Don't japa, Egbewole urges new Optometry inductees

he Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has appealed to newly inducted optometrists produced by the institution to resist the growing urge to leave the country, noting that Nigerians need their professional expertise now more than ever.

Prof. Egbewole cautioned them against prioritising financial gains over service, stressing that the country requires their skills to strengthen the health sector.

The Vice Chancellor commended parents and guardians for supporting their children throughout their academic journey, acknowledging their sacrifices and prayers that contributed to the success celebrated at the ceremony.

Meanwhile, the Registrar and Chief Executive Officer of the Optometrists and Dispensing Opticians Registration Board of Nigeria (ODORBN), Dr Obinna Edwin Awiaka, advised the newly inducted optometrists from the University of Ilorin to place professional knowledge above the pursuit of financial gains as they begin their careers.

Legislature sustains Nigeria's democracy- Jibrin

According to him, through its core mandates of lawmaking, oversight, representation, and budgetary authority, the National Assembly and state legislatures have shaped the country's democratic trajectory and ensured the protection of the rule of law.

He noted that the legislature remains indispensable in checking executive excesses, promoting accountability, and strengthening public institutions.

Senator Jibrin, who represents Kano North at the Senate, acknowledged that despite progress recorded over the last 25 years, several structural and institutional constraints still impede legislative effectiveness.

He stressed that deepening democratic governance will require sustained reforms aimed at enhancing legislative independence and capacity.

He outlined key reforms necessary for strengthening the legislature, including full financial autonomy for legislative bodies, strengthening committee systems, improving access to research and policy analysis, and promoting open parliament initiatives such as livestreaming plenary sessions and publishing committee reports for public scrutiny.

The Deputy Senate President further called for the reinforcement of ethical standards, deeper engagement between the legislature, civil society, and the academic community, as well as constitutional and electoral reforms that will protect legislative powers and promote functional local government administration.

Declaring the Public Lecture open, the Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, said that the Lecture was timely and significant, noting that discussions on strengthening democratic governance could not have come at a better moment in Nigeria's political development.

Speaking through the Deputy



Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Prof. Moji Taibat Bakare-Odunola, Prof. Egbewole explained that universities have a critical responsibility to provide platforms for informed dialogue on national issues, particularly those that shape governance, institutional stability, and civic participation.

While affirming that the University of Ilorin remains committed to fostering such engagements as part of its mandate to contribute meaningfully to national development, the Vice Chancellor commended the Department of Political Science for sustaining the tempo of intellectual discourse through its Distinguished Personality Lecture series.

According to him, the Department has consistently demonstrated leadership in presenting lectures that address pressing and emerging national issues and in hosting eminent personalities whose insights contribute to public understanding.

Prof. Egbewole also noted that the choice of Senator Jibrin as the speaker was fitting, describing him as a figure whose stature aligns with the importance of the theme of the event.

He expressed confidence that the Lecture would enrich students' understanding and broaden public discourse on the role of the legislature in democratic consolidation.

In his welcome address, the

Head of the Department of Political Science, Dr Abdulkareem Jimoh Edun, described the Distinguished Personality Lecture as a vital platform for intellectual engagement between academia and public office holders.

Dr Edun noted that the Lecture provides students and scholars with an opportunity to bridge theoretical knowledge with practical governance realities, especially at a time when Nigeria faces multifaceted political, economic, and security challenges.

The don, who stated that the Distinguished Personality Lecture series serves as a unique avenue for robust institutional dialogue and national reflection, commended Senator Jibrin for being a distinguished legislator and statesman whose contributions to national development, institutional reforms, and youth empowerment align with the leadership ideals the Department aims to showcase to its students. reaffirmed the Department's commitment to promoting political education, legislative literacy, and civic consciousness, adding that hosting the Deputy Senate President underscored the dedication of the University to academic excellence, national visibility, and sustained relevance in national discourse.

