The Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has again pleaded with the Kwara State Government to urgently rehabilitate the Abubakar Tafawa- Balewa Road, Ilorin. The road is the only link between the University and the city of Ilorin.

Prof. Egbewole made the plea last Monday (September 15) while responding to a question at the 62nd Special Meeting of the University Congregation held at the institution's Auditorium.

The Congregation consists of all the staff members of the University who possess a University degree.

The Vice Chancellor lamented the

UNILORIN partners NISS on security training

The University of Ilorin, through its Centre for Management and Leadership (CMLI), has entered into a strategic partnership with the National Institute for Security Studies (NISS), Abuja, towards organising a high-level training programme on Community Conflicts and Security Management.

The Ag. Director of CMLI, Dr Adeola Odebode, who represented the University at a meeting held in Abuja between 9th and 11th September, 2025, disclosed that the week-long training has been scheduled to hold between December 7 and 13, 2025.

Dr Odebode said, "This training is designed for top government functionaries, including State Governors and senior officials, and will be facilitated by both NISS and the University of Ilorin. While NISS will handle the security component, CMLI will take the lead on the community conflict aspect, ensuring a balanced and holistic approach to the training."

She thanked the Commandant of NISS, Mr J.O. Odama, for warmly receiving the University delegation as she commended the foresight of the University of Ilorin in initiating the programme.

Dr Odebode also expressed appreciation to the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, for his visionary leadership and support as he

He explained that the initiative aligns with his Administration's commitment to broadening the impact of research beyond the laboratory and into the marketplace, and consequently addressing societal challenges and contributing to national development.

The Vice Chancellor, who is equally the Vice President (West Africa) of the Association of African Universities (AAU), noted that the partnership is expected to strengthen commercialisation of the University's research outputs, provide greater visibility for the University patents, and enhance the impact of existing research.

Prof. Egbewole, who is also the Secretary-General of the Association of West Africa Universities (AWAU), said while NACHRED has recorded notable progress in research commercialisation has remained a challenge due to limited

collaborations. He added that the synergy with NASENI is anticipated to bridge this gap and turn research outcomes into practical solutions for the country.

He, therefore, advocated that the collaboration should extend beyond NACHRED to involve the entire university and to create wider opportunities for innovation, societal impact, and sustainable development.

Speaking earlier, the team lead and Deputy Director in NASENI's Engineering Infrastructure Department, Dr Emmanuel Ajani, expressed delight at the initiative, noting that NASENI has been monitoring Unilorin NACHRED's progress since its inception and is impressed by the Centre's determination to expand its research impact.

He added that the agency is eager to work closely with the University of Ilorin to transform ideas into innovations and make history by jointly driving technological advancement in Nigeria.

Dr Ajani further assured the management that NASENI would bring its experience, infrastructure, and expertise to bear in the collaboration, stressing that the agency is committed to supporting research centres that are ready to translate their work into practical outcomes for national development.

On her part, the Director of NACHRED, Prof. Omodele Abiodun Eletta, explained that the Centre is working to establish collaboration with NASENI, EMDI, and PEDI as part of its drive to scale up ongoing research efforts and move them towards commercialisation.

Prof. Eletta added that the collaboration aligns with NASENI's mandate and provides a unique opportunity for the University to leverage national infrastructure support in order to make its research outputs more impactful and widely accessible.

Prof. Egbewole recalled that the University had written a letter to the State Governor, Mallam AbdulRahman AbdulRazaq, CON, on the state of the road, adding that a delegation of the management of the University also met the Kwara State Commissioner of Works, Mr AbdulQawiy Olododo, on the need for the government to consider the repair of the failed portions of the road.

While noting that the government has enormous responsibilities, the Vice Chancellor

expressed the hope that the Kwara State Government would do something positive on the road before the commencement of the 40th Convocation Ceremonies of the University and the 50th anniversary of the establishment of the institution that are expected to draw huge traffic to the University. The two ceremonies hold in October and November, 2025, respectively.

The Vice Chancellor promised that the University would continue to draw the attention of the Kwara State Government to the road as there is certainly no alternative to government intervention.

Speaking on the road around the University's Staff Residential Quarters, Prof. Egbewole said that the management was working towards the rehabilitation of the road based on its capacity.

