

## Five years enough for VCs-Egbewole

he Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has said that a single term of five years is enough for Vice Chancellors of Nigerian universities to make their marks.

Prof. Egbewole stated this last Monday (October 20, 2025) while answering a reporter's question during a Press Briefing that heralded the activities marking the institution's 40th Convocation Ceremonies.

The Vice Chancellor said that five years is long enough for any Chief Executive of either a State or Federal University and even privately-owned ones to leave lasting legacies on the sand of time in their respective institutions. He said that anyone who could not make his marks within five years in office may not be able to make a remarkable difference even in a

prolonged tenure.

Prof. Egbewole, who has spent three years as the Chief Executive of the University, said that the responsibilities of the Office of Vice Chancellor are too demanding and energy-sapping for such a tenure to be extended for another term.

He said that he would be delighted to end his tenure and return to the warm embrace of his family after the completion of his tenure in 2027.

The Vice Chancellor appealed to his colleagues across the nation to maximally utilise the privileges entrusted on them and make do with one term, saying that those who worked hard would neither wish nor pray for a second term in office.

Speaking on other issues, the Vice Chancellor said that the University of Ilorin would continue to relate effectively with its staff members.

Prof. Egbewole said that fraternity with staff members and students of the University would ensure continuous industrial harmony that would facilitate the maintenance of its strict adherence to its academic calendar for the benefit of students and their parents and the nation at large.

President Tinubu, who was represented by the Vice Chancellor of the Federal University of Technology, Akure (FUTA), Prof. Temidayo Oladiji, commended the University on its stimulating record of discipline and academic excellence, describing it as a model for other institutions.

"As the University of Ilorin approaches its 50th anniversary, it continues to stand out as a centre of excellence. Nigeria must produce Nobel laureates, and I believe UNILORIN can lead that charge," the President stated.

President Tinubu also announced that the University had been chosen as one of the host centres for the National Universities Commission (NUC) Digital Innovation Hubs, which, he said, are designed to nurture creativity and entrepreneurship among students.

He said, "This hub will position Ilorin as a leading centre for innovation in Nigeria's knowledge economy."

The President also disclosed that UNILORIN is among 18 universities benefiting from a №110 billion national intervention fund to expand medical training facilities nationwide. He explained that the decision to suspend the creation of new tertiary institutions was a deliberate move to consolidate and strengthen the existing ones.

"We must prioritise quality over quantity. Adequate resources will, therefore, be channelled to existing institutions to enhance their capacity and impact," he stated.

President Tinubu further noted that earned allowances and part of the previously withheld salaries of academic.

and non-teaching staff had been paid, while a loan scheme for tertiary institution workers had been introduced to cushion economic pressures. "This initiative is a genuine empowerment effort, not a burden," he said.

Addressing the broader economic reforms, the President appealed for public understanding, assuring Nigerians that the temporary hardships being experienced were transitional.

He said, "I acknowledge the challenges Nigerians face today, but these are short-lived. The foundation we are laying will build a stronger and more inclusive economy."

He also urged alumni, individuals, and the private sector to complement government efforts in improving education, saying education is too important to be left solely to the government.

"The partnership of all stakeholders is vital in building a prosperous and knowledge-driven nation," he said.

The President congratulated the graduands and reminded them of the fact that their degrees represent a call to leadership and responsibility.

"Be creative, innovative, and resilient—the future belongs to you, and it is your generation that must transform Nigeria into a nation of our dreams," he declared.

Meanwhile, the Executive Secretary of the NUC, Prof. Abdullahi Ribadu, represented by Prof. AbduLateef Oladimeji, Vice Chancellor of Al-Hikmah University, Ilorin, commended the University of Ilorin for attracting more than №12 billion in research grants from both local and international partners over the last two years.

He said that it was stimulating that the University continues to demonstrate that with vision and commitment, world-class achievements are possible in the nation's University system.

On his part, the Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, described the 40th convocation ceremonies of the University as a milestone in the University's journey and urged the graduands to uphold the institution's values of integrity and discipline.

He said that at 50, the University has matured as he stated that the University is beginning another future, urging graduands to be deliberate in shaping their destinies.

He urged the graduands to run away from those who flaunt flamboyant and exotic lifestyle from money they can neither disclose nor explain its sources.

Mr Fashola, who also served as Governor of Lagos State between 2007 and 2015, said that the road to prosperity is often long, predictable and requires someone to prove himself not only by hardwork but also by character.

While declaring that there is no easy and fast money anywhere without consequences, Mr Fashola warned that consequences always lead to misery, regret and sometimes irredeemable damage.

The Convocation Lecturer also urged the graduands to discover and develop their innate and unique talents so that they can quickly transform to their best version.

He added that once they discovered their talents, navigating present and future challenges would be easy.

Mr Fashola also urged them to deploy social media appropriately, saying that social media should be used to reach people for causes, work and business or showcase whatever positive things they undertake.