Prof. Adekeye, who is the Editorin-Chief of Ilorin Journal of Business and Social Sciences, expressed delight with the fact that over ten women are currently Managing Directors of various banks and financial institutions in the country, a development, which he said, is a remarkable improvement compared with previous developments.

While she said that the University of Ilorin has been doing very well in ensuring that women in its services are not denied their rights and privileges, Prof. Adekeye said that the University currently has no fewer than 76 Professors across various academic Departments.

The don also noted that the University of Ilorin currently has three of her female Professors who are currently serving as Vice Chancellors in some Nigerian universities and beyond.

Prof. Adekeye said that this trend would improve and more women would attain eminence in life if they fight barriers such as poor level of education, low self-esteem, and time management that may be militating against their aspirations and motive for success.

Prof. Adekeye, who is a former Acting Head of the Department of Criminology and Security Studies, University of Ilorin, said that this can only be achieved through proper education, training, and mentoring that would assist individuals to reach the top of their careers or achieve success in their chosen fields.

The Inaugural Lecturer said that all organisations or work settings should do away with such cultures as negative working environment, gender discrimination, biased corporate policies, and leadership style that are detrimental to the advancement of women in the organisations.

She said that every organisation



must give room for a work-balance environment that will allow women to perform their responsibilities at home and

Prof. Adekeye also encouraged the Federal Government to encourage female education, especially in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics, because access to education, especially in those areas, will improve opportunities for girls and close the gap in higher education enrolment.

She also said that there should be conscious efforts by all members of the society to reduce all the obnoxious norms under the patriarchy system in African countries.

She said that deliberate efforts should be made to eradicate gender-based violence and harmful traditional practices such as genital mutilation, child marriage, and widow inheritance.

Prof. Adekeye also called on the Federal, State, and Local Government Councils to implement the 35% affirmative action for Nigerian women like their counterparts in other African countries like Rwanda and South Africa.

This, she hoped, would ensure more women participation in politics. She encouraged women to be focused and determined as she said that there is no limit to which they can go in any field of their choice.

VC charges new physiotherapists to uphold professional excellence

He noted that their training at the University of Ilorin had equipped them with the skills and character required to excel both locally and globally.

In his welcome address, the Provost of the College of Health Sciences, University of Ilorin, Prof. Biodun Alabi Sulyman, congratulated the 63 newly inducted physiotherapists and urged them to step confidently into their professional journey with diligence, versatility, and an unwavering commitment to excellence.

Prof. Alabi noted that they represent only the second cohort of physiotherapy graduates produced by the College, a testament to the rapid progress and rising profile of the programme.

He described the induction as the beginning of an exciting yet demanding career path that requires not just academic knowledge, but also refined clinical skills, mature professional attitudes, and adaptive strategies suitable for today's fast-paced and ever-evolving healthcare landscape.

The Provost reminded the inductees that physiotherapy is a vital component of modern healthcare delivery, saying that society looks up to them as competent practitioners capable of assessing, diagnosing, planning, and implementing rehabilitative programmes tailored to improve or restore human motor functions.

While highlighting the wide range of therapeutic techniques and interventions within the physiotherapy profession, which include prescribed exercises, ultrasound, heat therapy, laser therapy, manipulation, as well as programmes designed for screening and preventing physical disorders, the Provost stressed that beyond these interventions, physiotherapists are professionally mandated to offer expert consultations within their scope, identify when patients require referral to other health professionals, evaluate treatment outcomes, and guide clients in appropriate self-management practices.

He encouraged the inductees to uphold professionalism, broaden their competencies, and contribute meaningfully to improving healthcare delivery in Nigeria and beyond.

He reminded them that physiotherapists are regarded as problem-solvers in the healthcare system, and their success will depend on how well they prioritise meeting the needs of their patients and communities.

While explaining that the future of physiotherapy lies in knowledge expansion, innovation, and adaptability, the guest lecturer encouraged the inductees to take advantage of the vast resources available on the internet to deepen their expertise, keep up with global best practices, and stay informed about emerging developments in the field.