The meeting was attended by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic), Prof. Moji Taibat Bakare-Odunola; the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Research, Technology and Innovation), Prof. Muhtar Etudaiye; the Registrar, Mr Mansur Adeleke Alfanla; the University Librarian, Prof. Kamaldeen Tunde Omopupa and other members of the University Congregation.

The Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has enjoined both the academic and non-teaching staff of the University to assist the management in ensuring that students of the University adhere strictly to its dress code.

Prof. Egbewole made the appeal last Monday (September 15, 2025) while addressing the 62nd special meeting of the University Congregation held at the University Auditorium.

The Vice Chancellor explained that all hands must be on deck to ensure that students of the University dress decently, saying that it is also the responsibility of every staff to instill discipline in the students.

Prof. Egbewole added that students are not just in the University to receive degrees but they are also enrolled to be tutored on how they would become responsible citizens.

While saying that the

University has a set of rules guiding conducts, the Vice Chancellor emphasised the fact that the full participation of every staff would reduce the tendencies of students to violate the rules.

Prof. Egbewole added that apart from quality learning and impactful research, the University is also renowned for decency among its students.

He reminded students of the University that decent dressing is an

important feature of human civilisation and that individuals would be addressed the way they are dressed.

Prof. Egbewole urged the various Faculties and Departments to activate their committees on dress code, saying that everybody must work together to achieve the aspiration of ensuring that the University maintains its leadership.

The Vice Chancellor said that discipline is important and that all should avoid being accused of blackmail and intimidation while enforcing discipline.

Responding to another question, the Vice Chancellor announced that arrangements were underway to honour some of those who contributed to the greatness of the University by renaming some structures and monuments after them.

He explained that the proposal is currently awaiting the approval of the University Governing Council as he expressed the hope that the renaming would take place as part of the upcoming 50th anniversary of the University.

UNILORIN operates smart system - Bakare-Odunola

The University of Ilorin has emphasised its commitment to leveraging technology in its operations, with the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic), Prof. Moji Taibat Bakare-Odunola, stating that the institution's processes, from registration to graduation, are now automated.

Prof. Bakare-Odunola, who disclosed this in an interview on *UNILORIN 89.3FM* last Wednesday (September 17, 2025), added that both fresh and returning students would resume on September 29, 2025, with registration commencing immediately.

According to her, the University awards certificates in both character and learning, stressing that punctuality, discipline, and modesty are essential values that students must uphold.

The Deputy Vice Chancellor noted that the Senate had approved the results of returning students, which are now available on their portals. She

added that the academic calendar for the new session is also ready.

Prof. Bakare-Odunola stated that registration for the new session will run from September 29 to October 10, 2025, while late registration will take place from October 13 to 17, 2025. Lectures are scheduled to commence on October 20, 2025.

She advised fresh students to

complete their registration, including the clinic registration, to enable the management provide adequate care. She also urged students who suspended their studies to write to the management for activation through their various Faculties.

Other key highlights include the penultimate screening, which will run from September 29 to October 9, 2025, for the first group, and October 10 to 30, 2025, for the second group.

The University's commitment to curriculum review and staff development was also highlighted, with Prof. Bakare-Odunola noting that staff members attend workshops, seminars, and trainings to stay current.

Students facing financial challenges are encouraged to explore the NELFUND opportunity, while those who wish to suspend their studies are advised to do so immediately after registration closes.

The don restated that the University frowns at indecent dressing, while advising students to adhere strictly to the dress code.



VC pledges support for postgraduate students

The Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has pledged to strengthen postgraduate education in the institution by linking students with grant agencies and scholarship bodies.

Prof. Egbewole made the pledge last Tuesday (September 16, 2025) when he received the new members of the Executive Committee of the Postgraduate Students Association (POGSASS) of the University during a familiarisation visit to his office.

The Vice Chancellor announced that the University's Centre for Research Development and In-House Training (CREDIT) and Centre for International Education (CIE) would be tasked with identifying potential funding bodies to support postgraduate programmes, adding that efforts would also be made to connect postgraduate students with colleagues across disciplines who already have access to research grants, particularly to engage them as research assistants for career advancement.

While stating that postgraduate students are vital members of the University research community, given the diversity of their academic interests and their potential contributions to societal development, the Vice Chancellor encouraged them to take advantage of available resources to improve their academic performance.