While encouraging the graduands to use social media to advertise the positive part of their personalities and concerns, he warned them not to advertise

their body parts. He encouraged them not to use foul, abusive or hate language on social media as he warned that the internet will forever credit them with whatever they write or say.

In his address, the Pro-Chancellor and Chairman of the Governing Council of the University, Surv. Abiodun Jacob Aluko, said that the University has improved tremendously in service delivery.

Surv. Aluko commended the Federal Government for its investment on the University over the years as he also urged the graduands to join the team of alumni who are making the University proud in all areas of human endeavour.

The Governing Council Chairman, who is also a former Deputy Governor of Ekiti State, advised the graduands to ensure that the nation's investment on them is not wasted, saying that much in expected from them by their families, alma mater, the nation and the world at large.

In his address, titled 'The Man is the Style and the Style is the Man', the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, charged the graduands to become the embodiment of the University style.

Prof. Egbewole urged them to allow the University's mantra of Better By Far to become part of their identities wherever they find themselves as they go into the real world.

### Ajao hails UNILORIN's impact on medical education in Kwara State

he pioneer Provost of the College of Health Sciences, Kwara State University (KWASU), Malete, Prof. Salihu Moyosore Ajao, has acknowledged the impressive positive impacts of the University of Ilorin on the growth and development of medical and allied training and practise in Kwara State and beyond.

Prof. Ajao, who is also the immediate past Dean of the Faculty of Basic Medical Sciences, University of Ilorin, made this assertion last Monday (October 20, 2025) in a chat with UNILORIN Bulletin.

The renowned medical scholar observed that since 1977 when the UNILORIN Medical School was founded, the story has not been the same considering the calibre and number of medical doctors and trainers the University had produced who are exerting great influence on medical practice in Kwara and other neighbouring states and beyond.

Prof. Ajao said that most of those who have served as Chief Medical Directors of the University of Ilorin Teaching Hospital and Medical Directors of other Hospitals across Kwara State were trained at the University.

He also said that the establishment of Medical Colleges by sister universities in Kwara State such as KWASU, Thomas Adewunmi University (TAU), Oko; and Al-Hikmah University, Ilorin, were mostly facilitated by medical teachers from the University of Ilorin who

played one significant role or the other in bringing them to light.

The Provost added that it was a former Director of Academic Planning of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Sulyman Alege Kuranga who midwived the Committee that birthed the establishment of the KWASU and TAU Medical Schools.

He also recalled that the founding Provost of the College of Medicine of the Federal University of Health Sciences, Ila Orangun, Prof. Aishatu Ahmed Gobir, is a staff member of the University of Ilorin as he also noted that the pioneer Chief Medical Director of TAU Teaching Hospital in Omu-Aran, Prof. Ademola Popoola, is also a staff member of the Better By Far University.

Prof. Ajao, who also recalled the pioneering research of a former Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic), University of Ilorin, Emeritus Professor Luke Edungbola, which led to the eradication of guineawtorm disease in Nigeria and attracted global applause as well as the award-winning

rollback Malaria efforts of a former Director of the Centre for International Education, University of Ilorin, Prof. Olugbenga Ayodeji Mokuolu, as two of the several groundbreaking researches enabled by staff members of the University of Ilorin Medical School.

The former UNILORIN ASUU Chairman commended the Governor of Kwara State, Mallam AbdulRahman AbdulRazaq, CON, for his love and support for the expansion of medical education and practice in the state as he also hailed the Kwara State Commissioner for Health, Dr Aminat Ahmed El-Imam, who is a staff member of the University of Ilorin, for her impacts on the development of medical practice across the state.

Prof. Ajao added that the establishment of three additional medical schools in Kwara State would lead to the production of more medical practitioners who would help the state and humanity. He enjoined proprietors of those universities to ensure proper funding of the schools to enable them produce high quality medical manpower and greater access to quality health care and service delivery to the people. He said that their functional existence would reduce pressure on the University of Ilorin Medical School and the University of Ilorin Teaching Hospital.

He assured that the KWASU Medical School, which he currently runs, would not only be modelled after that of the University of Ilorin but would also produce outstanding medical doctors whose impacts would be felt across the globe.

## Ajimotokan bags NIMechE's Fellowship

he Head of the Department of Mechanical Engineering, University of Ilorin, Prof. Habeeb A. Ajimotokan, has been conferred with the prestigious Fellowship of the Nigerian Institution of Mechanical Engineers (NIMechE).

Prof. Ajimotokan was conferred with the Fellowship at the 38th NIMechE International Conference, Exhibition and Annual General Meeting, tagged EKO 2025, held in Lagos from October 14 to 16, 2025.

At the well-attended event, which brought together Mechanical Engineers, industry leaders, researchers, and policymakers from across the country and the diaspora, Prof. Ajimotokan was described by its organisers as "a visionary academic and mentor whose career bridges generations, disciplines, and continents."

The organisers added that Prof. Ajimotokan's election as a Fellow represents a significant