According to him, modern physiotherapy practice demands lifelong learning, and those who fail to continuously upgrade their skills risk becoming obsolete in a rapidly evolving healthcare landscape.

Prof. Onigbinde, who is the Dean of the Faculty of Medical Rehabilitation, University of Medical Sciences, Ondo, also stressed the importance of mentorship as a core hallmark of professionalism.

He urged the new practitioners to not only seek mentors but to consciously mentor others as they progress in their careers, saying that mentorship helps build confidence, strengthen clinical competence, and sustain the profession across generations.

he Director of the Physical Planning Unit, University of Ilorin, Mr Abdulrahaman Toyin Jimoh, has described the newly commissioned JAMB Merit Award Hostel in the University as a symbolic project that would boost student accommodation on campus.

Mr Jimoh stated this last Wednesday, (December 3, 2025), while speaking during the handing over of the project held at the project site. "The provision of the hostel was based on a merit award, considering the University of Ilorin as the most sought-after university, in terms of academic excellence and stability in academic activities, paved the way for the realisation of this symbolic project on our campus," he said.

The Director thanked the management of the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) headed by a former Vice Chancellor of the University, Prof. Emeritus Is-haq Oloyede, for facilitating this project. He said that the project would encourage more collaborations between the University and JAMB for mutual benefits.

The Director commended the contractor, Ayeloja Engineering Limited, for a good job welldone, describing him as a very passionate and committed man.

M Jimoh assured the contractor that the use of the hostel will be test-run f r o m December 2025 to June 2026, and in



July during the rainy season, to confirm if there are any leakages in any room of the hostel. He stated that the contractor will be responsible for restoration if any issues arise.

He warned the students against using heavy equipment that could trigger electrical sparking and tampering with any electrical fault detected. Instead, they should report to the Dean of Students, who would call the contractor for necessary action.

In his remarks, the Dean of Student Affairs, Dr. Alex Morenikeji Akanmu, who was represented by a Sub-Dean, Dr. Oluwatosin B. Igbayiloye, thanked JAMB for the provision of the project, which, he said came at the right time, particularly now that the students have just resumed. This, she said, would help address accommodation issues on campus, stressing that it is not just a room but self-contained accommodations that are satisfactory.

"The provision of the solar panel, pump machine, fire extinguishers, with this magnificent building, the management of the University under the leadership of the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, thanked Emeritus Prof. Is-haq Oloyede, whom Allah has used to get this done," he said.

He stressed that this standard will encourage others to partner with the University and ease accommodation problems on campus. The Dean assured the University that the project will be well managed and the students would make proper use of it.

Dr Afolabi, who also served as the pioneer Director of the ECOWAS Community Computer Centre, Lome, Togo, from 1989 to 2010, and National President of the Omupo Descendants Union(OMU), was celebrated for his extensive professional achievements.

Speaking on the development, Dr Afolabi expressed gratitude to the Nigeria Computer Society for the recognition, describing the award as an honour for decades of humble service to the IT profession in Nigeria and West Africa.

UNILORIN experts lead national call for action at AMR prevention summit

Register and the University of Illorin have raised strong concerns over the rising threat of Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR) in Nigeria, calling for urgent reforms in agricultural, pharmaceutical, veterinary, and public health practices.

The submission was made on Wednesday (November 19, 2025) at the Anti-Microbial Resistance Prevention Summit held at the University Auditorium.

The summit was organised by the AMR Club, SDGs Club, Planetary Health Club, and Students Livestock Estate Club in partnership with the Thriving Youth Leadership Network, founded and facilitated by Gobir Ibrahim Musa, an alumnus of the University.

In her submission, the immediate past Dean of Agriculture, Prof. Oluyemisi B. Fawole, warned that Nigeria's food system is increasingly endangered as antibiotic residues continue to damage soil health. She said many farmers rely excessively on antibiotics, which accumulate in the soil and promote the emergence of resistant microorganisms, eventually finding their way into food chains.