Prof. Egbewole further urged the students to deliberately build their research profiles by registering on platforms such as ResearchGate, Google Scholar, and LinkedIn, while ensuring they are linked to the University's

identity on these platforms. He stressed that the students represent the future of the University and assured them of his commitment to supporting their academic pursuits.

On conference opportunities, the Vice Chancellor announced that postgraduate students would be supported more to attend academic gatherings. He explained that while some conferences come at no cost or with discounted student rates, postgraduate students must show interest early, prepare abstracts ahead of deadlines, and seize available opportunities. He added that sponsoring students for conferences not only benefits them but also enhances the reputation of the University.

While addressing issues of school charges, Prof. Egbewole noted that despite prevailing economic challenges, the University fees remain comparatively lower than those of other federal institutions. He maintained that the charges are designed to ensure postgraduate programmes run efficiently without unnecessary delays in completion.

The Vice Chancellor, however, reaffirmed that the 60/40 payment arrangement remains in place, but reminded students that the balance must be settled within the session, as deferred payments to subsequent sessions would not be accepted. He urged the POGSASS executive to encourage their members to honour this agreement, stressing that the fee regime is highly economical when weighed against the value being added to postgraduate training at the University.

Prof. Egbewole expressed optimism about building a positive working relationship with the new student leadership and assured them that management would continue to address their concerns with empathy and

commitment.

Earlier in his remarks, the President of POGSASS, Comrade Hakeem Kurunga, appealed to the Vice Chancellor and the University administration to review school charges for postgraduate students in the light of the country's current economic realities.

He explained that the removal of fuel subsidy had worsened living conditions for many Nigerians, including postgraduate students who are largely self-sponsored. According to him, a majority of the students are finding it increasingly difficult to make ends meet while balancing the demands of their studies.

Comrade Kurunga, who observed that postgraduate education is research-intensive and requires significant financial investment, appealed to the University management to deliberately include postgraduate students in any scholarship schemes provided within the institution. He stated that many scholarship opportunities are targeted at undergraduates, leaving postgraduate students without adequate external support.

The POGSASS President also requested that postgraduate students be given greater access to conference sponsorship, especially those with relevant academic papers to present. He stressed that this is particularly important for PhD candidates, who are required to publish research articles before being eligible for graduation.

The POGSASS President assured the University management of the association's readiness to continue to collaborate, while urging that the concerns raised be given urgent and sympathetic consideration.

Be moderate in food consumption, Akanji urges elderly persons

An Emeritus Professor of Biochemistry at the University of Ilorin, Musibau Adewunmi Akanji, has encouraged Nigerians, particularly those who have attained the age of 50 and above, to always be mindful of what they eat and their dispositions to life generally in order for them to live longer and in sound health.

Prof. Akanji, who is also a former Vice Chancellor of the Federal University of Technology, Minna, gave this advice penultimate Friday (September 12, 2025) in his weekly exhortation shared on social media platforms, a copy of which was sighted by *UNILORIN Bulletin*.

The renowned scientist explained that as people advance in age they can "no longer enjoy the luxuries of life."

Prof. Akanji, who is also the pioneer Vice Chancellor of Al-Hikmah University, Ilorin, urged members of the ageing population to ensure a deliberate reduction in protein intake to avoid the production of excess acid.

He also urged them to reduce the quantity of carbohydrates they eat

because their body system can no longer store excess sugar due to reduction or ineffectiveness of insulin.

Prof. Akanji, who retired from the Department of Biochemistry, University of Ilorin, also urged the elderly ones to reduce the intake of fats and eggs because of the thickening of blood vessels and therefore fear of the onset of atherosclerosis, which often leads to hypertension.

He also implored them to either put a stop to the consumption of 'soft'

drinks or reduce their intake because their body system can no longer metabolise the additives.

He added that they should cultivate the habit of walking and reduce the period they sit down in order to reduce the tendency of joint pains and for other health reasons.

Prof. Akanji also urged the elderly to reduce travelling over long distances because of the weakness of lungs or reduction in competence of the erythrocyte to transport oxygen to remote areas of the body.

The former Vice Chancellor also discouraged them from the accumulation of wealth, particularly either through unreasonable or illegal means while there are numerous people around them who could not even afford a decent balanced meal. He said that we should always show kindness to the needy in your surroundings so that we may also be entitled to divine Allah's mercies.

He enjoined all to take advantage of the lessons derivable from happenings around them on a daily basis for them to live a life worthy of emulation.

