The Vice Chancellor, who was represented at the event by the Deputy Vice Chancellor (Research, Technology and Innovation), Prof. Muhtar Adeiza Etudaiye, said that the company's operations justify its designation as a "holding limited," given the breath of enterprises under its management.

He expressed confidence that with continued expansion, UHL would, in the future, operate with full independence from the administrative processes of the University.

Prof. Egbewole explained that members of staff of UHL were deliberately selected for their capacity to think creatively and function beyond the traditional civil service or academic mentality. He noted that the vision behind the staffing process is already yielding results, as reflected in the company's recent growth trajectory.

Describing the event as a day of reflection, appreciation, and celebration, the Vice Chancellor said the atmosphere was made possible by the outstanding performance of the staff and the initiative of the Managing Director, Prof. Bashir Raji, to organise the gathering.

Prof. Egbewole expressed gratitude to the management team and congratulated the award recipients, stressing that their recognition was based on honesty, transparency, integrity, and the distinguished qualities that justified their appointment into the organisation.

The Vice Chancellor urged the staff to sustain their commitment to excellence as UHL continues to advance its commercial leadership within and beyond the University environment.

Speaking earlier, the Director of UNILORIN Holdings Limited, Prof. Bashir Raji, said the company has demonstrated resilience and growth in the face of significant economic challenges experienced in 2025.

He appreciated both past and present staff of the Holdings, acknowledging their hard work, loyalty, and contributions to the company's accomplishments in 2025. He noted that the event was particularly historic as it was the first to be held since UHL formally became a limited liability company.

Reflecting on the business climate during the year, Prof. Raji revealed that some UHL ventures,



particularly the petroleum outlet, faced tough operational and financial conditions. He cited volatile fuel pricing as a major concern, noting that the company once procured a tanker of petrol at over N20 million only for the price to be drastically reduced the next day, largely due to market disruptions.

Prof. Raji said that despite these setbacks, the year also recorded notable successes as UHL expanded its operations, growing from seven business units to nine with the addition of the Optometry Unit and Unilorin Health Services to its portfolio.

He credited the achievement to the unwavering support of the University Governing Council led by Surv. Abiodun Aluko, and the University management under the leadership of the Vice Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN.

Prof. Raji also appreciated the company's partners and vendors, many of whom were present at the ceremony. He said that their support was instrumental to

UHL's stability and productivity, as he reflected the organic and mutually respectful relationships that helped sustain the organisation throughout the year.

Speaking on a major structural change within the organisation, the Director disclosed that all University staff were fully disengaged from UHL operations during the year, making the company a wholly private-driven entity. According to him, this transition has strengthened operational efficiency and positioned the Holdings for greater competitiveness.

Looking ahead, Prof. Raji called for renewed commitment in 2026, urging staff to align fully with the Vice Chancellor's vision of making the University of Ilorin the best in Nigeria. He added that achieving this ambition would naturally elevate Unilorin Holdings Limited to a leading position among corporate entities in the country.

The Director reaffirmed UHL's readiness to explore new opportunities and deepen its commercial footprint in the coming year.

UNILORIN takes disciplinary action against 13 students over misconduct

The University of Ilorin management has taken decisive disciplinary measures against 13 students for various acts of misconduct, following the recommendations of the Students' Disciplinary Committee (SDC) during its 227th meeting held on Thursday, October 9, 2025.

In the letters to the affected students, copies of which were made available to **UNILORIN Bulletin** last Monday (December 22, 2025), the disciplinary actions include the expulsion of six students, the rustication of six students, and a formal warning to one student.

The six students expelled with immediate effect are Abdulhafeez Abdulhammed of the Department of Educational Technology, Faculty of Education; Esther Ajuma Matthew of the Department of Human Kinetics, Faculty of Education; Divine Tijesunimi Stanislaus of the Department of Human Kinetics, Faculty of Education; Qozeem Abdulateef Mohammed of the Centre for Open and Distance Learning; Sormidat

Oluwatosin Lawal of the Department of Health Education, Faculty of Education; and Doris Comfort Falusi of the Department of History & International Studies, Faculty of Arts.

The letters of expulsion directed the affected students to "immediately surrender all University property, including their student identity cards, to the Student Affairs" and prohibited them from accessing the University campus. The students were also informed of their right to "appeal the decision to the University Council through their respective deans."

Similarly, six other students were rusticated for one academic session (2025/2026 Academic Session). They are Idowu Oluwadamilola Owoade of the Department of Civil Engineering, Faculty of Engineering & Technology; Quayum Damilare Aderibigbe of the Department of Finance, Faculty of Management Sciences; Onimisi Abdulmajeed Aliyu of the Department of Quantity Survey, Faculty of Environmental Sciences; Emmanuel Olayeni of the Department of Water Resources, Faculty of Engineering & Technology; Sulton Abidemi Salman of the Department of Agriculture, Faculty of Agriculture; and Faruq of the Department

of Finance, Faculty of Management Sciences.

The rusticated students were instructed to "submit all University property, including their Student Identity Cards, and to keep off the campus until the 2026/2027 Academic Session," when they are expected to resume with "written evidence of rehabilitation from a recognised medical centre certified by the Director, University of Ilorin Health Services."

One student, Isaac Chuks Okoh of the Department of Science Education, Faculty of Education, received a formal warning. The warning cautioned the student to "maintain good conduct," noting that "any repeat of the misconduct would attract stiffer disciplinary measures."

The student was also directed to "report to the Student Affairs Unit to complete the process associated with the disciplinary action."

The letters emphasised that the actions were taken "in accordance with the University's rules and regulations, aimed at maintaining discipline and ensuring a conducive academic environment for all students."

In his keynote address, Professor

Emeritus Anthony J. Afolayan of South Africa's University of Fort Hare, spoke on “Globalising Tropical Medicine.”

The plenary sessions delved into critical topics such as the biochemical mechanisms of herbs, their efficacy and safety, and their powerful role in integrative oncology.

Speaking at the panel session, a nephrologist at the University of Ilorin Teaching Hospital (UITH), Prof. Timothy Olanrewaju reiterated the need for evidence-based research to establish the efficacy and safety of herbal products in

order to avoid side effects particularly on the kidney.

The rigorous discussions at the conference coalesced to actionable recommendations, including: strengthening herbal research; promoting multidisciplinary studies to validate the mechanisms of action of herbal compounds, support clinical trials, enhancing regulation: mandating Good Agricultural and Collection Practices (GACP) and cGMP to ensure quality from farm to final product.



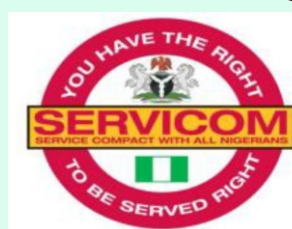
