of the Faculty including a former Sub-Dean of the Faculty, Dr Amos Bajeh; an Associate Professor at the Department of Information Technology, Dr Rofiat Oyekunle and a Senior Lecturer at the Department of Mass Communication and Member, UNILORIN Bulletin Editorial Board, Dr Abdulkadir Oba Laaro, among others.

Be familiar with varsity's rules, Alawaye urges new students

On the value of extracurricular activities, Dr Alawaye pointed out that student organisations are crucial for developing the soft skills employers seek. He advised students to follow their passions and start with one or two clubs to avoid burnout while building meaningful networks and experiences.

"Your degree will get you the interview, but your soft skills leadership, teamwork, communication often get you the job. These are honed outside the classroom," he counseled.

Responding to a listener's question on confidentiality, Dr Alawaye firmly assured members of the university community that it is the cornerstone of counselling services, guiding students through reporting processes with their safety and consent as the top priority.

Dr Alawaye, therefore, called on students to be intentional in exploring all the opportunities the university offers, reminding them that the institution is structured for their holistic development and success.

"If we truly believe in the teachings of our religion, care and concern for citizens should be paramount," he emphasised, calling on government officials to make justice their guiding principle.

UNILORIN JAC urges FG to honour agreements

he Joint Action Committee (JAC), which comprises the Senior Staff Association of Nigerian Universities (SSANU) and the Non-Academic Staff Union of Educational and Associated Institutions (NASU), has urged the Federal Government to urgently address all pending welfare issues and pay withheld salaries in order to sustain the peaceful atmosphere currently pervading the nation's University system.

He explained that the Unions' grievances include the non-payment of withheld two-month salaries from the 2022 strike, failure to remit third-party deductions, and government's delay in paying arrears of the 25% and 35% salary increments approved for University workers.

"From 2009 to 2025, everything in this country has changed; food, transportation, energy, and hospital bills have all skyrocketed. Government must act and review our conditions of service," Comrade Falowo added.

Also speaking, the NASU Chairman, Comrade Ibraheem Zubair, expressed dissatisfaction with the method adopted in the sharing of the N50 billion released for non-teaching staff allowances, noting that only 20% was allocated to their Unions while some universities and inter-university centres were excluded entirely.

"We are demanding the release of our share of the №50 billion earned allowance and full payment of one-year arrears of salary increments," he said.

The Union leaders also urged the Federal Government to renegotiate the 2009 agreement, which they described as outdated and unreflective of current economic realities.

They further decried the hardship faced by retired members who have been unable to access their pension funds due to unremitted contributions, calling on the government to treat non-teaching staff with dignity as critical stakeholders in the university system.

The peaceful rally, which was held simultaneously across universities nationwide, ended with a renewed appeal to the Federal Government to honour its commitments and ensure lasting industrial harmony in Nigeria's tertiary education sector.