He disclosed that a renowned businessman and President of the Dangote Organisation, Alhaji Aliko Dangote, GCON, has volunteered to construct the hostel at a cost of ₦1.1 Billion on behalf of the Mosque Committee.

Alhaji AbdulGafar stated this penultimate Sunday (September 14, 2025) while addressing a press conference at the women's wing of the Mosque.

The Chairman, who expressed the gratitude of the Emir and people of Ilorin Emirate to the renowned businessman, said that the University was chosen because it has the largest population of students in the state as he said that the University has kept on attracting more students from all over Nigeria and beyond.

Alhaji AbdulGafar, who is also the Danmadami of Ilorin and a former Head of Service and Secretary to the

Kwara State Government, said that the location of the University within a sprawling urban centre also encouraged the decision.

He equally said that the peace of the University also makes it attractive to investors, particularly in the building of commercial residential outlets for its students.

The Chairman, who thanked the authorities of the University for welcoming the

desire of the Committee and granting it a piece of land to transform the dream into reality, said that the project is expected to be completed within a year.

Egbewole reaffirms UNILORIN's commitment to SIMI partnership

The Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has reaffirmed that the institution will put all necessary measures in place to strengthen and nurture its relationship with the Strategic Intelligence Management Institute (SIMI), an arm of the National Intelligence Agency (NIA).

Prof. Egbewole gave this assurance last Tuesday (September 16, 2025) while receiving a team of Directors from SIMI, who visited the University to explore pathways for their graduates to pursue higher professional degrees in critical fields relevant to their work. The SIMI delegation, led by the Director of Studies, Amb. Gbara Awane, also included the Director of Liaison Services, Amb. Nuru M. Habib; and the Director of Research, Amb. Alex Oriaku.

The Vice Chancellor described the visit as a demonstration of SIMI's commitment to fulfilling its mandate, saying that the establishment of the Agency has helped bridge a major gap in the nation's intelligence sector.

The Professor of Jurisprudence and International Law explained that while much attention had previously been placed on the operational aspects of intelligence gathering and tracking, the academic input was often overlooked.

He, however, expressed confidence that the University would provide the intellectual backing needed to complement national security efforts. According to him, the collaboration will

not only strengthen SIMI's capacity but it will also allow the University to showcase some of its innovative research ideas and deepen its existing relationships with security agencies.

Speaking earlier, the leader of the delegation and Director of Studies at SIMI, Amb. Gbara Awane, said that the Institute which is domiciled within the NIA to serve the entire security and intelligence community, is seeking partnerships with University of Ilorin to create pathways for its graduates to pursue advanced professional degrees in areas critical to their work.

Amb. Awane expressed optimism that University of Ilorin's existing academic programmes could be leveraged to add value to Nigeria's intelligence system, particularly in the integration of research-based evidence into national decision-making.

The SIMI Director of Studies explained that the institute was inaugurated by the Federal Government in January 2025 to train senior intelligence and security officers, particularly those at the rank of Deputy Directors.

He stated that the central mandate of SIMI is to empower participants with the knowledge and skills required to generate the strategic insights and foresight Nigerian leaders need to navigate the complexities of the modern world. According to him, the government must constantly be aware of developments across the globe in order to manage emerging challenges and seize new opportunities.

Amb. Awane added that the

institute was also designed to foster a culture of intelligence-driven policymaking in Nigeria, stressing that the time had come for public policies to be rooted in empirical evidence. This, he said, informed the decision to enroll senior officers for the programme and to expose them to rigorous academic, professional, and leadership training that would prepare them for higher responsibilities, including the possibility of heading national agencies in the future.

The Director of Studies affirmed SIMI's readiness to work closely with the University to review and align programmes that would support the nation's security and intelligence goals.

Joining the Vice Chancellor to receive the team were the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic), Prof. Moji Taibat Bakare-Odunola; the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Research, Technology and Innovation), Prof. Muhtar Adeiza Etudaiye; and the University Registrar, Mr Mansur Adeleke Alfa.

Others were the Directors of the Centre for Research Development and In-House Training (CREDIT), Prof. Abdulkarim Oloyede; Centre for Peace and Strategic Studies (CPSS), Prof. Abdul-Jelil Gbemisola Animasawun; Centre for Gender Studies (CGS), Prof. Patricia F. Omojasola; Centre for Cyber Security and Sustainable Development (CCSD), Dr Olawoyin Lukman, Centre for Management and Leadership Ilorin, Dr Odebo A. Adeola; and Institute for Legislative Studies, Prof. Ibrahim Imam.