She stressed that sustainable agricultural practices such as crop rotation, composting, bio-fertilizers, integrated pest management, and improved livestock hygiene remain the most reliable approach to reducing antibiotic dependence. She urged universities, especially UNILORIN, to invest more in soil microbiology laboratories and surveillance systems to strengthen the country's food safety framework.

Also speaking, Dr AbdulMalik Aliyu, who is the Head of Pharmaceutical Microbiology and Biotechnology at the University, described antibiotic misuse as the primary driver of resistance. He said improper use, such as incomplete dosage, sharing drugs, or using leftover antibiotics gives bacteria the opportunity to mutate.

He insisted that pharmacists must serve as gatekeepers by ensuring that antibiotics are dispensed strictly on prescription, while laboratory testing should always guide treatment decisions. Strengthening laboratory capacity and drug stewardship training, he noted, is vital to reducing AMR nationwide.

reducing AMR nationwide.

In the same vein, Dr Oluwafemi Daodu, the Head of Veterinary Microbiology, explained that resistant microorganisms spread rapidly through poorly managed farms where overcrowding, unhygienic conditions, and uncontrolled drug use are common. He advised livestock keepers to adopt vaccination, routine diagnostic testing, and professional veterinary consultation before administering drugs.

He called for increased investment in research to develop safe local alternatives to antibiotics and urged government agencies to support veterinary institutions with stronger surveillance systems.

In her remarks, the Kwara State Commissioner for Health, Dr Amina Ahmed El-Imam, noted that AMR now threatens public health more urgently than ever, with hospitals witnessing rising treatment failures due to antibiotic-resistant infections. She said the Kwara State Government is strengthening surveillance, enforcing responsible drug use, and promoting community enlightenment to curb AMR.

She commended UNILORIN students for initiating a summit that aligns with global health priorities, assuring them that the state government would continue to collaborate with researchers and institutions to reduce drug misuse across Kwara communities.

Representing the President of the Nigeria Veterinary Medical Association (NVMA), Dr Musa Imam Abubakar outlined national strategies for AMR prevention, stressing the One Health approach, improved laboratory networks, and effective regulation of antibiotic sales.

In her remarks, the Kwara State Commissioner for Livestock Development, Hon Oloruntoyosi Ayobola Thomas, warned that AMR undermines livestock productivity, leading to major economic losses. She however reaffirmed government support for the newly launched Students Livestock Estate, describing it as a model for youth-led agricultural practice in the state.

The President of the Association of Fish Farmers in Kwara (AFFAK), Brig Gen Tayo Olasupo, who spoke on the misuse of antibiotics in fish farming, explained that resistant bacteria from ponds often contaminate water bodies, and urged farmers to adopt safer aquaculture practices.

Also speaking, an environmental advocate and Co-Founder of the Adun Group, Dr Bola Yusuf, described the environment as a "hidden reservoir" of resistant organisms due to untreated pharmaceutical waste, farm runoff, and contaminated water systems, calling for investment in waste treatment and environmental regulation

Dr Odebode expressed confidence that the 2026 Leadership Summit and the One-Day Staff Development Workshop will further position the University of Ilorin as a leading institution in leadership development, capacity building, and national discourse.

Make the Best of Distance Learning, VC Tells CODL Students

he Vice Chancellor of the University of Ilorin, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, has charged students of the Centre for Open and Distance Learning (CODL) of the University to maximise the opportunities offered by the programme and remain committed to excellence throughout their academic journey.

Prof. Egbewole gave the charge last Tuesday (December 2, 2025) during the fourday orientation programme for newly admitted CODL students held at Hall D of the Mini Campus, where he noted that learners under the distance learning mode are not in any way inferior to their counterparts at the University's permanent site.

Speaking through the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Prof Moji Taibat Bakare-Odunola, the Vice-Chancellor said the only distinction lies in the mode of delivery, with about 70 percent of the programme conducted virtually for the CODL students, while the quality of knowledge, academic standards, and learning outcomes remain the same.