IoE students tasked on discipline, integrity, academic excellence

Newly admitted sandwich students of the Institute of Education, University of Ilorin, have been urged to embrace discipline, integrity, time management, and responsibility as they begin their academic journey at the institution.

This call was made penultimate Saturday (September 13, 2025) during the Sandwich Students' Orientation Programme held at the Institute's Main Hall, where senior University officials counselled the students on the expectations, culture, and values of the institution.

In his keynote address, the Ag. Dean of Student Affairs, Dr Alex Akanmu, reminded the students that "there is a deal in the deal" between them and the University, stressing that academic success must be built on character and self-control.

Dr Akanmu urged the students to shun vices such as examination malpractice, drug abuse, violent conduct, and indecent dressing.

"Freedom comes with restrictions. If you want the degree, avoid the anger that is in danger," he said, warning that students who neglect discipline risk expulsion.

Dr Akanmu also narrated past cases of students dismissed for involvement in illegal parties, theft, and substance abuse, stressing that the University would not hesitate to enforce its rules.

The Dean, who further disclosed that a new Student Handbook of Information and Regulations, which introduces fresh provisions covering misuse of social media, refusal to carry identity cards, and misconduct during orientation and matriculation ceremonies, will soon take effect.

Dr Akanmu said, "There are two ways. It's either you are self-disciplined, or we give you institutional discipline. The choice is yours."

In his speech, the Registrar, Mr

Mansur Adeleke Alfanla, represented by a Deputy Registrar, Mr John Ayedun, lauded the Institute's contributions to academic excellence and praised the Director for his commitment to discipline, transparency, and human relations.

He noted that the Director of the Institute, Prof. Abdulraheem Yusuf, had distinguished himself as a mentor and administrator whose humility continues to inspire both staff and students.

In her paper, entitled "Toxic Habits, Time Management, and Academic Integrity," the Deputy Director of the Institute, Dr Hafsat Alabi, stressed that effective planning and consistency were the hallmarks of successful students.

She warned the students against time wasting, poor study habits, and examination malpractice, describing integrity as honesty, trust, fairness, and responsibility.

"Your intelligence is not enough; your attitude matters. Be a good ambassador of the University both academically and morally," she advised.

Also addressing the gathering, the Director of the Computer-Based Test (CBT) Centre, Prof. Kamilu Rauf, challenged the sandwich students to remain focused until graduation.

In an engaging interaction, Prof. Rauf asked the students to visualise their convocation ceremony and commit themselves to the academic journey ahead.

He asked, "Is it possible that I see you on graduation day? If you know I will see you, can you stand up for me?"

The CBT Director reminded the students that their admission into the University of Ilorin was not just a privilege but a call to excellence.

"You are adults and professionals. Carry yourself with dignity. Uphold integrity in all academic activities. Let your work reflect honesty and diligence," Prof. Rauf stressed.

Earlier, the Director of the Institute of Education, Prof. Abdulraheem Yusuf, who welcomed the sandwich students, described their admission as both an opportunity and a responsibility.

He acknowledged the presence of top University administrators and staff, including the incoming Students' Representative Council Speaker, urging the students to take pride in belonging to the "Better by Far" University.

"Anywhere you are introducing yourself, make it a point of duty for people to always recognise that you are a student of the University of Ilorin," he said.

Prof. Yusuf further cautioned the students that the sandwich programme is short and demanding, requiring sacrifice and resilience.

"At times, the workload may feel heavy, but those who stay focused and dedicated will surely reap the fruits of their labour," he said.

The Director tasked the students to attend lectures punctually, manage time effectively, respect colleagues and staff, and aim for academic excellence.

Other dignitaries at the event included the Secretary to the Institute of Education, and Deputy Registrar, Mr Toyin Bamgboye; representatives of the University Librarian; officials of the Security Unit, as well as several staff and student leaders, among others.

The event, which was held in a serene atmosphere, was described by some of the students as enlightening, inspiring, and well-timed, providing them with a clear understanding of the University's rules, culture, and expectations.

UNILORIN trains 70 senior staff, stakeholders on procurement standards