Prof. Egbewole expressed confidence that with dedication and proper engagement, CODL students will excel and contribute meaningfully to the University's enduring legacy of quality education.

On his part, the University Librarian, Prof. Kamaldeen Tunde Omopupa, encouraged the newly admitted students to take full advantage of the University's extensive digital resources by using their mobile phones and other devices to access the wealth of e-materials available in the institution's e-library.

Prof. Omopupa explained that the University of Ilorin has invested significantly in a wide range of academic databases, journals, and online learning platforms to support students across all modes of study, including those in the Centre for Open and Distance Learning (CODL).

He noted that these subscriptions were made specifically to enhance students' research capabilities, broaden their academic exposure, and ensure they enjoy the same level of access to scholarly materials as their counterparts on campus.

In his presentation on "Time Management and Self-Regulation Skills," Dr. Hussein Musa urged students to develop personal study schedules, minimise procrastination, and adopt effective learning strategies to cope with the unique demands of distance learning.

He stressed that self-discipline remains the foundation of achievement in a virtual academic environment.

On youth and national development, she said, "There is a lot to do for the youth. You have seen what has happened in Kenya, Madagascar. It is the youth who bring change, not the old people. If you are waiting for change from the old people, you will wait for a very long time. So it is you who have to bring the change that you want, and not by destroying yourself or destroying the country, but by doing the right thing.'

Instead, he intensified his service, insisting that in UNILORIN, winners and losers work together for the greater good of the institution.


He urged political actors in the country to visit the University to learn how harmony, cooperation, and shared purpose can thrive even in competitive terrains.

he University of Ilorin is currently conducting the National Examination Council (NECO) Computer-Based Test (CBT) Examinations.

Social Sciences Faculty takes possession of new buildings

he Faculty of Social Sciences, University of Ilorin, has formally taken possession of a newly completed administrative block and four additional classroom blocks designed to accommodate 100 students per class.

The facilities were provided as part of efforts targeted at improving the learning and working environment for staff and students of the Faculty.

The official handover ceremony took place at the project sites last Thursday (December 4, 2025).

Speaking at the event, the Dean of the Faculty, Prof. A.Y. Muhammed, described the projects as a reflection of the University Administration's commitment to providing world-class facilities across all faculties.

He assured Nigerians that the University of Ilorin would continue to prioritise infrastructural development that supports teaching and learning.

Prof. Muhammed described the new Administrative Block and classrooms as a landmark achievement and pledged that the Faculty would ensure the proper maintenance and sustainability of the facilities.

He urged staff and students to take collective responsibility for the structures while calling on the University management to provide necessary support for their full utilisation.

The Dean also commended the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN, for his unwavering support to the Faculty of Social Sciences and the University in general, noting that the completion of the projects marked a significant

starting point for the continued development of the Faculty.

In his remarks, the Director of the Physical Planning Unit, Mr Abdulrahman Toyin Jimoh, explained that the facilities were constructed to international standards and equipped with modern solar-powered systems, water facilities, and well-positioned fire extinguishers to ensure safety.

He added that the project was initiated to enhance teaching, research, and creative practice in the humanities, stressing that the new facilities would further strengthen the University's reputation for academic excellence.

The consultants on the project, Arc. David Ajayi and Arc. Ajibade Ayodeji, disclosed that quality and durable materials were used in the construction to ensure long-term usage of the buildings.

Also speaking, the Head of the University's Fire Service Unit, Mr Ibrahim O. AbdulRasaq, drew the attention of users to the importance of regular servicing of the fire extinguishers, which he said should be done every six months.

Mr Ibrahim charged students to maintain the buildings and warned against the misuse of safety equipment.

Dignitaries at the event included the Director of Works, Mr Ramoni Kolawole Amoo, who was represented by Mr Robert Emmanuel, Heads of Departments in the Faculty of Social Sciences, and other members of staff.
